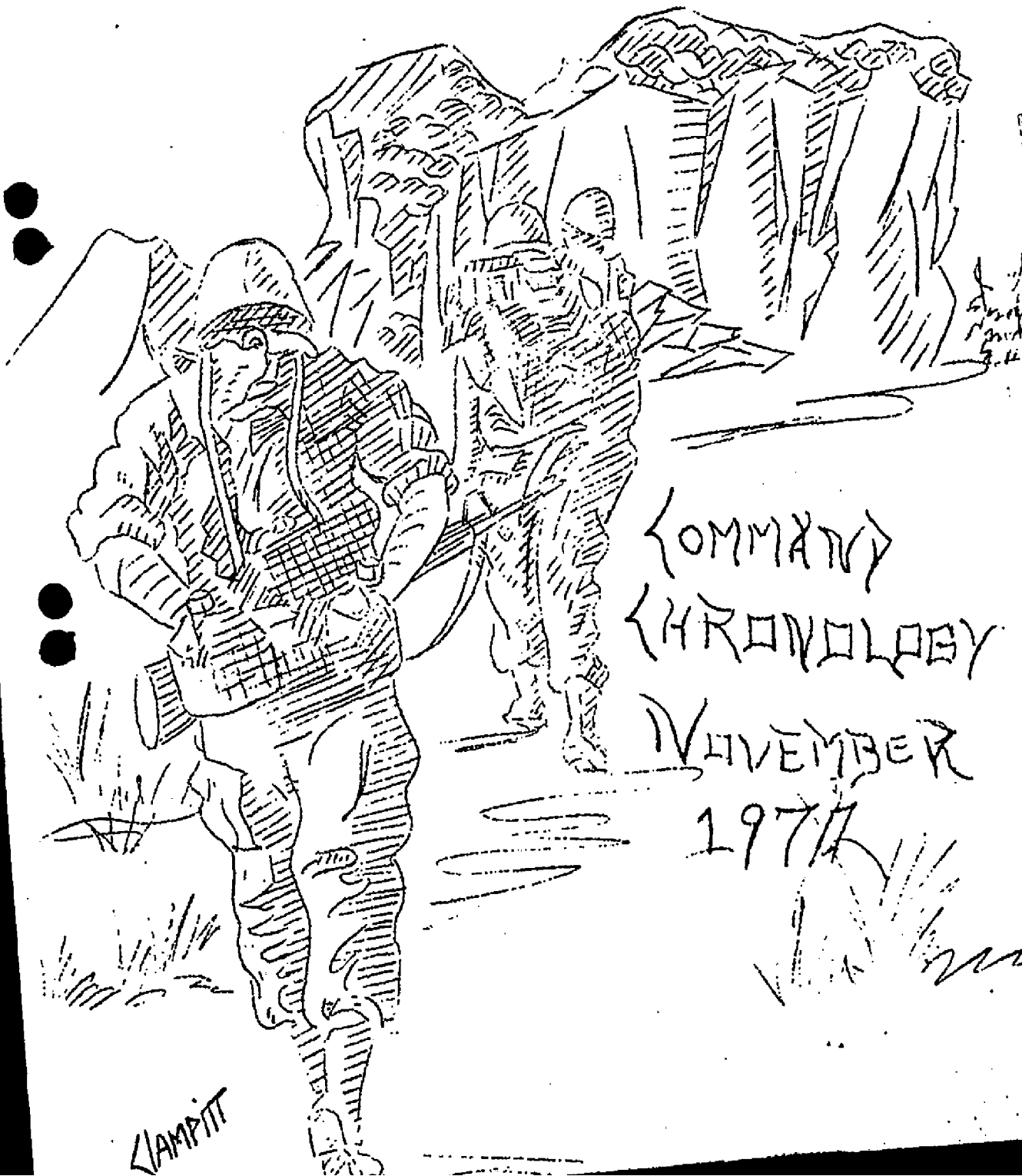

In addition to the recreation and rest programs available to all Marine in Vietnam, the Battalion maintains an enlisted club with a large outdoor theatre which has hosted five USO shows this month. High on the list of favorite pastimes is an outstanding beach with facilities for Sunday parties. The Special Services program is active providing nightly movies, a weight room, a reading room and equipment for sporting activities. The PX facilities include a Marine Corps exchange, laundry, photo shop and gift shop. This cantonment has a messhall which efficiently feeds 600 men three hot meals daily.

SECTION B
ENEMY, WEATHER TERRAIN & S-2 FUNCTIONS

1. Enemy. Enemy contacts dropped to a slightly lower level than last reporting period with eight (08) exchanges of fire. Enemy booby trap emplacements also decreased. There were two (02) rocket attacks on our T.A.O.R.

