3. Order of Bastle: Although there are to EVA main force units located as a oni, in 2/1's POR, there has been significant energy movement resulting in an Order of Battle change supremoting our TOR.

4. Thather and Terruin.

a. Forther. The average high temperature was the degrees and the average law temperature was 69 degrees with an everage handling of 82%. Rain for the month was 10.92.



Due to the fact that 2/1's TAOR is in the lowland area, flooding can be expected over 94% of the area during the monsoon. The flooding ing of the lowland areas will cause a channelization of both friendly and enemy travel. It is felt by S-2, 2/1 that booky traps will become even more provolant because we are restricted to predetermined routes.

b. Torrain. The terrain in 2/1's TAOR is in flat and sandy land with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines. There are two main water transportation routes, the Vinh Dien River in the East and the Non River in the West. In addition, there are monorous lakes, pends and paddies where beat traffic is heavy.

5. S-2 Functions.

- a. Security Cleareness: Eight security cleareness were initiated and none were terminated. Soven were required by Communications Section and one was required by S-3 Section.
- b. IRW Interpretors: Due to the reassignment of interpretors within the Hilitary Megion I Headquarters, the S-2 Section now has three interpretors. They are assigned to different units to aid in "on the spot" interpretation of detained information and any documents which need an immediate reador to
- c. S-2 Forsomel: Two new personnel joined the S-2 Section this month. The S-2 Secute centinue to work as a Entirelien Recon Squad.
- d. <u>WIP Funds</u>: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Program Funds romain a part of the S-2 function. A total of 10,050 WH were spont during the month of December. The Voluntary Informant Program is not only a source of intelligence information, but it also eliminates the availability of ordance to the energy.
- c. KC. Program: One KCS joined this Mondayarters increasing the number of scouts to eleven assigned to the Pattalian. By walking with the point man on patrols, the KCS are able to act as an early warning for booky traps and ambushes due to their familiarities with the enemy's tactics, habit and signs.
- f. Training: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indectrination training. At this time they are briefed in enemy, weather, terrain and the capabilities and functions of the S-2 Section.
- g. Maps: The S-2 Office has a full supply of maps of 2/1's TAOR and will continue to supply them as needed.
- h. Special Linison Torm: The S-2 Officer has operational control of a Special Linison team located in Nui Kim Son. The team now consists of thirteen calisted personnel. Their function is to get as a special intelligence gathering and pacification source.



PART II SECTION C OPERATIONS


1. Operations.

- a. Mission. The 2d Cattalion, let wheren a resigned the mission to:
- (1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TADA to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and ICC, with primary emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to GV: control of important population and economic centers and to the security of friendly military installations.
- (2) Doploy forces throughout assigned TOA to provide defense of the Da mang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/amspected mortar/rocket positions, to include anterways.
- (3) Represent to provide a reaction force for relief of No. Vang District Nordounters and CAP/CHP's within the TER.
- (4) In cooperation and coordination with PWIAF and District Honographers, maintain continuous programs to up rade hamlets within the TAOR in accordance with the Pacification Program.
- (5) Provide security for readsmeeps and other engineer projects as required.
 - (6) Support Revolutionary Dovelo ment Program within TOR.
- (7) Se propaged to be reinforced and committed anothere in RVM on 12 hour notice.
- (6) Be prepared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other battalions within the lat marine Regiment.

b. Operations.

- (1) The overall concept of operation within the TAOR is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrel/ambush activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle commany conducts mobile operations within the Battalian TAOA.
- (2) During December, the Battaline utilized both critical terrain and match tower for observation posts during the hours of daylight. This tactic not only provided cognizance of many densely vegetated areas and

thus potential enemy harbor sites, but also significantly reduced the number of Marine books trap casualties.

