

Morale and Welfare

- (1) The overall morale of the Dattalian is considered to be excollent. In addition to the recreation and rest programs available to all Marines in Vietnam, the Battalien maintains an enlisted club with a large outdoor theatre which hosts frequent USO shows. High on the list of favorite postimes is an outstanding beach with facilities for cookovies. The Special Services program is active providing nightly movies, a weight room, a reading room and equipment for sporting activities. The TX facilities include a Marine Corps exchange, laundry, photo and sift shops. This contorment has a mosshall which officiently foods 600 men three hot meals daily.
- (2) The morale in the field is also considered excellent. Each Company has recently completed 48 hours at "Stack Arms" Res Center. In addition the Battelion employs a standown program whereby a plateen can periodically spend one full day in the Dattelion Canterment and utilizing the Battalien beach area, post exchange and MINE calls facilities.

PARTILII 1...SECTION B ENEMY. WEATHER AND TERRATH

- 1. Enemy. Enemy initiated activity was concentrated in the first third of the month. During the entire reporting period, there were seventeen exchanges of fire, of which six were nighttime harassment maneuvers initiate by the enemy. Five of these occurred on or before the 11th of the month. There were no daytime incidents initiated by the enemy.
- a. The only mortar attack occured shortly after midnight on the hth and consisted of 10-12 82mm rounds fired at MAG-16. The only significant incident occuring in the latter part of the month was a rocket firing, again shortly after midnight, of 10-12 rockets on the 20th. This incident took place at peak lunar illumination and perhaps shows that the enemy is willing to risk movement under this condition rather than have to conswith increased patrolling and security measures initiated by FLORE drying "high threat" periods which generally coincide with low lunar illumination.
- b. In general, enemy activity has shown a decrease for each of the lest several reporting periods. This may be because the enemy believes his efforts will be more fruitful during and after the anticipated Marine withdrawal. Also, he may be effected by the recent operations in Cambodia which means that he may have to make present munitions and stores last longer than originally anticipated. The finding of 57 82mm rounds by CIT on the 2d of the month has further depleted his ready munitions supply.
- c. Finally, the VIP Fund Program in which Viotnamese civilians turn in ordnance and enoug weaponry to Marine units, has been a tremendous success in the TAOR. During the past menth, a total of \$105,500 VM-piasters have been paid out for ordnance. Selected items turned in as follows; the M-26's, 69 Chi-com groundes, 11 containers filled with C-4, the 105mm HE rounds, 13 81mm HE rounds, 19 60mm HE rounds, 35 M-79 rounds, Oh Chaymeres, 10 Too Poppers, 11 homomade mines with electrical blasting caps, 1 concussion grounde, 1 pressure type booby trap and 13 hell boxes.




4. Weather and Torrain

- a. Monther. The average high temperature was 94 degrees and the average low temperature was 76 degrees, with the average hundrity being 77%. The weather in the latter part of the month was characterized by heavy chowers in the lattermoon and early evening resulting in a total reinfall of 4:73 inches.
- b. Terrain. The terrain in the 2d Battalian, 1st Marines TAOR is flat and sandy, with rice paddies and scattered broken treclines. There are two main water transportation routes, the Vinh Dien River in the east and the Yen River in the west. In addition, there are numerous lakes and pends and paddies where beat traffic is heavy.

Allied observation of possible enemy infiltration routes is excellent due to land clearing and flat, open packy areas in approximately 60% of the TAOR. However, the vegetation has grown back in many of the land cleared areas and is providing more cover and concealment for the enemy. The other 10% of the area, particularly in the western TAOR, offers considerable concealment due to thick vegetation and treelines.

PART II SECTION C OPERATIONS.

