a. Personnel

(6) Special Services. An addition on the enlisted club was completed and a recreation room was erected within the Battalion CP. One platoon from Company "C" was sent to China Beach for a three day in-country R&R.

b. Administration

(1) Awards

(a) Ninety-five Purple Heart Awards were received for personnel in this Battalion during this reporting period. Twenty-nine were presented by Colonel MAILORY during a ceremony at the Battalion CP on 7 January.

(b) Four Vietnamese Cross's of Galantry were presented to members of this command during a ceremony at the 1st Marine Regiment Command Post by Major General LAM.

(2) Promotions. There were 67 promotions to corporal, 95 to lance corporal, and one to private first class during January.

c. Intelligence

(1) Intelligence reports during the month indicated two main areas of enemy activity. The first of these areas was the Xuyen Phuoc and Xuyen Tho Villages south of the Battalion's eastern TAOR. The VC were improving defences south of the Song Hoi An and conducting limited offensive operations north of the river. The enemy continued to avoid decisive engagement with Marines but was successful in attacks upon the Cam Kim outpost and the RF position on the Cam Thanh island complex. Both incidents indicate infiltration of the Vietnamese units involved. Reports continued to indicate an attack on the CAC unit at the Phuoc Trach bridge but again none materialized.

(2) South of the Battalion's western TAOR, on the Go Noi island complex, another buildup was in evidence. As in the east, the majority of activity was the construction of fortifications, but the VC also used this area to stage trainees enroute to mountain areas. The company-size raid by a company from this Battalion confirmed the above. It also confirmed an enemy communication capability and the ability of the VC to rapidly reinforce beleaguered units south of the Song Ky Lam.

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(3) Interrogation of captives and translation of captured documents provided the intelligence utilized for the majority of operations during the reporting period. During County Fair 1-29 field interrogation of captives led to the capture of a number of VC cadre from the Vinh Xuan Village area, the discovery and destruction of enemy fortifications, and the recovery of significant VC stores. Near the end of the month information provided by the Cam An Village Chief assisted in the capture of a VC school teacher and an assassination cell planning the murder of local GVN officials.

(4) Utilization of the Rewards Program during County Fair 1-29 was effective in assisting interrogation efforts. Ultimately the recovery of approximately 19 tons of VC rice resulted. The Rewards Program was also utilized at the Battalion CP and proved extremely successful in encouraging local children to bring both munitions and equipment to sentries. The children were rewarded with small cash payments and candy purchased with the Rewards Fund. (See Tab 1 of Part IV).

(5) Incidents of enemy contact dropped 28% from the previous month. Mine and harassing incidents remained constant in number but there was a 14% increase in the detonation of mines by Marines.

(6) Weather improved during the latter part of January and aided the movement of friendly forces. It also provided the VC an opportunity to reconstruct their underground fortifications.

(7) Enemy initiated incidents during the reporting period. The Viet Cong initiated 100 incidents within the TAOR during January. The incidents are categorized as follows:

d. Operations and Training

(1) Operations

(a) During the reporting period this Battalion conducted extensive patrols and ambushes within its TAOR with emphasis on squad-size patrols during daylight hours and fire team ambushes and security patrols and listening posts at night.

(b) During the month this Battalion worked with government forces on several occasions. On the second of January, CAC-D-3 with the Battalion Scouts supported the 322d Regional Force Company from DIEN BAN District in a search and destroy operation in the western portion of the Battalion TAOR. The Battalion Scouts and CAC-D-5 in conjunction with the HIEU NHON District Popular Force Platoon on 7 January conducted an operation of one day duration on the island centered at (BT 180555) and on 19 January Company C operated in conjunction with three Popular Force platoons from HIEU NHON District in a area of operations in the southeast portion of the Battalion TAOR.

(c) On 6 January a bomb drop was conducted in the northwestern portion of the TAOR utilizing ordnance with time delay fuzes. This was done anticipating that the VC would return after the drop in search of unexploded ordnance. The success or failure of this mission was undetermined as safety restrictions precluded an immediate reconnaissance of the area to confirm VC dead and determine the extent of damage.

(d) Reaction to agent reports and POW interrogation reports resulted in a successful series of company operations in the VINH XUAN Village in the central portion of the TAOR. A cordon and search operation in CO LUU (2) and a switch in County Fair sites resulted in a damaging blow to the VC infrastructure in that village during January.

