



#### 2. ENDAY, MEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. General. Enemy activity this reporting period was concentrated in the first third of the month and showed a sharp rise in rocket and mortar attacks as well as continued pressure on GWN pacification efforts. On the morning of the first, Camp Lauer received 10 - 82mm mortar rounds and T-1 Combined Unit Pacification Program Compound received 10 - 60mm mortar rounds. Also on the morning of the first, six or seven rockets were fired from ETO83652 on the Da Nang area. On the night of the second, an unknown number of rockets were launched from vic Liem Lac (1) BTO29685. Again on the fifth and eighth, rocket launchings were observed in the early morning hours; five at ETO52722 and one at AT982675 respectively.

On 6 April, VC terrorists at Ngan Cau New Life Hamlet executed an 18 year old VN nurse who refused to go with them, and then, during the early morning hours of the tenth approximately 30 VC entered Ngan Cau and Tu Cau New Life Hamlets and destroyed 70% and 30% of the homes respectively. This was followed by an attack by fire on the 134th RF compound by approximately 20 VC shortly after midnight on the eleventh.

Other enough activity consisted of booby traps being set around. PPB sites and commonly used patrol routes compled with continual harassment at ambush and harbor sites.

On 13 April, eight VN children detonated a N-26 booby trap they had just set. Five were WIA and evacuated; three were detained and sent to ITT. Under interrogation they admitted to having set many booby traps in the Tra line limitet area. Since this incident, booby trap incidents in this area have dropped off sharply.

#### d. Weather and Terrain

- (1) Weather. This reporting period the average high temperature was 90° degrees and the average low temperature 73° degrees, with the average humidity being 77%. The skies were mostly clear with 1.47 inches of rain and wind was mainly from the northeast at six to twelve knots.
- (2) Torrain. The termain is flat and sandy, with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines. There are two main water transportation routes, the Song Vinh Dien in the east and the Song Yen in the west. In addition, there are numerous lakes, pends and paddies where beat traffic is heavy.

Allied observation of possible enomy infiltration routes is excellent due to land clearing and flat, open, paddy areas in approximately 60% of the TAOR. The other how of the area, particularly in the western portion, offers considerable concealment due to thick vegetation and treelines.

#### 3. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

#### a. Operations

- (1) Mission. The 2d Pattalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:
- (a) Conduct unilateral, joint and combined offensive operations to locate and destroy enemy forces and logistic installations.
- (b) To locate and costroy enemy bases within the TAOR which pose a threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers.

(c) To doploy forces throughout the assigned TAOR and to provide defense of the Da Nang vital area and military complex, with emphasis on routes of approach to probable rocket/mortar launch positions, to include waterways.

## (2) Operations

- (a) The concept of operations within the TAOR is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrol/ambush activity within their respective area of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalian TAOR.
- (b) Local operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and liaison with Vietnamese Military and Civilian Officials who supply information of Viet Cong activity. This information coupled with extensive usage of aerial observers (AO) communicating with maneuver forces on the ground, produced significant results.
- (c) On 3 April, Company "F" and the 591st RF conducted a joint two day operation resulting in two VC/NVA KIA.
- (d) On 7 April, one plateon from Company "E" with the 1/34th RF Group participated in a joint operation in the Nui Kim Son (DT072703) area.
- (a) On 10 April, Company "H" conducted a cordon and search of Xom Son Thuy (BT081711) fishing village.
- (f) On 11 April, Company "H" initiated Riverine Operations along the Song Vien Dinh. A thorough search of the river and both banks was conducted. Company "H" continued Riverine Operations through 2h April, shifting search operations to the Song Yen on 16 April.
- (g) On 16 April, 2d Battalion assumed responsibility for the area West from the Song Yon bounded on the West by Route 540, South by the Da Nang Barrier and North by the Song Cau Do from 1st Battalion, 1st Marines relinquishing responsibility for the TMOR extension on 28 April.
- (h) On 17 April Company "E" conducted a joint day operation with the 111th and 170th RF Companies in the area of Tra Khe (1) (BT090670).
- (i) On 27 April, companies "I" and "M", 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines were chopped operational control to 2d Battalien for the duration of the current high threat period, a period of about two weeks.
- (j) On 28 April, Company "H" initiated joint operations with the 593rd and 59hth RF Companies in the area immediately West of the Song Vien Dinh for the duration of the high threat period.

