j. At the end of the month, preparations were underway to receive approximately 275 troops direct from 3d Battalion 26th Marines on 1 March 1970. Liaison with 1st Marines and 3/26 has been conducted and no significant problems are anticipated receiving or processing this large number of personnel. A prepared indoctrination program of two and one half days duration will facilitate the rapid delivery of these personnel to their respective duties and companies.

## 2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. General. Enemy activity during the month of February was extremely light with a peak in activity occurring on the 10th. At 2040H, a squad from Company "F" was providing security while CAP 2-7-5 was showing a movie to villagers of the Vinh Ky New Life Hamlet (DT054698), when a grenade impacted approximately 30 meters from the civilians. CAP 2-7-5 and Fox 2-2 immediately swept the surrounding area with negative findings. At 2115H, a squad from Company "E" encountered an unknown size enemy force at DT075601, resulting in four VC/NVA KIA, and the capturing of four AK-47 rifles, three M-16 rifles, four K-54 pistols, 23 M-26 fragmentation grenades, nine Chicom grenades, 10 rice packs and assorted documents. The documents indicated the KIA's belonged to the C.66th, which is also known as the K.36th Local Force Company, District III, La Nang City Forces.

At 1730H on 19 February, an observation helicopter spotted four Vietnamese personnel running to bunkers at DT075680. Three squads from Company "E" were dispatched to the area and detained 14 Vietnamese. The detainees were screened in the field by ITT and all were released except two males. One of two males was disguised as a female and confessed to being a Comm-liaison runner in the immediate area. He stated that he dressed as a woman because observation helicopter and Marine patrols do not pay much attention to women.

On the 20th at 1600H, a Sergeant from Unit 09 "Chieu Hoi'd" to Company "E" at DT037679. During subsequent interrogation, he stated that he had been separated from two comrades when the land clearing destroyed their bunker which was in the vicinity of Man Quan (DT0466). He added that he had received sapper training and was an assistant platoon commander, presently on leave enroute to visit his family.

## d. Weather and Terrain

(1) Weather. The weather this reporting period was mild with approximately one inch of rainfall. The wind direction remained variable with a velocity of five to ten knots.

(2) Terrain. The terrain in the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines' TAOR is flat and sandy, with rice paddies and scattered, broken treelines. Due to the land clearing operation conducted within this TAOR, 75% of the TAOR has been cleared, thus enhancing observation as well as reducing enemy rally areas.

## 3. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

### a. Operations.

(1) Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(a) Conduct unilateral, joint and combined offensive operations to locate and destroy enemy forces and logistic installations.

(b) To locate and destroy enemy bases within the TAOR which pose a threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers.

(c) To deploy forces throughout the assigned TAOR and to provide defense of the Ia Heng vital area and military complex, with emphasis on routes of approach to probable rocket/mortar launch positions, to include waterways.

## (2) Operations

(a) The concept of operations within the TAOR is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrol/ambush activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalion TAOR.

(b) Local operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and liaison with Vietnamese Military and Civilian Officials who supplied information of Viet Cong activity. This information coupled with extensive usage of Aerial Observers (AO) communicating with maneuver forces on the ground resulted in several significant finds which included the destroying and capturing of enemy equipment and personnel.

(c) On 1 February, Company E in conjunction with a company from the 111th Regional Forces executed a cordon and search operation of Tan An Hamlet (1T090691).

(d) On 10 February Company F participated in a two day operation with 4th Battalion, 51st ARVN Regiment which met with moderate success. On the 12th of February, Company F assumed responsibility for the 2d Provisional Land Clearing Company as it resumed the land clearing operation in 2d Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR.

(e) On 23 February, Company F passed responsibility for the Land Clearing Company to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. The second phase of the land clearing within this TAOR extensively cleared vegetation and materially reduced enemy harbor sites along the Western boundary bordered by the Vinh Dien River.

(f) On 27 February, 2d Battalion, 7th Marines was released from the Southern portion of the TAOR with 2d Battalion, 1st Marines resuming responsibility for the entire area.

(g) On 23 February, Company F, in conjunction with 5th Battalion 2d ROKMC Brigade, conducted a two day operation along the common border resulting in two VC/NVA KIA.

## b. Training

(1) Training consists of Orientation for replacement personnel, refresher training, as required for all personnel and attendance at formal schools.

The orientation course is broken down as follows:

(a) 5 day course. Designated for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Vietnam.