One item of military significance occurred during this reporting period. At 181330H Nov 70, Golf Company assaulted Quang Dong (1) Hamlet flushing the enemy East into Echo Company's block. Echo Company made contact, resulting in two (02) POWs and three (04) VC/NVA KIA at AT997607. A search of the hamlet resulted in finding 150 pounds of wheat and 125 pounds of rice buried, four (04) M-26 grenade booby traps and one (01) tomato can booby trap, one (01) AK-47 rifle, one (01) Chi-com grenade, two (02) 81mm fuses and two (02) concrete and steel reinforced bunkers. Seven (07) Vietnamese were detained.

3. Order of Battle. There were no significant changes in the Order of Battle within 2/1's T.A.O.R. There are no NVN or Main Force units located as a unit in 2/1's T.A.O.R. The enemy is expected to follow it's three (03) phase offensive during the following months.

4. Weather and Terrain.

1. Weather. The average high temperature was 78 degrees and the average low temperature was 73 degrees with an average humidity of 80%. Rain for the month was 10.27 inches.

Due to the fact that 2/1's T.O.R is in the lowland area, flooding can be expected over 94% of the area during the monsoon. The flooding of the lowland areas will cause a channelization of both friendly and enemy travel. It is felt by S-2, 2/1 that booby traps will become even more prevalent because we are restricted to predetermined routes.

b. Terrain. The terrain in 2/1's T.O.R is in flat and sandy land with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines. There are two (02) main water transportation routes, the Vinh Bien River in the East and the Yen River in the West. In addition, there are numerous lakes, ponds and paddies where boat traffic is heavy.

5. S-2 Functions.

a. Security Clearances: Nine (09) security clearances were initiated and none were terminated. Six (06) clearances were required by Communications Section personnel, two (02) were required by S-2 Section personnel and one (01) was required by a Lieutenant attending Registered Publications School.

b. ARVN Interpreters: Due to the reassignment of interpreters within the I Corps Headquarters, the S-2 Section now has four (04) interpreters. They are assigned to different units to aid in "on the spot" interpretation of detainee information and any documents which need an immediate readout.

c. S-2 Personnel: Two (02) new personnel joined the S-2 Section this month. The S-2 Scouts continue to work as a Battalion Recon Squad.

d. VII Funds: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Program Funds remain a part of the S-2 function. A total of 11,500 VM\$ were spent during the month of November. The Voluntary Informant Program is not only a source of intelligence information, but it also eliminates the availability of ordnance to the enemy.

e. KCS Program: Due to the transfer of one (01) KCS to the 1st Marines S-2 Section and one (01) KCS being UA, there are now a total of ten (10) KCS assigned to the Battalion. By walking with the point man on patrols, the KCS are able to act as an early warning for booby traps and ambushes due to their familiarities with the enemy's tactics, habits and signs.

f. Training: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indoctrination training. At this time they are briefed on enemy, weather, terrain and the capabilities and functions of the S-2 Section.

g. Maps: The S-2 Office has a full supply of maps of 2/1's T.O.R and will continue to supply them as needed.

h. Patrol Debriefs: Patrol debrief forms have been disseminated to all company recon squads in order to maintain an up to date intelligence picture. These forms when filled out are returned to the S-2 Office.

i. Special Liaison Team: The S-2 Officer has operational control of a Special Liaison Team located in Nui Kim Son. With the addition of one (01) Lance Corporal, the Special Liaison Team now consists of thirteen (13) enlisted personnel. Their function is to act as a special intelligence gathering and pacification source.

SECTION C
OPERATIONS

1. Operations

a. Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAOR to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and LOC, with primary emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers and to the security of friendly military installations.

(2) Deploy forces throughout assigned TAOR to provide defense of the Da Nang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/suspected mortar/rocket positions, to include waterways.

(3) Be prepared to provide a reaction force for relief of Hoa Vang District Headquarters and CAP/CUPPI's within the TAOR.

(4) In cooperation and coordination with FMAF and District Headquarters, maintain continuous programs to upgrade hamlets within the TAOR in accordance with the Pacification Program.

(5) Provide security for roadworks and other engineer projects as required.

(6) Support Revolutionary Development Program within TAOR.

(7) Be prepared to be reinforced and committed anywhere in RVN on 12 hour notice.

(8) Be prepared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other battalions within the 1st Marine Regiment.

b. Operations.

(1) The overall concept of operation within the TAOR is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrol/ambush activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalion TAOR.

(2) During November, the Battalion utilized both critical terrain and watch towers for observation posts during the hours of daylight. This tactic not only provided cognizance of many densely vegetated areas and thus potential enemy harbor sites, but also significantly reduced the number of Marine booby trap casualties.

(3) Long Range combat patrols continued to operate throughout the TAO. Each rifle company operated such patrols on a continuing basis in those areas targeted by current intelligence information. Long range patrols were conducted in order to increase the amount of ground that was physically occupied and to depart from any possible routine that may have been established by units departing from and returning to their Patrol Bases on a regular schedule.