- (3) Victumese civilians continued to turn in large amounts of ordnance to Marines and supplied periodic intelligence. This information, coupled with the employment of acrial observers and an extensive F.S. intelligence effort, produced significant results.
- (4) Operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and limited with Victuanese Military and Civilian Officials. The many Regional Forces (F) and Popular Forces (F) units located within the Mitalian Tidd carried an ever increasing position of the defense and safeguardia, of their areas. Operation Saturation II (Houng Dieu II) began on 17 December 1970. The concept of this operation was to again get the Victuan se military units out into the hamlets and fields on a continuous basis, providing better security for the people and pronter control of the countryside. These activities were most often joint ventures ensuring the closest of coordination.
- (5) Adopting its thatics to the mensorn season had the channelized lines of communications, the lattalien continued to stress road blocks had corden and search operations as the best methods to root out the Viet Gong Infrastructure. Read blocks were run every day on the main arteries that traverse the lattalients area of the ration. We corden and search operations were hold during the menth due to thatical commitments outside of the lattalien M.
- (6) The operational highlight of the worth was the eight day period that the lattalion jume Command Post and two companies operated in the One Son Kountains. The lattalion did not make any significant contact but learned some valuable les ons about mountain operations. The operations run in the Mattalian's Thol evidenced the continued Batalion contact of quickly reacting to any intelligence targets that developed.

2. Air Support.

- n. The 68thalian's air support for the mouth of December was, again, hampered by inclument weather and a restriction on fire support which included Close Air apport (CAS). Also due to inclument weather, livison runs normally facilitated by visual recompassance (VR) flights were often either rescheduled or conducted by vehicle. All aircraft were provided by the lat Harine Aircraft Wing, except for one CA-Sh (Flying Crane) which was obtained from the Anny.
- b. The littelies had a total of twenty-six medevac missions during Duccabor, concerting forth personnel. The medevacs included fourtoen U.S. energency, seven W.S. priority, one U.S. routine, three civilian




omorganer, six civiling routing, cight RVN macroner, and on. RVN priority. The languated at for an energency moderne was thirty-five minutes and the shortest delay was seven minutes. The average time for all emergency moderne missions was seventeen minutes. This time was computed as time classing from the moment the necessary was called into the fatality COC entil the casualty was airborne.

- c. There were thenty-five resup ly missions flown during December. This included 152 serties carrying 180,900 parais and 510 passengers.
- d. Trouty-five visual recommissance missions were completed during the month of December. The VR was utilized for limited rous, visual recommissance, and the administrative transfer of passengers.
- o. There were two heliberne assaults during December. The first consisted of four lifts carrying 128 passengers and the second consisted of fourteen lifts carrying 242 passengers.
- f. Five period observation (40) missions were flown. One was utilized during a heliborne assault, the assisted in hir strikes, and two were used for observation by units in the field.
- g. Due to the restriction on fire support only four flights of direct utilized during December. They dere need to prop a heavily boody trapped area and possible enemy haven site. They dropped a total of the bombs were dudy.

3. Artillary and Fire Support.

- a. Artiller fire support for the 2d Battalion, lat Mirines was provided by Battary "B", let Battali n, llth Firines and three tubes of Battary "W", let Battalion, llth Hirines. Reinforcing fires were provided by by Millan 155mm Fruitzers attached to Battary "B", let Battalion, llth Harines and "E" Plate n, 2d Tight Each Guas.
- b. 1st ratualism, 11th Marines remained in direct separat of 1st Marines during December with lattery """, 1st Nathalian, 11th Marines and "B" Plates, 2d Eight Inch Gas called Sed a Hill 55.
- c. Five observed missions were first by Attern WW, let Dittalian, lith Harines in support of 2d Authalian, let Darines. This missions were first in a pre-cleared artillery by 1000684 to 10085685 to 80091675 to 80085675. - d. The Olma Mortar Platoon fired twenty-two observed missions, all of which were fired in a pre-cleared artillery box. 1048 rounds High Explosive, sixty-five rounds White Phosphorous, and 445 rounds Illumination were fired during the month of December. One mortar section was located in Camp Lawer Combat Bise (ETO&1703), one section at Son Anchor (ETO&2698), one tube at Hill 55 and one tube at 157th RF Compound (ETO\$3671).
- e. During the operations in the Que Son Mountains, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was supported by Mattery "S", 2d Battalion, 11th Murines with one 155mm Howitzer and by Pattery "N", 2d Battalion, 11th Marines with four 4.2 inch morters. The Shum morters provided three tubes for the operation. The Shum morters fixed 100 rounds Migh Explosive, 140 rounds Illumination, and twenty-five rounds White Phospherous in support of the operation.



