2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. General. Enemy activity during the month of October was light. At 0330 on 21 October 1969, thirteen VC/NVA from the Q-82nd Main Force Company entered the Ngan Cau New Life Hamlet disguised as ARVN's. They were in the New Life Hamlet approximately thirty minutes and killed one Vietnamese and wounded two others. Fifteen VC/NVA were spotted by the FO Tower moving away from the area of the New Life Hamlet. An 81mm mortar fire mission was fired by 2/1 on the enemy's position and a sniper on the tower recorded one confirmed VC/NVA KIA. Results of the fire mission were undetermined due to darkness.

On 24 October, the 181st Regional Force Company found three 105 "Lob Bombs" set up to be fired at their position and one bangalore torpedo. A sweep around the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines CP resulted in the finding of two 105mm dud HE rounds with wire carrying handles attached.

On 25 October at 1245, the point man of a platoon from Company "H" came upon five VC/NVA relaxing in a small clearing. The point man opened fire, which resulted in four VC/NVA KIA's and the capture of five AK-47's. Documents found indicated one of the VC/NVA KIA's was a Platoon Commander with the Q-82nd VC Main Force Company. These VC/NVA had been forced out of the Cam Sa (1) area by a search and cordon operation being conducted by 1st Battalion, 1st Marines and Republic of Korea Marines.

On 28 October, at 1420, Company "F" captured four VC/NVA hiding in a bunker. One VC/NVA was wounded during the capture, and was evacuated to Naval Support Activity Hospital. Subsequent interrogation at NSA revealed him as being the Executive Officer of the C-2 Company, D-1 Battalion, District 3 (AKA: R20th Battalion). The prisoner gave the future mission of his battalion and provided information concerning a large-scale offensive, (Code LB), in which all units of District 3 were to participate.

d. Weather and Terrain

(1) Weather. The weather for the month was poor with 40 inches of rain. The wind direction remained variable with a velocity of 5 to 10 knots.

(2) Terrain. The terrain in the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR is flat and sandy, with rice paddies and broken treelines. Cover and concealment is fair and observation very good.

3. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

a. During the period 1-31 October 1969 this battalion with one company OPCON from 1st Battalion, 1st Marines conducted offensive operations from the Cau Ha Combat Base and three outlying Company Combat Bases.

b. During the period 17-19 October 1969, Company E, attached to 1st Battalion 1st Marines, participated in Phase Five of Operation Pipstone Canyon. While on the operation Company E discovered 6,500 pounds of rice, which was turned over to the Regimental S-5.

c. On 21 October 1969, a squad from Company H, ambushed approximately six VC/NVA. The squad conducted a thorough search of the area and found three VC/NVA killed, one Chicom grenade, one K54 9mm pistol, one AK-47 rifle, and one M-16 rifle captured.

d. During the period 24-29 October 1969, Company E, again attached to the 1st Battalion 1st Marines, participated in the disposition of villagers to the New Tu Cau Resettlement Hamlet and the destruction of tunnels and bunkers in the area.

e. On 25 October 1969, a squad from Company H came upon five VC/NVA wearing green uniforms. Marines opened fire killing four VC/NVA, while one escaped. In addition, the squad captured five AK-47 rifles, two Chicom grenades, one poncho liner, two cartridge belts, and one small jar containing blasting caps and wires.

f. On 28 October 1969, a squad from Company F conducting a routine joint patrol with elements of 1/34th RF Company, observed four VC/NVA fleet into a bunker. Upon closer examination, a trap door was discovered leading into the bunker. When breaching the door with a M-26 grenade, a secondary explosion was noted. After investigation of the interior of the structure, the squad captured four VC/NVA PW's. Vietnamese soldiers working with Company F interrogated the prisoners, and determined that the individuals captured were NVA. In addition, two AK-47 rifles, M-26 grenades, clothing and documents were discovered.

g. Road security during this reporting period was maintained by day and night motor vehicle patrols.

4. AIR SUPPORT

a. 2d Battalion, 1st Marines had eight medevac missions in which there were 28 evacuations. Marine casualties were broken down into 10 emergency, 12 priority, and six routine. Of these casualties, three were emergency and six were priority non-battle casualties. One emergency medevac was called for a VC/NVA prisoner and one for a local civilian. The average delay for an emergency medical evacuation was 30 minutes, the shortest lasting 13 minutes while the longest taking 60 minutes.

b. During the reporting period two troop lift missions involving 30 sorties were used to transport 173 troops.

c. Six aerial observation missions were flown by OV-10's for the battalion with a total time on station of four hours and twenty minutes. Seven visual reconnaissance and command and control helicopter missions were flown, carrying a total of 24 passengers.

d. Because of extensive Marine, ARVN and CAP activities, and the dense civilian population in the 2d Battalion TAOR, no fixed wing air strikes were flown.

e. On 23 October the Battalion's ALO was replaced by a new ALO from MAG 13.