(4) Vietnamese civilians continued to turn in large amounts of ordnance to Marines and supplied periodic intelligence. This information, coupled with the employment of aerial observers and an extensive U. S. intelligence effort, produced significant results in that no rockets or mortars were fired into the Da Nang vital area from the Battalion's TAO during the month of November.

(5) Operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and liaison with Vietnamese Military and Civilian Officials. The many Regional Forces (RF) and Popular Forces (PF) units located within the Battalion TAO carried an ever increasing portion of the defense and safeguarding of their areas. Operation Saturation (Huong Diou) was extended for eight (08) days and ended at 0600H on 30 November 1970. The concept of this operation was to get Vietnamese military units out into the hamlets and fields on a continuous basis, providing better security for the people and greater control of the countryside. These activities were most often joint ventures ensuring the closest of coordination.

(6) Adapting its tactics to the monsoon season and the channelized lines of communications, the Battalion continued to stress road blocks and cordon and search operations as the best methods to root out the Viet Cong Infrastructure. Road blocks were run every day on the main arteries that traverse the Battalion's Area of Operation. Three cordon and search operations were run during the month of November and many more were in the planning stages for execution during following months.

(7) During the month of November the concept of tactical mobility was re-emphasized. The companies in the field lightened their loads and were constantly on the move throughout the Battalion's TAO. Such tactical mobility coupled with the flexibility of a swing company gave the Battalion the capability of rapidly reacting to intelligence reports and targets of opportunity. During the month of November the Battalion participated in six (06) quick reaction type operations, both inside its TAO and outside, resulting in thirteen (13) enemy KIA, two (02) NVA PWs, eleven (11) VC detainees, and the capture of two (02) tons of rice and 150 pounds of wheat.

2. Air Support.

a. The Battalion's air support for the month of November was hampered by inclement weather and a restriction on fire support which included close air support (CAS). Also, due to inclement weather, liaison runs normally facilitated by visual reconnaissance (VR) flights were often

either rescheduled or conducted by vehicle. Helicopters were obtained from MAG-16 and OV-10, aerial observation aircraft, from MAG-11.

b. The Battalion had a total of thirty-two (32) medevac missions in November, evacuating thirty-eight (38) personnel. There were sixteen (16) U. S. emergency, four (04) U. S. priority, and (01) U. S. permanent route, five (05) emergency civilian, nine (09) priority civilian, two (02) ARVN emergency, and one (01) ARVN priority. The shortest delay for an emergency medevac was nine (09) minutes. The longest delay for an emergency medevac was forty-four (44) minutes. The average time for all emergency medevac missions was sixteen (16) minutes. This time was computed as time elapsing from the moment when the medevac was called into the Battalion COG until the casualty was airborne.

c. There were twenty-eight (28) resupply missions flown during November. This included 164 sorties, carrying 250,650 pounds and 214 passengers.

d. Twenty-four (24) visual reconnaissance (VR) missions were completed during the month of November. The VR was utilized for liaison runs, visual reconnaissance, and the administrative transfer of passengers.

e. There was one (01) heliborne assault during November. This included thirteen (13) lifts carrying 227 passengers.

f. Five (05) aerial observation (AO) missions were flown, two (02) of which were utilized during the heliborne assault.

The remaining three (03) were used to observe areas of suspected enemy locations, ammunition caches, and possible rocket launch sites.

g. Due to the restriction on fire support, no close air support (CAS) missions were flown during November. On one occasion a flare ship was utilized to provide illumination for an engaged unit.

3. Artillery and Fire Support.

a. Artillery fire support for the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was provided by Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and three (03) tubes of Battery "W", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. Reinforcing fires were provided by two (02) M114 155mm Howitzers attached to Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and "B" Platoon, 2d Eight Inch Guns.

b. 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in direct support of 1st Marines during November with Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and "B" Platoon, 2d Eight Inch Guns collocated on Hill 55.

c. There were no observed missions fired in support of allied units in the Battalion TAO. Also, there were no pre-emptive or intelligence

targets fired during November. There were no artillery rounds expended in support of 2d Battalion, 1st Marines during November.

d. The 81mm mortar platoon fired four (04) observed missions, all of which were contact illumination missions fired in support of units engaged with the enemy. There were no prep fires or targets fired in support of the Camp Lauer defenses. The platoon expended 200 illumination rounds during November. One (01) mortar section was located in the Camp Lauer Combat Base (BT081703), one (01) section at Soa Ancher (BT082698), one (01) tube at Hill 55, and one (01) tube at the 17th Armored Cavalry Compound (AT990673).

e. Due to the high density of civilian population and the provisions of 1st Marine Division message 181520Z October 1970, there were no preemptive or intelligence fires fired into the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines TAOB.

