

# FART II SECTION B ENEMY, WEATHER TERRAIN & S-2 FUNCTIONS

1. Enemy. Enemy contacts dropped to a slightly lower level than last reporting period with eight (08) exchanges of fire. Enemy booby trap emplacements also decreased. There were two (02) rocket attacks on our TAOR.

One item of military significance occurred during this reporting period. At 181330H Nov 70, Golf Company assaulted Quang Dong (1) Hamlet flushing the enemy East into Echo Company's block. Echo Company made contact, resulting in two (02) POWs and three (04) VC/NVA KI: at AT997607. A search of the hamlet resulted in finding 150 pounds of wheat and 125 pounds of rice buried, four (04) M-26 grenade booby traps and one (01) tomato can booby trap, one (01) AK-47 rifle, one (01) Chi-com grenade, two (02) Slime fuses and two (02) concrete and steel reinforced bunkers. Seven (07) Victnamese were detained.

3. Order of Battle. There were no significant changes in the Order of Battle within 2/1's T.OR. There are no NV. or Main Force units located as a unit in 2/1's T.OR. The enemy is expected to follow it's three (03) phase offensive during the following months.

# 4. Weather and Torrain.

1. <u>Yeather</u>. The average high temperature was 78 degrees and the average low temperature was 73 degrees with an average humidity of 80%. Rain for the month was 10.27 inches.

Due to the fact that 2/1's T.OR is in the lowland error, flooding can be expected over 94% of the area during the mensors. The flooding of the lowland areas will cause a channelization of both friendly and enery travel. It is felt by S-2, 2/1 that booky traps will become even more prevolant because we are restricted to predetermined routes.

b. Terrain. The terrain in 2/1's TOR is in flat and sandy land with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines. There are two (02) main weter transportation routes, the Vinh Bien River in the East and the Yen River in the West. In addition, there are numerous lakes, ponds and paddies where best traffic is heavy.

# 5. 3-2 Functions.

- a. Security Clearances: Nine (09) security clearances were initiated and none were terminated. Bix (06) clearances were required by Communications Section personnel, two (02) were required by S-2 Section personnel and one (01) was required by a Lieutenant attending Registered Fublications School.
- b. <u>ARVN Interpreters</u>: Due to the reassignment of interpreters within the I Corps Headquarters, the S-2 Section new has four (O4) interpreters. They are assigned to different units to aid in "on the spet" interpretation of detained information and any documents which need an interdiate readcut.
- c. <u>S-2 lerscnnel</u>: Two (O2) now personnel joined the **S-2** Section this menth. The S-2 Scouts continue to work as a Battalien Recon Squrd.
- d. <u>VI Funds</u>: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Irogram Funds remain a part of the S-2 function. i total of 11,500 VN\$ were spent during the month of November. The Voluntary Informant Irogram is not only a source of intelligence information, but it also eliminates the availability of ordnance to the enemy.
- e. KCS irogram: Due to the transfer of one (O1) KCS to the lat Marines 5-2 Section and one (O1) KCS being Ut, there are now a total of ten (10) KCS assigned to the Battalion. By walking with the point man on patrols, the KCS are able to act as an early warning for booby traps and arbushes due to their familiarities with the energy's tactics, habits and signs.
- f. Training: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indectrination training. At this time they are briefed on energy, weather, terrain and the capabilities and functions of the S-2 Section.

- g. Maps: The S-2 Office has a full sumply of maps of 2/1's TWOR and will continue to supply them as needed.
- h. <u>latrol Debriofs</u>: Tatrol debriof forms have been disseminated to all company recon squads in order to maintain an up to date intelligence picture. These forms when filled out are returned to the S-2 Office.
- 1. Special Linison Team: The S-2 Officer has operational control of a Special Linison Team located in Nui Kim Son. With the addition of one (Ol) Lance Corporal, the Special Linison Team now consists of thirteen (13) enlisted personnel. Their function is to act as a special intelligence gathering and pacification source.