PART II SECTION D TRAINING

1. Training

- a. Training consisted of indoctrination training for replacements, platoon rehabilitation training, formal schools and refresher training as required.
 - b. The replacement indoctrination course was broken down as follows:
- (1) 5 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Viet Ham. Daring the month of December, seventy-five Marines completed the course. The subjects included: MPC and Piaster Spending, Pay and Allouances, Margency Leavey Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty Procedures, CAP Program, R&R, Postal Ragulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Religions based on customs of Viet Nam, Moral Guidance Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TAOR/Woather, Enony Forces, Emery Tactics, Rewards Programs, Hundling of POWs, Caro of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromise, War Trophics, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Roading and Aorial Photos, Paramord and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Mavigation, Employment of Snipers, Battalian Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MaCV Indes of Engagement, Viotnamese irmed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Demolitions and Destruction of Bubby Traps, Booky Traps, Booky Trap Lano, Compass, Saill Unit Tactics, Implyment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Viotnamese Customs/Pers.nal Response, Chiou Hoi Pregram, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Victnamoso Copple, Conduct/Attitude Toward Victnamose Mationals, Victnamose Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Marcotics, Mechal, Loyal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Weapons, Raddy Lin, Heat Casualties, Personal Hydicae, Proventative Modicino, Veneral Diseaso, Anti-Malaria M.asres, Military Docurum, Local Regulations, Military Courtery and Discipline, Marpons Safety, 60mm Mortor, Claym ro Mines, Gronado Safety and M-26 Fragmentation Grenade, N-16 Al Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalian Jange Regulations, Fam Firing, Zerbing of Mempons, and Quick Tire/Quick Kill.
- (2) 3 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel joining the Battalien from other "in country" commends. This training was designed to disseminate requirements and theties relevant to the Battalien's TAOR. Thirty Marines completed this course during the month of December. The subjects included: Tactical Update, Logal Considerations, Victuatese Relations, Reli ion and Personal Wolfare, Omick Fire/Quick Kill, Military Bearing and Leadership. Booby Trap Lane, Countermeasures for Mines and Booby Traps, Night Fire "X", COC Brief, Communications Security,





Pursonal Affairs and Logistics.

- c. On 1 and 2 December the Mine/Broby Trap Mobile Contact Torn from the 1st Engineer Bettalian instructed 262 Marines and Navy Coromon on VC mines and beeby traps. On 26 and 27 December the Mobile Contact Term instructed 244 Marines on military explosives, special and improvised charges,
- d. On h_{\bullet} 5 and 21 December Gulf, For and Motel Companies received a special two hours lacture on Mountain Tips.
- e. On the 14th of December the Battalion graduated busive men from it's patrol Leaders School. The purpose of the school was to teach advanced patrol leading techniques to sound leaders and potential squad leaders. The school was a reusing success as it or duced karaledgeable and enthusiable graduates. The school included instruction in him to desing, Terrain Appreciation, Warning Orders, Patrol Orders, Reporting Procedures, Combat Intelligence, The PRC-25 Radio, First Lid, Patrol Taps, Rappelling, and Bubber Beat Maintenance an Handling. The instruction was presented by the let Recon Battalian.
- f. During the month of December 3h9 Marines received practical application on the Battalian Booby Trap Land during the hours of daylight and another 240 men received practical application during the hours of darkness.
- g. On 28 December the Britislian had three men graduate from the 1st Marine Division Victorianse Lacyvage Culture Course.
- h. In December 698 Marines from this Butt lien were instructed in Quick Fire/Quick Kill and few fired their individual meapons, to include, three rifle company. Forty hours were spent on the 1,000 inch range and bulve hours on the general purpose range.
- i. During the month two officers completed RPS School conducted in Okianna.
- j. During the north of December training was alowed dam considerably due to the Battelian's operational conmitments.



