INTEGLICENCE

- 1. During the month of July 1968, the Battalion saw n great deal of movement. From the 1st through the 6th the Battalion CP and Company "C" were located at Hill 558 (XD 821449), with Company "A" at Hill 861 (XD 803445) and Company "B" at Hill 881 South (XD 777438).
- 2. During this time, the positions at Hills 661 and 881 South received light 82mm mortar fire, with night probes by sniper fire and rifle grenades. These probes increased slightly in intensity during the 4th and 5th.
- 3. On the 5th of July 1968, Company "D" located at Hill 689 (XD 803409) come back under operational control of the Battalion from 2d Battalion, lst Marines. During the past 6 8 days, Company "D" had been subject to 82rm and 120mm mortar fire, rifle granades and SA/AM sniper fire. On the 5th, elements of Company "D" at MD 795408 came under intense nortar and AM attack which resulted in heavy friendly casualties.
- 4. On 6 July 1968, the Battalian, less Company "D" dispalced to Hill 689. On the 7th, elements of Company "C" moved through the wire to XD 795408, only to come under heavy attack by SA/AV and 82m norther fire. The enemy used the tactic of having troops well dug in in spider holes near friendly wire and covered by SA/AV fire.
- 5. On the night of the 7th, on enemy attack from XD 702408 (western slope of Hill 689) resulted in 15 KIA's (cnery) inside the parimeter. The rest of the night saw the parimeter probably from all directions.
- 6. The enery attack on the 7th took the form of undercover pascult with the enery yelling Figlish phrases such as "Friendly Corporari", "Got Down" and "Friendly." Upon gaining access through the wire, they covered their attack with 60m norter fire. At one time during the battle, 7 NVA took refuge in a binker, which was subsequently fine lished by LAAW fire from close range.

- 7. Exemination of the energy KIA's showed frosh haircuts, good uniforms/ equipment and generally well cared for weapons.
- 8. During the period 6 12 July 1968, the Battalian received sporadic 82m norter fire and 50 caliber medine gun fire from a general heading of 3900 mills. The fire usually ceased at sundown. Possible location of the 82m norter site was XD 780301, XD 791381, and 793387. Artillary coverage, 61m norter fire and air strikes were directed on all of the above positions.
- 9. On the 12th, the Battelier left Hill 669 for Quang Tri and a day's rest. On the 14th, the Battelier, less Company "B", departed Quang Tri for positions at the Rockpile and Camp Carrell. Company "B" remained at Quang Tri. Energy contact during the next two weeks was negligible with the exception of 2 rocket attacks at the Battelier CP at the Rockpile (XD 900553). The rocket attacks were on the 19th and 22d and were composed of 122rm and 102rm rockets. Rocket lumbhing positions were XD 908533, XD 912522, XD 925554 and 929534. Heavy artillary coverage and air strikes were conducted. Both attacks took place in the late afternoon.
- 10. On the 26th of July 1968, the Battelien moved to Con Thien, with the CP at Λ -4. Light incoming 82m norters were received at Λ -3 with a possible morter site at YD 167752.
- 11. Light to noderate enony neverent during the rest of the north was noving from the DNZ, down to the Market Place (YD 135725), southwest through the "Agricultural Development Center" (YD 0969) and south southeast through "An Phu", "Lee Son" and near "Loatherneck Square" (YD 155702).
- 12. Future plans are to carefully obscave the infiltration routes just outlined with amphasis on the Agricultural Development Conter as a possible lay over or neeting place. Utilization of all on position "Dual Blade" equipment will be stressed to the maximum output.

OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

1. Operations

a. <u>Mission</u>. Ist Battalion, 1st Marines continued the mission of defense of (Operation SCOTIAND II) and systematic destruction of (Operation CHARLE) the combat bases and combat outposts on Hills 550, 861 and 881s to be completed prior to "E" Day.

b. Operations

- (1) On I July 1965, let Battalion, let Marines, centimed the mission of defending the combat outposts on Hills 550, 061, and 0818. Company "D" was OPCON to 2d Bn, let Marines and was occupying the combat outpost on Hill 609. Destruction of the positions continued as part of Operation CHARLIE. This included destroying all bankers and transhes, burying all matting and stakes, rendering the sandbags unumable and burning all that could be burned. This was to be completed prior to "E" Day which was scheduled for 6 July.
- (2) On 5 July at 1000, let Bettalion assumed the control of Company "D" and also Company "G" and "E" of the 2d Battalion, let Maximes. Company "G" (-) was on Hill 609 assisting Company "D" to recover the remains of 8 Marine casualties which were located on the Southwest slope of the hill, approximately 150 noters from the edge of the tectical whre. One plateon of Company "G" and Company "T" were located on Hill 552. Plans were made to recover the bodies the norming of 6 July under the cover of close air support.