TRAINING

1. Training

a. Training consisted of indoctrination training for replacements, platoon rehabilitation training, formal schools and refresher training as required.

b. The replacement indoctrination course was broken down as follows:

(1) 5 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Vietnam. During the month of November, forty-four (44) Marines completed the course. The subjects included: MPC and Platoon Sponsoring, Pay and Allowances, Emergency Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty Procedures, CAF Program, R&R, Postal Regulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Religions based on Customs of Viet Nam, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TAOR/Weather, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rewards Programs, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromise, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading, Employment of Snipers, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Demolitions and Destruction of Booby Traps, Booby Traps, Booby Trap Lane, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnamese Customs/Personnel Response, Chieu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vietnamese People, Conduct/Attitude Toward Vietnamese Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotics, Alcohol, Legal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Weapons, Buddy Aid, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygiene, Preventative Medicine, Venereal Disease, Anti-Malaria Measures, Military Decorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, 60mm Mortar, Claymore Mines, Grenade Safety and M-26 Fragmentation Grenade, M-16 Al Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalion Range Regulations, Fan Firing, Zeroing Weapons, and Quick Fire/Quick Kill.

(2) 3 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel joining the Battalion from other "in country" commands. This training was designed to disseminate requirements and tactics relevant to the Battalion's TAOR. Twenty-five (25) Marines completed this course during the month of November. The subjects included: Tactical Update, Legal Considerations, Vietnamese Relations, Religion and Personal Welfare, Quick Fire/Quick Kill, Military Bearing and Leadership, Booby Trap Lane, Counter-measures for Mines and Booby Traps, Night Fire "X", COC Brief, Communications Security, Personal Affairs and Logistics.

c. On 2, 3, and 4 November the Mine/Booby Trap Mobile Contact Team

from the 1st Marine Division Inspector's office gave instruction to a total of 125 Marines in the Battalion.

k. In November a total of thirty-five (35) Marines from the Battalion, attending three (03) different five (05) day sessions, graduated from the Landmine Warfare Resident Course as presented by the 1st Engineer Battalion. The Battalion now has 385 Marines who have completed the course.

l. In November 213 Marines underwent Quick Fire/Quick Kill training. The Battalion had 300 Marines who completed familiarization firing this month. Thirty-four (34) hours of this instruction were completed on the Battalion 1,000 inch range and eight (08) hours on the general purpose range.

SECTION E
LOGISTICS

1. Logistics

a. During November, resupply of operating units was accomplished by helicopter and trucks. There were a total of 164 helicopter resupply lifts with a combined weight of 250,650 pounds. Trucks logged approximately 7,750 road miles.

b. There were five work orders completed during the month. New front and rear gates to Camp Lauer were constructed and installed. Fields of fire were cleared around the camp's lower perimeter. A SEI hut was constructed at the Main Gate of Camp Lauer for the processing of Tienanmen civilian workers. Two work orders requesting mount-cut boxes were completed when materials for fifteen boxes were delivered.

c. Two new work orders were submitted during the month; one requesting construction of a rope bridge at Ha Dong for tactical use by our GULI units and the other requesting that the Stack Arms Pavillion be rewired.

d. During the month of November, the Battalion's Laundry Unit washed and dried approximately 20,700 pounds of clothing.

2. Motor Transport

a. As of 29 November four (04) M274 mules are on deadline, one M3781 personnel carrier and two (02) M151A1.

b. Presently we are one M151A1 short. We rate this vehicle as a special allowance and it is presently on order. Three (03) new jeeps were drawn from Rolling Stock at FLC to replace three (03) code H vehicles.

c. We have added a monthly reschooling program for all vehicle operators to help them keep abreast of the latest developments in the fields of safety and maintenance.

d. With the arrival of Monsoon Season emphasis has been placed on preventive maintenance. To accomplish this we have installed the "If It Ain't Broke Don't Fix It" concept of preventive maintenance into our system.

e. We have gained one (01) 3516 mechanic and two (02) 0311 personnel this month and have lost one (01) 3531 driver.

3. Supply

a. One (01) Staff Sergeant, 3041, rotated during this month. Also, an additional 3041 and a 3051 joined the section during the month.

b. Shortages that previously existed for combat boots have recently been alleviated.

c. The warehouse section is presently transferring bulk items from old embarkation boxes to newer boxes. A recent embarkation inspection revealed the existence of inadequate storage boxes in use by the Battalion, i.e. mahogany wood was utilized whereby pine should have been used.

d. The C-ration storage point has been moved from the outside storage to an area within the warehouse. Better control can be exercised over the issue and receipt of the above item.

e. Ninety-three (93) M-16 Rifles were turned into FLC. This action was taken in order to make the quantity on hand correspond with the current authorized T/E i.e. 1132.

f. The following items were invoiced to the Battalion during the month:

CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

a. Public Works. The month of November was a fairly active one in the area of public works. Ten (10) pieces of plywood were given to the R.D.'s of Xuan Tran to be made into anti VC and pro GVN signs. Twenty-four (24) pieces of tin, and fifty (50) pieces of plywood were delivered to Lo Son for the repair of the school damaged during the storms. Ten (10) bags of cement, and numerous pieces of plywood, were delivered to Tan Luu for the school project now very near completion. A swing set was completed in Hoa Long Village next to the Son Thuy School. Several large sections of old canvas, collected from Son Anchor, were taken to the old church in Hoa Long Village for the patching of roof holes. The old church is to be used for the showing of movies. Ten (10) speed limit signs were erected in the villages throughout the MCR in an effort to reduce the number of traffic accidents.

b. Welfare. During November, a total of 44,000\$VN was paid for local hire and the AIK (Assistance In Kind) employment fund. This program accomplished two basic things; first, it enabled needy Vietnamese to earn money on a daily basis for their food, etc., second, it provided a temporary work force that could perform many of the menial tasks throughout the cantonment i.e., police, burning of feces, etc., which freed that many more Marines for other uses. There were twelve (12) Vietnamese working for the Battalion under the AIK (Assistance In Kind) program. They worked and were paid on a daily basis, and received a wage of 150\$VN per day.

c. Education. This month the new school in Tan Luu fishing hamlet was nearly completed. Building materials for the school, came from scrap lumber that was given to the S-5 by 1st Engineers Battalion and from materials taken by the P.S.D.F. and the R.D.'s from the old Sea Anchor area. Requests for tin and materials to repair the roofs of all the schools that were damaged during the wind storms were turned into District. Relief was promised in the near future.

d. Health. A daily MEDCAP was carried on in the S-5 Office, and this past month, a total of 217 people were treated for medical problems. In addition to this, field MEDCAPS were held in the various hamlets several times each month. A total of 273 MEDCAP patients were treated in the field during November. During the month of November there was a total of three (03) civilians medevaced to local hospitals for treatment of serious injuries, severe cooking burns, skin diseases, and dog bites that could have resulted in rabies.

To aid in health improvement in the New Life Hamlets, excess food from the Battalion messhall was distributed to the local officials and

from there to needy refugees. The introduction of fresh vegetables and meat into their diet, even on a temporary basis, provided them with much more protein, and vitamins so necessary for good health. It also served to raise their spirits and increase the good relations between the local populace and the Marines in their area. In November, twelve (12) cases of tomatoes, four (04) cases of lettuce, twenty-five (25) cases of lemons, and six (06) cases of cucumbers were delivered to Tan Chanh Chau. Le Son received six (06) cases of lemons, and four (04) cases of lettuce, while the people of Tan Lau received six (06) cases of various vegetables and two (02) cases of corned beef. The storm left many people homeless and without food. Forty (40) cases of G-rations were delivered to Le Son (HCH) to sustain the people until they recovered from the disaster.

e. Security. Two (02) cases of hand illumination communication were delivered to the PSDF (Peoples Self Defense Force) of Xuan Tra (HCH) to aid them in spotting the enemy during periods of poor illumination.

f. Solatium. A total of 8,000 \$VN was paid in solatiums this past month for two (02) incidents resulting in two (02) deaths. Both deaths occurred from traffic accidents. One (01) solatium was paid out for the death of a Vietnamese woman that was struck by an unidentified ARVN vehicle near Le Son. The second incident involved a vehicle from the CG. Near Xuan Tra a Vietnamese child was killed when he stepped into the path of the vehicle. In regard to the traffic accidents, driver safety classes were periodically held for 2/L drivers which emphasized the traffic problems encountered in Vietnam and how to prevent accidents in the future.

g. Personal Response. A total of ninety-nine (99) enlisted men and four (04) officers joined the Battalion during the month of November and were given an indoctrination brief covering the many facets of Civil Affairs and personal response. Personal Response literature was distributed throughout the indoctrination classes by the S-5.

SECTION G
COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications

a. During November the Communications Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications for the Battalion. In addition, several Advance Command Post displacements were conducted, providing excellent training and experience for communications personnel. A courtesy Command Material and Management Inspection was conducted by the 1st Marines Communications Officer and members of his staff, which also proved valuable in preparation for the upcoming Division CMMI. Minor discrepancies were noted and action is being taken to correct those.

b. Radio Relay Section. This Section continued its normal function in support of the Battalion by providing radio relay channels to 1st Marine Regiment Headquarters. A total of 5.4% downtime was experienced, primarily due to power failure at either the Regimental or Battalion terminals. Malfunction of radio relay equipment accounted for a minority of downtime.

c. Radio Section. The Radio Section functioned normally in providing and maintaining tactical, administrative and logistical radio nets for the Battalion. Utilization of a defective lot of BA-4386 batteries in KY-38 cipher equipment resulted in overheating and bursting or expanding of the batteries, but no serious damage was noted. Personnel of the Section conducted inventories of communications equipment of the rifle companies and provided instructions to Company and Platoon operators in waterproofing, operation and maintenance, in addition to Communications Security.

d. Wire Section. The Battalion and Guard Switchboards continued normal functions by providing internal wire communications for the Battalion Command Post. Color coding CP was completed. Terminal Boards have been considerably improved upon by relocation and/or straightening. A thorough policing of excess wire was completed throughout the commandment by removal and destruction of old, dead wiring.

e. Message Center Section. Teletype and Courier message traffic for the month of November totaled 35 outgoing and 800 incoming messages. 29% downtime was experienced for the teletype net due almost entirely to the power failures during the month.

f. Electronics Maintenance Section. In addition to normal second echelon maintenance operations, personnel of this Section were instrumental in conducting training for rifle company operators in first echelon maintenance procedures, waterproofing and construction and utilization of field expedient antennas.

