SECTION B INTELLIGENCE

- 1. During the month of Hovember, the battalion participated in the Voluntary Informant Program with purchases totaling 6,250 Piasters. All purchases were made for ordnance/information brought out of the field by local Vietnamese.
- 2. During November, enemy sightings and contacts rose as the enemy moved back into the lowlands as the flood waters receded. As expected the enemy began the task of resupplying his beleagured forces. On 12 November 1970, the battalion launched an operation to interdict the enemy's lines of communications and conduct rice denial in the Football Island area, vic. AT8952.
- 3. It is anticipated that the enemy will continue his attempts to resupply and counter pacification efforts while harassing FWMF with stand-off attacks by fire, decreasing as lunar illumination increases.

SECTION C OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

1. Open College

a. <u>Mission</u>. From 1-30 November 1970, let Battelien, let Marines was assigned the mission of conducting unilateral and combined offensive operations in cooperation/coordination with Vietnamese Forces within designated TAOR to search out and eliminate enemy forces and logistical installations. The primary emphasis was placed on those elements and base areas posing the greatest hazards to the Government of Vietnam's control of significantly populated areas and to the security of friendly installations, as well as the task of denying the enemy access to rocket sites against the Danang Vital Area.

b. Tasks. From 1-30 November 1970, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the following tasks:

- (1) To occupy and defend USMC portion of Hill 37, vic. 41916581.
- (2) To cocupy and defend Hill 65, vic. AT880580.
- (3) To occupy and defend Hill 52, vic. AT214554.
- (4) To occupy and defend Hill 10, vic. AT924690.
- (5) To provide one plateon OPCON to 11th Marines for security of the OP located on Hill 250, vic. AT795531.
 - (6) To provide security for OP located on Hill 270, vic. AT865681.
- (7) From 1 to 30 November 1970, provide security for Engineer and SeaBee projects within our TAOR, to include daily mine sweeps along common access routes.
- (8) To be prepared to provide a reaction force capable of relieving the Hieu Duo and Dai Loc District Headquarters and Combined Action Company units within the TAOR.
- (9) To deny the enemy access to probable rocket launch sites against the Danang Vital Area.

c. Special Operations

(1) From 1 to 30 November 1970, Company "N" CUFP units conducted combined tactical, civil, medical and psychological operations with local RF/PF Forces in their assigned TAOR.

- (2) From 1 to 30 November 1970, elements of Company "M" and Company "C" provided day security and extensive night ambushes along Route 4 east to ensure safe passage of convoys.
- (3) From 6 to 8 November 1970, Company "C", in coordination with Dai Loc District Forces, conducted a combined operation on "Charlie Ridge" to locate and destroy a suspected energy harbor site. (See TAB A).
- (4) On 13 November 1970, a reinforced platoon from Company "M" was inserted on "Charlie Ridge", vic. AT823605, to establish and provide security for a sefe haven for recon units working in the vicinity. (See TAB B).
- (5) From 12 to 15 November 1970 and 19 to 20 November 1970, a two company search operation was conducted in response to intelligence information indicating a concentration of enery food supplies were located in "Football Island", vic. AT890520. The operation was conducted to locate and evacuate the food caches and to deny the energy use of same. (See TAR C).

2. Training

- a. A Mine/Booby Trap Contact Team from 1st Engineer Battalion held instructions on land mines and booby traps. Five classes were held with a total attendance of 231 personnel.
- b. During the month, 70 personnel joining the battalion received the battalion orientation course.
- c. Thirteen personnel successfully completed the one week Resident Land Mine Warfare School conducted by the 1st Engineer Battalion. Three personnel attended the Vietnamese Language School conducted by lst Marine Division G-5.
 - d. A total of 5 personnel attended out of country schools:

(1)	Embourkation School (Okinowa)	2 Officers
(2)	Registered Publication School (Japan)	1 Officer
(3)	Registered Publication School (Okinawa)	1 Officer
(4)	NBC Defense School (CBR) (Okinawa)	1 Enlisted

c. Company level training during the month of November placed emphasis on Patrolling Techniques, Land Navigation, Map and Compass Reading, Rules of Engagement, Personal Response and Mines/Booby Traps Countermeasures.