(e) Units of this Battalion participated in two successful operations outside the Division TAOR during the month of January. The first mentioned above in sub-paragraph (b) was conducted on the island located at (BT 180555) and the second, a company raid, was conducted at BAN LAHN (2) south of the Division TAOR on 14 January.

(f) Three times during the month operational control of units of this Battalion was passed to adjacent battalions to conduct search and destroy operations along common TAOR boundaries.

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(g) During the reporting period there were 803 fire team, 482 squad, 82 platoon, and 18 company operations conducted. Listening posts increased 15% over last month.

(2) Training

(a) The following schools were conducted by the Battalion during January:

1. A three day orientation school was conducted for 177 newly joined personnel.

2. A small unit leaders' school was conducted for 37 squad leaders and prospective squad leaders of this Battalion. It was the purpose of this school to review basic infantry skills and provide leadership guidance to better prepare the squad leader to accept his ever increasing responsibilities.

3. In addition to regularly scheduled classes, individual companies conducted training on the M-16 rifle and continued training and familiarization instruction and firing on all organic weapons.

e. Logistics

(1) Supply. The shortage of individual equipment lessened during this month. Surface draft replacements arriving on 27 January had been issued individual equipment prior to depart from CONUS, and this reduced the drawdown on battalion stocks. M79 ammunition and claymore mines were not available during the latter part of the month.

(2) Maintainance.

(a) Motor Transport. During the month constant velocity (CV) joints on the M-422A1 vehicle wore out at a high rate, this was a result of constant 4 wheel drive operation in the deep sand within the battalion command post. The deep sand also caused rapid wearing of the brake shoes on this type vehicle. Starting on 19 January, the battalion began using the Direct Exchange Program at FLSC. This program was used to replace worn out master cylinders, generators and brake shoes. Sixteen M-274A1 Mechanical Mules were received to replace like items turned into FLSC for repair.

(b) Ordnance. The number of item on deadline was reduced significantly when FLSC-A issued replacements for most items on 3d echelon repair.

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(c) Communication. The shortage of replacement modules for the AN/PRC-25 worsened with no modules being received during the month.

(3) Food Service. Beginning 13 January 1967 fresh bread was furnished by FLSG for those personnel subsisting on C rations.

(4) Contonment and Camp Facilities. A drainage system for the Battalion Messhall and shower was installed by battalion personnel, eliminating the standing pools of soapy water.

(5) Transportation. On 17 January the five 2½-ton trucks from 1st Motor Transport Battalion were replaced by five 5-ton trucks from 11th Motor Transport Battalion.

(6) Water. A detachment from 1st Engineer Battalion relieved a similar unit from 3d Engineer Battalion on 11 January at the battalion water point. On 9 January, the 3d Engineer Battalion removed one 3000 gallon water storage tank from the water point reducing the storage capacity by a comparable amount. This storage reduction resulted in shorter shower hours for the battalion.

f. Civic Action. The normal Civic Action activities during January were high lighted by County Fair 1-29 which received full support from RVN agencies. The considerable amount of rice that was captured during the month was bagged and delivered to Hieu Nhon and Dien Ban Districts. Medcaps totaled 2,395 during January.

g. Psychological Operations. Psychological warfare tapes and leaflets were made by the wives of eight VC for use against a platoon of VC reported adjacent to this Battalion's TAOR.

h. Fire Support Coordination and Naval Gunfire.

(1) Artillery support for the month of January was provided by the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. The artillery liaison personnel conducted classes on map reading and forward observer procedures in conjunction with the orientation and small unit leader training programs. Four artillery forward observer teams were in support of the Battalion during the month.

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i. Air Support.

Air support during the reporting period was provided by the 1st Marine Air Wing with missions utilizing both fixed wing and helicopter aircraft. There were 32 close air support missions conducted by Company C on 14 January. In addition to close air support, one illumination and four aerial observation missions were flown. Helicopter support during the month consisted of 18 cargo missions, 19 medical evacuations, three Sparrowhawks, and three reconnaissance flights.

j. Medical and Dental.

During the month of January there was an increase in general medical disease which was attributed to the cold, wet weather. There were no specific medical trends and immersion foot casualties were markedly decreased in incidence compared to the preceeding month. Dental clinic continues to function productively in the Battalion, showing a significant savings in man-hours. There were a total of 210 treatments administered during the month.

k. Chaplain.