(k) On 29 April, 2d Inttalion adopted the "Night Hawk" package for use within its TAOR. The package consists of a CH-46 equipped with a Might Observation Decree and two .50 Caliber machinegums. The CH-46 is assisted by two Cobra gunships which provide immediate responsive firepower. The primary massion of the "Night Hawk" is to interdict enemy movement within the rocket and mortar belts, and also to provide rapid response to enemy sightings and or rocket/mortar firing.

#### b. Training

- (1) Training consists of Orientation for replacement personnel, refresher training as required for all personnel and attendance at formal schools.
  - (2) The orientation course is broken down as follows:
- (a) 5 day course. Designated for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Victnem.
- (b) 3 day course. Designated for replacement personnel joining this Battalion from other "in country" commands. This training is geared to unique requirements relevant to this TAOR.
- (c) Refresher course. Designated for personnel who need instruction on a specific subject or bank of subjects.
- (3) Formal and semi-formal schooling is conducted by 1st Marinos and 1st Marine Division.
- (4) The Dattalion orientation course includes the following subjects: MPC and Piaster sponding, Pay and Illowances, Energoncy Leave, Record of Emergency Inta, Evac/Casualty, CAP Program, R&R, Postal Regulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Roligions based on Customs of Vietnam, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/MVA Mission, TAOR/Woather, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rewards Program, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromises, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Pasic Map Reading and Aerial Photos, Password and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Mavigation, Employment of Snipors, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rulos of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Domolitions and Destruction of Booby Traps, Booby Trap Lane, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Viotnamese Customs/Porsonal Response, Chicu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vietnamoso Poople, Conduct/Attitude toward Vietnamuse Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Aroas, Prostitution, Marcotics, Alcohol, Legal Assistance, Accidental Dischargos, Loss of Weapons, Duddy Aid, Heat Cosualties, Personal Mygiene,

Proventive Medicine, Venereal Disease, Anti-Malaria Heasures, Military Decorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, 60mm mortar, Claymore Mines, Grenade Safety and M-67 Fragmentation Grenade, M-16Al Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalian Range Regulations, FAM Firing, Zeroing Weapons and Quick Fire/Quick Kill,

d. On April 5 and 6 1970, Division Mobile Training Team conducted a two day class on the XM-191 Weapons System. This course was attended by (1) Officer, (4) SNCO's and (15) Enlisted men from this Battalion. Presently, the Battalion has three such weapons for its operational use.

# 4. ARTILLERY AND FIRE SUPPORT

- a. Fire support was provided by Battery A and Batte y P, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery F, 2d Battalion, 11th Marines; and Battery C and Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines.
- b. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in direct support of the 1st Marines during the entire month with Battery B co-located with 2d Battalien, 1st Marines.
- c. 109 observed missions were fired, 28 of which were contact illumination missions fired in support of units initiating ambushes, and detecting confirmed movement. Harassment and interdiction fires totaled lift targets. These targets were planned on suspected enemy assembly areas, avenues of approach, and known bunker areas. The total expenditure of 105mm high explosive ammunition fired was 6,984 rounds. 651 105mm illumination rounds and 87 white phosphorus rounds were also fired.

- d. The 81mm mortar plateon fired a total of 19 missions in support of plateon and squad size activities engaged with the enemy. 61 harassment and interdiction missions were fired within the TAOR. There was an expenditure of 45h high exclusive rounds, 61 white phosphorus rounds and 1,290 illumination rounds. At least two 61mm mortar sections were located in the Cump Lauer Combas Dase (ETO31703) at all times during the month.
- e. Due to civilian population concentration and ARVM activities, fires are restricted to several distinct areas. The areas are Cam Sa (1) (BTOSh6h4), Cam Sa (2) (BTO6O6h3), La Bong (AT962673), and An Trach (AT960650). On occasion, clearance was received for the North central and Northwestern sectors of the TACR which consists of thick tree limes and rice paddy areas, affording excellent assembly areas for the enemy. Both observed missions and harasement and interdiction fires were directed into those areas upon clearance.