3. Air Support

- a. During the month of November 1970, 70 flights of fixed wing from Mag 11 were flown in support of the battalion. The aircraft expended a total of 629,000 pounds of bombs, 109,000 pounds of napalm and 5,000 rounds of 20 mm ammunition. The damage assessment included 4 bunkers destroyed and 210 meters of treeline with 13 secondary explosions.
- b. OVIOA Bronco aircraft from VMO-O2 flew a total of 32 hours conducting aerial observation, artillery spotting missions and close air support. The aircraft expended five pods of rockets and 7,400 rounds of 7.62 ammunition.
- c. In support of combat operations in the TAOR, a total of 70 sorties for 25 emergency, 24 priority and 32 routine med-evacs were flown. Also 74 sorties were flown by CH-46D and CH-53 helicopters lifting and extracting 1,840 troops. A total of six hours flight time was flown by "Cobra" gunships. Twenty-one visual reconnaissance missions were flown with a total of 25 hours and 10 minutes of flight time. Twenty-one resupply lifts with a total weight of 311,016 pounds were flown.

4. Artillery Support

- a. During the month of November 1970, Battery "A" 1st Battalion, 11th Marines continued to give priority of fires to the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. Batteries "B" and "VY" with Battery "L", now OFCON to 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, Battery "C" of the 94th Army Artillery Brigade provided general support for the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.
- b. A total of 2,246 rounds were fired during the month of November in support of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. There were six contact missions in which 98 rounds were expended; 26 targets of opportunity in which 797 rounds were expended; 61 intelligence targets which accounted for 336 rounds and 13 illumination missions which accounted for 199 rounds. There were also 204 pre-emptive targets fired on during the month and this consumed 816 rounds.
- o. There were no significant incidents occurring this month. Artillery fire is oredited with three enemy KIA's and one probable.



SECTION D LOCISTICS

- 1. From 27 to 29 Movember 1970, "A", "B" and "C" Company rears were moved to Hill 37. The battalion is presently in the process of turning Hill 10 over to a RF Company and their U.S. Army Advisors.
- 2. Elements of Company "A", 7th Engineers are using the cantonment on Hill 37 as a base of operations. They are requiring the road bed on the Dai Loc Bridge. Engineers estimate 14 working days until repair work is completed, but present flood waters have halted repair work.
- 3. 1st platoon "A" Company, 1st Engineer. Exttalion have expanded LZ 432 by 327 feet. They have also cleared fields of fire on Hills 37, 65 and 52.
- 4. A detachment of SeaBees from MCB-3 are repairing MCB Dai Loc Bridge vie. AT914579: Estimated completion date is January 3, 1971.
- 5. Elements of Company "A" 7th Engineers, 1st platoon, "A" Company 1st Engineer Battalion and the dotachment of SeaBees are currently bill eted on Hill 37. The battalion is providing food, water, shelter and security for these units and will continue to do so until they depart Hill 37.
- 6. For the month of Movember, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines supplied its units out of Hill 37 LSU-5. A total of 279,936 pounds were lifted out of LZ 432 during the month.

The battalion has one Medical Officer, one Chief Hospital Corpsman and 12 Hospital Corpsmen assigned to Hill 37 BAS; one Medical Officer and 2 Hospital Corpsmen assigned to Hill 65 BAS; 26 Hospital Corpsmen assigned to the rifle companies and 10 Hospital Corpsmen assigned to the CUPP units.
- 2. Facilities. The Battalion Aid Station on Hill 37 consists of 4 buildings and 1 bunker which are utilized for storage, sleeping quarters, sick-call, administration, supply and emergency bunker. The BAS on Hill 65 consists of 2 buildings and 1 bunker.

