PART II NARRIIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Personnel: 2 officers and 22 enlisted members completed overseas towns and rotated to CONUS during the month of May. 2 Officers and 20 emlisted members made use of R&R quotas to Hawaii, Lustralia, Kuala Lumpur, Manila, Okinawa, Tokyo, Taipei, and Hong Kong.
- Combat Operations and Training Classes: Due to operational commitments classes were not conducted during the month. During the early hours of 12 May 1969 the Regimental contonnent came under an enemy ground and rocket attack by an estimated force of 100 to 110 suppers, which resulted in 30 enemy KIA's and three captured with only one of our men receiving minor wounds.

Operation PIPESTONE CANYON was initiated on 26 May 1969 in the DODGE. CITY and GO NOI ISLAND area by elements of the Fifth Marines and BLT 1/26. On 29 May 1969, the Readquarters Company advance party displaced to the forward CP. On 31 May 1969, the forward command group consisting of 12 office and 71 enlisted combers of Headquarters Company displaced to the Forward Regimental Command Post. On that date the First Marines took over overall operational control of Operation PIPESTONE GANYON. Administrative and Logistical support was supplied by Readquarters Company.

. Logistics: Motor Transport vehicles traveled a total of 20,599 miles during the month with only one accident.
