

d. Significant intelligence incidents reported during Operation WAYNE were as follows:

(1) 101420H - H&S Co CP security discovered 2-VC moving along a side trail at (YC908990). Security opened fire killing both VC. No friendly casualties. Captured equipment: (1) Thompson SMG with 45 rds of ammunition, (1) ChiCom 7.62 MOSSIN-NAGANT Carbine Mod. 53 with 12 rds of ammunition, (1) cartridge belt, (2) ChiCom grenades, (1) leather cartridge pouch; VC wore black shirts, camouflage material wrapped possibly around their waist and one blue hat. Possibly a VC security element flushed out by Naval gun-fire. VC were heading west when they were detected.

(2) 101515H - "A" Co found an abandoned VC hut vicinity (YC923991). The following items were found inside: (1) 12 gage shotgun of U.S. make, (1) VC pack containing mess gear and documents, and 200 pounds of rice.

(3) 101630H - "A" Co received 1 burst of automatic weapons fire vicinity (YC923991) slightly wounding two (2) USMC (non-evac). "A" Co returned fire killing 1-VC and 2-VC KIA. Pursued VC (estimated 4-5) and found 3 huts, possibly a VC aid station. Equipment found in huts: (1) VC flag, (1) pair of binoculars and case, (1) knife, (3) hammocks, (25) sets of clothing and rain gear, (2) packs, (3) canteens, (1) can of milk, (1) M-26 hand-grenade, (16) ChiCom hand-grenades, (3) cartons of beef, (3) boxes of ammunition of unknown type, (1) cooking pot, (40) pounds of documents, (1) pen-knife, (3) flashlight bulbs, 150 blasting caps, 800 pounds of rice, (1) ChiCom rifle caliber 7.62 and (30) pounds of assorted medical supplies.

(4) 110755H - A-3 point fired on 5-VC coming down a trail vicinity (YC933998). The initial burst killed two VC. The other 3-VC dropped their rifles and packs and withdrew back along trail. A-3 pursued with a heavy volume of fire resulting in 2 VC KIA. Equipment captured were (5) ChiCom 7.62 carbines and (5) packs. No friendly casualties. All VC were wearing khaki uniforms with blue sweaters. One grave approximately 3 months old and 2 fresh fighting holes were found vicinity (YC933999) along the same trail.

(5) 110804H - "B" Co at (YC924999) found 6 huts (15X30 feet) and 8 smaller huts, 200 rds of 9mm SMG ammunition, 15 sets of VC khaki uniforms, 2 VC field packs, 8 punches, 4 pounds of ChiCom TNT, 6 sweaters, and 2 bunkers. At 110855H (YC924999) "B" Co found 6-60mm mortar ris, 1-60mm mortar base-plate, 4 machine gun barrels for a ChiCom 7.62 mm DPM DEGTYAREV automatic rifle, 8 pounds of TNT, 50 VC khaki uniforms, 3 - 3X35 feet medical huts, 1 - 8X8 feet cooking hut, 2 - 6X4 feet living quarters, 9 cans of powdered milk, 500 pounds of rice, 200 pounds of dried shrimp, 33 pounds of cooking shortening, 4 cartridge belts,

7. INTELLIGENCE. Operation WAYNE, 10-12 May 1966, was a search and destroy operation conducted in the THUA THIEN Province, PHU LOC District, KHE BAI DA area. Prior intelligence indicated the presence of the 804th Viet Cong Main Force Battalion, with an estimated strength of 450 men. Two (2) separate Local Force Guerrilla units that numbered 100 men each were reported bordering the KHE BAI DA area in the capacity of a screening force. A confirmed Main Force Battalion, the 810th, was reported by III MAF Order of Battle to be located in the BACH MA French Resort area, vicinity GS (ZC0592). This battalion was reported to be capable of reinforcing the 804th Battalion within a 12 hour period. Weapons for both the 804th and the 810th Battalions included 81mm and 82mm mortars, 57mm recoilless rifles, and assorted automatic, semi-automatic and bolt action small arms. The PHU LOC Viet Cong District Headquarters with administrative and transient facilities was also reported located in the KHE BAI DA area.