#### 5. AIR SUPPORT

a. In April, the Battalian's usage of air support was considerably more extensive than in previous menths. In addition to the usual resupply missions, medical evacuations, aerial observation, reconneissance missions, and tactical troop lifts, the Battalian utilized fixed wing jet air strikes. Other fixed wing support consisted of flareships and AC-119 "Shadow" gunships. A special helicopter "Night Hawk" package, consisting of two Cobra gunships and a specially equipped CH-46 with night observation device and zeon light, used to detect enemy movement at night, was utilized by the Battalian for the first time on the night of 29 April. The package is in the early stages of development and more extensive usage by the Battalian is anticipated.

Helicopters were derived from Marine Air Group 16; OV-10 observation aircraft from Marine Air Group 11; fixed wing aircraft from Marine Air Group 13; and other fixed wing aircraft such as flaroships and infrared detection aircraft from USAF.

b. The Battalien had 58 medical evacuations which totaled 81 personnel evacuated. There were 34 emergency U.S., 17 priority U.S., six routine U.S., one KIA U.S., 13 emergency civilian, four priority civilian, three emergency RVN, two priority RVN and one emergency VC/NVA.

The shortest delay for an emergency mission was 10 minutes while one hour and 30 minutes was the longest delay, for an average time of 25 minutes per mission.

- o. There were 300 sorties of resupply flown which included 160,572 pounds of resupply and 163 passengers.
- d. The Battalien utilized 42 aerial observation and recommaisance missions with a total time on station of 36 hours and 53 minutes.
- o. The Battalion had six tactical troop lifts, totaling 730 passongers.
- f. The Battalion utilized three close air support sorties, with a total of 15,000 pounds of ordnance.

- g. Ten flareship sorties were utilized with a total of 340 flares dispensed and 18 hours 57 minutes on station.
- h. The Dattelion utilized two "Stadow" mireraft for a total of 13,500 rounds 7.62 expended, and three hear. 35 minutes on station.

#### 6. LOGISTICS AND SURRLY

#### a. Logistics

- (1) During April, resupply of operating units was accomplished by helicopters, trucks and "Huskies". On 27 April 1970, Companies I and M 3rd Eattalien, 7th Marines were chopped operational control to 2d Battalien, thus increasing resupply requirements. Resumply amounted to 300 helo-lifts for a total weight of 460,672 pounds.
- (2) The work order for 18 Sea Huts for the 81mm mortar plateen and Battery "E" was completed.
- (3) The work order for the leach field for the officers mess was completed, as was the work order for the partition for two generators.
- (4) Work order number 395-70 to repair the four leach fields for the Dattelion showers has been assigned to the 1st Engineer Battalion.
- (5) Nork order number 302-70, repairs to COC bunker is assigned to 1st Engineer Eattelion and is pending the arrival of air conditioners to air condition the COC.

## b. Motor Transport

- (1) The overall deadline rate for the motor transport section is 15%, this is an increase of 1% over last menth. The increased deadline rate was anticipated and is attributed to our present geographical location.
- (2) The current maintenance problem is with the M274A2 mechanical mule. Clutch and transmission wear on the mule, due to sandy, hilly terrain, is the leading maintenance problem. With the large contenement and current construction projects, a large number of flat tires are occuring. Tire tubes have been on order for quite some time, but as yet have not been received, the problem becoming more critical as more tires become unserviceable due to repeated punctures. Also, the sand works as an abrasive, causing quicker wear on brake shees.
- (3) Two MISIAL's are currently at FSR. One for a transmission and the other for a new oil pan. One additional MISIAL is on second echolon deadline for brake replacement. Eight 127hA2 "mechanical mules" are presently on deadline. Four for third echelon WORM and four for second echolon WORS. One MITHL is deadlined for third echelon NORM.

- (4) T/E deficioncios are as follows:
  - (a) two M2714A2 ton.
  - (b) one MB7RL 3/l, ton,

#### c. Supply

- (1) Additional mount-out boxes have been constructed for use in the warehouse. These boxes will provide a substantial increase in embarkation-ready storage facilities.
- (2) All unserviceable tentage has been coded and disposed of. Serviceable tents are being boxed in preparation for turn-in or permanent storage.
- (3) Battalion Supply is continually reporting and disposing of excess major and items. There are currently seven items of communication gear awaiting disposition instructions.
- (4) The outside storage lot is being established. Now boxes have been waterproofed and are being packed and marked. Any unserviceable gear found in the process is being delivered to Salvage Plateon, heree Logistics Command. Unserviceable boxes are being disposed of.