In an attempt to insure that American Red Cross messages are handled in a more expeditious manner, a program was instituted whereby such messages are now forwarded to the Battalion Chaplain for delivery. The Chapel grounds were landscaped and tape recorded Church music is now provided for both Chapel and field worship services.

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Part III

Sequential Listing of Significant Events

2 January--A sweep force from Company C apprehended three VCS at coordinates (BT 077605). Interrogation by CIT revealed two to be confirmed VC cadre and one a guerrilla squad leader.

CAC D-3 and Battalion Scouts supported the 322d Regional Force Company from DIEM DAN in the western portion of the Battalion TAOR.

4 January--VITH XUAN Village chief reported four VC killed in QUANG LANG Hamlet bunkers destroyed by Marines.

Company R conducted an amphibious landing with two LVTB-6's and five LVTB-5's and commenced a five day search and destroy operation in the village of CAM THANH (BT 1856).

6 January--Instruction team from 1st Marine Division commenced M-16 training for 14 NCO's of this Battalion to provide instructors for the eventual integration of the M-16 rifle.

Delayed and instant fused bombs were dropped in western sector of TAOR.

7 January--OPCON of Company A returned to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

A blocking force from Company C observed two VC fleeing across rice paddies at (BT 068605). One VC was killed by small arms fire; the other was captured and later confirmed as a VC by CIT.

8 January--1st Battalion, 1st Marines commenced County Fair 1-29.

A blocking force from Company C captured two VC at coordinates (BT 074605) who were confirmed by CIT as VC cell leaders.

9 January--A tank attached to Company C hit a pressure detonated mine at coordinates (BT 095615). A track and road wheel were destroyed.

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10 January--A fire team stay-back ambush from Company B observed four VC at coordinates (BT 178567). The VC were taken under fire and two were killed. A sub-machinegun and several grenades were captured from the dead VC.

11 January--A VC captured by Company C pointed out 8,000 pounds of rice at coordinates (BT 089602). The rice was bagged and taken to the Battalion CP for disposition.

12 January--A more detailed search of the storage area at coordinates (BT 088602) pointed out by a VC at County Fair 1-29 revealed an additional 12 tons of rice. A cache of 250,000 North Vietnamese masters was also found. The rice was bagged by Marines and sent to the Battalion CP for disposition.

County Fair 1-29 terminated.

13 January--An OMTOS hit a pressure type mine at coordinates (BT 032577) resulting in the total destruction of the vehicle and three USMC KIA.

17 January--Companies B and D changed to 3d Battalion, 1st Marines.

18 January--OPCON of Companies B and D returned to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

20 January--The Battalion instigated a program to encourage local children to turn in munitions and emulment to sentries. Small cash payments and candy were given to children by sentinels on gate duty.

22 January--A patrol from Company A located 1,000 pounds of rice which was hoarded by Marines and sent to the Battalion CP for disposition.

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24 January--The DIEN BAN District Intelligence Center commenced operations providing a new collection agency and a source for GVN cadre heretofore difficult to obtain.

26 January--1st Battalion, 1st Marines assumed responsibility for Bald Eagle.

A stem-back ambush from Company B observed two VC moving down a trail at coordinates (WT 035591). The VC were taken under fire with small arms and both were killed. One carbine was captured.

27 January--Psychological Operations exploited the willingness of 8 wives of VC to attempt to get their husbands to take advantage of the Chieu Hoi program during TET.

28 January--1st Battalion, 1st Marines channeled the 1st Platoon, Company B to 7th Motor Transport Battalion for Rough Rider commitment.

29 January--1st Battalion, 1st Marines channeled two platoons and command group of Company A and the 3d platoon of Company B to 2d Battalion, 1st Marines.

30 January--OPCON of 1st Platoon, Company B was returned to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines at completion of Rough Rider commitment.

CAC D-5 on a patrol at coordinates (WT 204571) with the CAM AN Village Police Chief captured three VC whose mission it was to assassinate the Village Chief of PHUOC TRACH (1). One attempted to escape and was wounded. The remaining were sent to the Battalion CP for processing.

