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2. INTELLIGENCE.

a. The month of June was characterized by a decrease of over three quarters of last month's VIP funds. The total for the month of June was 64,800VN\$ in comparison to 251,340VN\$ total for May. The decrease in funds expended was due mainly to the unavailability of funds.

b. There were twenty-seven enemy initiated attacks for the month of June. This is an increase of seven attacks over May's total of twenty. Enemy KIA's increased from twenty-five to forty-four for the month of June.

c. On 2 June, a squad from Company D sighted two groups of 25 VC/NVA moving north (vic AT995582). Unit engaged VC/NVA resulting in one NVA KIA, one NVA POW, and one captured 9mm pistol. Ref: En. Spot Report #65.

d. On 6 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT006572) while at an ambush site observed four VC/NVA emerge from a tunnel under a bunker that had previously been blown. The unit opened fire resulting in four VC/NVA KIA's.

e. On 12 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT017551) captured one VC and one NVA. Both POW'S were found in bunkers. One was wounded and one was suffering from malnutrition. Unit also found one NVA I.D. card, and one NVA belt with three chicom. Unit sent captured personnel and equipment to the 1st En. GP for evacuation and further disposition.

f. On 12 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT010577) located a rice cache totaling 10,900 lbs. Rice was buried in 100 lb. bags under approximately ten inches of soil. Bags were manufactured in the U.S. Also found were twenty-seven M16 rounds buried near by and packed in metal boxes with three rounds and two boosters per box. Rice and M16 rounds were taken to the 1st En. GP for evacuation.

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ENCLOSURE (1)

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g. On 13 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT007552) found sixteen bunkers reinforced with timbers, approximately 4'x4'x4' in size. Also found was a possible VC/NVA obstacle course, five chicom grenades, seventy-five AK-47 rounds, miscellaneous clothing, and two boats approximately fourteen feet long and two and a half feet wide. Unit destroyed these findings with 40 lbs. of C-4, including the boats and obstacle course.

h. On 14 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT021531) found one NVA in a ditch. NVA tried to run, and was shot. While checking body, unit found some papers, which were turned in to the Jn. CP for disposition.

i. On 15 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT012524) found three dud 105mm rounds, three dud M-79 rounds, one ten foot long boat (in good condition), one tunnel measuring 3'x6' leading to a bamboo reinforced bunker 8'x4'x4'. Inside the bunker were some documents. The ordnance, tunnel, bunker, and boat were blown with six sticks of C-4. The documents were turned over to S-2.

j. On 15 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT012524) while sweeping found one hundred twenty-five 100 lb bags of rice buried along the river bank. Bags were manufactured in the U.S. Total rice found was 12,500 lbs. of which 4,700 lbs. was unsalvageable. All of the rice was American Long Grain. Battalion CP was notified of the discovery and 7,000 lbs. was evacuated.

k. On 16 June, a squad from Company B captured two VC and one AK-47 while on sweep (vic AT977523).

l. On 19 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT001539) while on sweep found six bunkers 4'x4'x6' reinforced with wooden beams, five bunkers 3'x3'x4' reinforced with bamboo, four bunkers 5'x12'x4' reinforced with steel and concrete, one tunnel eight feet in length, one VN boat 2'x10', one ammo box with miscellaneous rifle grenades (still in cannisters), three M-79 rounds, one LAW, two water pumps, and one M-1 carbine. Bunkers, tunnel, and boat were destroyed. Documents were turned over to the S-2 along with ordnance and equipment.

m. On 20 June, a platoon from Company D (vic AT965554) while sweeping from south east unit encountered and detained eighty-seven Vietnamese civilians, living in the area. When questioned by KOS civilians stated that approximately one VC platoon had been in area, but had fled to south west at approximately 200500H. Unit remained civilians and swept south-west and north east from south east to a reasonable area with negative findings.

n. On 21 June, a platoon from Company D (vic BT010539) while probing area found one 82mm tube lying in the area. It was turned in to the B Company CP and later destroyed.

o. On 28 June, a platoon from Company A (vic BT022592) found fresh bloody uniforms and the remains of two NVA soldiers killed by artillery. Bodies were about 6-12 hours old. Unit searched out entire area with negative results and buried uniforms.

3. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

A. OPERATIONS

MISSION, 1st Battalion 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(a) Conduct deliberate, detailed searches to find, fix, capture, and/or destroy enemy forces, NVA/VC/FGI, harbor sites, supplies, and fortifications in the "Dodge City - Go Noi Island" area of operations in conjunction with Phase II and Phase III of Operation Pipestone Canyon.

(b) To conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAOH to neutralize hostilities, with emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers and the security of military installations.

(c) Deploy forces throughout the assigned TAOH to provide a defense of the landing area and military complex with emphasis on routes of approach to probable rocket/mortar launch positions, including waterways.

(d) Provide security for the Chuoi Bridge (AT 990705) and the Ma Dong Bridge (AT 990041).

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(a) Locate and interdict routes of infiltration in the TACH to include waterways.

(2) OPERATIONS

(a) From 1 June to 21 June 1969 the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines (-) (Rein), participated in Phase II and Phase III of Operation Pipestone Canyon, in the "Dodge City - Go Noi" area of operations.

(b) On 22 June 1969 1st Battalion, 1st Marines returned to their Combat Base and continued to conduct aggressive combat operations against the insurgent enemy forces within the assigned TACH. Company A returned to the operational control of 1st Battalion, 1st Marines at that time.

(c) On 27 June Company A moved into northern "Dodge City" to conduct a detailed, deliberate, search and clear operation in conjunction with Operation Pipestone Canyon. Company A returned to the Western Combat Base to resume normal mission at 291600H.

(d) On 28 June 1969 Company D (Rein) cordoned off the village of Ha Tay (vic BT009645). One Vietnamese male was detained and turned over to 3rd CIT.

(3) ARTILLERY

(a) During the month of June, Battery A 1st Battalion, 11th Marines continued its mission in direct support for 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

(b) In addition to Battery A, Batteries B and C 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, Battery L 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, and the 3rd 8 inch Battery, all fired in support of 1st Battalion, 1st Marines activities.

(c) During the month of June there were 85 observed missions expending 1387 rounds. There were also 400 unobserved missions expending 5900 rounds in the form of prep fires, TOT missions, H & I fires, and intelligence targets.

(d) In order to provide maximum artillery support for Operation Pipestone Canyon 1st Battalion, 11th Marines displaced Batteries B and C to the same combat base where Battery A is located (vic BT0114526). As the operation continued south Battery C displaced to Liberty Bridge (vic AT975529).

(4) AIR SUPPORT

(a) During the month of June, 11 sections of fixed wing from F4G 11, 12, 13, were flown in support of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines on Operation Pipestone Canyon. The aircraft expended a total of 108,000 pounds of bombs. The damage assessment was as follows: bunkers destroyed 40; structures destroyed 22; fighting holes 30; 500 meters of treeline destroyed. Three secondary explosions and fires were reported during this period. AC-47 "Spooky" gunship expended 17,000 rounds of 7.62 ammunition and five aerial illumination flares in support of the battalion.

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(b) OV-10 Bronco aircraft from VMO-02 amassed 25 hours of flight time in aerial observation, artillery spotting missions and close air support. The aircraft expended 8 pods of 2.75 rockets and 5,000 rounds of 7.62 ammunition with negative damage assessment. Four visual reconnaissance missions were flown during the month with a total of two hours flight time.

(c) In support of combat operations in the TAO and Operation Pipestone Canyon, 51 med-evac sorties were flown. Helicopter gunships expended a total of four rocket pods and 4,000 rounds of 7.62 ammunition, while escorting med-evac missions. There were 30 trooplift sorties flown by OH-53 helicopters mostly in direct support of the Operation.