#### d. Financial Status

(1) Total SFA obligations for the month of April were \$30,562.14. Total ASA obligations were \$19.492.72.

#### 7. CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

a. Public Works. The month of April was a busy one in the area of public works. For the new dispensary being built in Xuan Tra New-Life Hamlet (NLH), 30 sheets of plywood, 15 bags of coment, 30 2"Xh" boards, and 20 h"Xh" boards were delivered. For a new village toilet and playground in Xuan Tra, 12 sheets of plywood, 25 bags of cement, 30 sheets of tin, 30 2"Xh" boards, 20 2"X10" boards, and 3 h"Xh" boards was distributed. Five truck loads of wood and 96 sheets of salvaged tin were also taken to Xuan Tra for use in building 10 new houses for 35 relocated families moving to Xuan Tra from Ngan Cau NLH.

DECLASSIFIED Enclosuro (1) To reconcile damage done by an orratic artillory round that went through the roof of a house in Phong Nam, 25 bags of cement, 2 sheets of plywood, 15 2"Xh" boards and 2 8"X8" boards were acquired and delivered.

b. Welfare. During the month of April, a total of 16,500 piasters was paid out for local hire under Assistance in Kind (AIK) employment fund.

The pig project in Hoa Hai Villago is still doing well with plans being made for the purchase of more pigs.

VC terrorism accounted for a great dual of destruction in the New Life Hamlets of Ngan Cau and Tu Cau. However, the people are remaining in the village's and with GVN help are rebuilding.

- c. Education. Eighty General Walt scholarships have been distributed to the schools in this area. Thirty have gone to the students of Cau Nam school and fifty to the students of Xuan Tra school which was finished last month and began holding classes this month.
- d. Health. To aid in health improvement in the New Life Hamlots, excess food from the Battalion Messhall is distributed from time to time. Five cases of yeal and a case and one-half of fish went to Fan Lun this month.

A daily modeap is carried on in the S-5 office treating a total of 140 people this last month. McdCaps held in Tan Luu, Mgan Cau NLH, and Tu Cau NLH treated a total of 190 people. McdCaps conducted by the PolMar team used in our area treated a total of 1,210 people. There were also six dental cases and 21 people mcdevaced to hospitals.

The village nursing program suffered a severe set back with the assassination of the nurse in Ngan Cau NLN by the VC, and their intimidating the nurse in Tu Cau NLN into quitting. It is anticipated that the nursing program in these hamlets will be renewed before long.

e. Agriculture. The pig project in Kunn Tre MLH is still doing well using food scraps from the messhall as well as 500 pounds of corn obtained from G-5. Buying more pigs is plenned for the near future.

Also about two dozen picks and hoes were distributed among the people for forming use.

f. Social. Three major social functions were attended this month. A Thanksgiving type dinner was given in Xuan Tra. Chief Trinh of Hoa Hai village held a party for officers and staff NCO's of this battalion and there was also a memorial dinner held in Nui Kim Son for one of the Battalion's employees who died as a result of an accident.

g. Socurity. About 3000 sandbags and a case of illumination pop-ups was given the two Revolutionary Development forces in Xu.m Tra for building defensive bunker position around the perimeter of the handet.

The 759th RF Company replaced the 105th as security forces for the Ngan Cau - Tu Cau area.

h. Solutium. It is noted with regret that the rate of serious incidents involving Marines and Vietnamese increased sharply this last menth. A total of 19,000 piasters was paid out for incidents resulting in three Vietnamese deaths and four injuries.

i. Personal Response. A total of 27 new personnel were given an indestribution brief covering the many facets of Civil Affairs and Personal Response. Information booklets were distributed to the companies and sections concerning "pacification" and Viotnamese religions.

A De Nang Culture Tour lesting about six hours was taken by 40 personnel from this Battalion. Visited were religious sarines and temples, mesoums, and a children's orphanege. The response was excellent and another tour is scheduled for the coming month.