(b) 3 day course. Designated for replacement personnel joining this Battalion from other "in country" commands. This training is geared to unique requirements relevant to this TAOR.

(c) Refresher course. Designated for personnel who need instruction on a specific subject or bank of subjects.

(3) Formal and semi-formal schooling is conducted by 1st Marines and 1st Marine Division.

(4) The Battalion orientation course includes the following subjects: MPC and Piaster spending, Pay and Allowances, Emergency Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty, CAP Program, R&R, Postal Regulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Religions based on Customs of Vietnam, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TAOR/Weather, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Howard's Program, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromises, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading and Aerial Photos, Password and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Navigation, Employment of Snipers, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Demolitions and Destruction of Booby Traps, Booby Trap Lane, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnamese Customs/Personal Response, Chieu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vietnamese People, Conduct/Attitude toward Vietnamese Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotics, Alcohol, Legal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss Of Weapons, Buddy Aid, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygiene, Preventive Medicine, Venereal Disease, Anti-Malaria Measures, Military Decorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, 60mm mortar, Claymore mines, Grenade Safety and M-67 Fragmentation Grenade, M-16A1 Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalion Range Regulations, FAM Firing, Zeroing Weapons and Quick Fire/Quick Kill.

#### 4. ARTILLERY AND FIRE SUPPORT

a. Fire support was provided by Battery A and Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, and Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines.

b. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in direct support of the 1st Marines during the entire month with Battery B co-located with 2d Battalion, 1st Marines.

38 observed missions were fired, three of which were in support of Company E on the nights of 10, 15, and 19 February. On the night of 10 February, Company E was supported with 56 105mm illumination rounds from Battery A and 16 155mm illumination rounds from Battery L. Harassment and interdiction fires totaled 32 targets. These targets were planned on suspected enemy assembly areas, avenues of approach, and bunker areas.

The total expenditure of 105mm high explosive ammunition fired was 1074 rounds. There were 70 105mm illumination rounds fired during the month. 16 155mm illumination rounds were fired by Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines in general support within the Tactical Area of Responsibility.

c. The 81mm mortar platoon fired a total of 21 missions in support of platoon and squad size activities engaged with the enemy. 96 harassment and interdiction missions were fired within the Tactical Area of Responsibility. There was an expenditure of 1974 high explosive rounds, 40 white phosphorus rounds and 693 illumination rounds. Two 81 mortar sections are located in the Camp Lauer Combat Base (BT081703), and one section is located with Company G at the French Fort in the village of Nui Kim Son (BT071703).

Due to civilian population concentrations, GVN military activities, and a reduced Tactical Area of Responsibility, fire support was restricted to several distinct areas. These areas included Man Quan (BT041680) and "No Name Island" (BT086666). The northwestern and southeastern sectors are laced with thick treelines affording excellent assembly areas for the enemy. Harassment and interdiction fire was directed into these areas upon clearance.

#### 5. AIR SUPPORT

a. The Battalion's use of Air Support during February was typical of January's usage. Air Support was used extensively for resupply, medical evacuations, aerial reconnaissance and observation. The helicopter was the primary vehicle used for air support of the Battalion; Fixed Wing support was limited to flare drops, night infrared detection, and aerial observation. Fixed Wing aircraft were not used for ordnance delivery within the Battalion's area due to friendly population density. On one occasion, helicopter gunships supported field units directly with forward firing ordnance.

Helicopters were derived primarily from Marine Air Group 16, with the exception of one light observation helicopter from 11th Marines. OV-10 observation aircraft were derived from Marine Air Group 11, and other fixed wing aircraft such as flareships and infrared detection aircraft were derived from the USAF.

b. The Battalion had nine medical evacuations which totaled 15 personnel evacuated. There were six emergency evacuated WIA, six priority WIA, one priority illness and one routine KIA.

The shortest delay for an emergency mission was 15 minutes, while 60 minutes was the longest delay for an average time of 24 minutes per mission.

c. There were 90 sorties of resupply flown, which included 83,560 pounds of resupply and 74 passengers.

d. 2d Battalion, 1st Marines utilized three aerial observation missions with a total time on station of two hours and six minutes.

## 6. LOGISTICS AND SUPPLY

### a. Logistics

(1) During February resupply of operating units was accomplished by trucks, helicopters, and huskies. Currently the Battalion is in the process of transferring the resupply commitments from helicopters to huskies where practicable.