PART II SECTION C OPERATIONS

# 1. Operations

- a. Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:
- (1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TWOR to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and LOC, with primary emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to OVN control of important population and occuming centers and to the security of friendly military installations.
- (2) Deploy forces throughout assigned TADR to provide defense of the Da Nang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/suspected mortar/rocket positions, to include water-ways.
- (3) Bo propored to provide a reaction force for relief of Hoa Vang District Hoadquarters and CAP/CUPP's within the TAOR.
- (h) In experation and coordination with FMAF and District Hondquarters, maint in continuous programs to apprade hamlets within the TMOR in accordance with the Pacification Program.
- (5) Provide security for rendsweeps and other engineer projects as required.
  - (6) Support Revolutionary Davelopment Program within MOR.
- (7) Bo propored to be reinforced and committed anywhere in RVN on 12 hour notice.
- (8) Be prepared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other battaliens within the lst Marine Regiment.

# b. Operations.

- (1) The over 11 concept of operation within the TAOR is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patr 1/ambush activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalian TAOR,
- (2) During November, the Battalien utilized both critical terrain and watch towers for abservation posts during the hours of daylight. This tactic not only provided cognizance of many densely vegetated areas and thus potential enemy harbor sites, but also significantly reduced the number of Marine booby trap casualties.





- (3) Long Rango combat patrols continued to operate throughout the TADR. Each rifle company operated such patrols on a continuing basis in those areas targeted by current intelligence information. Long range patrols were conducted in order to increase the amount of ground that was physically occupied and to depart from any possible reliting that may have been established by units departing from and returning to their Patrol Bases on a reg lar schedule.
- (4) Viotnamose civilians continued to turn in large amounts of ordnance to Marines and supplied periodic intelligence. This information, coupled with the employment of norial observers and an extensive U. S. intelligence effort, produced significant results in that no rockets or marters were fired into the Dr Nang vital area from the Battalian's TADR during the manth of November.
- (5) Operations were characterized by continued close comperation and linison with Viotnemese Military and Civilian Officials. The many Regional Forces (RF) and Fopular Forces (PF) units located within the Battalian TMOR carried an ever increasing portion of the defense and safeguarding of their areas. Operation Saturation (Hang Dieu) was extended for eight (08) days and ended at 0600H on 30 Nevember 1970. The concept of this peration was to get Viotnemese military units out into the hamlets and fields on a continuous basis, providing better security for the people and greater control of the countryside. These activities were most of ten joint ventures ensuring the closest of continuation.
- (6) Adapting its tactics to the monsoon season and the channelized lines of communications, the Battelian continued to stress read blocks
  and corden and search operations as the best methods to rest out the
  Viot Cong Infrastructure. Read blocks were run every day on the main
  arteries that traverse the Battelian's Area of Operation. Three corden
  and search operations were run during the month of November and many more
  were in the planning stages for execution during following months.
- (7) During the month of November the concept of tactical mobility was re-emphasized. The companies in the field lightened their loads and were constantly on the move throughout the Battalian's TAOR. Such tactical mobility coupled with the flexibility of a swing company gave the Battalian the capability of rapidly reacting to intelligence reports and targets of apportunity. During the month of Herember the Battalian participated in six (06) quick reaction type apporations, both inside its TAOR and outside, resulting in thirteen (13) enemy KIA, two (02) NVA PWS eleven (11) VC detainess, and the capture of two (02) tens of rice and

# 2. Air Support.

a. The Battalian's air support for the month of November was hampered by inclement weather and a restriction on fire support which included close air support (CAS). Also, due to inclement weather, liaison runa normally facilitated by visual recommissance (VR) flights were of ten

either rescheduled or conducted by vehicle. Helicopters were obtained from MAG-16 and OV-10, normal observation aircraft, from MAG-11.