a. Helicopter Landing Zone SWALLOW, at (YC903997) showed little evidence of Viet Cong activity. Lack of fortifications, used structures and tilled crop areas indicated that the Viet Cong avoided the open terrain within this area. Though several structures were in the landing zone area, they were in poor condition and showed no sign of recent occupation. Several patches of ground contained second or third season growth of dry crops, but were unworked and bore no crops.

b. The KHE BAI DA area appeared to be a staging and transient area complete with medical, messing and billeting structures located along main trails running parallel to streams for easy access to fresh water supply and beneath jungle canopy for protection against visual detection. All structures were placed in draws or ravines that offered excellent defense against high-explosive munitions. Well constructed bomb shelters and covered fighting holes were found in the near proximity to all structures. Messing facilities were centrally located within billeting areas. A VC hospital, complete with recovery, billeting and messing facilities was found at (YC923991). All areas and buildings were connected by a net of well covered paths and trails.

c. The contact that was made during Operation WAYNE with the Viet Cong was scattered and failed to show indications of organized resistance. The Viet Cong encountered did not appear to be well trained or disciplined. On one occasion, a Marine patrol surprised a five man Viet Cong patrol coming down a trail. The Marines killed the leading two Viet Cong and the other three dropped their weapons and packs and fled back along the trail. This contact resulted in two (2) VC KIA, five (5) ChiCom 7.62 carbines and five (5) VC packs captured. The VC did not fire one shot in this engagement.

(6) 110940H - A-1 found 3 large huts along a stream bed at (YC933005). A outdoor messing table was found plus 10 fighting holes, 1 cave, 25 pounds of VC equipment, documents, 100 rds of 7.62 and 9mm ammunition, small arms ammunition and 40 pounds of salt.

(7) 111115H - "B" Co found at (YC916999) 1 French SMG (MATS-49) caliber 9mm, 150 rds of 50 caliber ammunition, 4 Bangalore Torpedoes with 4 warheads, 2 drum type magazines for a ChiCom 7.62 DPM DEGTYAREV automatic rifle and 12 9mm MATS-49 magazines.

(8) 111145H - (YC927997) H&S Co CP security spotted 2-VC; opened fire and the VC fled dropping 1 ChiCom 7.62 MOSSIN-NAGANT Carbine Mod. 53. Contact immediately lost. VC were wearing khaki shorts and black shirts plus were barefooted.

(9) 111950H - At (YC995995) "C" Co encountered 6-VC armed with small arms of undetermined type. "C" Co opened fire and began pursuit. VC fled without returning fire. Contact lost with the VC. One hut discovered and destroyed.

(10) 121355H - One (1) USMC M-54 truck struck a mine on road at (YB907006). Mine believed to be a 105mm rd. Crater was 4X13 feet.

8. Mission. Commencing L-Hour (1000H), D-Day (10 May), 1st Bn, 1st Marines lands by helicopter in LZ SWALLOW; seizes HILL 273, destroying enemy installations located there; after seizure of HILL 273, continues attack north to destroy enemy in zone. The battalion prepares to take OPCON of Co G, 2d Bn, 1st Marines, on order.

9. Concept of Operation. See paragraph 3.a. and Annex B (Operation Overlay) of Enclosure (1) (Operation Order 10-66). Planning envisioned the battalion's landing with three rifle companies (Rein) and a command group. After landing, each company was to proceed along its assigned axis of advance to its portion of Phase Line RED. The command group was to follow the center company, halting initially in the vicinity of HILL 273. On order, after all companies had reached Phase Line RED, the attack was to continue in each company's zone of action. Co G, 2d Bn, 1st Marines, OPCON 4th Marines initially, was to come under OPCON 1st Bn, 1st Marines when communications between the company and the battalion were established.