5. ARTILLERY AND FIRE SUPPORT

a. For the period 1 through 31 October, fire support was provided by Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines.

b. During the reporting period three officers reported to Bravo Battery and were assigned the primary duty of Forward Observers with Companies E, F, and H. One officer is presently TAD to 11th Marines. Two officers were brought in from the field, one assigned to Bravo Battery and the other to FSCC as the Artillery Liaison Officer.

c. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in general support of the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines. During this reporting period, approximately 60 observed missions were recorded. Daily pre-empted fires totaled 326 targets. Due to the civilian population and increased ARVN activity within the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR, artillery fire has been restricted to several distinct areas. These areas are Cam Sa 1 and 2, No Name Island, and Vien Dong. These areas are situated in the southern and eastern portion of the 2d Battalion's TAOR. During this period approximately 6,500 artillery rounds were fired in direct support of 2d Battalion, 1st Marines. These were supplemented by 2,364 HE, 114 WP, together with 759 illumination rounds fired by organic 81mm mortars.

6. TRAINING

a. During October, training within the Battalion consisted of Orientation Training for replacement personnel, Rehabilitation Training for rifle company personnel, and attendance at Division and FMFPAC schools.

b. Orientation training consists of five days of classes covering the following subjects; MPC and Piaster spending, Pay and Allowance, Emergency

Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty, CAP Program, R&R, Postal Regulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect For Religions Based on Customs of Vietnam, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TAOR/Weather, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rewards Program, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromises, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading and Aerial Photos, Password and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Navigation, Employment of Snipers, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Demolitions and Destruction of Boobytraps, Boobytrap Lane, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnamese Customs/Personal Response, Chieu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vietnamese People, Conduct/Attitude toward Vietnamese Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotics, Alcohol, Legal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Weapons, Duddy Aid, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygiene, Preventative Medicine, Venereal Disease, Anti-Malaria Measures, Military Decorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, Grenade Safety, M-16/EL Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalion Range Regulations, FAM Firing, Zeroing of Weapons and Quick Fire/Quick Kill.

c. Rehabilitation Training consists of six days of classes covering the following subjects; The Map and Compass, M-79 Grenade Launcher, MACV Rules of Engagement, 45 Caliber Pistol, M-60 Machinegun, Weapons/Grenade Safety, M-16 Rifle, Claymore mine, Fire Control/Discipline, Patrolling, Starlight Scope, Supporting Arms, Blmm Adjustment/FO Techniques, Ambushes/Counter Ambushes, the LAIW, First Aid/Field Sanitation, Combat Leadership, Tank/Infantry Coordination, Narcotics/Drug Abuse, Mines/Boobytraps, Race Relations and Attack of Fortified Positions. All personnel underwent the Quick Fire/Quick Kill Course and fired their individual weapons for zero at the 1000 inch range.

7. LOGISTICS AND SUPPLY

a. Logistics

(1) During this reporting period the Battalion conducted several operations within it's TAOR. Resupply of operating units was accomplished by trucks and LVT's. The Battalion has the responsibility of logistically supporting five rifle companies, of which two provide security for three major

bridges in the Battalion's TAOR. These three bridges are on the primary routes of resupply for all operational units south of Danang.

b. Motor Transport

(1) The overall deadline rate for the Motor Transport Section was 30%. This is a decrease of 10% from last month. The deadline on M274A2's is attributed to spare parts. The deadline rate on M151A1's is attributed to third echelon NORS.

(2) Two M151A1 vehicles were coded H during the month. Two are presently at FSR for third echelon NORS.

(3) Thirteen M274A2 vehicles are currently deadlined. Eleven are deadlined for third echelon NORS of which two are deadlined for second echelon NORS. Seven M274A2 mechanical mules were coded H during the reporting period.

(4) T/E deficiencies are as follows:

- (a) Two M151A1 jeeps
- (b) Two M274A2 mechanical mules
- (c) Four M16A1 trailers
- (d) One M170 ambulance

c. Supply

(1) A supply chief, MOS 3041, arrived on 20 October. The remainder of the monsoon requirements on requisition has not been received. Final orders will be completed when assets from FLC become available. The use of barrier construction are held in sufficient quantities with a few exceptions. Assets of body armor and rifle cleaning gear are still unavailable in the supply system.