1. Operations

- a. Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:
- (1) Conduct unilateral, joint and combined offensive operations to locate and destroy enemy forces and logistic installations.
- (2) To locate and destroy enemy bases within the TAOR which pose a threat to GVM control of important population and economic conters.
- (3) To deploy forces throughout the assigned TAOR and to provide defense of the Da Mang vital area and military complex, with emphasis on routes of approach to probable rocket/mortar launch positions, to include waterways.

b. Operations

- (1) The overall concept of operations within the TAOR is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrol/ambash activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalian TAOR.
- (2) During June, the concept of daytime operations changed significantly as the Battalien initiated the use of observation posts manned by rifle squads and sniper teams on significant pieces of terrain throughout the TAON. This change not only increased cognizance of many densely vegetated areas but also decreased the number of Marine booby trap casualties.
- (3) Local operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and limison with Vietnamose Military and Civilian Officials who supply information of Viet Cong activity. This information coupled with extensive usage of aerial observers (10) communicating with maneuver forces on the ground, produced significant results.
- (4) On 3 June, the Battalion assumed OTCOF of Company "I" 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines for the duration of the high threat period. On 8 June, Company "I" was released from OPCON of 2d Battalion and returned to their parent unit.
- (5) Consistent with the Battalion mission, Rocon Divers were used twice during the month to search the banks of the Vinh Dien River within the Battalien's TAOR and also to search various lakes within the Eastern portion of the TAOR. On the latter occasion, PBN's were used in conjunction with the divers to facilitate security and movement along the river.

- (6) On 6 June, Company "H" (-) participated in a sembined corden sweep operation with the 592nd NF Company, 59th NF Battalien in the Phong Lo (1) area (17994698) resulting in two detainess and numerous documents captured.
- (7) Deginning on 11 June, the rifle companies of the Battalian attended Stack Arms completing the cycle on 22 June. During this period the TLOR was successfully maintained with the three remaining rifle companies.
- (3) On 15 June, a two day continued operation with the 5th Bette low.

 2nd ROKMC Brigado and Company "F" (-) was initiated along the communi
 REK/USIC border. Company "F" supplied the blocking force as the ROKMC
 swept to the North. The operation resulted in 27 VC/NVA KIA, 03 individual
 weapons captured, Ol crew served weapon captured and 92 people detained.
- (9) Company "E" with tanks, hydrios and CIT attached conducted a cordon and swoop operation in the vic BT082655, on 16 June, detaining a total of seven personnel.
- (10) On 19 June, Company "H" (-) in conjunction with CAP 2-7-8 and the 306th AF Company cordoned and searched Tu Cau New Life Herslet (BTC51657) detaining so on personnel. Also, on the same day, Company "F" participated in a combined operation with the 591st RF Company in the Dueng Song (2-3) area (AT995675) resulting in four detainers.
- (11) On 22 June, 2d Battalion (-), the 25th and 27th Companies 5th Battalion, 2d ROKMC Brigado, and 1 Platoon 170th MF Company participated in a two day joint operation along the common border (BT0736hh) resulting in seven personnel d taimed and thirty-four well constructed bunkers destroyed.
- (12) On 26 June, Secretary of the Navy Chafee visited 2d Battalion Command Post receiving a thorough briefing on the tactical situation within the TAOR and also an indestribution on booby traps including a practical application sassion in the Battalian's Booby Trap Lance
- (13) Anticipating a new high throat period, Company "K" 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines was passed OPCON to 2d Battalien on 29 June.
- (1h) A long range combat patrol inherent to the Battalien initiated operations this month after an extensive/intensive training currictly was completed. The unit was task organized with a specific pre-emptive mission to work in these areas where allied activities were minimal and intelligence reversed evidence of enemy activity.

2. Air Support

a. In the month of June, the Dattalien's air support was less than in previous months, although still significantly high. In addition to the normal resupply missions, medical evacuations, aerial observers, reconsissance missions, and tactical troop lifts, the Dattalien also utilized AC-119 "Shadow" flare/gun aircraft, and flareships on numerous occasions.

Helicopters were obtained from Marine Air Group 16; OV-10 serial observation aircraft from Marine Air Group 11; and other fixed wing support such as floroships and "Shadow" floro/gun aircraft from the Air Porce.

b. The Battalion had 30 medical evacuations in June totalling 59 personnel evacuated. There were 23 emergency U.S., 17 priority U.S., seven routine U.S., one routine killed in action U.S., two emergency civilians, one routine civilian, two emergency Regional Force Soldiers, three priority Regional Force Soldiers, one routine Regional Force Soldier, one routine killed in action Regional Force Soldier and one emergency VC/NVA.