10. Execution.

a. See Enclosures (2) through (5):

b. The operation was conducted essentially as planned except that the boundary between the 1st Bn, 1st Marines and the 3d Bn, 4th Marines--established as a limit of advance for units of the 1st Bn, 1st Marines--was moved 200 meters south effective 111245H, and the direction of attack was changed from north to west once this new limit of advance was reached. Effective communications were not established, and OPCON of Co G, 2d Bn, 1st Marines was not assumed until 111400H.

c. Upon completion of the westward sweep through the valley, 1st Bn, 1st Marines was assigned additional patrolling and ambushing missions along, and to the west of Route 14. (See Enclosure (4).)

11. Results.

12. Administrative Matters. No significant problems encountered.

13. Special Techniques.

a. The scarcity of landing zones under the thick canopy of most of the area of operations precluded normal helicopter resupply techniques. Excellent teamwork between helicopter support team personnel and the helicopter pilots was responsible for the success of the hovering and hoisting/lowering techniques which had to be employed.

b. The AN/PRC-25 radio, especially when equipped with the long antenna, proved entirely satisfactory for radio communications---even under the canopy. For future reference, the battalion command group experimented with field expedient antenna, constructed of communication wire, which was lifted above treetop level by a lighter-than-air balloon. The makeshift antenna proved to be entirely satisfactory, although further experiments are needed to reduce the weight and bulk of the gas-generating apparatus for the balloon.

14. Commander's Analysis.

a. The discovery of enemy installations and materiel in the area of operations tended to bear out intelligence reports which had been received prior to the start of the operation. It is estimated that the area was the home--on a continuing basis--of a VC company, with facilities for handling either an influx of recruits or transient individuals/units.

b. One unusual feature of the operation was the unwillingness of the VC encountered to hang on to their weapons when faced with sudden assault by Marines. This indicates that the VC encountered were either recruits or rear echelon security forces in a relatively low state of training.

c. Movement through the area of operations posed no significant problems. A conventionally equipped Marine battalion would have no difficulty operating for an extended period in this or similar areas.

15. Recommendations.

a. It is recommended that as a matter of routine planning, truck convoys be provided with a mine sweeping capability, with which to check intended turn-around areas. After a truck detonated a mine on 12 May (See Enclosure (5).), a significant delay in loading the convoy occurred until mine sweeping teams could be dispatched to check the turn-around areas which were eventually used.

b. Dampness under the canopy caused difficulties in destroying VC huts and rice stores by fire. It is recommended that units planning operations of this type be advised to carry a supply of white phosphorous or other incendiary type grenades.

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

1. 10 May - The helilift to LZ SWALLOW commenced on schedule at 1000H. By 1040H, Co A, Co B, and initial elements of the battalion command group had been landed. After a refueling delay, the remainder of the command group and Co C were landed. The unopposed lift was completed by 101145H. As the companies commenced movement along their assigned axes of advance, air strikes and naval gunfire missions were conducted to block possible enemy routes of withdrawal. The first ground contact was made at 1340H, as the point squad from Co C spotted one VC vicinity YC 9055998. The Marines fired one round and commenced pursuit, but were unable to trap the VC. At 1420H, a Marine from the command group security element killed two VC as they approached the command group on a side trail vicinity YC 908990. Both VC were dressed in black, with camouflaged material wrapped around their waists. Weapons and equipment recovered included: one Thompson submachine gun; one CHICOM 7.62mm rifle; two CHICOM grenades; a cartridge belt; and a leather ammunition pouch. At 1552H, the 2d Plat, Co A discovered an abandoned hut vicinity YC 923991--in an area previously reported to contain a VC camp for transient cadre. The hut contained 12-gauge shotgun and 200 pounds of rice. At 1630H, as the platoon continued to search the area, its point squad received small arms fire from an estimated five VC. The Marines returned fire with small arms and M79 grenade launchers, and commenced an immediate pursuit. One VC was killed, and blood stains indicated that at least one other was wounded in this encounter. Two Marines were wounded slightly--neither requiring evacuation. The pursuit led the Marines to three additional huts, which contained a CHICOM 7.62mm rifle; 800 pounds of rice; 30 pounds of assorted medical supplies; one pair of binoculars; one M-26 hand grenade; three boxes of assorted small arms ammunition; 16 CHICOM hand grenades; three hammocks; 25 sets of assorted clothing and rain gear; one VC flag; one knife; two packs; three canteens; 40 pounds of documents; . . . The equipment was collected for forwarding through S-2 channels. As the companies established night positions in the vicinity of Phase Line RED (See Enclosure (2)) the 2d Plat, Co A remained in the vicinity of the suspected transient camp. Ten squad-sized ambushes were established along trails near night defensive positions, but no contact with the enemy was developed during the night.

