NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Personnel. Four officers and twenty-four enlisted members completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. Seven officers and fifty-two enlisted replacements were joined into this company during January. One officer and twenty-three enlisted members made use of R & R quotas to Manila, Okinawa, Singapore, Tokyo, Bangkok, HongKong, Hawaii and Taipei. Two enlisted members extended their overseas tours during the month of January.
- 2. Combat Operations and Training. Enlisted personnel received instructions on, and FAM Fired their M-16 rifles. Also received, were instructions on Drug Abuse Suppression Programs from the Regimental Aid Station. Members of Meadquarters Company actively participated in the defense of Camp MUIR. One attached Officer and one enlisted member were seriously wounded in combat actions.
- 3. Logistics, Headquarters Company Supply continues to draw equipment from FIC. Quantities of priority items on hand are sufficient to satisfy 75% of recurring demands. Shortages are on valid priority requisitions.
- 4. Motor Transport, There were no reported vehicle accidents during January, Motor vehicles traveled a total of 13,523 miles during January. No vehicles were deadlined.