The shortest colay for an emergency mission was ten minutes with the langest being 50 minutes, for an average time of 15 minutes per mission.

- c. There were 288 resupply serties flown totalling his,970 pounds of cargo and 320 passengers carried.
- d. The Battalion utilized 11 normal observation aircraft and 53 visual reconsissance helicopter missions.
- o. Fifton troop lifts were completed, for both "Stack Arms" and tactical purposes, amounting to 69 serties with 1840 passengers moved in support of the Battalien. I69 of the total were moved in conjunction with a Battalien size joint operation with the 5th Battalien, 2d ROKAC Brigage on 22 June. One close air support sertie was flown, dropping a total of 3000 pounds of napalm and 3000 pounds of "Snake Eye" on a active bunker complex destroying 80% of same.
- f. Five flareships nero utilized with a total of 252 flares expended over a period of 11 hours and 14 minutes for CAP and Echo Company units in contact.
- g. Other fixed wing support consisted of three AC-119 "Snadow" flare/gun missions, for a total of four hours and 47 minutes on station. Two missions were fired in support Echo Company, 22 Battalion and the third in support of CAP 2-7-9 resulting in 1 VC/NVA KIA.
- h. On three occasions AH-10 helicopter gunship missions were utilized expending 98 reducts, 3,000 rounds of 7.62mm and 200 rounds of 40mm for Etho Company units in contact resulting in 1 VC/NVA KIA.


3. Artillery and Fire Support

- a. Artillery & Fire Support was provided by Battery A and Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery F, 2d Battalion 11th Marines; Battery L, 4th Battalion 11th Marines; and the 3rd 8 Inch Howitzer Battery.
- b. The let Battelion, 11th Murines remained in direct support of 1st Murines during the entire menth with Battery 8 co-located with 2d Mattalian, 1st Murines.
- c. 138 observed missions were fired 36 of which were contact illumination missions fired in support of 26 Battalian, let Marines units and Combined Action Company 2-7units initiating embushes and/or detecting confirmed movement. Pre-emptive fires totaled 293 targets. These targets were planned on suspected enemy assembly areas, known enemy infiltration routes, avenues of approach, and known bunker areas. The total round expenditure for 105mm high explosive amountation uses 8,822 rds, 453 105mm illumination, 210 105mm white phosphorous; 32,8 Inch high explosive rounds were also fired.
- c. The 81mm Morter Flatorn fired 79 observed missions, 13 of which were contact illumination missions fired in support of activities engaged with the enemy. The remaining missions were properties on patrol routes of night activities. 31's also fired illumination on 25 trajets in support of the Comp Lauer defenses. There was an expenditure of 4,553 high explosive rounds, 309 white phosphorus rounds and 570 illumination rounds. Three morter sections were located in the Comp Lauer Combat Base (FT081703), one section in the Man Quan Company Patrol Base (FT08188) and one in the 17th Armored Cavalry Compound (AT990675) during the month.
- e. Due to civilian population concentrations and ANN activities, fires were restricted to several distinct areas. These areas are Cam Sa (1) (DTO3h6hh), Cam Sa (2) (DTO976h3), Ngan Trung (DTO636h3) and Man Quan (1) (DTO36687). On occasion, electrone was received for the North Control and Horthwestern sectors of the TAON which consist of thick treelines and rice packy areas, affording excellent assembly areas for the enemy. Doth beserved missions and pro-emptive fires were directed into those areas upon clearance.
- F. Clearence for artillary fire missions remains the most significant problem, although great strides have been unde in attempting to expectite political electance through the massive limisen network set up within Hea Veng and Hieu Duc Districts. A more thorough understanding of artillary procedures by our Viotnamese counterparts will hopefully, in the future, dispel many of these problems and allow increased artillary support within the TAO.:





PART II SECTION D TRAINING



1. Training

- a. Training consists of Orientation for replacement personnel, refresher training as required for all personnel and attendance at formal schools.
 - b. The orientation course is broken down as follows:
- (1) 5 day course. Designated for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Vietnem.
- (2) 3 day course. Dosignated for replacement personnel joining this Battalion from other "in country" commands. This training is geared to unique requirements relevant to this TAOR.
- (3) Refrosher course. Designated for personnel who need instruction on a specific subject or bank of subjects.
- c. A 60mm Mortar School for all rifle company mortar sections was conducted by the Battalion on the 29th and 30th of the month. The school, instructed by 81's personnel, included three hours of classes covering nomenclature, functioning, firing, and range cards. After completion of the classes, each mortar section was given a three hour practical application period on the Battalion's 60mm Mortar Range.
- d. Also on the 29th and 30th of June, a Division Marksmenship Training Contact Team conducted FAM Firing, Veapons Zero and Quick Fire/Quick Kill classes for the Marines deployed in the field. Approximately 125 men from each rifle company participated in the training.
- e. Formal and somi-formal schooling is conducted by 1st Marinos and . 1st Marino Division.
- f. The Battelien erientation course includes the following subjects: MPC and Pinster spending, Pay and Allowances, Emergency Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty, CAP Program, RCR, Postal Regulations, Private Mapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Religions based on Customs of Vietnam, Moral Guidanco, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TiOR/Woather, Themy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rewards Program, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVL Infrastructure, Interpretors and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromisos, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading and Lorial Photos, Password and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Navigation, Employment of Snipers, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MLCV Rules of Engagoment, Viotnamese irmed Forces, Spot Reports, imbushes and Counter imbushes, Domolitions and Dostruction of Booby Traps, Booby Traps, Booby Trap Lano, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Irmory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnamese Customs/Personal Response,

PART II SECTION E LOGISTICS

1. Logistics

- a. During June 1970, resupply of operating units as accomplished by helicopters, trucks, and huskles. There were a total of 288 resupply lifts with a combined weight of 145,970 pounds. Resupply by huskles and trucks amounted to approximately 17,520 pounds.
- b. There were four work orders completed; these included the construction of two Sea Ruts, one velleyball court, a ventilation system for COC, and the installation of shelves in the Stack arms supply building. Work was started on three work orders which included the construction of a perimeter berm, with present bunker positions being upgraded, the repair of four leach fields and the construction of an outside storage let for Battalion Supply.

2. Motor Transport

- a. The overall deadline rate for the Moter Transport Section is 12%. This is an increase of 3% from the provious worth. The increase in deadline may be attributed to an inordinate number of deadlined number.
- (1) The greatest maintenance problem has been the M27442 mechanical mulo. Seven mules were deadlined during the month for Third Echolon Norm. Of those, four were for clutches, two for head gaskets and one for a new engine.
- (2) Although these problems had been anticipated, due to Comp Lauer's sandy environment, a program of administrative deadline is presently under way. This together with vehicle discipline will hopefully reduce the deadline rate.
- (3) The greatest First Echelon maintenance problem is the lack of water to clean vehicles. With the summer water conservation program in effect, the Battalien is left with no fresh water source for cleaning vehicles. There are no natural sources of water in the cantenment.
- (4) The greatest Second Echelon maintenance problem remains the unavailability of spark plugs, carburetors, and seals to the 127442 mule.
- (5) Two id51Al Jeeps are currently on deadline. The two are deadlined for Third Echelon Horm for transfer cases. Soven M27hA2 mules are currently deadlined, however only one of the seven requires Third Echelon maintenance. Those requiring Second Echelon maintenance include two for plugs, one for shifing linkage, one for a carburator, one for bearings, and one for an oil scal.

- b. The personnal situation during the past month, has greatly improved; the section is presently operating only one man below T/O, that deficiency caused by a shortage of one driver.
- c. Two driver school's wore held during the month resulting in the licensing of 23 joep and mule drivers.