31 January--OPCON of units previously committed to 2d Battalion, 1st Marines resumed by 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

Bald Eagle requirement was relinquished to 2d Battalion, 1st Marines

Timely employment of Company C in reaction to intelligence obtained from the Third Counter Intelligence Team prevented the accomplishment of this scheme.

b. It is felt that the capture of the village guerrilla squad leader, an intelligence assassination cell leader, and three female guerrilla intelligence agents has weakened considerably, if not destroyed, the VC infrastructure of the hamlet of TAY MY (1). This is further substantiated by the killing of six VC during the operation. In addition, the VC infrastructure of the village of VINH XUAN has also been debilitated.

These battalions are believed to be the V 25th and R 20th main force units and are considered capable of passing in a matter of three or four hours. There are probably from one to three companies supported by local guerrillas in the objective area. They will arrive and have extensive tunnels and fortifications. They normally quarter themselves in houses of villagers.

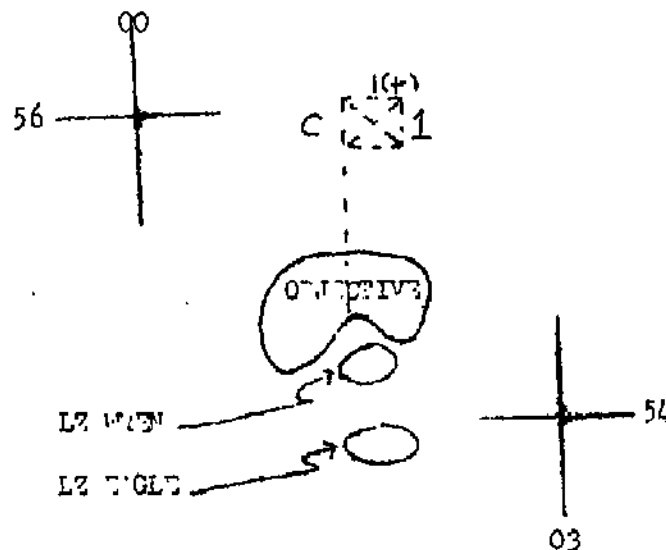

Planning was initiated at a conference attended by representatives of the air and ground headquarters concerned, and it was continued on a closely integrated basis up to the time of execution. The degree and quality of control exercised by the controlling headquarters, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines, was particularly noteworthy.

6. Supporting Forces.

A. Artillery.

(1) Artillery support was provided by Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery A, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. Battery L, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines was in a general support role with priority of fires to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. Employment of artillery was limited by the abundance of fixed wing support and helicopter gunships. Artillery was used to isolate the objective area and to suppress long range automatic weapons and mortar fire. It was not used for close in ground support during this operation.

b. Air.

(1) Units participating were from 1st Marine Air Wing.

(2) All phases of air support were pre-planned and pre-arranged for the operation. Detailed joint planning between participating air and ground units prior to the operation resulted in excellent coordination in the employment of the air-ground team during the operation.

(3) The objective area was prepared by fixed wing strikes prior to the landing. The principal ordnance employed was napalm which was delivered quickly and effectively, greatly reducing the preparation time and providing excellent neutralization of the landing zone. Seven dud napalm bombs did reduce the effectiveness of the preparation to a minor degree.

(4) Four helicopter gunships fired on targets of opportunity during the landing which greatly reduced enemy ground fire as the helicopters entered and exited the landing zone. Simultaneous with the landing, fixed wing aircraft isolated the objective area by conducting napalm and smoke runs on the enemy's main route of reinforcement and withdrawal, 1500 meters west of the objective area.

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(5) The troop lift was conducted with six CH-46's. All six were used in each of two waves that lifted 15 Marines per helicopter. Two additional CH-46's were held at the pick up landing zone for stand by use, and the six helicopters that inserted the assault company returned to the pick up landing zone and stood by to lift the reserve company on order.

(5) Fixed wing aircraft and four helicopter gunships remained on station throughout the operation. They quickly delivered accurate fires in response to requests from the ground. Because of the well defined objective area and the simple scheme of maneuver, friendly troops were easily identified and the supporting air was free to maximize its capability of rapidly engaging targets of opportunity.

(6) A tactical air controller airborne was on station continuously providing excellent air-ground coordination. On several occasions the air observer spotted enemy troops attempting to escape from the objective area. Fixed wing aircraft and helicopter gunships were immediately called against these targets.

(7) A helicopter was utilized as command and control aircraft, providing close liaison with air-ground units as well as affording an excellent vantage point from which operations could be observed during the initial phases of the raid.