PART II SECTION 3 LOGISTICS

l. L istics

- a. During December, resupply of operating units was necessalished by helic oter and trucks. There were a total of the helicopter resupply lifts with a combined weight of 180,900 pounds. Trucks logged approximately 5,900 road miles.

1. Civil 'If irs/Civic ction

- a. Public Torks. The month of December was a fairly active one in the area of public works. Seventeen wooden planks which were cut into 2xhs, and simily base of coment were delivered to Hoa Long Village for the construction of a dew office building for Chief Tran. On our request, the Air Force storage provided the building supplies for the office. They are being allocated to the construction site as progress is made. Ten base of coment, ten gellons of green paint, and thirty pieces of plywood were delivered to Tan Luu, which completed the building of a new school. A new school is under my in Le Son. So far, thirty-nine pieces of tin, fifty pieces of plywood, five pounds of nails and eight wooden plants have been delivered. Ten brockloads of assorted sized alymood was delivered to Xuan Tra to aid in construction of twenty-eight now houses.
- bi Welfare. During December a total of Mi,000 NK mas paid for local hire and the AIK (assistance in Kind) employment fund. This program accomplishes two basis things; first, it employs needy Vistamese to earn money on a daily basis for their food, sto., Secondly, it provides a temporary work force that can perform many of the menial tasks throughout the employee it.o., police, burning of feece, etc., which from that many more Harinesion other functions. At present there are twelve Victaryes working for the Battalian endor the AIK (Assistance in Kind) program. They work and are paid on a daily basis, and receive a maximum of 1505WH per day.
- e. Education. This month the new school in Tan Low has been completed, that a new school is under construction in Lo Son. Building materials for both schools come from scrap lumber that was given to the S-5 by lot Eveneer Buttalion and from materials taken by S-5 members from the old Sea Anchor area. One hundred school kits were delivered to Lo Son. The hits consisted of too the sto, chalk, sencils, chalk boards, seap, writing ands, too the brushes, and various other asserted needs.
- d. Morlith. A daily modean is empired on in the S-5 office which this worth treated a total of 211 people. 1. Modical and Dontel

- a. The Buitelina Surgeons are Lt. R. D. COX, MC, USHR and Lt. R. L. FIDEB, MC, USH. The Buttelina Chief is IMC G. L. ADMIS, USH. During this reporting period the Buttelina had three officers (two Medical Corps and one Chaplain Corps), and fifty-one enlisted in the field and garrism.
- b. The Pattalian Aid Station treated six hundred and sixty-nino patients during the manth. The Division reventative Medicine Units Menthly Sanitation Inspection Report was submitted and the discrepancies were noted and corrected.
- c. Analysis of routine treatment revealed seventeen cases of diarrhea, one hundred and thirty-four cases of upper respiratory infection, eighty-six cases of fact disarders, fifty-two cases of skin disorders, furteen cases of imporsion fact, two new cases of unlaria, and no heartitis. There were two hundred Devial Patients seen.
- c. The civilian medical program was active. There were too hundred and forty Victormese civilians treated for medical reasons, none of which were the to embat related injuries. Throw Victormese civilians were treated for deatal rose us.
- f. There were one USHC, zero Victoraese civilians, and zero wounded Viet Cong evacanted.
- g. Two was a total of eighty-one Patients sent on consultation to 1st McCical Battalien or 95th Evacuation Hospital.
- h. There were twenty-three dental patients sent to 1st Medical Battalian on consultation.