#### 8. COMMUNICATIONS

- a. During the month of April, the Communications Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications facilities for the Eattalian. Maximum effort was made in preparation for the Command Material Management Inspection which is scheduled for May. A proliminary CMII was conducted by the Division inspecting term on 13 April and all sections since that time have been correcting the discrepancies.
- b. Radio Relay Section. The Radio Relay Section improved the installation and operation of the radio relay shot to 1st Marines via Hill 327. The system realized no more than 1% downtime as a result. The antenna was stablized and more reliable equipment and cables have been implemented into the system.
- c. Radio Section. The Radio Section continued to function in support of the Lattalian providing and maintaining all radio nots and support systems. A large number of excess equipment was turned in for disposition through the supply system. A new preventive maintenance system was introduced and all radio equipment scheduled for quarterly preventive maintenance. A MRC-123 radio jeep was received for the older MRC-83. Five radio operators were sent to 1st Marines for schooling on the AN/PCC-VCC radio equipment.
- d. Wire Section. In addition to propering for the upcoming CMM, the Wire Section concentrated on improving the existing wire system within the Eattalian. A new wire office and work shop was constructed in the Communications Platean area greatly facilitating the wire operation. Several new terminal boxes were constructed and installed to facilitate the maintenance of telephone lines. One wireman completed the Cable Splicing School at Long Binh, and other wireman have attended classes on cable color coding, pole climbing, and wire laying.

- conducted all normal operations during April. The message traffic for the month consisted of 655 incomer and 30 outgoing. The total downtime for the teletype circuit in the let Narines and this Battalien was 43 hours due mainly to the downage of the radio relay system and the heat conditions in the message center. A COMTAC publications inspection was conducted by Division and a grade of satisfactory was received.
- f. Electronics Maintenance Section. For the month of April, the Tech Shop concentrated mainly on preparing for the CMM. The support publications were inventoried and placed on order. In addition to normal repair operations, 2d echelon preventive maintenance was accomplished on a large number of communication equipment and radio vehicles. During April the following equipment was repaired:

#### 9. MEDICAL AND DESTAL

- a. The Battalion Surgeon is I. R. VICTEXINDT, MC, USNR. The Battalion Chief Hospital Corpsnan is HMC. MMS, USN. During this period the Battalion Aid Station had approximately two officers (one Medical Corps and one Cheplain Corps) and 54 enlisted in the field and in garrison.
- b. The Battalien Aid Station treated 850 patients during the month of April. Entemologists from the Division Preventive Medicine Unit surveyed the area and found no significant sanitation defects. Routine monthly sanitation inspections of all outlying areas were made, and recommendations to correct the discrepancies were submitted. There were n major sanitation problems at this time.
- c. Analysis of routine treatments revealed 57 cases of diarrhea, seven cases of upper respiratory infection, eight cases of foot disorders, 18 cases of skin disorders, 21 cases of 6. C., 11 cases of fever of undotormined origin, and no new cases of malaria. There were no new cases of hepatitis. There were 721 patients treated for miscellaneous problems at routine sick call. There were 145 cental patients seen.
- d. Analysis of mortality figures reveal four USMC KIA, two USMC DOW, 33 USMC WIA, 15 USMC NBC's, and one USMC DAI. There were no USM casualities.
- e. The immunization program was adequate: 334 immunizations and 84 Tuborculin tests were given to members of this Battalion.
- f. There was an active civilian medical program. There were 597 Vietnamese civilians treated for medical reasons, of which II were combat related injuries. Six Vietnamese civilians were treated for dental problems.
- g. There were 20 USMC (seven from Stack Arms) and 21 Vietnamese civilians evacuated for medical reasons.

#### 10. CHAPLIAN

- a. During the month of April, the Battalion Chaplain conducted 21 services with approximately 355 personnel in attendance. Protestant coverage was extended to Marines of the Battalion by the Regimental Chaplain both in the field and in the rear. Catholic coverage is now being extended by the Battalion Chaplain to the mon of 3d Battalion, 1st Marines.
- b. A total of 11 visits were made between the 1st Medical Battalian and NSA hospitals and four visits were made to the Division Drig. Six Marines were assisted in obtaining Health and Welfare Reports on their femilies and ten were assisted in placing emergency Mars calls. The Chaplain also counselled a total of 76 Marines and delivered two lectures on Personal Response.