8. Ground Power Section. Cantonment power was considerably reduced during the month as a result of the deadlining of one of the Battalion's two 150KW generators for approximately two weeks. It became necessary to disconnect various power lines within the Command Post to allow the functioning generator to carry the necessary load requirement. The re-wiring of all perimeter lights was started. This Section accepted and added to its inventory, two 20KW generators. Numerous minor wiring repairs were conducted in both the Command Post and Stack Arms messhalls.

MEDICAL & DENTAL

1. Medical and Dental

a. The Battalion Surgeons are Lt. R. D. COX, MC USNR and Lt. R. L. FROEB, MC USNR. The Battalion Chief is HTC G. L. ADAMS, USN. During this reporting period, the Battalion had three (03) officers (Two (02) Medical Corps and one (01) Chaplain Corps) and fifty (50) enlisted in the field and in garrison.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated 710 patients during the month. The Division Preventive Medicine Units Monthly Sanitation Inspection Report was submitted and the discrepancies were noted and corrected.

c. Analysis of mortality figures reveals that there were zero USMC KL, zero USMC DOW, nineteen (19) USMC WL, six (06) USMC NEC, one (01) USMC DLI, and two (02) USMC WLINE. There were zero USN KL, zero USN WL, and zero USN NEC.

d. Analysis of routine treatment revealed twenty-two (22) cases of diarrhea, 150 cases of upper respiratory infection, seventy-four (74) cases of foot disorders, forty-eight (48) cases of skin disorders, seventeen (17) cases of gonorrhea, one (01) case of fever of undetermined origin, zero cases of immersion foot, one new case of malaria and no hepatitis. There were 260 Dental Patients seen.

e. The civilian medical program was active. There were 480 Vietnamese civilians treated for medical reasons, none of which were due to combat related injuries. One Vietnamese civilian was treated for a dental reason.

f. There were zero USMC, zero Vietnamese civilians, and zero wounded Viet Cong evacuated.

g. There was a total of 106 patients sent on consultation to 1st Medical Battalion or 95th Evacuation Hospital.

h. There were twenty-two (22) dental patients sent to 1st Medical Battalion on consultation.

CHAPLAIN

1. Chaplain.

a. On 10 November the Battalion Chaplain, Lt. Frank D. MINTEAL, CHC, USNR, representing the Catholic chaplains serving the infantry Marines in Military Region I, conducted Divine Services at the XXIV Corps Chapel, in a religious observance of the 195th Anniversary of the USMC. Thirty-one chaplains and guests from all branches of the U. S. Armed Forces were in attendance.

b. On 25 November a Memorial Service was held for Lt. Col. William G. LEFTWICH, Jr., former Battalion Commander, who died 18 November. Approximately seventy-seven attended the service.

c. Thanksgiving Day, 26 November, was observed in Camp Lauer, the home of the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines, with two chapel services attended by a total of forty-eight (48) personnel and with a brief prayer service in the Enlisted Messhall for approximately one hundred and fifteen men prior to the Traditional Dinner.

d. During the month of November the Battalion Chaplain offered twenty-nine (29) Catholic Services with a total attendance of four hundred and eighty-one (481). He also conducted six (06) services outside the Battalion for another eighty-six (86) Marines and Corpsmen.

e. Ten Protestant Services were conducted for two hundred and thirty-seven (237) members of this Battalion; seven (07) by Cdr. E. ANDRESS of the 1st Marine Regiment and three (03) by Lt. W. ROLAND of the 1st Engineer Battalion.

f. During November seventy-eight (78) men were counselled and thirty-three (33) patients were visited in seven (07) trips to hospitals. One hundred and twenty (120) "Vietnam Gift Pacs", seventy (70) books and magazines, forty (40) pieces of religious literature, along with approximately ninety (90) rosaries and sixty (60) religious medals, were distributed to members of the Battalion.

These items were donated by friends in the U. S.

g. Two (02) good-will visits were made to the nearby orphanage (Sacred Heart Nursery). Accompanied by several Marines the Chaplain delivered forty-six (46) crates of food and 13,750 piasters (\$50), the latter in anonymous donation by a Marine.