- (3) On 6 July, Company "D" and Company "G" (-) failed to gain fire superiority over the enemy who was dug in around the Marine Modies in a series of spider holes. The enemy had numerous norter firing positions which continued sported fire on the defensive position and the planned recovery was aborted.
- (4) At 1200 on 6 July, the CO of the 1st Marines directed that the remainder of the 1st Bettalion helolift to Hill 609 to assist Company "D" and that the 2 companies of 2d Battelion, then be lifted to return to thior perent unit. The lift was scheduled to commonce at 1500 however at 1515 Company "B" reported that a Marine was missing fronthe parimeter on 0015. A shot had been heard and a blood trail was found leading from a break in the tactical wire. A patrol left the perimeter and located the body, however the energy had set up an ambush around it. 2 attempts were nade to recover the body resulting in numerous casualties. The area was propped with an air strike prior to each attempt but the position was out of artillery range and the company had deploted their Slam norter and 60m amunition so these supporting arms were not evailable. Company "B" was the final unit noved to Hill 609 and the Marine was listed as KIA, body not recovered. The hololift was completed successfully but Company "C" systemed casualties when the landing zone was northred. with O2m nortars. The Battalion was then OPCON to the 4th Marines. Plans were made to recover the Marine bodies on 7 July.
- (5) 7 July damed with a low cloud cover which prepented early utilization of close air support to silence the energy nortars and attack the well entrenched energy. The location of the energy positions were masked by the Battelion's position from all but high angle artillery fire. After a 90 minute air strike; Company "C" moved through the tectical wire on the southern portion of the perimeter; in front of Company "D" is lines to recover the bodies. The Marines were mortared initially but maintained their nomentum until they were about 100 meters from the bodies, when they came under intense small arms fire from NVA troops from spider holes. Company "C" was then withdrawn leaving 3 of thier own dead near the former casualties.
- (6) Just prior to 2100, the Battalion was set in for the might, (see Figure 1). An artillery/air OP had been established to maintain fire on the enemy position and illumination by use of a flare ship over the area where the bedies lay. At about 2100 at least 30 NVA breached the wire outside Company "D's" lines. As they hit the tranch line they attacked along it in both directions, (see Figure 2). A quick reaction by CO of Company "D" and Company "C" and a plateon of Company "B" succeeded in containing the penetration by 2300. Company A was moved from the ridge they had occupied to the west of Company "D" and attacked on line in a southernly direction to restore the parimeter by 000300H, see Figure 4). One of Company "D's" KIA's here to fore missing, recovered during the action.
- (7) The 1st Battalian was reinforced by Company "L", 3d Bn, 4th Marines at 1530 on 0 July. 6, 9, and 10 July, were spent making plans and covering all known and suspected enemy positions with artillary and

- 6 Jul 68 Heli hft of E/1/1 from Hill 881 (S) to Hill 689 commenced at 1500H and was completed at 2015H.
- 6 Jul 68 Helilift of A/I/1 from XD 803443 to Hill 689 commenced at 1510H and was completed at 1547H.
- 6 Jul 68 Helilift of C/1/1 and 1/1 CP from XD 820450 commenced at 1547H and was completed at 1725H.
- 6 Jul 68 F/2/12 was chopped from I/11 to Task Force Hotel at 1715H.
- 6 Jul 68 Holilift of G/2/1 from Hill 689 to IZ DIME JAY commenced at 1725H and was completed at 1820H.
- 6 Jul 68 Hq (...) 1/11, G/3/12 and F/2/12 were chopped from 1/11 to CG, TF Hotel at 2025H. Concurrently 1/1, 3/4, 3d Plat, COG 3d Tk Bn, 1st Plat Co B 3d SP Bn, 1st Plat Co B 3d Tk Bn and Co A 3d Tk Bn were chopped from 1st Marines to CG, TF Hotel.
- 6 Jul 68 lst Writnes terminated participation in Operation SCOTIAND II at 2020H and concurrently closed CP at YD 00746I and opened at YD 349695.
- 5 Jul 68 lst Marines assumed responsibilities of NAPOLEON/SALINE ACT from 1st Amtrac Dn et 2300H.



c. Generator failure continues to plague this command; one PU-348 is in Okinawa; one PU-366 is in Yekuska, Japan, both awaiting parts. One PU-259, which was in Da Nang for repair, was shipped to the Battalian rear at Phu Bai. This generator has never arrived at this command.