- c. Five boxes of toys and 600 bars of seap were distributed to the children of Sacred Heart Orphange.
- d. The Chaplain also conducto. A Battalion Momorial Service for Li Marines who died while in the service of their country. Approximately 150 Marines were in attendance including the Battalian Jammander and the Executive Officer. A Mamorial Service was also conducted for Marines that are attached to CACO 27 with 36 personnel in attendance.

Two VC/NVA were observed running into treeline as unit assaulted treeline; action resulting in two VC/NVA KIA's, one AK-h7, two NVA ponchos, one harmock and a black list of VC in villages, and a list of names, assorted clothing, one NVA uniform, two Chi-coms and food stuffs. All gear turned into 59th RF Battalion.
- 1805 Fox 1 loc AT982675 on 031805H. While platoon was in their daytime PPB site, they received one incoming M-79 round from approximately 100 meters away, resulting in three USMC WIA's. Area of contact was swept with negative results, medevac completed by air.
- 1845 Fox I loc AT982676 on 031845H. While unit was in pursuit of sniper, individual tripped one booby trap. Believed to be can of C-4 with trip wire. No casualties resulted.

- 2300 Fox 31 loc BTO13662 on 202300H. While squad was set in ambush position, they came under small arms fire from VC/NVA to their Southeast. Unit returned fire with small arms and M-79 fire. 105mm and 60mm illumination was called in and a sweep of area resulted in the finding of one VC/NVA female. KIA. Approximately 19-25 years of age.
- 21 Apr 70 0630 Company G loc AT975671 on 210630H. While unit was conducting sweep operation, a sandbag was uncovered containing assorted items of clothing, medical gear, documents and one M-26 grenade. Upon further sweep of area, a tunnel 5'x2'x2' was uncovered at grid AT978673. While unit continued to sweep, grid AT977674, an individual tripped a booby trap. No casualties resulted. Booby trap consisted of a 60mm round with trip wire and delay fuse. Tunnel was destroyed with C-4. Cache will be brought to command post.
  - 0720 Hotel 3 loc AT957693 on 210720H. Vietnamese child brought in one 82mm round with .50 cal. round at base. Child was paid 500 piasters for ordnance. Ordnance was destroyed with C-4.
  - GOOS Golf 1 loc AT978675 on 210805H. While unit was conducting sweep of an area, an individual tripped a booby trap resulting in two USMC WIA's. Booby trap consisted of a can filled with C-4 and rocks with a trip wire. Medevac was completed by air.
  - 0930 Echo 3 loc BT068682 on 210900H. Datween the hours of 0900H and 0930H, two booty traps were tripped by Vietnamese civilians. One civilian was injured in each explosion. Echo 3 gave medical assistance. Medevac was completed by air.

- 22 Apr 70 1400 Echo 21 loc BT084648 on 221400H. While squad was on routine patrol, an individual tripped a booby trap resulting in two USMC WIA's. Booby trap consisted of an M-26 grenade with trip wire. Mine dog team was not with unit. Modevac was completed by air.
  - 170h Golf 11 loc AT977675 on 221700H. While squad was on a routine patrol, a fire was started in a treeline which resulted in one secondary explosion. This area is known to be heavily booby trapped.
  - 1716 Hotel 3 loc AT966695 on 221650H. A Vietnamese child brought in one 105mm round and one M-79 round. Child was paid 500 piasters for ordnance and unit destroyed ordnance with C-4.
  - 1733 Company E loc BT074682 on 221730H. A Viotnamose child brought: in one 105mm round. Child was paid 500 piasters for ordnance. and unit destroyed ordnance with C-4.
  - 1859 Hotel 31 loc AT951687 on 221400H. While squad was on routine patrol, three bunkers were uncovered, two were 6'x3'xix' and one was 12'x3'xix'. One tunnel was also uncovered which produced five Chi-com grenades, two c-ration cans filled with C-4. one RPG round, four dud M-79 rounds and one LAAM, which appeared to be booby trapped. Unit destroyed bunkers, tunnel and ordnance with C-4.
  - 2037 Echo 21 and 111th RF's loc BT085684 on 221800H. Reacting to intelligence supplied by 111th RF Co, Echo 21 and a unit of 111th RF's entered Tan An village and dotained seven Vietnamese females between the ages of 15 and 35 years old. Initial interrogation by RF's disclosed they are possible VC sympathizers and have been with two VC squads in the area. The detainess will be turned over to ITT for further interrogation. Unit is taking up blocking position outside village and will sweep through village at first light.
  - 2345 Golf 33 loc AT976644 on 222345H. While squad was set in ambush site, one VC/NVA was observed moving Southwest into a tree-line approximately 150 meters away. Unit opened fire with M-16, M-60 and M-79 fire. A scarch team checked the kill zone and found one VC KIA 22-23 years old. Also found was one AK-47 with magazine, clothing, a Chi-com grenade and a VC pack. Area was swept again with negative results.



