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b. Administration

(1) Awards. Two Silver Star Medals, two Bronze Star Medals, four Navy Commendation Medals, and 56 Purple Heart Medals were presented to members of this Battalion by Major General NICKERSON at an awards ceremony at the Battalion CP on 10 March 1967. Eleven Purple Heart Medals were also forwarded by this organization for presentation to personnel who were transferred.

(2) Promotions. There were five promotions to sergeant, 45 to corporal, 86 to lance corporal, and three to private first class during March.

c. Intelligence

(1) Low level intelligence reports received during the beginning of the month indicated continuing activity of the Q-15th Company and the V-25th Battalion just to the south of the southwestern portion of the TAOR. The majority of the reports indicated an attack on DIEN BAN Sub-Sector Headquarters or VINH DIEN Electric Plant but none materialized. Increased enemy activity in the eastern portion of the TAOR, particularly the March 13th attack on HIEU NHON District Headquarters, revealed the ability of the VC to mass to the south of this TAOR and to foray across the river. During the latter part of the month increased reports of impending mortar attack on the Junk Fleet and HOI AN Sector Headquarters were confirmed by several mortar incidents at those positions.

(2) Interrogation reports during the entire month revealed that the VC were using the good weather to rebuild and reconstruct fortifications throughout the TAOR. Interrogation of captives in the GO NOI area indicated that main force troops operated mostly in the western section of the island. Captives from CAM HAI Village revealed that the VC were no longer hiding in caves and tunnels but were instead fleeing the area due to the Marines ability to locate tunnels and caves through interrogation or cooperation of the people. The use of captives throughout the month in conjunction with Kit Carson Scouts led to the discovery and destruction of numerous caves, tunnels and spider traps. KCS were helpful in pointing out VC in the field and during Operation LAFAYETTE several KIA were identified as members of the 402nd Sapper Battalion.

(3) Incidents of enemy contacts increased 100% with a 125% increase of mine and booby trap incidents. The increased use of anti-vehicular mines by the VC was significant west of Highway 1, and several instances were accompanied by harassing fire.

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(4) Weather during the reporting period remained favorable to friendly operations. Water barriers were of no consequence but the daily temperature increased considerably.

d. Operations and Training

(1) Operations

a. The Battalion was engaged in Operation LAFAYETTE in the central portion of the TAOR when the reporting period started. During this operation the 1st Battalion accounted for 59 VC KIA's and 46 POW's.

b. After the completion of LAFAYETTE, Company C established a base in the Horseshoe area and continued clearance of mines and booby traps. The civilians again had to be convinced the government and USMC forces were in control of the area.

c. During the remainder of the month the Battalion concentrated on company-size and smaller operations within the TAOR with the execution of a two day reconnaissance in force on GO NOI Island. This operation was conducted by two companies and a command group in conjunction with the 2/4 APC Company, ARVN. The operation resulted in no major enemy contacts, however it commenced with a well executed night river crossing in which the Battalion moved deep into VC controlled territory undetected.

d. The Battalion TAOR was reorganized into three zones established as rifle company areas of responsibility. The boundaries were selected to provide for maximum coverage of enemy infiltration and withdrawal routes, make maximum use of key terrain and natural barriers to deny the enemy mobility within the TAOR, and to provide adequate lines of communication for operating units. The three zones were established to be occupied by three of the four rifle companies of this Battalion. The companies rotate between zones with each company spending seven out of 28 days in the Battalion CP to train, equip and generally relax. The company in the command post maintains a readiness posture to rapidly exploit enemy contacts within the TAOR and to provide for reaction forces such as the Bald Eagle and Sparrow Hawk.

e. The Battalion conducted extensive patrols and ambush actions within assigned TAOR, to locate, fix, and destroy enemy forces and material in the area. During the month of March the Battalion conducted 310 fire team, 499 squad, 23 platoon and eight company-size operations.

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(2) Training

a. The following schools were conducted in the Battalion during March.

(1) The Battalion three day orientation school was conducted for 88 newly joined personnel. M-16 transitional training was included in the orientation.

(2) A three day training program for companies rotating into the Battalion CP was established with heavy emphasis placed on artillery FO procedures, M-60 machinegun, 60mm mortar and M-16 transitional training.

e. Logistics

(1) Supply. This Battalion's allowance of the M-16E1 rifle and accessory equipment was received during March and the transition from the M-14 rifle was begun. There was still a shortage of jungle utilities and individual equipment consisting of steel helmets, grenade pouches, canteen cups, and canteens.

(2) Maintenance

(a) Motor Transport. The addition of six replacement M422 Mighty Mites along with a slight reduction in deadlined vehicles somewhat increased the transportation capabilities of this organization. However, the shortage of wheel bearings and seals still exists.

(b) Ordnance. A recent LTI weapon inspection revealed a number of minor discrepancies in the rifle companies' crew served weapons. As each company rotates back into the CP area these discrepancies will be eliminated.

(3) Food Services. Cold milk served from refrigerated dispensing unit was available for consumption on a daily basis. On Easter Sunday, the messhall provided chow for an Easter Party at a HOI AN orphanage.

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(4) Contonment and Camp Facilities. A fuel pipe line was laid connecting a 10,000 gallon bulk fuel gasoline tank at the front end of the compound to a 800 gallon fuel storage tank for the tracked vehicles in the rear of the compound. Improvements in the CP perimeter defenses continue daily.

(5) Transportation. This organization is supported by five 2½ ton trucks from the 1st Motor Transport Battalion. The emplacement of 10,000 gallon gasoline storage tank within the compound has greatly reduced the problem of fuel resupply.

(6) Water. During March the 1st Engineer Battalion was in process of digging a new well for water supply. The present water point does not produce enough water now that hot weather is here.

f. Communications and Electronics

(1) General. Radio, wire, and message center operated with no interruption of essential services.

