2. INTELLIGENCE

a. During the month there was a continued decrease in expenditures under the Volunteer Informant Program Fund. A total of 8,200 VN\$ were spent during the month of September as compared with 10,000VN\$ for the month of August. The decrease in expenditures reflects the decrease in funds available as well as the fact that M-79 rounds, illumination rounds, and amounts of small arms ammo under 50 rounds are not purchased. b. There were eight (8) enemy initiated attacks for the month of September. This represents a slight increase of enemy activity as compared to the August total of five (5) enemy initiated attacks. Enemy KIA's increased from four (4) for August to sixteen (16) for September.

c. On 2 September the point element of a platoon of Company "B" in the vicinity of BT039432 observed 2 VC/NVA carrying AK-47's. The unit took the enemy under fire resulting in one (1) confirmed enemy KIA with miscellaneous 702 gear and assorted documents.

d. On 2 September a squad from Company "C" in the vicinity of BT039432 observed 6 VC/NVA with weapons leaving a village at BT066396. The enemy moved southeast toward hill 110. At this point the enemy were taken under fire with the M-60 and small arms, 81's and 105's. A thorough search of the area was unable to turn up any indication of enemy casualties.

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e. On 1 September a squad from Company "B", located at BT069415, while on patrol spotted 12 VC/NVA. Ten were carrying weapons. The unit called in SA mission. Three of the enemy dropped and the rest continued up the hill. During the search 2 individuals were detained and three bodies were found.

f. On 3 September a platoon from Company "M" (opcon to L/L) located at AT959607, working with Regional Forces and a Local Combined Action Platoon, checked out a bunker behind a pagoda. The bunker was fragged, resulting in 2 VC KIA's. Inspection of the bunker produced 6 RPG-2 rounds, 2 BKT Launchers, 6 AK-47's, 15 AK-47 magazines, and 35 Chinese grenades.

g. On 13 September a squad from Company "A", located at AT958680, while checking the banks of the Song Yen in a rubber boat surprised 8 VC in the water. The squad took the enemy under small arms fire at a range of 20 meters. The contact resulted in 8 VC KIA with miscellaneous 762 gear and assorted documents. The bodies sank in 10 feet of deep swift water.

h. On 13 September the Mobile Combat Base, located at BT015628, received 5 lob bombs of 105mm rounds, resulting in 3 USMC WIA's, one building completely destroyed. Four of the five lob bombs detonated. The combat base was put on condition I.

i. On 13 September a platoon from Company "A", located at BT965677, spotted 3 VC moving west to east and engaged the enemy with small arms fire, resulting in one VC KIA. The unit swept the area and found one model 56 Czech assault rifle. The rifle was turned into Battalion S-2.

j. On 23 September the point man of the S-2 patrol located at BT065532 engaged a group of four enemy moving north along the edge of the cemetery. The enemy returned fire with small arms and then fled. A search of the area resulted in discovery of one VN female KIA, 15 years of age, dressed in black PJ's. The individual had no weapons and appeared to be acting as a guide for the group. Identification card and miscellaneous gear were turned into the S-2. The unit searched for additional casualties with negative results.

k. On 24 September an element of S-2, located at BT019627, along with elements of the 3rd ITT and one Platoon from Company "A", cordoned off the hamlet of Phong Lue (3). During the next 2 1/2 hours approximately 40 people were interrogated by S-2 and 3rd ITT with negative results. During the interrogations S-2 found 6 more bunkers and 3 tunnels.

l. On 25 September a platoon from Company "C", located at AT994598, while in night defensive positions received automatic weapons fire and possible B-40 rockets, and M-79 fire resulting in one USMC WIA.

7. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

A. OPERATION

(1) MISSION. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(a) Be prepared, on order, to conduct unilateral, reinforced and combined offensive operations within Regimental TAOR to locate and destroy enemy forces and logistic installations.

(b) Conduct local security operations as required to provide security for combat base at Phong Luc (2) grid BT 012636 coordinating activities with Western Battalion.

(c) Be prepared to conduct offensive and reconnaissance operations within RZ on order.

(d) Be prepared, on order, in cooperation/coordination with ARVN and district headquarters, to conduct continuous Special Pacification Offensive to upgrade designated hamlets within Regimental TAOR. Be prepared to continue these operations during the RVN Pacification and Reconstruction Program which commenced July 1969.

(e) Be prepared to conduct offensive operations exterior to Regimental TAOR on order.

(f) Be prepared to provide Alert/Rapid Reaction Forces, on order.

(2) OPERATIONS

(a) From 1-4 September 69, Company B and C and the Battalion CP participated in operations in southwestern Que Son and southeast Duc Duc vicinity.

(b) From 6-23 September 69, 1st Battalion conducted search and close operations in an area bounded on the west by grid line 945, on the north by Song Cau Do, on east by route 10 and on the south by the Danang rocket barrier.

(c) On 19 September companies A and D provided blocking forces in the La Bon and La Chau areas (vic AT 970680) in support of a search and destroy operation of the 1st Battalion, 51st ARVN.

(d) On 24 September a platoon of company A conducted a cordon and search of the village of Phong Luc (3) (vic BT 019627) in conjunction with S-2 and ITT personnel.

(e) From 25-29 September companies A, C, and D and Battalion CP conducted operations in "Dodge City" in conjunction with Phase IV of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON.