(2) The Field Supply Analysis Office Inspection was held on 15 October. The formal results of the inspection are due to be received by 15 November.

d. Fiscal Obligations

(1) Obligations during the month of October for SFA items were \$57,312.07. Funds for ASA items were \$31,248.16.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

a. During the month of October 1969, the Communications Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications facilities for the Battalion. Communications in the Cau Ha Combat Base was primarily centered around installing new camp wiring and improving existing wire and a new antenna system installed to provide a more effective communication system.

b. Radio Section: The Radio Section, during the month of October, improved the radio and antenna system throughout the cantonment as well as setting up a radio system within the new COC.

c. Wire Section: The Wire Section continued to improve the existing wire system throughout the Combat Base. A new cable has been installed within the Security Headquarters. In addition, a cable was laid from the new COC bunker to the Battalion switchboard.

d. Message Center Section: The message traffic for the month of October consisted of 34 outgoing and 886 incoming messages. The total downtime for the month of October between Regiment and the 2d Battalion was 12 days, 10 hours, and 28 minutes. This excessive downtime is due to the 100% deadline rate of the TGC-14 teletypewriter, the GGC-3, reperforator typewriter, and the duplicating machine.

e. Engineer Equipment: The generator section emphasized maintenance of all engineer equipment. The total downtime for all generators was 1 hour and 4 minutes.

f. Electronic Maintenance Section: During the month of October, 23 TEROS were completed out of 51 turned in. During this reporting period the following equipment was repaired.

9. MEDICAL AND DENTAL

a. During the reporting period the Battalion Surgeon was LT N. L. SMITH, MC, USNR. During this period the Battalion Aid Station had a strength of three Officers (one Medical Corps and Dental, one Chaplain Corps) and 54 Hospital Corpsmen in the field and garrison.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated 877 patients during the month of October. There were no acute or unusual medical problems of epidemic scale during this period. There are no major sanitation problems at this time.

c. Analysis of routine medical treatments revealed 12 cases of upper respiratory infection, seven cases of diarrhea, 114 cases of foot disorders, 163 cases of dermatology problems and eight cases of venereal disease. There were five cases of flu of unknown origin, and three new cases of malaria. There were 573 patients treated for miscellaneous problems at routine sick call, 266 dental patients, and one case of hepatitis.

d. Analysis of mortality figures reveal no USMC KIA's and no USMC DOW's as a result of hostile action. There were seven USMC WIA's, three USMC WIANE, with 14 USMC NBC's, one USMC DOD and one USMC DAI. There were no USN casualties.

e. The immunization program was adequate with 1,928 immunizations being administered to members of this organization.

f. There was an active civilian medical program wherein 1,611 Vietnamese civilians were treated, with 10 Vietnamese civilians receiving dental work.

g. There were seven USMC and six Vietnamese civilians evacuated for medical reasons.

10. CHAPLAIN

a. On 15 October 1969, Lt. Julian M Gnull, CHC, USNR, assumed the duties as Chaplain for the 2d Battalion 1st Marines, relieving Lt. Irvin H. Thompson, CHC, USNR.

b. Lt. John J. Conway, CHC, USNR, gave regular and extensive coverage to the Catholic personnel of this Battalion for the period 1-15 October 1969.

c. During the month a combination Library/Recreation Room was completed and opened for the use of all personnel. This project was initiated and worked on under the direction of Chaplain Thompson.

d. Catholic Mass is now offered daily by Chaplain Gnull. Sunday Mass is also said for the benefit of all the companies in the area which they are located as well as in the CP Chapel. Coverage is also extended to the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines in their CP Chapel and at the Ha Dong, Cau Do and Golden Gate Bridges. CDR. William Fuller, CHC, USN, Regimental Chaplain of 1st Marines, is giving Protestant coverage to various units of this Battalion.

e. The Chaplain councelled 18 Marines and assisted 11 in making emergency MARS Calls during the latter part of this month. The Chaplain also made four visits to the hospital and two visits to the brig. Four lectures on Personal Response were given to incoming personnel.

f. There were 960 gift packages forwarded to this unit via the Regimental Chaplain, which were oqually distributed to all the companies via the office of the Chaplain. These gift packages were donated by various church and civic groups within the Continental United States and totaled approximately \$3,000.