- b. The Battalian had a total of thirty-two (32) medevac missions in Nevember, evacuating thirty-eight (38) personnel. There were sixteen (16) U. S. emergency, four (04) U. S. priority, one (01) U. S. permanent routide, five (05) emergency civilian, nine (09) priority civilian, two (02) ARVN emergency, and one (01) ARVN priority. The shortest delay for an emergency medevac was nine (09) minutes. The langest delay for an emergency medevac was forty-four (44) minutes. The average time for all emergency medevac missions was sixteen (16) minutes. This time was computed as time elapsing from the mement when the medevac was called into the Battalian COC until the casualty was airborne.
- c. There were twenty-eight (28) resupply missions flown during November. This included 164 serties, carrying 250,650 pounds and 214 passengors.
- d. Twenty-four (24) visual recommaissance (VR) missions were completed during the month of November. The VR was utilized for limiten runs, visual recommissance, and the administrative transfer of passengers.
- e. There was one (01) heliberse assault during November. This included thirteen (13) lifts carrying 227 passengers.
- f. Five (05) aerial observation (AO) missions were flown, two (02) of which were utilized during the heliborne assault.

The remaining three (03) were used to observe areas of suspected energy locations, ammunition caches, and possible rocket launch sites.

g. Due to the restriction on fire support, no close air support (CAS) missions were flown during November. On one occasion a flare ship was utilized to provide illumination for an engaged unit.

# 3. Artillery and Fire Support.

- a. Artillary fire support for the 2d Battalian, lat Marines was provided by Battery "B", lat Battalian, 11th Marines and three (03) tubes of Battery "W", lat Battalian, 11th Marines. Reinforcing fires were provided by two (02) Millail 155mm Howitzers attached to Battery "B", lat Battalian, 11th Marines and "B" Flatcon, 2d Eight Inch Guns.
- b. 1st Battalian, 11th Marines remained in direct support of 1st Marines during Hovember with Battery "B", 1st Battalian, 11th Marines and "B" Flatoon, 2d Eight Inch Guns collected on Hill 55.
- c. There were no observed missions fired in support of allied units in the Battalian TAGR. Also, there were no pre-emptive or intelligence

targets fired during Nevember. There were no artillery rounds expended in support of 2d Battalien, 1st Marines during Nevember.

- d. The Slam mortar platean fired four (Oh) observed missions, all of which were contact illumination missions fired in support of units engaged with the enemy. There were no properfires on targets fired in support of the Camp Louer defenses. The platean expended 200 illumination rounds during November. One (Ol) norter section was located in the Camp Louer Combat Base (BTO81703), one (Ol) section at Sea Incher (BTO82698), one (Ol) tube at the 17th Armored Cavalry Compound (AT990673).
- o. Due to the high density of civilian population and the provisions of 1st Marine Division message 181520Z October 1970, there were no promptive or intelligence fires fired into the 2d Rattelien, 1st Marines TAGR.

# l. Training

- a. Training consisted of indoctrination training for replacements, plateen rehabilitation training, formal schools and refresher training as required.
  - b. The replacement inductrination course was broken down as follows:
- 5 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel initial. ly coming into the Republic of Vietnam. During the month of November, forty-four (141) Marines completed the course. The subjects included: MPC and Plastor Sponding, Pay and Allowances, Emorgoncy Leave, Rocard of Emorgoncy Data, Evac/Casualty Procedures, CAP Program, R&R, Postal Rogulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Roligions based on Customs of Wiet Nam, Moral Guidence, Red Gross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TAOR/Weather, Encmy Forces, Encmy Tactics, Regards Programs, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromise, War Trophles, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading, Employment of Saipers, Battolion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MLCV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushos and Counter Ambushos, Demolitions and Dostruction of Booby Traps, Booby Trays, Booby Tray Lone, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnomese Customs/Porseand Response, Chieu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Viotnamese People, Conduct/Attitude Toward Vietnamese Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotics, Alcohol, Logal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Weapons, Bucky Aid, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygione, Proventative Medicine, Venereal Discase, Inti-Malaria Monsuros, Military Docorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, 60mm Mortar, Claymore Minos, Grenado Safety and M-26 Fragmontation Gronado, M-16 Al Rifle, Care and Claming, Bettelion Range Regulations, Fem Firing, Zeroing Weapons, and Quick Firo/Quick Kill.
- (2) 3 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel joining the Battelion from other "in country" commands. This training was designed to disteminate requirements and tactics relevant to the Battelionic TAOR. Twenty-five (25) Marines completed this course during the month of November. The subjects included: Tactical Update, Legal Considerations, Viotamese Relations, Religion and Personal Wolfare, Quick Fire/Quick Kill, Military Bearing and Leadership, Booby Trap Lane, Countermeasures for Mines and Booby Traps, Night Fire "X", OCC Brief, Communications Security, Personal Affairs and Legistics.
  - c. On 2, 3, and 4 November the Mine/Booby Trap Mobile Contact Toam