(3) A work order has been approved by Division Engineers for 18 sea huts to provide living accommodations for personnel from the 81mm mortar platoon and artillery battery who are, at the present time, living in tents.

(4) There are three work orders pending for:

(a) A 15' head shower.

(b) Road repair.

(c) Leach field for the Officers Mess.

b. Motor Transport

(1) The overall deadline rate for the Motor Transport Section is 16%. This is a decrease of 1% over last month. It is anticipated in the future that the deadline rate will be increased due to present commitments coupled with the geographical area that we are currently operating in.

(2) The greatest maintenance problem lies in a shortage of mechanics. The Battalion is T/O in mechanics. However, mechanics are being utilized for tasks other than their assigned responsibilities because of a shortage of drivers.

(3) Seven truck platform, M-274A2's are presently at FSR. Two are at FSR, one is in transit, two M-37B1's are in transit to FSR.

(4) T/E deficiencies are as follows:

c. Supply

(1) Upon relocation to Camp Lauer, work was initiated to prepare Battalion Supply for operation in the new facilities. The reorganization of the warehouse was started. This involved turning in excess and unserviceable supplies to Force Logistics Command as well as painting, numbering, and marking of mount-out boxes.

(2) A Supply Chief, 3041, arrived during February. Retraining of personnel for new jobs was started to compensate for the loss of personnel being transferred to other units.

(3) The use of combat rations was extremely high during the first two weeks of February as elements of 2d Battalion, 7th Marines were being supported from 2d Battalion, 1st Marines Command Post.

(4) Several Motor Transport vehicles were received by invoice from the 3d Amphibian Tractor Battalion. A few Communication items were also received. Recent incoming messages indicated that other T/E equipment will be invoiced to this Battalion by redeploying units.

(5) A complete garrison property inventory has been started in order to add the items remaining in the combat base to the Garrison Property Account.

(6) Measures were taken to transfer responsibility for .45 caliber pistols from individuals to the company responsible officers.

d. Financial Status

(1) Total SFA obligations for the month of February were \$65,051.92. Total ASA obligations were \$72,871.50.

7. CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

a. Public Works

(1) Public works for the month has been limited due to lack of materials. Primary distribution has been made to those hamlets which have school projects underway. Xuan Tra New Life Hamlet (BT065675) was given 36 2"x4"x14' boards to insure completion of the roof on their school. Tu Cau New Life Hamlet was given three bags of cement to continue construction of well rings which are distributed to the other hamlets. The Hai An New Life Hamlet (BT064675) has received the majority of the logistic support from this command for the construction of the school at that hamlet. It has been given one truckload of lumber, 10 4"x4"x16' boards, 15 4"x4"x14' boards and 250 bags of cement. The cement will be used for the flooring of the school and houses in the hamlet. The Medcap building at the Cau Ha Combat Base has been dismantled by the people of the Ngan Cau New Life Hamlet (BT061665) and reconstructed for the same use at the hamlet site. It will be used in conjunction with the nursing program.

b. Welfare

(1) A total of 13,500 \$VN was paid out for local hire of unskilled laborers. A surplus of food from this battalion's messhall has been distributed to the people in the various new life hamlets. Xuan Tra NLH received 400 pounds of meat, Ngan Cau NLH received 1400 pounds of meat and vegetables, and Tu Cau NLH received 1300 pounds of meats and vegetables.

c. Education

(1) Eighty General Walt Scholarships have been distributed this month from the funds raised five months ago by members of this battalion. 30 scholarships were given to the Cam Nam School (15,000 \$VN) and 50 scholarships were given to the Xuan Tra School (25,000 \$VN). Celebration of the Lunar New Year slowed completion of the schools but progress is continuing. Xuan Tra NLH and Hai An NLH are very near completion with only interior work to be completed. Ngan Cau NLH has erected the framework for their school and are currently working on the siding.

d. Health

(1) The nursing program is continuing successfully. A total of 1500 have received medical attention in the new life hamlets this month, while 500 civilians have received medical attention at the Battalion Medcap program.

e. Agriculture

(1) The pig project, now in its third month at Xuan Tra New Life Hamlet, is continuing to meet with success. With G-5 contributing 12,000 pounds of corn, the people have been substantially aided in their project and they continue to get a good market price for the pigs of approximately 2500 \$VN. Xuan Tra has received 2000 pounds of corn while Hai An NLH received 2000 pounds and Ngan Cau NLH received 1200 pounds.