- 23 Apr 70 1255 Echo 3 loc BT07468I on 231240H. A Vietnamese child led unit to the location of a booby trap. Booby trap consisted of an M-26 grenade with trip wire. Child was paid 100 piasters for ordnance and booby trap was destroyed in place with C-4.
- 2h Apr 70 0820 Hotel 31 loc AT952686 on 210510H. While squad was set in ambush site, two VC/NVA were observed approaching ambush site from the South. Squad initiated fire with M-16, M-60 and M-26 grenades. Kill zone was searched with aid of 105mm ill-umination finding an VC/NVA KIA and a heavy blood trail. Squad swept area again with negative results. One AK-47 w/magazines, one M-26 grenade, a U.S. type compass, assorted documents, uniforms and comfort items were found on the VC/NVA KIA.
  - 1117 Golf 21 Toc AT977686 on 211100H. While squad was on routine patrol, a haystack hi wide by 71 high, was found with a hollow center and a hole in the floor large enough to conceal weapons or supplies. A search was conducted with negative results and the haystack was destroyed.
  - 1500 T-2 CUPP loc AT999659 on 2hT500H. While unit was on a daytime patrol, they heard an explosion; upon investigation, it was found that one Vietnemese female had tripped a booby trap. Medevac was completed by air.
  - 2200 T-D CUPP loc AT985657 on 212200H. While PF's were working inside village, they received incoming small arms fire and a grenade resulting in one PF WIA. Medevec was completed by air.
- 25 Apr 70 0530 Hotel 23 loc BT025675 on 250530H. While returning from night activity site, an individual observed a figure rise out of the bushes. He fired at the figure resulting in one Vietnamese female WIA. Medevac was completed by air.
  - 1100 Echo 12 loc BT082619 on 251100H. While squad was on routine patrol, a group of 20 Vietnamese was sighted. Three Vietnamese from this group fled South. Squad fired warning shots and pursued them with negative results. Three Vietnamese females were detained as suspects. Detainees will be turned over to ITT.
  - This Echo 31 loc BTO76668 on 251145H. While squad was on a routine patrol, a bunker 15'x3'z'x2'z' was uncovered. It was reinfored with bricks and timber. Bunker was destroyed with C-4.

- 26 Apr 70 1545 Golf II loc AT978675 on 261545H. While squad was on routine petrof, a mine dog was being used to find a path through a thicket and tripped a booby trap resulting in three USMC WIA's and one mine dog WIA. Booby trap consisted of a M-26 grenzde with trip wire. Medevac was completed by air.
  - 1720 Echo 1 & Echo 3 loc BT0936h3 on 261300H. Echo 1 & Echo 3 reacted to serial observer reports of a bunker complex and many Vietnamese civilians at grid BT0926h8 to BT0936h3. Units swept above area from 261300H to 261700H and detained two Vietnamese males, age 16. Five bunkers were destroyed with C-h. Also found was a bloody shirt.
- 27 Apr 70 2047 Mike Company, 3d Battalion, 7th Marines loc AT979673 on 272000H. While squad was enroute to ambush site, they came to a river and sent out two men to check out bank before crossing. They received one incoming Chi-com grenade. The two men returned to squad and commenced fire with M-60 into susnected area. 60mm illumination was called in and squad swept the area with negative results.
  - 2115 Fox 22 loc BTO47702 on 272115H. While squad was set in ambush site, they had suspected enemy movement 50 to 75 meters from their position. Squad initiated fire with small arms and called for 105mm illumination mission while sweeping area with negative results.
  - 2205 India Company, 3d Battalion, 7th Marines loc BT088657 on 272205H. While Company I was in night position three Chicom grenades were thrown into their position from the West resulting in one USMC WIA. 105mm illumination was called in and area was swept with negative results. WIA will be medevaced at first light.
- 28 Apr 70 1310 Echo 11 BT068679 on 281215H. While squad was on routine prtrol, a small cache of 13 pieces of 782 gear in good condition was uncovered along a trail. Gear was brought to command post.
  - 1345 Echo 1 Toc BT073684 on 281345H. Vietnamese children brought seven M-79 rounds to this position. Ordnance was destroyed with C-4.