(8) All friendly casualties were evacuated by the two stand by CH-46's prior to the extraction of the company. The extraction was accomplished with one wave of six CH-46's and a second wave of four CH-46's. Close air support during the extraction was provided by four helicopter gunships and a flight of fixed wing aircraft. The supporting aircraft were extremely effective in suppressing ever increasing ground fire to allow a successful extraction. Target coverage during extraction was outstanding.

7. Intelligence.

a. Documents taken from the body of a VC on 10 January 1967 revealed that a meeting of DIEN BAN and HIEU MUC District VC Cadre was scheduled for 1200 on 14 January at the religious center in PHU HUNG Village of DIEN BAN District in the vicinity of (BT 012547). Subsequent to this meeting the VC were to depart for the mountainous area in the south of DU' XUYEN District for senior training.

b. Analysis of available intelligence indicated that the enemy had the capability to organize and defend in battalion strength and reinforce with an additional battalion within three to six hours. VC main force battalions, V.25 and R.20, had been reported recently operating in the vicinity of the objective area and since 1 January several sources had

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reported six sightings of battalion-size units in the immediate vicinity of the objective hamlet. The VC were reported as billeting themselves in villagers' homes in groups of four to six.

c. Intelligence collected during the operation tended to corroborate the initial estimate of enemy strength and capabilities.

(1) The assault company met with light resistance initially, and as the situation developed it was estimated that two enemy companies had regrouped and were defending within the objective area.

(2) Heavy contact was encountered as friendly forces began to withdraw from the hamlet. The enemy recovered from camouflaged underground positions and was able to direct heavy fire parallel to the hedgerows that canalized friendly forces.

(3) A Women's Association cell leader was captured in the hamlet. She revealed that 20 strangers had entered the hamlet three days prior to the raid but offered nothing else of significant intelligence value. It is interesting to note that she had attempted to evade capture by holding a baby in her arms. Interrogation revealed she had no children and had never been married but considered this tactic an effective one to deter apprehension by U. S. Forces.

(4) Documents taken from the body of a VC platoon commander identified one unit as the "P-9" Company with an effective strength of 90 men at some time during December. Other documents of particular interest included overlays showing routes of infiltration from North Vietnam, training manuals, maps of planned objectives, a limited personal history of the platoon commander, and approximately two pounds of assorted additional papers.

d. Subsequent to the operation it was reported by a sub-sector agent that a VC battalion had entered the objective area only two days prior to the raid.

e. The objective area was surrounded by cane fields to the north and northwest and rice paddies to the west and south and it joined in an "L" on the east by another hamlet. A large cemetery occupied the "V" between the objective area and the adjoining hamlet.

(1) Most of the rice paddies in the area of operations were ankle deep in water and airy underneath. The area southeast of the graveyard, however, was an excellent helicopter landing zone. This area was not inundated and provided suitable defensive positions with excellent observation and fields of fire. Paddy dikes in this area afforded good cover from flat trajectory fire.

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(2) Inside the objective area the VC had constructed extensive fortifications. Virtually impenetrable hedgerows reinforced with barbed wire "cow fence" existed at 15-20 meter intervals. Parallel to these hedgerows the enemy had dug a double trench line system which was used effectively during latter phases of the raid. Family bunkers were reported as providing excellent protection from indirect fire and capable of withstanding a direct hit from an 81mm mortar. The hamlet was on relatively high ground and could have contained a sophisticated tunnel system.

8. Mission. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) commencing at L-hour on D-day conducts a helicopterborne raid to eliminate or capture the VC officials reported to be meeting in the village of PHU HONG (PT 0155).

9. Concept of Operation. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) commencing at L-hour on D-day conducts a helicopterborne raid with Company C (Rein) landing in LZ "W" at coordinates (PT 015544). Searches for and eliminates or captures the VC officials reported to be meeting in the hamlet of BAN LAM (2) (PT 0155). Upon completion of mission, Company C will be extracted by helicopter. Company D will stand by to reinforce Company C in the objective area.