f. Social

(1) Two social meetings took place this month involving the Assistant Division Commander, the Battalion Commander and local village chiefs in order to promote a harmonious relationship with GVN officials in the area.

g. Security

(1) To aid in the security of the Xuan Tra NLH, the people received 1200 sandbags in order to fortify defensive positions occupied by People Self Defense Forces.

h. Solatum

(1) A total of five solatium payments were made during the month. Four payments were made to the survivors of four Vietnamese boys from the Ngan Cau NLH. These children were killed in the vicinity of a US Marine operation but the exact cause of death could not be determined; therefore payment was made in the best interests of US Forces. A fifth payment was made to the widow of the village chief of Thanh Thuy village, Dien Ban district who was killed during the enemy Lunar New Year offensive. The chief was ambushed and killed while riding a motorcycle in the vicinity of his village. The VC were dressed in ARVN uniforms. This payment was also made in best interest of US Forces.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

a. During the month of February, the Communications Platoon was primarily involved with getting settled in the new battalion area. The Da Nang East Telephone Company relocated 28 dial telephones and provided dial telephone service to most staff sections. The field telephone system was expanded to provide telephone service to subordinate sections as well as the guard positions. Radio Relay was established to provide telephone service and teletype circuits to Regiment. Perimeter lights were installed to illuminate large sectors of the camp perimeter.

b. Radio Section. The section installed additional antennas and radios for the Combat Operations Center and guard bunker. Secure voice radio equipment was introduced into the 81mm mortar net. School was held for the rifle company operators on usage of the authentication and shackle publications. The annual overhaul for all crypto equipment was completed in February.

c. Wire Section. The wire section constructed a new switchboard bunker to house the Battalion switchboard. It was connected to the main telephone frame by a hundred-pair telephone cable. All guard posts telephone circuits were relocated to terminate in the new guard bunker. Two switchboards were installed in the guard bunker to handle the guard traffic. Radio Relay was set up in a tower and connected to the Battalion switchboard by means of a 25 pair cable.

d. Message Center Section. The Battalion Message Center conducted all normal operations in addition to guarding the circuit for Bravo Company, 3d Amphibious Tractor Battalion. The message traffic for the month consisted of 44 outgoing and 670 incoming messages. Due to power fluctuations causing equipment breakdown and teletypewriter breakdown, the total downtime for the month was 21 hours.

e. Engineer Equipment Section. The generator section installed 18 perimeter lights around the Battalion perimeter. The section assisted in maintaining and installing electrical wiring for the camp and assisted in wiring the laundry unit for operation. An electrical survey was completed for locating two large camp generators in the command post in preparation for the Navy Transmitter Facility's move in March.

f. Electronic Maintenance Section. The technician shop maintained normal repair and maintenance of electronic equipment. The quarterly preventive maintenance of electronic equipment was completed on the majority of radio equipment. The following equipment was repaired during the month:

## 9. MEDICAL AND DENTAL

a. The Battalion Surgeons are Lt J. R. WITTEKINDT, MC USNR and Lt R. D. COX III, MC USNR. The Battalion Chief is HMC G. L. ADAMS, USN.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated 270 patients during the month of February. Entomologists from the Division Preventive Medicine Unit surveyed the area and found no significant sanitation defects. Routine monthly sanitation inspections of all Battalion outlying areas were made and recommendations for correction of discrepancies were made. There are no major sanitation problems at this time.

c. Analysis of routine treatments revealed 44 cases of upper respiratory infection, nine cases of diarrhea, 28 cases of foot disorders, 31 cases of dermatology problems, two cases of venereal disease. There were two cases of Flu, no new cases of malaria, and no new cases of Hepatitis. There were 154 patients treated for miscellaneous problems at routine sick call. There were 116 Dental patients seen.

d. Analysis of mortality figures reveal one USMC KIA, no USMC DOW, eight USMC WIA, six USMC NBC's, two USMC WIANE's, one USMC DAI. There were no USN casualties.

e. The immunization program was adequate; 468 immunizations were given, and 159 Tuberculin tests were given to members of this Battalion.

f. There was an active civilian medical program. There were 496 Vietnamese civilians treated for medical reasons, of which none were combat related injuries. Three Vietnamese civilians were treated for Dental problems.

g. There were seven USMC and three Vietnamese civilians evacuated for medical reasons.