3. Supply

- a. The physical arrangement of the supply office was altered to allow for more efficient use of space and easier flow of paper work. The outstanding requisitions for formal account items were separated from other pending documents and placed under the direct control of to formal accounts clerk. This change allows closer attention be given to requisitions for major T/E and S/A and items.
- b. The wardhouse section is currently involved in a project to move all bulk storage boxes from the warehouse to the obtdoor storage let. This will allow more warehouse space for items which must be maintained in a protected area.
- c. In inspection of the fiscal status of the Pattalion was hold on 17 June 1970. The rating received was "satisfactory with discrepancies"; currently all discrepancies are in the process of being corrected.
- d. As a result of the Division-wide equipment redistribution program, several items of excess property were invoiced to other organizations. The following items were invoiced from the Battalian during June:

PART II SECTION F CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION


1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- a. Public Works. Public works received maximum attention in the Battalion TAOR during Jume. The main project was the moving of 1758 refugees from Ngen Cau New Life Hamlet to Tu Cau New Life Hamlet.

 2,800 individual pieces of lumber and wood were delivered and distributed to the people of Ngan Cau New Life Hamlet for the rebuilding of their homes. Also delivered to Ngan Cau were 150 cmmo boxes, carpenter's tools (hammers and saws) and 400 pounds of mails. The NF compound near Tu Cau received I truck load of wood and lumber which they had requested. A water analysis of the wells in Xuan Tra, Hai An, and Tu Cau were taken. Coment was obtained for well aprens in Kuan Tra, and Hai An.
- b. Welfare. During Juno, a total of 29,300 pinsters was paid out for local hire under AIK (assistance in kind) employment fund. The pig project in Hoa Hai village is continuing to do well with the addition of two new litters; vaccination boosters are due and will be given in the near future.
- c. Education. One-hundred General Walt Scholarships were distributed this month to the schools in this area. Fifty have gone to the students of Kuan Tra School, thirty to the students of Cam Num School and twenty to the students of Giang Num School.
- d. Houlth. To wid in health improvement in the New Life Humlets, excess food from the Battelian Messhell is distributed when available. Eight cases of cabbage and 75 pounds of corn boof more distributed to Myan Cau Hill this month.

The daily medeap, which is carried on in the S-5 office, treated a total of 1,080 civilians for this menth. Defing the move of refugees from Ngan Cau to Tu Cau, two medeaps were held and a total of 75 civilians were treated. Six civilians were treated for dental problems.

- e. Scirl. Two major social functions were attended this month.
 The S-5 staff and Battelion Commander fore areas at the corner stone laying ceremony of the new Cau Dan Church in Mil Kim Son. A Vietnamese appreciation day celebration was held by Col. Tin at Hoi An, the Province Capital, which was attended by the S-FA.
- f. Security. 10,000 sandbags were given to the people of ligan Cau MLH for the building of bunkers. The Revolutionary Development Team in Yuan Tra was given two cases of illumination populas.
- g. Solatium. A total of 18,000 piasters was paid out for three different incidents which resulted in six people injured and one killed, including five RF's and two civilians.

h. Personal Response. One-hundred poster type leaflets were distributed to the rifle companies explaining personal response. The Da Nang Culture Tour was attended by his personnel from this Battalian. A total of lish new personnel wor, given the indectrination brief covering Civil Affairs and Personal Response.



PART II SECTION G COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications

- a. During June, the Communications Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications facilities for the Battalion. Maximum effort was put forth in the improvement of communications security and in reducing the number of security violations recorded by 1st Radio Battalion over voice radio nots.
- b. Radio Relay Section. The Radio Relay Section continued to function in support of the Battalion, providing radio relay channels to let Marines Regimental Headquarters. A new PU-694 generator was instituted to improve down time due to power fluctuations within the Command Post power system. Only 3.5% down time was experienced.
- o. Radio Section. The Radio Section continued to function in support of the Battalion by providing and maintaining all radio nets. In addition, classes were conducted in the field for all radio operators and Company Commanders concerning communications security and the utilization of the new USKAC 801. "whiz whoels" to be implemented on 1 July 1970. Classes were also conducted for all newly arriving personnel on the importance of communications security.

A sorious problem was expurienced with Gould Harathen brand BA-386 batteries. The life expectancy was reduced to 2 to 3 hours with some lasting as little as 15 minutes.