(2) Radio. During the month of March no major difficulties were experienced.

(3) Wire. During March all lines going to HOI AN were mounted on poles and cabled. The Company A forward position was also overhauled. Otherwise wire communications were normal.

(4) Message Center. Normal "ON LINE" cryptographic and radio teletype message traffic were conducted.

(5) Radio Relay. No difficulties were experienced with the AN/TRC-27.

(6) Problems Encountered. A critical shortage of replacement components and repair parts still exists for the radio AN/PRC-25. Whip antennas, whip antenna bases, and certain modules are in limited supply.

g. Civic Action

(1) During the month of March daily sick calls were held at the Battalion CP, CAC D-4, and CAC D-5 and a total of 3255 Vietnamese were given medical treatment.

(2) A collection center was held during Operation LAFAYETTE. Medical aid was given to 1550 people. Items distributed during this time included 12,000 pounds rice, 200 pounds meat, 60 pounds salt, and 600 pounds of soap.

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h. Psychological Operations. Four leaflet drops were made in the TAOR during the month of March, exploiting US victories and dissatisfaction of VC troops. A drop was also made on GO NOI Island, south of the TAOR. During Operation LAFAYETTE a Vietnamese culture-drama team was used to work with the people removed from the operational area.

1. Fire Support Coordination and Naval Gunfire

(1) During the month of March artillery support was provided by the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. Four artillery observer teams were in support of the Battalion during the month. Classes on forward observer procedures and map reading were held in conjunction with the Battalion orientation program.

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j. Air Support. Air support during the month was provided by the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing with missions utilizing both fixed wing and helicopter aircraft. There were 11 close air support missions and 12 aerial observation missions. In addition there were four helicopter cargo missions and 33 medical evacuation missions flown. Four flareship missions were flown.

k. Medical and Dental

(1) During the month of March the incidence of immersion foot and traumatic dermatitis of the feet decreased in incidence considerably. Conversely, the number of cases of upper respiratory infections increased greatly. The medical department participated in a "County Fair" as part of Operation LAFAYETTE and treated 1300 civilians. From 11 to 16 March a tent was erected adjacent to the BAS in order to facilitate proper care of 22 sick civilian infants who were children of detainees within the Battalion CP. On 22 March 380 civilian detainees were treated at DIEN BAN District Headquarters.

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(2) During the month of March a total of 866 treatments were rendered to 176 patients. The dental unit participated in the County Fair during Operation LAFAYETTE and the treatment of the civilian detainees at DIEN BAN.

Sequential Listing of Significant Events

- 7 Mar A company clearing operation was conducted in TAN MY (1) Hamlet (BT 082592) with Company B reinforced by LVTE-1's and supported by two flights of F-4's. Six line charges and eight tanks of napalm were expended on trenches, bunkers and hedgerows.
- 13 Mar A platoon patrol from Company A observed 30-35 VC across the CONG KY LAM River (BT 016552). An artillery mission resulted in 18 VC KIA and 10 probables. Snipers killed four additional VC who were recovering bodies.
- HIEU NHON District Headquarters was attacked and overrun. HOI AN was also attacked. Reinforcements were requested by Sector Headquarters and a company-size relief force was moved to HOI AN but no contact was made.
- 17 Mar HOI AN was mortared and three Vietnamese civilians were killed and nine were wounded.
- 22 Mar At the request of the District Chief, 380 Vietnamese detainees were medically treated at DIEN BAN District Headquarters.
- 24 Mar This Battalion commenced Operation EARLY on GO NOI Island. Ref: 1st Bn Frag Order 10-67 (See Tab B to Part IV)
- 25 Mar A 100 vehicle ARVN convoy was ambushed south of the TAOR on Highway # 1 (BT 1050) by an enemy force estimated at 1000 men.
- Operation EARLY terminated at 0600.
Ref: 1st Mar msg 251303Z Mar 1967 (See Tab C to Part IV)
- 29 Mar Launched a platoon-size Sparrowhawk to destroy the wreckage of a C-47 flare ship south of the TAOR (BT 0951).
- 30 Mar Two gun tanks detonated what appeared to be locally constructed concrete mines that had not been found during a prior sweep with mine detectors (BT 984583).
- 31 Mar Issued M-16 rifles to Company C and one platoon of Company D.

Annex A (Concept of Operations) to Frag Order (10-67) (Operation Early)

Ref: (a) Map: VIETNAM, 1:50,000 AMS L 7011, Sheets 6640 I and IV

Time Zone: H

1. Mission. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducts Recon in force operations on GO NOI Island in order to make contact with the enemy in the Zone of Action and upon contact maneuver to close with and destroy him.
2. Concept. At 2400H on D-day 1st Battalion, 1st Marines will cross the SONG DIEN BINH River at (BT 046562) and take up positions on LOD. At H-hour on D-day 1st Battalion, 1st Marines with Companies "D" and "B" abreast will commence sweep toward the west to LOA at railroad tracks. The right flank will be anchored on the water and the 2/4 APC Company will provide a screen on the left flank. Four squads from Company "A", reinforced with tanks, ONTOS and Snipers will block north of the river and the PF platoons from PHU LOC will take up positions from (BT 045567) to (BT 046556). Prior to H-hour the area between the 00 and 03 NS grid lines will be extensively preped with air strikes, artillery, and Naval Gun Fire. When the LOD is crossed movement will be rapid with reliance placed on visual reconnaissance. A series of Phase Lines will be utilized to coordinate movement of the Companies. The Command Group and Battalion Scouts will move behind Company B. Estimated duration of the operation is 3 days. Two sections of 81mm Plat and an FDC will displace to CAC-1 by H-hour and be in position to support operations.