10. Execution.

a. On 13 January, at 1000H, the 1st Battalion and supporting units, air and ground, were briefed on the mission and general concept of the raid to be conducted south of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR. At this time the detailed intelligence and terrain briefings were presented and integrated air-ground planning was finalized. The 1st Battalion, 1st Marines received 1st Marines Frag Order 5-67 early in the evening on 13 January and the order to conduct the helicopterborne raid was issued at 1900H to Company C and attachments.

b. On 14 January, at 1130H, Company C's first wave boarded six CH-46's at the assembly area at the HOI AN airstrip, and at 1145H they were airborne circling north of the landing zone while the LZ was prepared by fixed wing aircraft. At 1150H the CH-46 carrying the Company C command group was hit three times by ground fire and was forced to return to the HOI AN airstrip. The command group changed helicopters and rejoined the first wave.

c. At 1215H, the first wave landed. The wave received moderate to light ground fire as they disembarked. The 1st Platoon deployed to set up security for the LZ, two squads of the 2d Platoon deployed to the west in order to gain entrance to the objective area from the south.

d. At 1220H, the unit in the LZ received 10-12 60mm mortar rounds. An airstrike was called and the mortar fire was suppressed.

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e. At 1245H, incoming ground fire had increased and as the second wave of six CH-46's landed with the rest of the company, heavy ground fire was received resulting in two USMC KIA and three MIA before the ground units could disembark.

f. At 1255H, the 2d Platoon deployed to enter the hamlet from the east but ran into an impassable water barrier. It was apparent that any entrance to the hamlet would be canalized because of trench and barbed wire barricades. The 3d Platoon had met heavy resistance from a trench line across a water barrier on the south side of the objective and took one KIA and two MIA's. Upon arrival of the Company Commander, it was determined that this barrier was also impassable. At this time the plan was modified and instead of a double envelopment the 3d Platoon established a blocking position across the south end of the hamlet and the 2d Platoon moved in to search and destroy from east to west.

g. At 1330H, the blocking force observed 40 VC leaving two tunnel exits across the barrier and took them under fire at a range of about 200 meters with small arms and M-79's. An estimated 30-35 VC were seen to fall but were dragged off into a cane field out of sight. Airstrikes by helicopter gunships and fixed wing aircraft were called on the VC escape route.

h. At the same time the 2d Platoon had breached a wire fence and entered the hamlet. The 1st Platoon and remainder of the command group in the LZ was still receiving heavy small arms fire and intermittent 60mm mortar fire which continued sporadically for the rest of the afternoon.

i. At 1400H, with the 3d Platoon in a blocking position, the 2d Platoon moved into the hamlet with two squads, leaving one squad back as rear security. Eight VC were killed as they entered and several documents were recovered. As the 2d Platoon moved through the center of the hamlet resistance grew and contact was made as close as five meters with a heavy exchange of grenades.

j. The 3d Platoon deployed an element at 1430H to reconnoiter a route into the hamlet but could not find one which would not expose the unit to heavy flanking fire. The decision was made to maintain that platoon in its position. The heavy fighting continued in the hamlet and by 1445H the 2d Platoon had confirmed 27 VC killed while sustaining one KIA and three MIA's.

k. At 1500H, the withdrawal from the objective area to the LZ began. The next hour was spent in softening up the area around the LZ as continued airstrikes and artillery missions were called in to prepare for the extraction. At 1615H, the 2d Platoon was unable to reach three of their casualties, one KIA and two MIA's. The Company Commander and one squad from the 3d Platoon entered the hamlet to assist in their removal.

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1. By 1730H, all troops had reached the LZ with the four KIA's and 19 MIA's that then existed. It had been with great difficulty that the 2d Platoon had broken contact and returned to the landing zone. Red flares were used to mark the Marines' positions and the helicopter gunships conducted close air strikes to cover the landing of the first wave of pick up choppers to extract the company.

m. The extraction was completed under heavy contact with enemy units moving to encircle the withdrawing company. The close in contact resulted in an additional 26 VC KIA while the accurate fire from the supporting gunships prevented further enemy reinforcements.

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12. Commanders Analysis

a. It was never confirmed that the 50 VC cadre that were the target of the operation were in fact in the objective area at the time of the raid. All VC sighted and killed, with exception of the one VC female cell leader captured, were uniformed and could not be identified as anything but members of main force units.

b. The raid, however, aside from the obvious success with regard to losses inflicted on the enemy, was of even greater significance psychologically. It demonstrated to the enemy the USMC capability to insert a relatively small force into the center of enemy forces, strike a heavy blow to one of his main force units, and withdraw under cover of supporting arms. Exploitation of this tactic could further restrict the use of areas adjacent to friendly combat bases for staging of VC units. In addition it could require the VC to devote additional resources to defensive postures.