4. LOGISTICS

(a) During the month of June all sections under the cognizance of the S-4 received a Command Material Management Inspection. The MARS/ FORSTAT and Ammunition Inspections received a grade of satisfactory with no discrepancies. The Mess Hall, Motor Transport, Embarkation, and Engineering Commodity areas each received a grade of satisfactory with minor discrepancies. The Supply Section received a courtesy inspection and will be inspected during the month of July, 1969.

5. COMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONICS

(a) During the month of June the Communications Platoon provided communications support for 1st Battalion, 1st Marines during Operation Pipestone Canyon. Radio was the only means of communication used during the operation.

(b) A frequency and call sign change went into effect at 0600 15 June 1969.

(c) During the month of June the platoon took in a Command Material Management Inspection and received a satisfactory with minor discrepancies. All discrepancies have been corrected.

6. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS/CIVIL AFFAIRS

A. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

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(1) Psychological activities for June included 30 regular leaflet air drops with accompanying tape broadcasts. Psyops has been stressed through Marine channels and also through RF units. Hand distribution of leaflets totalled 50,000 for the month. Seventh Psyops Battalion personnel showed movies on five different occasions during the month. There were two Serious Incident Reports during the month, which required the payment of 17,000VNs.

B. CIVIC ACTION PROJECTS

(1) Civic action projects for the month included continuation of a pig project, the repair of a school and the repair of Quang Chau village (vic AT996687) and Quang Dong village (vic AT996667). This month 51 truckloads of lumber went to Quang Chau (vic AT996667) for repair of homes. In addition, to the lumber, 800 pounds of cement, 60 sheets of tin, 1500 items of clothing, 14 sewing kits, 2000 pounds of food and 500 pounds of rice were brought into the village. One truckload of fertilizer and 2 truckloads of lumber were given to Ye Ne (vic AT987689) so the people could build chairs and desks for their school children. Also 600 gallons of gas were brought to the people of Ye Ne (vic AT987689) in order to run their water pumps. A total of 75 pounds of soap was distributed on the 13 Medcamps held during the month. Five truckloads of lumber were given to the people of Duong Son (2) for the repair of several homes. In conjunction with the ARVN Engineers, S-5 has started building a dam at (vic AT008648) for the people of that area. In addition a requisition for 75 feet of culvert material has been submitted for an irrigation project for the people of Duong Son (2) (vic AT96677).

C. TRAINING

(1) Two RF corporals are being thoroughly trained by Navy Doctors and accompany them on Medcamps. The troops of this Battalion will be participating in a 100 Vietnamese word program.

B. FACILITIES

(a) The BAS consists of four huts, one small shed, and two metal-reinforced bunkers. The huts are utilized for sick call and treatment wards, immunization areas, health and dental records, supply, administration, laboratory, and berthing spaces for officers and enlisted personnel. The small shed is for storing personal gear and effects.

C. DAILY ACTIVITIES

(1) Sick call - is held from 0600-0900 and 1300-1400 daily. Sundays and holidays sick call hours are conducted from 0600-0900 only. Emergencies are seen anytime.

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(2) A total of 493 patients were seen at sick call, 20 were referred to other medical facilities, 21 physical examinations, 147 laboratory tests, 6 admissions, 44 skin disease (including jungle rot and immersion foot syndrome), 12 cases of upper respiratory infection, 3 fever of undetermined origin, 26 patients treated with Venereal diseases, no malaria cases seen this month, and 9 cases of acute diarrhea.

(3) Immunization - A total of 764 immunizations were given this month.

(4) Transportation - Provided for patients referred to other medical facilities. BAS ambulance will be utilized for emergency runs only or as required; Medical evacuation via helicopters are called where time is of critical importance.

(5) Medical Civil Affairs Program - 250 Vietnamese civilians were seen at BAS sick call. Mobile Medcaps were conducted two or three times a week to nearby hamlets and villages.

D. WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

(a) Sanitation inspections of various facilities of this cantonment and road positions are conducted once a week or whenever necessary.

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOR by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "I", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Endings

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOID by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "I", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

1. Headings

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "I", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Endings

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOR by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "I", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