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1 Oct 69 - 1030 - Hotel at DTG 1020H at BT099664. One 81mm HE and one M-79 HE were turned into Hotel Company CP by Vietnamese children. Destroyed rounds with C-4 and paid children 400 piasters.
- 1056 - Echo 31 at DTG 1025H at BT082676. While on patrol, squad observed four personnel dressed in black, talking amongst themselves. Unit beckoned for personnel to come forward, at which time each of them picked up an AK-47 rifle and began fleeing in the direction of the northwest. Patrol opened fire on the VC/NVA and pursued them, only to lose them in a deep rice paddy. Made a thorough investigation of the area with negative results.
- 1123 - Hotel at DTG 1100H at BT099664. One 81mm HE, one 81mm illumination, three 60mm illumination, one 105mm WP, one M-79 HE, and one red smoke grenade were turned in by Vietnamese children. A total of 1,000 piasters were paid for the ordnance.
- 1120 - Hotel 21 at DTG 1300H at BT075638. While on a routine squad size patrol unit noticed seven Vietnamese observing their movements. At this time the patrol leader dispatched a detail of six men to check them out. Seeing the Marines moving toward their position the personnel fled into a treeline evading the Marines. After a thorough search of the area of last sighting, unit discovered foot prints and began to follow them. Unit received approximately 40 rounds of AK-47 fire resulting in one USMC WIA and the destruction of one M-16 rifle. Called for 81 fire mission on area where small arms fire was coming from, and also requested assistance from Hotel 2 unit. Hotel 2 made a thorough sweep of the area of contact detaining 15 adults and one child for interrogation. In addition, unit discovered 12 bunkers 4'x4'x4' which were destroyed with C-4.
- 1855 - Hotel at DTG 1800H at BT099664. One 105mm HE, two 60mm HE, one 81mm HE, one 60mm illumination, one 60mm WP, and one 81mm illumination were turned in by Vietnamese children. A total of 1800 piasters were paid for the ordnance and they were destroyed with C-4.

- 0420 - 2d Battalion, 1st Marines at BT074654 at DTG 210420H. Whiskey Tower observed 15 VC/NVA moving in a southeasterly direction away from the 181st RF Compound at grid coordinates BT065615. In addition, observed an unknown number of VC/NVA personnel also moving in a southerly direction at BT082649. Scout Sniper Team fired on enemy at BT065645, observing two VC/NVA fall, and the remainder flee into a nearby bunker. Subject bunker was taken under fire by 81mm HE mission and the area is now in the process of being investigated.
- 0430 - Echo 1 at BT056656 at DTG 210430H. Unit was dispatched from 2d Battalion, 1st Marines Combat Base as a quick Reaction Force. While in route to 181st RF Company position unit received enemy fire from a treeline at BT065661, also observed enemy movement. Echo 1 returned fire and conducted thorough search of the enemy position with negative results. Platoon continued assigned mission and proceeded to the 181st RF Compound, setting in a cordon around the New Life Hamlet at BT056658, the RF conducted a sweep through the area.
- 0430 - CIT at BT058654 at DTG 210430H. In reference to 0330 entry of this journal, 13 VC/NVA were reported entering the New Life Hamlet wearing ARVN uniforms. VC/NVA had one 60mm mortar, one B-40 rocket with launcher, and one M-79 grenade launcher. Enemy took hamlet under fire killing one RF soldier and wounding two others. In addition 15 Vietnamese civilians were injured in the action. It was determined enemy were in the area for thirty minutes. VC/NVA fled hamlet when Reaction Force appeared. Also called in artillery HE fire mission on suspected enemy route of withdrawal. Unit reports one VC KIA confirmed, medical evacuation of personnel completed at 0550.
- 0650 - Hotel 32 at BT066641 at DTG 210545H. Unit in ambush position reports killing three VC/NVA when approximately six VC/NVA walked into unit's killing zone. Squad conducted a thorough search of the killing zone finding one ChiCom grenade, one K54 9mm pistol, one AK-47 rifle, and one M-16 rifle. In addition one small notebook, one wallet and two magazines for the K54 pistol and one magazine for each rifle.
- 0650 - Fox 2 at BT050700 at DTG 210640H. Platoon swept from BT050700 to BT057702 in search of a possible rocket site. Unit completed thorough sweep of the suspected area with negative results.