from the lat Marine Division Inspector's effice gave instruction to a total of 125 Marines in the Battalian.

k. In November a total of thirty-five (35) Marines from the Battelion, attending three (03) different five (05) day sessions, graduated from the Landmine Warfare Resident Course as presented by the lat Engineer Britislion. The Battalian new has 385 Marines who have completed the course.

It In November 213 Marines underwent Quick Fire/Quick Kill training. The Battelien had 300 Marines who completed familiarization firing this month. Thirty-four (3h) hours of this instruction were completed on the Battelien 1,000 inch range and eight (08) hours on the general purpose range.

#### FART II SECTION E LOGISTICS

# Logistics

- a. During Nevember, resupply of operating units was accomplished by helicopter and trucks. There were a total of 164 helicopter resupply lifts with a combined weight of 250,650 pounds. Trucks legged agreed instelly 7,750 read miles.
- b. There were five work orders completed during the month. Now front and rear gates to Camp Lauer were constructed and installed. Fields of fire were cleared around the camp's lower perimeter. A SEL but was constructed at the Main Gate of Camp Lauer for the processing of Ticonomese civilian workers. Two work orders requesting mount-out boxes were completed when materials for fifteen boxes were delivered.
- c. Two new work orders were submitted during the month; one requesting construction of a rope bridge at Ha Dong for tactical use by our CWI units and the other requesting that the Stack arms Pavillion be rewired.
- d. During the menth of Nevember, the Battalion's Laundry Unit washed and dried approximately 20,700 pounds of clothing.

# 2. Motor Transport

- a. ..s of 29 November four (04) M274 mules are on deadline, one M3/81 personnel carrier and two (02) M151A1.
- b. Irosontly we are one MiSIAL short. We rate this vehicle as a special allowance and it is presently on order. Three (03) now jeens were drawn from Rolling Stock at FLC to replace three (03) code H vehicles.
- c. We have added a monthly reschooling program for all webicle operators to help them keep abreast of the latest developments in the fields of safety and maintenance.
- d. With the arrival of Monscon Senson emphasis has been placed on proventive maintenance. To accomplish this we have installed the "Mr. Stables" concept of proventive maintenance into our system.
- e. We have gained one (01) 3516 mechanic and two (02) 0311 persone? this worth and have lost one (01) 3531 driver.

# 3. Supply

- a. One (O1) Staff Sergoant, 3041, retated during this menth. Also, an additional 3041 and a 3051 joined the section during the menth.
- b. Shortages that proviously existed for combat boots have recently been alleviated.
- c. The warehouse section is presently transferring bulk items from old experkation boxes to never boxes. A recent embarkation inspection revealed the existence of invioquate storage boxes in use by the Battalian, i.e. mahagany wood was utilized whereby pine should have been used.
- d. The C-ration storage point has been moved from the outside storage to an area within the warehouse. Better central can be exercised over the issue and receipt of the above item.
- o. Ninety-three (93) M-16 Rifles were turned into FLC. This action was taken in order to make the quantity on hand correspond with the current authorized T/E i.e. 1132.