Daily Activities

- a. Sickcall is held from 0830 to 0930 and 1300 to 11400 daily. Emergencies are seen at any time.
- b. A total of 629 patients were seen during the month of November. Ailments are broken down as follows:

- Ollo20H IOD located on Hill 65, vic. AT880580, observed Vietnamese towing one USMC body. Upon investigation, body was identified as that of L/CPL MICKO reported MIA 291700H October 1970.
- 030810H While conducting a road sweep on Route 540, vic. AT924533, an Engineer unit received 30 rounds of sniper fire and one 60 mm mortar round from vic. AT921530. To prevent possible friendly on friendly as PF's had been working in that vicinity, unit took cover and withdrew. Negative casualties sustained.
- O41501H A convoy was moving west on Route 4, vic. AT928578, when the third vehicle in the convoy, a 6X6 truck, detonated a mine resulting in extensive damage to the vehicle and wounding 04 USMC. The mine was estimated to be approximately 70 pounds and was apparently pressure detonated.
- 050800H "C" Company was conducting a platoon inspection of 782 gear in Company "C" rear area, when an explosion occurred in the immediate area designated as a collection point for unserviceable ordnance resulting in 12 USMC med-evacs and 02 USMC non-evac. A ground incident report was initiated to determine the cause of the explosion.
- 052145H D23, while in ambush position, vic. AT794548, heard VC voices and observed some flickering lights approximately 200 meters to the northwest. Fired 60 nm mortars on the position. The VC moved toward the ambush site. D23 initiated contact with claymores and small arms fire. The VC returned five with small arms and 3 chicom grenades resulting in Ol USMC non-evac. A sweep of the area produced negative results.
- 062113H Two men on Hill 65, vic. AT880580, were emergency medevaced because of fragmentary explosion of undetermined source. The area of incident was frozen by staff and officers, and personnel present were questioned. A Ground Incident Report was initiated.
- 070830H M4 while on patrol, vic. NT808564, found approximately 400 pounds of rice, a plastic bag of blasting caps, tar, wax, and a booby trap consisting of a chicom with a tripwire. All of the materials were destroyed.



- 121730H Hill 37, vic. AT916582, received 02 rounds of 82 mm mortar incoming. There were negative casualties and damage.
- 141150H Hill 37, vic. AT916582, received 01 82 mm mortar round outside of the defensive wire. There were negative essualties or damage.
- 142144H M31 while in ambush site, vic. AT944581, spotted 12 enemy moving south. M13 took the enemy under small arms fire resulting in Ol VC/NVA KIA.
- 150830H "C" Company while searching the area vie. AT878520, found a series of small rice and corn caches totaling approximately 2,000 pounds and evacuated it to Hill 37.
- 151210H M32 uncovered a small staging area, vic. AT937595, and found 100 pounds of rice, 100 pounds of bananas, assorted foodstuffs, 02 M-16 magazines and 03 RPG rounds. Foodstuffs and ordnance were destroyed.
- 151345H C3 while scarching river bank, vic. AT882517, uncovered numerous documents in a plastic container. Documents were forwarded to the Battalion S-2 for action.

- 201730H "F" Company, while being extracted, vic. AT875524, received small arms and M-79 fire from vic. AT875522. Marines returned small arms fire and gunships fired on board ordnance. The extraction was completed with negative casualties.
- 251400H A32, while on patrol, vic. A7898703, stopped at a stream to replenish water supply. The squad leader moved away from the other members of the squad to dispose of an M-26 grenade, an explosion occured resulting in 05 USMC WIA. A ground accident report was initiated to determine the cause of the explosion.
- 261751H Dai Loc District Headquarters received 02 61 mm mortar rounds impacting vic. AT917576, resulting in 09 Vietnamese civilian casualties, 07 of the Vietnamese were med-evaced. 1st Battalian, 1st Marines Command Post Hill 37 set Condition 2 and cleared grids for countermortar fire.

280950H M32, while on patrol, vic. AT929597, had a patrol member detonate a booby trap resulting in Ol USAC WIA med-evac. Booby trap was an M-26 grenade with tripwire.

282130H H2 while in night position, vic. AT974522, observed 02 VC/NVA approximately 15 meters away, noving west to east. Engaged onemy with small arms and M-26 grenades, resulting in OI VC/NVA KIA.