- (3) A cordon and search of Binh Ky Hamlet (BT054698) was conducted by Golf Company, reinforced. Five (05) detainees were taken and one (01) Chi-com, one (01) M-26 grenade, and one (01) LAAN were found.
- (4) On 2, 3, and 4 November 1970 the Mobile Engineer Mine and Booby Trap Contact Team instructed 220 Marines and Sailors in the Battalion.
- (5) Echo Company, reinforced, ran a cordon and search operation of Le Son (1) Hamlet (AT987663) on 7 November 1970. 381 persons were screened and one (01) was detained as a VCS.
- (6) On 8 November 1970 forty (40) Marines comprised the first graduating class of the Battalion Patrol Leader's School.
- (7) On 10 November 1970 the Battalion celebrated the Marine Corps Birthday with a special ceremony that included cutting a huge, traditional birthday cake.
- (8) Fox Company, 2d Battalion Marines, was opconned to the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines for an operation in the Football Island area (AT8952) on 12 November 1970.
- (9) On the 14th of November the thirty-one (31) members of first platoon, Echo Company completed the four (04) day platoon rehabilitation training program conducted at Camp Lauer.
- (10) On 15 November Fox Company, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was returned to the operational control of the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines. They netted one (01) VC WIA captured and two (02) tons worth of rice caches.
- (11) Brigadier General Simmons, Assistant Division Commander, visited Echo, Golf, and Zetol Companies in the field on 15 November 1970.
- (12) Acting according to a plan that had been based on an intelligence report the second platoon of Golf Company flushed five (05) VC into a Vietnamese SEAL Team ambush. All five (05) VC were killed near the grid BT077691 at 2235H on 15 November 1970.

and Echo Company (minus) conducted holiborne assault of Quang Dong (1) Hamlet at 1300H on 18 November 1970. In the resulting action four (04) VC/NVA were killed, one (01) NVA lieutenant and one (01) NVA Master Sergeant were WIA PW's, seven (07) detainees were captured, and numerous bunkers and documents were discovered.

- (14) AT 1345H on 19 November 1970 Fox Company, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was once again opconned to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.
- (15) On 19 November 1970 seven (07) men from the CUPP units completed an eleven (11) day CUPP training school held at II CAG Headquarters in Hoi An.
- (16) On 22 November 1970 Operation Hoang Dieu (Saturation) was extended for a thirty (30) day period.
- (17) Fox Company, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was returned to the operational control of the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines at 1315H on 24 November 1970.
- (18) On the 25th of November Hotel Company (minus) and the 1st platoon of Echo Company conducted a cordon and search operation in An Tra (1) Hamlet (BT081691). 128 Vietnamese were screened and one (01) VC was discovered and detained.
- (19) The six (06) CUPP units attached to 2d Battalion, 1st Marines were visited by Brigadier General Simmons, the assistant Division Commander, on 27 November 1970.
- (20) A Hoang Dieu operation began in the Battalion TAOB on 281200H November to end at 0600H on 3 December. The 21st, 37th, and 39th Vietnamese Ranger Battalion's were involved in the operation.
- (21) Hotel Company was deployed by air as the **Regimental Quick Reaction Force** to an area in the vicinity of AT9951 on the 28th of November 1970. The two (02) day operation netted three (03) VC/NVA KIA, six (06) VC detainees and numerous bunkers found and destroyed.
- (22) On the 28th of November 1970 eight (08) Marines completed the Battalion's second Patrol Leader's School.
- (23) At 0600H on 30 November 1970 Operation Hoang Dieu was suddenly terminated.