# 1. Civil Aff irs/Civic Action

- the area of public works. The month of November was a fairly active one in the area of public works. Ten (10) pieces of plywood work given to the R.D.'s of Muon Tran to be made into anti VC and pro GN signs Twenty-four (24) pieces of tin, and fifty (50) pieces of plywood word delivered to Le Son for the repair of the school damaged during the sterms. Ten (10) bags of coment, and numerous pieces of plywood, were delivered to Tan Lun for the school project now very near activation. A swing set was completed in Hea Long Village next to the Sec Tany School. Several large sections of old canvas, collected from Sea Archae, word taken to the old church in Hea Long Village for the patching of movies. Then (10) again the old church is to be used for the showing of movies. Then (10) again limit signs were erected in the villages throughout the MeR in an effort to reduce the number of traffic accidents.
- b. Volfare. During November, a total of 1/1,000 \$VN was paid for local hiro and the AIK (Assistance In Kind) employment fund. This program accomplished two basic things; first, it enabled needy Viotnamese to earn money on a daily basis for their food, etc., second, it provided a temporary work force that could perform many of the mental tasks throughout the contonment i.e., police, burning of feces, etc., which freed that many more Marines for other uses. There were twolve (12) Vivenesses working for the Battalian under the AIK (Issistance In Kind) are gram. They worked and were paid on a daily basis, and received a maximum of 150 \$VN per day.
- c. Education. This month the new school in Tan Luu fishing hamble was nearly completed. Building materials for the school, came from scrap lumber that was given to the S-5 by 1st Engineers Battalian and from materials taken by the P.S.D.F. and the R.D.'s from the old Sea Anchor area. Requests for tin and materials to repair the roofs of all the schools that were damaged during the wind storms were turned into District. Relief was primised in the near future.
- d. Hoalth. A daily MEDCAP was carried on in the S-5 Office, and this past month, a total of 217 people were treated for medical problems. In addition to this, field MEDCAPS were hold in the various hadlets several times each month. A total of 273 HEDCAP patients were treated in the field during November. During the month of Hovember there was a total of three (03) civilians medevaced to local hospitals for treatment of serious injuries, severe cooking burns, skin diseases, and dog bites that could have resulted in rabies.


To aid in health improvement in the New Life Hunlets, excess food from the Battalian messhall was distributed to the local officials and

from there to needy refugees. The introduction of fresh vegetables and meat into their diet, even on a temporary basis, provided them with much more partien, and vitamins so necessary for good health. It also served to raise their spirits and increase the good relations between the local populace and the farines in their area. In November, include (12) cases of temptoes, four (04) cases of lettuce, trentaging (13) cases of lemons, and six (06) cases of cucumbers were delivered to in Smallean Cau. 

- f. Solation. A total of 8,000 NN was paid in solations this past month for two (02) incidents resulting in two (02) deaths. Both deaths occurred from traffic accidents. One (01) solation was paid out for the death of a Viotamose woman that was struck by an unidentified 4000 vehicle near to Sen. The second incident involved a vehicle from NE CAG. Near Kurn fra Viotamose child was killed when he stapped into the path of the vehicle. In regard to the traffic accidents, driven safety classes were periodically held for 2/1 drivers which emphasized the traffic problems encountered in Viotam and how to prevent accidents in the future.
- g. Personal Response. A total of ninety-nine (99) enlisted montant four (04) officers joined the Bittelian during the month of November end were given an indestrination brief a vering the many facets of Civil Affairs and personal response. Personal Response literature was distributed throughout the indestrination classes by the S-5.