1. Chaplain.

- c. Six moral-guidance lectures were given to lill enlisted men, eight hospital visits were mide for 51 patients, and one visit to the brig to see throughtsoners was completed.

- o. The Entration Chaplain represented the 2nd Bittelion, 1st Marines at two Command Receptions: for Terrence Cardinal COCKS, Archbishop of all Catholics in the 1.5. military, on 22 December; and for Mari Frank GARRETI, Chief of Chaplains, on 24 December.
- f. This is the last chronology to be written by the uncorsigned, since he will be succeeded by Lt. William C'ACD, C'C, Will, on 2 January 1971. The uncorsigned takes this experiently to express his gratified and normal admiration for the outstanding support of this Command and its members toward every aspect of the Chapel program.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- (1) On 1 and 2 December 1970 the Mobile Contact Team from 1st Engineer Battalion instructed 262 Marines on VC mines and booby traps.
- (2) On 2 December 1970 the Assistant Division Commander, Brigadier General Simmons, visited the Battalian and inspected the Booby Trap Lane.
- (3) On 4 December 1970 at 1415H Golf Company was opconned to the 5th Marines.
- (4) On 7 December 1970 a Vietnamese SEAL Team was inserted into Finger Lake (BTO80685) to commence a three company operation. When the SEAL Team was extracted two Marine rifle companies and one RF company put a corden around Finger Lake and a VC haven site. Air strikes and mortars pounded the haven site. A detailed search was then conducted of the haven site. The results, so far, were one VC KIA, three rifles captured, 1,350 AK-47 rounds captured, approximately forty booby traps discovered, seven 81mm mortar rounds found, four 61mm mortar rounds captured, ten grenades found, 350 blasting caps recovered, one dead make in a shallow grave, and approximately six pounds of documents. The search was still going on the first of January.
- (5) On 7 Docember 1970 Echo Company conducted a heliborne assault on In Huan (2) Hamlet while the 51st ARVN Regiment threw up blocks to the north, east, and south. Utilizing Engineer Terms, scout dogs, CIT, ITT, Vietnamese interpreters and a Vietnames source approximately eighty tillagers were screened and ten were detained. Seven bunkers were found and destroyed. One 8" dud was found and destroyed. Documents were found and turned ever to CIT. The operation was terminated and Echo Company was extracted by heli—opter at 1800H on the 7th.
- (6) On 14 December 1970 twelve Marin's from the Battalion completed Patrol Landers School presented by the 1st Recon Battalion.
- (7) On 16 December 1970 a Bittalion jump CP, the third plateon of Echo Company, and Hotel Company joined Golf Company in being opcound to the 5th Marines. This two company (+) force operated in the Que Son Mountains until 23 December 1970. The operation notted seven dead VC/NVA bodies, ten B-40 rockets with boosters, thirty-eight boxes of Chi-com pull friction fuses, four blasting caps, and one can of det cord.
- (8) On 17 December 1970 operation Hoang Dieu II commenced.
- (9) On 22 December 1970 the 1st plateon of Fox Company was hit by an

unknown number of energy at 2345H. Four Marines were medewacod. Energy losses were unknown.

- (10) On 26 and 27 December 1970 the 1st Engineer Buttalion Mobile Contact Torm instructed 244 men from the Buttalion on mulitary explosives, special and improvised charges.
- (11) On 29 December 1970 the CEPP Caster unit was hit by an uninown onemy force. On Tarino and one RF were KIA and three Marines were wornded. Enemy losses were unknown.
- (12) During the month of December 105 Marines joined the Batualian, including five officers and five Staff MCO's. Seventy-five men completed the five day injectrination course. The three day indectrination course graduated the other thirty Marines.