### 10. CHAPLAIN

a. During the month of February, the 1st Marines was assigned a new Regimental Chaplain. Cdr Charles Koyser, USN, replaced Chaplain William Fuller who is now the Assistant Division Chaplain.

b. Approximately 48 Marines were counselled by Chaplain J. M Gnall, the Battalion Chaplain. 12 Visits were made to the area hospitals and three visits to the Brig. Eight Marines were assisted in obtaining Health and Welfare reports regarding their relatives and six were assisted in making emergency MARS calls.

c. The Chaplain also held a Memorial Service for the CAP Marines of GACO 2-7 who were recently killed in action. This service was held at the request of the Company Commander and 30 of their personnel were in attendance.

d. Three lectures on personal response were given to incoming personnel. The Chaplain also made visits to all the companies which were out in the field.

e. Two hundred gift packages were received through the Division Chaplain's Office and released to this Battalion for distribution among the troops in the field. Some 100 toy dogs were sent to the Chaplain's Office by a Catholic Church Group for distribution among the Vietnamese children.

f. Chaplain Gnall also offered a Byzantine Liturgy, during the monthly Day of Recollection for Chaplains, at St. John's Seminary in Danang. Some 35 Chaplains were in attendance.

- 4 Feb 70 - 0020 - Company H loc BT071702 on 040020H. While in ambush position engaged one VC/NVA with small arms fire wounding him in the left leg. Searched area finding 23 individual wrapped rolls of cooked rice. VC/NVA had a Vietnamese ID card saying he was 45 years of age. NPFF said he was VC/NVA and had come down from the caves for food. NPFF interrogated him with negative results, they will continue interrogation in the morning. Detainee did not require evacuation.
- 1317 - Echo 31 loc BT087687 on 041210H. While squad was on routine patrol detected an 82mm mortar round lying on trail. Ordnance was not booby trapped. Destroyed ordnance with 1/2 pound of C-4.
- 5 Feb 70 - 1320 - Fox 2 loc BT034677 on 051200H. Platoon while on routine patrol, checked ID cards of five Vietnamese with negative results. Fifty meters down the trail observed one Vietnamese male with weapon. Ordered individual to halt, when he started running, unit engaged suspect with small arms fire but lost contact in heavy brush. Platoon searched area where suspect was last seen finding three bunkers, one 3'x6'x4' the second 12'x3'x4' and the third was 6'x3' with no roof. Bunkers were reinforced with brick and bamboo. Detained one Vietnamese female age 45 and found three documents which will be turned over to ITT. Bunkers were blown with five pounds of C-4.

The bunkers were reinforced with dirt and had brick entrances. Destroyed all bunkers with five pounds of C-4.
- 7 Feb 70 - 0711 - Echo 31 loc BT081678 on 062140H. While squad was setting up ambush position, detected one booby trap. Booby trap consisted of one 105mm round using two trip wires to detonate ordnance. Will destroy booby trap at first light.

Fired two small arms rounds and subject fell to the ground. Swept area finding one Vietnamese male wounded in left side. Requested Company H give assistance to medevac individual. Completed medevac by air.
- 1210 - Echo 31 loc PT084683 on 131130H. While squad was on routine patrol detected one booby trap beside a trail. Booby trap consisted of one can of C-4 mounted on two 10' logs using a pull friction fuse for detonation. Destroyed ordnance in place with 1/2 pound of C-4.
- 1800 - Echo 22 loc PT093662 on 131300H. Follow up spot report on Echo 22 102230H by ITT. Reliable Vietnamese source reported that three VC were wounded in Echo 22 action of 102230H and were in a bunker in the vicinity of PT093662. Directed S-2 to find out more details and inform 2/7.
- 14 Feb 70 - 2121 - Echo 31 loc PT085678 on 142015H. While enroute to ambush site received enemy small arms fire. Engaged enemy with small arms fire and requested 105mm artillery and 81mm mortar illumination. Swept through area with negative results.

1100 - 5th Battalion ROKMC loc PT097643 on 281035H. While on joint operation with Company F, 25th Company, 5th ROKMC observed two VC/NVA hiding in reeds along a lake. ROKMC engaged enemy with small arms fire. Subsequent search of killing zone revealed two VC/NVA KIA's and one .45 Cal submachine gun. Weapon was turned into ROKMC Headquarters.