- 2225 India 21 3d Battalion, 7th Marines loc BT079657 on 282200H.

  While squad was set in ambush site, an individual observed five to six VC/NVA approximately 75 meters away. Squad cpened fire with small arms and called in 60mm and 105mm illumination. Unit then swept area to East and North. One VC/NVA was seen fleeing South and one to the North, the rest fled Northeast. Unit continued sweep with negative results.
- 29 Apr 70 1030 S-2, CIT and NPFF loc BT060664 on 291030H. A unit from S-2 and CIT combined with a squad of NPFF troops, conducted a search of the above area. 30 Vietnamese civilians were screened with aid of black list with two Vietnamese females ages 16, 33 years old being detained for further interrogation.
  - Thoo Hotel 21 loc BT030690 on 291100H. At 1100 Hours, a gun team of Hotel 21 proceeded to the river to clean up. At 1130 Hours a Marine came to the area and announced that he was going to swim across the river. He then entered the water and a short while later, his cries for help were heard. Upon seeing that the Marine was in trouble, the team entered the water to attempt a rescue. Two men were forced to return to shore, as they were poor swimmers. The third man continued his rescue attempt, but after three attempts were made, he had to return to shore. Further attempts were made to recover the body with negative results. Positive identification was made of the USMC NBC by the man who attempted to save him. Further attempts to recover the body with assistance of an aerial observer are presently continuing.
  - 2015 Mike 3, 3d Battalion, 7th Marines loc AT973653 on 292010H. While unit was setting in ambush site, a 60mm morter position was observed 400 meters to their West. The rounds were impacting approximately 150 meters from Mike 32's site at AT982654. A total of four rounds were fired. A fire mission was called in by the Company M forward observer and the area will be swept at first light.
  - 2307 Company F loc BT039702 on 202215H. While unit was set in command post site, a boat was observed moving from the West bank to the East bank of the river. A second boat was seen shortly thereafter. Unit engaged the boat with 60mm mortar fire and small arms fire resulting in one boat being sunk and the other boat Crifting North around a bend in the river. The area was searched with the assistance of the Night Hawk package with negative findings.



- 30 Apr 70 0950 Mike 31, 3d Battalion, 7th Marines loc AT967652 on 300745H.

  While squad was conducting sweep of area where incoming mortar rounds impacted, a mortar firing position was uncovered; also found were increments and two fuse covers. Unit will change its night acts to cover this area.
  - 1357 Crowsnest loc BT067698 on 301120H. Unit on Crowsnest observed a Vietnamese female throwing grenades at a Vietnamese male who was running East on Binh Ky road. Female stopped throwing grenades when male was out of range. She then moved toward Northwest approximately 25 meters and picked up a bag. Observor on Crowsnest Host sight of her at this time. The male who had fled was then picked up by Vietnamese male on a motor bike. As the two Vietnamese males moved down the road, a shot was heard by Crowsnest and one male was observed falling off the motor bike. He was assisted by the second man and was taken to 2d Battalion, lst Marines DAS. Units from Company F and Company G were alerted. Company F was directed to send a patrol into area.
  - 1130 3rd CIT and CAP 2-7-5 loc BT062698 on 301130H. Follow up spot to Regimental Journal #35 DTG-301120H. Two Vietnamese policemen while riding a motor bike East from Binh Ky Village, were attacked by five VC/NVA, one of which was a female. The VC/NVA attempted the association with the detonation of a claymore mine and three M-26 grenades resulting in the wounding of one policeman. WIA was then medevaced to 2d Battalion, list Marines BAS. A sweep of area resulted in the detaining of four VC suspects. Detainees will be held for further interrogation