- d. Whre Section. The Wire Section maintained a continuous watch on the Enttalion switchboard and the guard shack switchboard. The inside of the Enttalion switchboard bunker was remodeled and painted. New cable was laid to the guard shack and old lines were removed. In addition, new cables were installed within the cantenament to replace the old slash lines for improved telephone communications and resistance to meisture.
- e. Mossage Conter Section. The Mossage Center experienced only 15 hours and 29 minutes of down time, caused principally by outage of the radio relay shot to Regiment. 43 outgoing messages and 784 incoming messages were processed.
- f. <u>Klectronics Maintenance Section</u>. Normal repair operations and 2d echolon maintenance were performed during the month. The following equipment was repaired:

PART II SECTION H MEDICAL & DEVIAL

1. Medical and Dental

- a. The Battalion Surgeon is Lt. F. A. Tardolla, MC USNR. The Battalion Chief is HAC G. L. Adams, USN. During this reporting period, the Battalion Aid Station had two Officers (1 Medical Corps and 1 Chaple's Corps) and M4 enlisted in the field and in garrison.
 - b. The Battalion Aid Station treated 545 patients during the month. Entemologist from the Division Preventive Medicine Unit Surveyed the area and found no significant sanitation defects. Routine monthly sanitation inspections of all outlying units were made, and recommendations for the discrepancies were submitted. There are no major sanitation problems at this time.
 - . c. Analysis of mortality figures reveal three USAC MIA, one USAC DOW, 31 USAC VIA, six USAC HBC, and one USAC VIANE. There was one USA HBC and one USA WIA.
 - d. Analysis of routine treatment revealed seven cases of diarrhoa, lip cases of upper respiratory infection, 50 cases of foot disorders, 28 cases of skin disorders, lip cases of G.C., ten cases of fever of undetermined origin, and no new cases of malaria or hepatitis. There were 125 patients treated for miscellaneous problems at routine sick call, and there were 312 dental patients seen.
 - e. The immunization program was adequate; 1,003 immunizations and 185 Tuberculin tests were given to members of this Battalian.
 - f. The civilian medical program was active. There were 1,080 Vietnamese civilians treated for medical reasons, of which two were combat related injuries. Seven Vietnamese civilians were treated for dental reasons.
 - g. There were 67 USHC and six Vietnamese civilians evacuated for modical reasons.
 - h. Since the Hospital at NSA closed, the Battalion has to use the facilities at lat Med, USS Sanctuary and 95th Evac Hosp. to obtain the same services which were available at NSA. Having to use the above three facilities results in many lost man hours because of the time involved in transporting personnel. Most optical services are now received from the Army at the old NSA location, with very good results.
 - 1. There were five dental patients sent to 1st Dental and the Dental Dept lost twenty-four man hours due to a power failure in the contonment.





PART II SECTION I CHAPLAIN

1. Chaplain

- a. During June, the Battalion Chaplain conducted 16 services for the Catholic personnel of 2/1, with approximately 390 in attendance. Eight services were effered for Protestant personnel by the Regimental Chaplain, both in the Comp Chapel and in the field, with 180 men attending. Special Services were introduced to accommodate personnel of the Latter Day Saints Church and were held each Sunday by & Marine Officer of 2/1 who is an approved Group Leader of the LDS Church. 15 personnel participated.
- b. A total of 68 Marines were counselled by the Battalion Chaplain and approximately 15 were assisted in completing Emergency MARS Calls to their families. Some 29 patients were visited in the area hospitals. With the closing of NSA Hospital, Marine casualties are now being treated on the USS Sanctuary Hospital Ship. Neekly visits to hospitalized Marines are made via helicopter or while the Sanctuary is anchored in Da Nang harbor.
- c. Four trips were made to the III MAF Brig where a total of the different intermees were visited. Also, four lectures on Personal Rosponse were given to 84 incoming personnel.
- d. 1,000 gift packs were received from the Division Chaplain's Office for distribution among the troops in the field via Project Thank You, which is spensored by the Laymon's League of the Christian Reformed Church. In addition, several boxes of cookies and cakes, sent by private organizations, were also distributed to the men in the field.
- o. The Battalion Chaplain as well as the Battalion Commander and the S-5 Officer were in attendance at cornerstone laying ceremonies of the new Cao Dai Temple in Mul Kim Son.