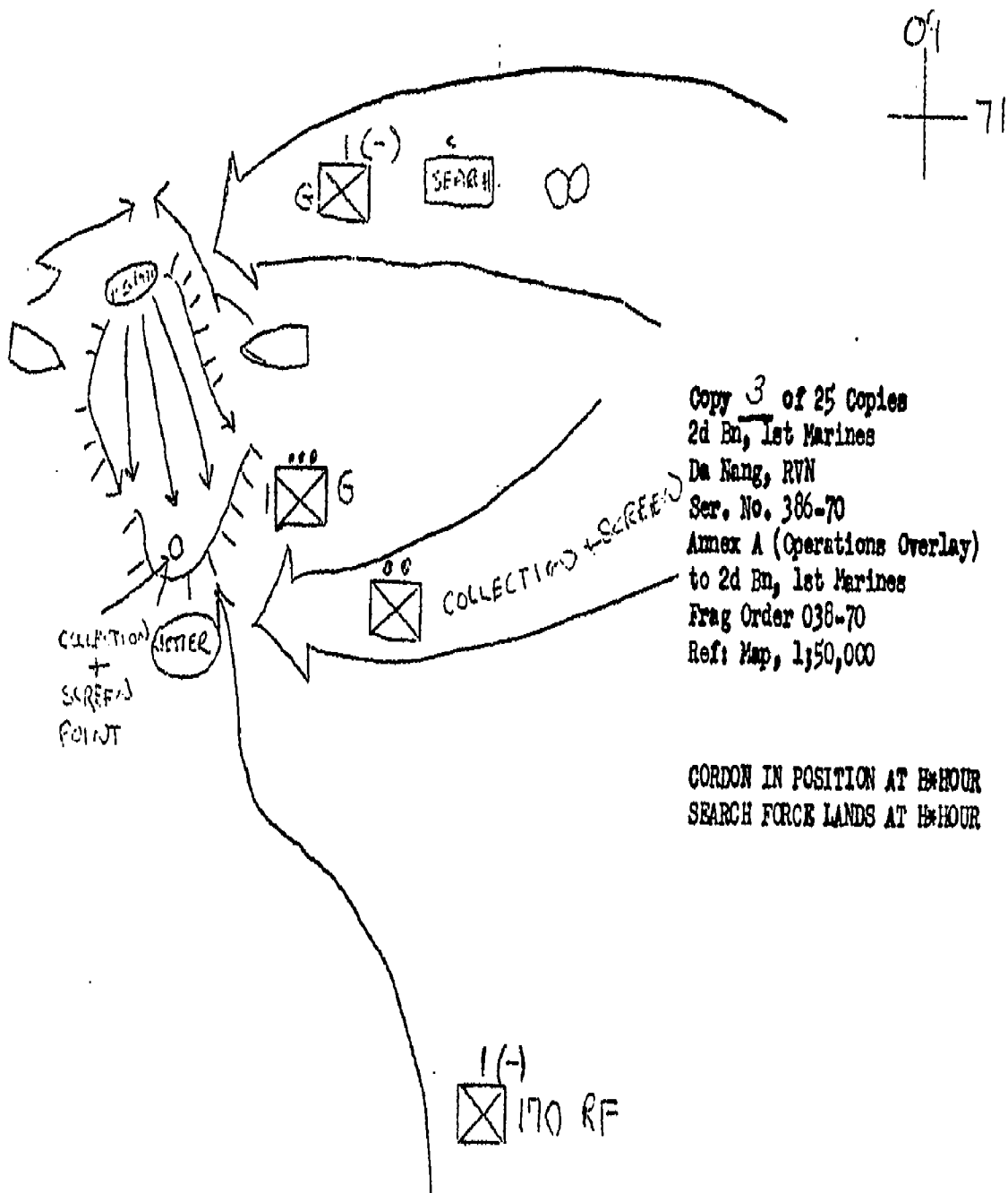

1. SITUATION.

- a. Enemy Forces. Current INTSUS.
- b. Friendly Forces. No change.

2. MISSION. 2d Bn, 1st Marines continues its mission of preventing indirect fire attacks on the Danang Vital Area and interdicting enemy lines of communications in the Battalion TAOR.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operations. The battalion will continue operations in the TAOR but will give up all fixed positions except Camp Lauer, Crownest OP, and Ostrich OP. The rifle companies will be completely mobile, keeping all platoon and company command posts on the move. Patrols will be tasked against specific targets developed by the S-2 and will be company, platoon, or squad sized as the mission requires. Company commanders will plan and execute the patrols in response to missions assigned them. One rifle company will be held at Camp Lauer as a swing company to act as Battalion Reserve and to train or execute special operations throughout the TAOR. The swing company assignment will be rotated bi-weekly. A CUPP Platoon will be established at Hill 55 to administer and control the CUPP's in the TAOR as well as coordinate fires and maneuver around Hill 55. Fire support will be provided by organic company mortars, 81mm mortars at central locations, and artillery at Camp Lauer and Hill 55.

b. M&S Company.

(1) Continue defense of Camp Lauer and manning of Crownest OP and Ostrich OP.

(2) Provide one full infantry squad, including corpsman, from 106RR Platoon for attachment to the CUPP Platoon at Hill 55. This squad will be a "swing" CUPP to relieve other CUPP's on a rotational basis. It will report to CUPP Platoon on 15 November.

(3) Locate 81mm Mortar sections at Hill 55, 17th Armored Cavalry Regiment, ARVN compound, 1/34 RF Company Group compound, and Camp Lauer.

(4) Be prepared to provide a "jump" CP for Battalion (-) operations. This will include a security section from the 106RR Platoon and a section of 81mm mortars.

c. Company E.

- (1) Return to Camp Lauer by 161200H November and assume swing company duty.

f. Company H.

- (1) Reduce CPB at BTO73669 and PFB at BTO89676.
- (2) Assume responsibility for Eastern AO at 141200H November.

g. CUPP Platoon.

- (1) Assume operational control of CUPPs Taylor, Caster, Wiggins, McClarnae, Russell, and 106RR squad at 151200H November
- (2) Conduct combined operations in respective Tactical Areas of Coordination (TAOCs) with assigned RVNAF units.

(d) By 0600H of the day concerned the S-3 will coordinate with adjacent units about any day patrols which may be in conflict.

(e) By 1200H the S-3 will coordinate with adjacent units about night patrols.