2. 11 May - The companies resumed movement in their respective zones toward the boundary between 3d Bn, 4th Marines and 1st Bn, 1st Marines--designated earlier as the limit of advance. At 0745H, Co B discovered a hut and 50 pounds of rice at YC 924999. Material found in the hut included six 60mm mortar rounds; one 60mm mortar base plate, two 7.62mm MG barrels; 50 khaki uniforms; eight pounds of CHICOM INT; one diary; one grenade pouch; one bayonet scabbard, and a stretcher. The hut and the rice were destroyed. At 0755H, the point squad from Co A encountered a VC patrol on a trail vicinity YC 933998. The Marines fired first, killing two VC with the initial burst. The remaining three VC dropped their rifles and packs and fled, followed by a heavy volume of fire from the pursuing Marines. Bloodstains found on the trail indicated that two additional VC may have been wounded. No friendly casualties. The VC were wearing khaki uniforms with blue sweaters. Five CHICOM 7.62mm carbines and five packs were recovered. At 0940H, Co A found a 12x20 hut vicinity YD 934006. A transient barracks and a mess table were found in the area. Fresh food was discovered in canteen cups on the table, indicating that VC had recently left the area in a hurry. At 1145H, the point security squad from the battalion command group sighted two VC on a trail vicinity YC 927997. The squad opened fire and began pursuit. One dropped weapon (a CHICOM 7.62mm carbine) was recovered. The VC were wearing khaki shirts and shorts and were barefooted. The pursuing Marines were unable to trap the fleeing VC. At 1245H, the boundary between 3d Bn, 4th Marines was moved 200 meters south of its original location, and Companies A, B, and C were ordered to commence a sweep westward to Route 14, checking out all side trails enroute. At 1400H, Co G, 2d Bn, 1st Marines was placed under OPCON of 1st Bn, 1st Marines, and directed to follow in trace of Co A. By nightfall, companies and the command group had reached the positions shown on Enclosure (4). At 1930H, a platoon from Co C, en route to its night position, encountered six VC vicinity YC 895995. The Marines opened fire and began pursuit, but were unable to trap the VC. During the night 12 patrols and 12 ambushes were conducted, without enemy contact.

3. 12 May - During the morning and early afternoon, Co A and Co C conducted patrols within their respective AOR's indicated on enclosure (4). A platoon from Co C began a patrol to locate and destroy a reported underwater bridge at YC 835984, but was ordered to return when it became apparent that terrain difficulties would keep it from

completing the patrol within the allotted time. At 1350H, the second truck of a convoy detonated a mine vicinity YD 897005. Eleven Marines were wounded by fragments from the blast--seven requiring helicopter evacuation. The truck lost a rear wheel. The mine was a 105mm round, activated by a pressure device, which had been buried beneath the macadam surface of Route 14. Engineers swept vehicle turn-around points, and the convoy was loaded and ready to depart by 1700H. The last elements of the battalion closed on the battalion's PWU BAI command post at 1800H.