(3) ARTILLERY

(a) During the month of September Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines continued its mission of direct support of 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

(b) In addition, Batteries B and C, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines fired in support of 1st Battalion, 1st Marines activities.

(c) During the month of September, there were 52 observed missions expending a total of 1459 rounds. There were also a total of 80 unobserved targets fired expending 733 rounds. These targets were in the form of pre-emptive fires, prep fires, and TOT's as well as intelligence targets.

(4) AIR SUPPORT

(a) During the month of September 10 flights of fixed wing from VMF 11, 12, 13 were flown in support of the Battalion. The aircraft expended a total of 35,000 rounds of bombs, 9000 pounds of napalm, 2 pods of 5 inch rockets and 1000 rounds of 20mm ammunition. The damage assessment was as follows: 2 bunkers destroyed 1 bunker damaged, 100 meters of treeline, 50 meters of trenchline, 1 structure destroyed and 1 secondary fire.

(b) OV10 Bronco aircraft from VMF-02 amassed 10 hours of flight time in aerial observation, artillery spotting missions and close air support. The aircraft expended 2 pods of 2.75 inch rockets and 1,500 rounds of 7.62 ammunition. A total of 1 hour and 30 minutes were flown by AC-47 "Spooky" gunships. The aircraft expended 21,000 rounds 7.62 ammunition and 19 flares providing aerial illumination.

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(c) In support of combat operations a total of 34 sorties for 27 emergencies, 24 priority, and 8 routine medevacs were flown. Also 17 sorties were flown by OH-46 and CH-53 aircraft inserting and extracting 713 troops. A total of 1 hour and 30 minutes were flown by "Cobra" Gunships. They expended 5 rocket pods and 3000 rounds 7.62 ammunition. Nine visual reconnaissance missions were flown with a total of 6 hours flight time. Four admin runs amassing 2 hours and 1 resupply with a total weight of 2000 pounds were flown.

4. LOGISTICS

a. During the month of September 1969, all sections under the cognizance of the Battalion S-4 functioned normally and efficiently with no unusual occurrences.

5. COMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONICS

The Communications platoon continued to support the Battalion at the Mobile Combat Base with no significant problems or any unusual occurrences.

6. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

A. PUBLIC WORKS

(1) The HE team made three showings for a total of $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours. The showings were made at Duong Son (1) hamlet at (AT 998687), Yen Ne (AT 986681) and Mieu Bong (BT 016683).

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(2) We provided 1,600 sandbags and wood for a bunker at the village Headquarters for Thanh Trong at the hamlet of Than Quit (BT 041623).

(3) In conjunction with S-4 we provided 12 cots and 2 rolls of screen for 1st Battalion 51 ARVN Regiment BAS (AT 989668).

B. WELFARE

(1) Six requests to rebuild homes have been submitted to this command. The requests are being fulfilled as quickly as material becomes available.

(2) During the month, 100 pounds of clothes were given out plus 40 pairs of shower shoes.

C. EDUCATION

(1) 60 General Walt Scholarships were passed out during the month. A fund drive within the Battalion is now in progress. 60 Scholarships is the goal of this drive.

D. HEALTH

(1) During the month, Battalion Med-cap treated 1,460 civilians medically and 13 dentally. 10 civilians were medevaced by BAS during the month.

H. SOLATUIM PAYMENTS

(1) 16,000 \$VN was paid out for 3 people killed, 3 pigs killed, and 1 house destroyed in Quang Dong (2) hamlet at (AT 999627) as a result of mis-directed ordnance.

(2) 4,000 \$VN was paid out for 1 person killed near Ha Long (AT 994643) by small arms fire of unknown origin.

7. MEDICAL

A. PERSONNEL

(1) 2 Medical Officers, 1 Chaplain, 54 Hospital Corpsman (23 HM's BAS; 1 HN replacement; 30 HM's company corpsman). During the month 2 Hospital Corpsman were transferred to CONUS, 1 HM transferred TEMEDU under treatment, 2 HM's were medevaced to hospitals in RVN, and 4 HM's were reassigned to units in the division rear.

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B. FACILITIES.

(1) The BAS consists of 9 huts which are used for sick call, administration, laboratory, supply health records, shot clinic, and living quarters for personnel assigned to the BAS. Other facilities consists of 1 brick building for storage of personnel effects and 3 bunkers.

C. DAILY ACTIVITIES

(1) Sick call is held from 0800-0900 and 1300-1400 daily and 0800-0900 on Sunday. Emergencies are seen anytime.

(2) A total of 220 patients were seen at sick call, 30 were referred to other medical facilities, 6 physical examinations were conducted, 161 lab tests, 19 admissions, 15 skin disorders, 5 upper respiratory infections, 22 VD, 19 malaria, and 15 diarrhea.

(3) 1661 immunizations were given.

(4) Transportation is provided for patients referred to other medical activities. The BAS ambulance is utilized only for emergency use or as required. Medical evacuation via helicopter are called where time is of critical importance.

(5) Civilian MEDCAP is conducted Monday thru Saturday from 0900-1100, during the past month 1677 Vietnamese were treated. No mobile MEDCAP was conducted for this period.

D. WEEKLY ACTIVITIES. Sanitation inspections of the contonement and messing facilities are conducted at routine intervals.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Endings:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

1. Headings:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Endings:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal Files:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