#### PART II SECTION G COMMUNICATIONS

# 1. Communications

- a. During Hovember the Communications Plateon provided and maintained all normal communications for the Battalien. In addition, several Advance Command Post displacements were conducted, providing excellent training and experience for communications personnel. A courtesy Command Material and Management Inspection was conducted by the lst Marines Communications Officer and members of his staff, which also proved valuable in reparation for the upcoming Division CMM. Minor discrepancies were noted and action is being taken to correct those.
- b. Radio Rolay Section. This Section continued it's normal function in support of the Battelion by providing radio relay channels to let Marine Regiment Readwarters. A total of 5-k% downtime was experienced, primarily due to power failure at either the Regimental of Battelion terminals. Malfunction of radio relay equipment accounted for a minority of downtime.
- c. Radio Section. The Radio Section functioned normally in providing and maintaining tactical, administrative and legistical radio nots for the Battalian. Utilization of a diffective lat of BA-4386 batteries in KT-38 cipher equipment resulted in verheating and bursting or expanding of the batteries, but no serious damage was noted. Personnel of the Section conducted inventories of communications equipment of the rifle companies and provided instructions to Company and Plateon operators in waterproofing, operation and maintenance, in addition to Communications Security.
- d. Wire Section. The Battelian and Guard Saitchboards continued normal functions by providing internal tire communications for the Battalian Command Post. Calar coding CP was completed. Terminal Boards have been considerably improved upon by relocation and/or straightening. A thorough policing of excess thre was completed throughout the contonuous by removal and destruction of old, dead wiring.
- e. Mossage Center Section. Teletype and Courier message traffic for the month of November totaled 35 outgoing and 800 incoming messages. 29% downtime was experienced for the teletype not due class entirely to the power failures during the month.
- f. Electronics Maintenance Section. In addition to normal second echolon maintenance operations, personnel of this Section were instrumental in conducting training for rifle company operators in first echolon maintenance procedures, waterproofing and construction and utilization of field expecient antennas.

g. Ground Power Section. Contourout power was considerably reduced during the month as a result of the deadlining of one of the Battalian's two 150KV generators for approximately two weeks. It became necessary to disconnect various power lines within the Command Post to allow the functioning generator to carry the necessary load requirement. The rewiring of all perimeter lights was started. This Section Seccepted and added to it's inventory, two 20KW generators. Numerous minor wiring repairs were conducted in both the Command Post and Stack Arms messhalls.

- d. malysis of routine treatment revealed twenty-tw (22) cases of diarrhea, 150 cases of upper respiratory infection, seventy-four (74) cases of foot disorders, forty-eight (48) cases of skin disorders, seventeen (17) cases of generates, one (01) case of fever of undetermined origin, zero cases of immersion foot, one new case of malaria and no hopatitis. - e. The civilian medical program was active. There were 480 Vietnmese civilians treated for medical reasons, none of which were due to combat related injuries. One Vietnamese civilian was treated for a dental reason.

#### 1. SITUATION.

- 2. MISSION. 2d Bn, 1st Marines continues its mission of preventing indirect fire attacks on the Danang Vital Area and interdicting enemy lines of communications in the Battalion TAOR.

#### 3. EXECUTION.

e. Concept of Operations. The battalion will continue operations in the TAOR but will give up all fixed positions except Camp Lauer, Crownest OF, and Ostrich OF. The rifle companies will be completely mobile, keeping all platoon and company command posts on the move. Patrols will be tasked against specific targets developed by the S-2 and will be company, platoon, or squad sized as the mission requires. Company commanders will plan and execute the patrols in response to missions assigned them. One rifle company will be held at Camp Lauer as a swing company to act as Battalion Reserve and to train or execute special operations throughout the TAOR. The swing company assignment will be rotated bi-weekly. A CUPP Platoon will be established at Hill 55 to administer and control the CUPP's in the TAOR as well as coordinate fires and manuser around Hill 55. Fire support will be provided by organic company mortars, 81mm mortars at central locations, and artillory at Camp Lauer and Hill 55.

#### b. Hes Company.

(1) Continue defense of Comp Lewer and manning of Crowsnest OF and Ostrich OP.

(2) Provide one full infantry sound, including corponen, from 1069R Platoon for attachment to the CUPP Platoon at Will 55. This squad will be a "swing" CUFP to relieve other CUPP's on a rotational basis. It will report to CUPP Platoon on 15 November.

Resupply helicopters will be directed to bases being reduced on 12 and 13 November to retrograde serviceable material.

(2) OP watch towers at BT073669, BT089672, BT044687, and AT977673 will be manned during the day by no more than a squad; during the night the towers will be manned only when weather and moon conditions permit night observation. On those nights when towers are not manned routes of

approach to the towers will be ambushed.