MEDICAL

- 1. Aside from bettale casualties, the health of the Battalien has been generally excellent. 202 patients were seen at the Battalien aid station, nest of when had minor problems. Major problems included: dysentary -7, maps -1, non-battle injuries -5, minor surgery -7, venerial disease -5, malarie -2 and heat exhaustion -5.
- 2. We have begun to receive Depson tablets, each tablet a 25mg done for use in conjunction with Chloroquin-Prinagnin for the provention of Malaria. Intake of this dang is being enforced to the greatest extent possible. Probably as a consequence of Dapson use and novement eastward away from the Khe Sanh area, the incidence of malaria has undergone a narked decrease.
- 3. While the Battalien remains in the Con Thien area, one of the greatest problems enticipated is a high incidence of heat exhaustion. Prevention will depend on water discipline, use of salt tablets, pacing of patrols, and the avoidance of the use of high gressy areas for rest areas while on patrol.
- 4. Classes were started for correspon with the forward element of the Battalian. Instruction by the Battalian Surgeon has so far included diagnosis of febrile diseases, the use of antibiotics and combat psychiatry. These classes will be continued.

2. Training

a. During this reporting period, this Battalion remained in an operational status, participating in Operation SCOTIAND II, MANASTER II and "MENTUCKY." Training during the period was limited almost entirely to indoctrimation of newly arrived personnel. LOGISTICS

1. Supply. Some difficulties have been encountered in obtaining sufficient quantities of 702-gear. Some of the hard to obtain items are flak jackets, canteens, cancuflage covers and certain sizes of clothing. Since the Battalion's move to Con Thien, the supply section has established a forward element at Dong Ha. This should expedite the resupply of the Battalion considerably. The Battalion is short general combat essential pieces of equipment including three (3) Ohm morters, two (2) M-60 machine gums, one (1) 106 Recoiless Rifle and one (1) AN/MIR-109 radio jeep. These items are being placed on Red Ball. The supply personnel situation remains satisfectory with the exception that the


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

cir strikes. High angle artillery fire missions on the area surrounding the bodies was fired on the afternoon of 10 July.

- (8) On 11 July, air strikes delivering mapsin and 500 1b bombs were directed around the objective area. At 111345H the following nessage was sent to the 4th Mirines. "H-Hour planned for 112030H. Airstrikes planned this afternoon. Supporting fires by artillery and Bn weapons during the operation, bodies to be picked up by four men toans. Non illuminated." On schedule the recovery terms from Company "A" recovered 7 of the bodies, the remainder being destroyed by the air strikes, (Fig 5) without further casualties. 300 artillery rounds were expended during the 2 hour operation in preplaned suppressive fires.
- (9) The Battalion was helolifted from Hill 609 on 12 July. The lift was completed in 2 stages, the first to LZ Stud and the second to Quang Tri Combat Base. At Quang Tri, the Battalion was taken to a rest over area for showers, clean clothes, hot chow, celd beer and a 2 might rest. Company "C" assumed responsibility for defense of 3 key positions along Rewte 9, Company "D" assumed responsibility for defense of Camp Carroll and Company "A" took over the defense of the fire support base at the Rockpile. The Bettalion CP was located with Company "A" at the Rockpile. At 6900 on 15 July, responsibility passed from 2/3 to 1/1 for all the assigned positions in the LANCASTER II AO.
- (11) At 1600 on 17 July, Company "A" minus one platoob noved to a position north of Camp Carroll along Route 9, to provide security for 2 artillary batteries, firing in support of 3d Marine units. The remaining platoon of Company "A" and H&S Company provided security for the fire support base at the Rockpile.
- (12) At 1500 on 25 July, 2d Bm, 3rd Murines returned by helicopter to the Rockpile, and propared to relieve the 1st Battalian, 1st Murines of their defensive positions.




Route of Recovery Teams


