NARRATIVE SUMMARY

DECLASSIFIED

1. PERSONNEL. Two officers and twenty enlisted Marines participated in R & R during the month of May to Manila, Tokyo, Bangkok, Hong Kong, Taipei, Australia, Okinawa, and Hawaii. One officer and twelve enlisted personnel completed their tours in WestPac and rotated. One officer and thirty-two enlisted Marines joined Headquarters Company during May. There were no extensions granted or requested during the month.

2. COMBAT OPERATIONS AND TRAINING. Classes were held at Camp PERDUE on Security of Classified Information, Career Planning, Mines and Booby Traps. In addition, an exercise was held at the Gas Chamber. Approximately 1/3 of the company Fam-fired the M-16, M-60, and the M-79. Members of the Security Platoon are manning 4 out-posts in defense of the Danang vital area. Members of Headquarters Company actively participated in the defense of Camp PERDUE.

3. MOTOR TRANSPORT. This company suffered no accidents during the month of May. Vehicles were driven a total of 20,476 miles. There were 41 vehicles dead-lined for a total of 64 days. Ten for third echelon and thirty-one for second echelon.