- 0800 - H&S Co at BT068688 at DTG 210800H. One M-26 dud grenade was turned over to mine sweep detail by a Vietnamese boy. Destroyed ordnance in place with C-4 and paid individual 200 piasters.
- 1117 - Fox 31 at BT055710 at DTG 211100H. Squad swept area from BT056710 to BT054715 in search of possible rocket site, with negative results.
- 1440 - Hotel 21 at BT101655 at DTG 211400H. While on routine patrol unit discovered one bunker 15'x5'x3' reinforced with logs. Destroyed with 2 lbs of C-4.
- 1550 - Hotel 21 at BT088665 at DTG 211455H. While on routine squad size patrol, point man observed two VC/NVA concealed behind heavy vegetation with weapons. Point man took enemy personnel under fire with approximately five rounds of 5.56 small arms fire as enemy began to flee. Unit conducted a thorough search of the area with negative results. Patrol continued along it's assigned route.
- 2045 - Fox 3 at BT042681 at DTG 211920H. While enroute to assigned ambush site, unit received enemy small arms fire and one incoming M-26 grenade. Returned fire with small arms and M-26 grenades, and swept area of contact finding one VC/NVA KIA floating in water. A second enemy soldier, having been wounded crawled away and was unable to be located. Unit had one USMC WIA as a result of the action.
- 22 Oct 69 - 0906 - H&S Company at BT068688 at DTG 220825H. One M-26 grenade and 1/2 lb TNT was turned over to mine sweep detail by a Vietnamese boy. 300 piasters were made in payment to individual and destroyed ordnance with C-4.
- 1300 - Hotel 11 at BT087668 at DTG 221300H. While moving along assigned patrol route, squad received incoming sniper fire from BT086666. Countered with small arms fire, and 60mm mortars, unit is now in the process of sweeping area of contact.
- 1325 - Hotel 11 at BT078668 at DTG 221300H. (Follow up spot) Unit called for AO assistance and detained one female approximately 50 years of age at BT094662, she will be turned over to ITT for further interrogation.
- 1455 - Hotel 31 at BT090658 at DTG 221445H. While on routine patrol discovered four SFD's fashioned from discarded "C" ration cans packed with C-4 with fuses attached. Each SFD was clearly marked with a warning indicator. SFD's were situated on a trail in foot traps. Destroyed each separately with C-4.
- 1630 - CAP 274 at BT044634 at DTG 221630H. Unit observed one Vietnamese male fleeing from a house, patrol gave chase but was unable to apprehend him. Unit conducted a thorough search of the area and discovered a shirt. In the pocket of the garment was a letter from a man to his wife advising her to observe activities of the Marines operating in this area.

A closer search of the area located the subject woman mentioned in the letter. Another Vietnamese female was apprehended as she attempted to flee from her house. In addition a young Vietnamese boy directed unit to a bunker where he claimed VC/NVA personnel were using as a place of refuge. Dimensions of the bunker were six feet long, two feet wide and four feet high. Detained females, and will turn them over to IFF for further disposition.

- 1730 - Hotel Company at BT099664 at DTG 221730H. Fifteen 105mm HE rounds, three 60mm HE mortar rounds, four 82mm HE rounds, one M-26 grenade, one yellow smoke grenade, nineteen 60mm illumination rounds, and five 105 illumination rounds were turned over to Company Command Post position by Vietnamese children. A total of 1,400 piasters and 28 individual "C" ration meals were given as payment for ordnance.
- 1855 - Hotel 21 at BT095658 at DTG 221530H. Unit discovered a hole 3'x 4'x1' with three 105 dud rounds lying around the edge. AO reports observing seven Vietnamese males earlier. Unit conducted thorough investigation of the area with negative results. Destroyed ordnance in place with C-4.
- 2107 - 3d Amtrac Bn at BT082705 at DTG 221930H. Unit received one incoming 60mm HE round resulting in minor damage to motor vehicle maintenance shop. Crows Nest and Chin Strap notified of mortars suspected position, CAP 276 is now in process of sweeping area from BT068705 to MSR Road.
- 2030 - CAP 274 at BT045632 at DTG 222030H. Unit received 150-200 rounds AK-47 rifle fire from a tree line 400 meters to the north. Unit returned fire with twelve 60mm HE rounds, 200 5.56 rounds and 10 M-79 rounds. It was determined enemy force consisted of 5 or 6 personnel. Unit conducted a sweep of the area of contact with negative results.
- 23 Oct 69 - 0655 - Echo 2 at BT041665 at DTG 230630H. While on routine patrol unit discovered an old French house converted into a classroom. There were documents, diagrams and literature on United States tanks and weapons and methods on how they may be destroyed. The prisoner admitted she was a member of the local force VC and she had participated in the attack of 12 August 1969 on the C/P 273 position. Prisoner will be turned over to ITT at first light.
- 1100 - 2d ITT at BT026687 at DTG 301100H. A Civil Defendent identified a Vietnamese female as being a VC Commo-Liaison and supplier of foodstuffs to the enemy. Detained woman for further interrogation by ITT personnel.
