INTELLIGENCE

1. The month of April was characterized by a 200% increase in VIP fund payments. A total of 400,693\$VN was paid in comparison with the total payment of 271,030\$VN for the month of March. The reason for this increase can be attributed to the fact that the rifle companies utilized more of the funds in the field.

2. There were 10 enemy initiated attacks during the month of April. This is a decrease of 34 attacks over the March total of 44. Enemy KIA's also decreased from 36 to 8 for the month of April.

3. On 3 April, the 2nd Squad, 3rd Platoon of Company D located at AT988600 saw 15 VC/NVA in an open area moving west to east. Artillery was fired resulting in two secondary explosions and 4 NVA/VC killed. The 4 bodies were not recovered due to the river obstacles.

4. On 3 April, the 3rd Platoon of Company C located at AT983004 found 6 surprise firing devices in one village.

5. On 5 April, the 3rd Platoon, 2nd Squad of Company C located at AT968645 found 645lbs of rice buried in a hedgerow.

6. On 7 April, the 3rd Platoon of Company C located at AT953633 found two well concealed tunnels in a thicket on a riverbank. The entrance was 3 feet in diameter and 15 feet long with enough room in the tunnel for 4 people. The tunnel had two entrances, one from the river and one from the riverbank. The riverbank entrance had an SFD, which was made from a LAAW (M-72) with a trip wire. A female detainee from a nearby area was instrumental in finding the second tunnel and 1 NVA Staff Sergeant who was hiding inside. After a complete search of both tunnels which turned up a large amount of equipment and documents, both tunnels were destroyed. Results were: one PW, four Chi-coms, one 9mm K-54 pistol, 24 K-54 rounds, one hammock, an assault pouch, assorted clothing and raingear.

7. On 29 April, a "Rat Patrol" from Company G in the vicinity of AT989673 observed 15 men wearing helmets, packs, and carrying weapons moving east to west. The "Rat Patrol" took the enemy under fire. The enemy dispersed moving to the east and west of route 100. The "Rat Patrol" returned to the area with reinforcements and searched the area without finding a trace of the enemy.

OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

1. OPERATIONS

a. Mission. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(1) Conduct unilateral, joint and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAOR to locate installations, with emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers and to the security of military installations.

(2) Deploy forces throughout the assigned TAOR to provide a defense of the DaNang area and military complex with emphasis on routes of approach to probable rocket/mortar launch positions, including waterways.

(3) Provide security for the CAU DO Bridge (AT998705) and the HA DONG Bridge (AT990641).

(4) Locate and interdict routes of infiltration in the TAOR to include waterways.

b. Operations

(1) During the month of April the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines continued to conduct aggressive combat operations against the insurgent enemy forces within the assigned TAOR. Company A continued under the operational control of the Quang Da Special Defense Zone to conduct combined operations with Regional Forces. Company B and Company C continued to provide and improve the defenses of the CAU DO Bridge and HA DONG Bridge, respectively, while Company D patrolled extensively in the heavily booby trapped Duc Ky area and La Tho Bac area south of the rocket barrier.

(2) On 3 April 1969, Company D was utilized as a blocking force along the Song La Tho for the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines search and clear operations in the "Dodge City" AO. Company A returned to the 1st Battalion's TAOR on 4 April 1969 to cordon the village of VIEM TAY (BT031634). On 15 April 1969, Company D conducted a one day search and clear operation in the northwestern sector of the "Dodge City" AO. Company A (-) remaining under the operational control of the Quang Da Special Defense Zone, began a land clearing operation in CAM NE (1) and CAM NE (2) center of mass (AT980688) on 21 April 1969.

(3) On 29 April 1969 a rotation of companies was initiated with Company B assuming the mission of saturation patrolling in the Duc Ky and La Tho Bac areas south of the rocket barriers and Company D providing security for the CAU DO Bridge. Company A rotated from the 1st Tanks cantonment to the HA DONG Bridge and Company C went under the operational control of the Quang Da Special Defense Zone on 30 April 1969.

c. ARTILLERY

(1) During the month of April, Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, continued its mission of direct support of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

(2) In addition to the aforementioned battery, Batteries B and C, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, and Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines, fired in support of the battalion's activities.

(3) These units fired 50 observed missions expending 1064 rounds. There were approximately 600 unobserved missions expending approximately 3200 rounds. The unobserved missions consisted of TOT's, intelligence targets, and H&I's.

d. AIR SUPPORT

(1) During the month of April, 16 sections of fixed wing from MAG 11, 12, and 13 were flown in support of the battalion. The aircraft expended a total of 79,000 pounds of bombs, 32,500 pounds of napalm, 8 pods of 2.75 inch rockets, and 150 rounds of 20mm ammunition. The damage assessment was as follows: one bunker destroyed, one bunker damaged, 300 meters of treeline and four acres of heavily booby trapped area destroyed, numerous sustained and 1 secondary fire.

OV-10 Bronco aircraft from VMO-2 amassed 7 hours of flight time in aerial observation, artillery spotting missions, and close air support. The aircraft expended 7 pods of rockets and 3000 rounds of 7.62 ammunition resulting in two bunkers destroyed, one bunker damaged, three structures destroyed, and one structure damaged. Ten visual reconnaissance missions were also flown during the month with a total of 11 hours flight time.

In support of combat operations in the TAOR a total of 36 emergency, 10 priority, and 4 routine medevacs were flown. Also, 2 sorties were flown by CH-54 Skyraider placing two observation towers.

c. During the month of April there were three additional periods of instruction held in the Battalion cantonment. These classes were: Personal Response conducted by G-5 for all Officers and SNCO's; Career Planning conducted by the Division Career Planning NCO and a special class on Land Mine Warfare conducted by a Mobile Training Team for Company A.

LOGISTICS

1. During the month of April all sections under the direction of the S-4 functioned normally and efficiently without any events of significance occurring during this period.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONICS

1. The Communications Platoon erected two 45 foot poles on both sides of the COQ Bunker for mounting antennas to overcome interference.

A frequency and call sign change went into effect on 160001H April. Some interference was experienced but this was remedied by obtaining new frequencies.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

During the month of April there were 30 requested leaflet air drops accompanied by tape broadcasts. Hand distribution of leaflets throughout villages and hamlets totalled 76,000. In addition to the leaflets and broadcasts there were movies shown to the local populace on six different occasions.

Three Serious Incident Reports were made during the month of April. The 59th RF's rendered some assistance by conducting some psyops in the area of one of the incidents. The assistance rendered was in the form of posters, broadcasting and also face to face communications.

Additional emphasis has been placed on utilizing ARVN, PF and RF units to assist in psychological operations.

MEDICAL

1. A total of 527 patients were seen at sick call during the month of April. Of those seen, 48 were referred to other medical facilities. There were 795 immunizations given during the month and the Medical Civil Affairs Program treated 114 Vietnamese civilians at the BAS.

The mobile MEDCAPS were conducted on the normal weekly schedule visiting villages and hamlets at least 3 times a week.

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common

symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
