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SECTION II: PERSONNEL/ADMINISTRATION

A. Summary. During September, the 3d Battalion, 1st Marines continued normal operations within the assigned Tactical Area of Responsibility (TAOR). Personnel/Administration functions were conducted in a normal manner except as noted in the succeeding paragraphs.

B. Significant Events

1. Awards

a. On 20 September 1966, Hospital Corpsman Third Class Michael W. MacKILIN was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroic achievement displayed during Operation UTAH.

b. During the same awards ceremony, twenty-seven Marines of this organization were awarded the Purple Heart Medal for wounds received as a result of hostile action against the enemy.

2. Casualties. The battalion sustained casualties totaling eight marines and one navy corpsman killed in action; two marines died of wounds; seventy-eight marines and six navy corpsmen were wounded in action. There was one nonbattle casualty.

3. Transfers. The battalion transferred nine Marine officers, eighteen staff noncommissioned officers, and ninety-one enlisted marines to other 1st Marine Division units or to the Continental United States. Concurrently, the battalion joined five marine officers, one navy officer, nine staff noncommissioned officers, and 195 enlisted marines. The personnel combat readiness category dropped from C-2 to C-3 during this period.

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SECTION III. INTERVIEW

A. Summary of Enemy Activity. Enemy contact throughout the month was moderate; the most significant was the VC attempts to disrupt the Vietnamese Elections on 11 September. The other major contacts were the attack on India Company Command Post on 21 September and the grenade attack on the Kilo Company Command Post on 26 September. Other significant occurrences are as listed in Section IV (Operations/Training).

B. Recapitulation of Enemy Activity.

1. Contacts. A total of one hundred and seven contacts were made during the month of September.

c. Weather and Terrain

1. Weather. September marked the beginning of the Northeast monsoon with its increased cloudiness and thunder storms. During most of the month, the weather was generally partly cloudy, warm and humid. Late evening and early morning temperatures were mostly cool. Total rainfall for the month was 7.30 inches.

2. Terrain. The terrain in the tactical area of responsibility assigned to this Battalion consists primarily of rice paddies, low sandy hills and many small streams and waterways, none of which pose any significant problems under normal conditions. Trafficability of secondary roads by normal vehicles is greatly reduced during and after periods of extensive rainfall.

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SECTION IV/ OPERATIONS/ TRAINING

A. Operations

1. During September, 3d Battalion, 1st Marines continued operations within its assigned Tactical Area of Responsibility, Danang Combat Base, by conducting extensive security patrols/ambushes, Company size search and clear operations, and four County Fairs. The preponderance of patrol and ambush activity was conducted during the hours of darkness.

2. From 1 to 3 September, in cooperation with Hoa Vang District Headquarters, the 3d Battalion, 1st Marines conducted County Fair operations in the following hamlets: Thi An (2), Khai Tay (3), Tu Cau (1), vicinity coordinates BT 034674, BT 047667, and BT 036663 respectively. Forces participating included: Company L, 3d Battalion, 1st Marines; 4th Platoon, Company L, 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion; 3d Platoon (-), Company C, 1st Tank Battalion; detachment, 244th Psychological Warfare Company; Psychological Warfare Team, Hoa Vang District Headquarters; elements, 4th Battalion, 51st ARVN Regiment. This operation was executed utilizing Company L, 3d Battalion, 1st Marines as a blocking force to cordon each target hamlet while the 4th Battalion, 51st ARVN Regiment conducted a detailed, systematic search of the hamlet and channeled all inhabitants to a predesignated assembly area. The detachment from the 244th Psychological Warfare Company, in conjunction with the Hoa Vang District Psychological Warfare Team, presented propaganda films, tapes, and newsreels at the assembly area. In addition, candy was distributed and motion picture comedies were shown. Meals consisting of rice and meat, provided from civic action sources, but prepared by local women, were fed to all inhabitants. This operation commenced at 010530H and terminated at 031600H. One large tunnel/cave complex approximately 100 meters in length was discovered and destroyed.

3. At 091030H, 4th Battalion, 51st ARVN advisor reported VC sleeping area vicinity coordinates BT 036647 to the north and east. Company L (-), 3d Battalion, 1st Marines, reinforced with section of ONICS and section of tanks, proceeded south and assumed blocking positions from vicinity BT 042665 to BT 050055. At 091310H, Company L (-) (Rein) chopped operational control to the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines to exploit the enemy contact. At 092100H, Company L (-) reinforced returned to operational control of parent unit.

4. From 160900H to 161500H, Company K assumed blocking positions from BT 034657 to BT 060650 in support of search and destroy operation conducted by ARVN forces in 1st Battalion, 1st Marines TAO.

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5. From 105705H to 161500H, Company L (-), reinforced, conducted a detailed and systematic search of the east and west banks of the Song Yen River in cooperation with 2d Battalion, 26th Marines. Objective area included from AT 968698 to AT 965665. Several tunnel/cave complexes were discovered and destroyed.

6. From 27 to 28 September, in cooperation with Hoa Vang District Headquarters, the 3d Battalion, 1st Marines conducted a County Fair operation within the hamlet of Ba Tung (2), vicinity coordinates BT 042693. Forces participating included: Company L (-) (Rein), 3d Battalion, 1st Marines; detachment, Medical Platoon, H&S Company, 3d Battalion, 1st Marines; 2d Company, 59th Regional Forces Battalion; psychological warfare team and district officials, Hoa Vang District Headquarters; detachment, 1st USMC Scout Dog Platoon; and section, 1st Platoon, Company B, 1st Tank Battalion. This operation was executed utilizing Company L as a blocking force to cordon the target hamlet. Regional Force personnel conducted a detailed search, and channeled inhabitants into an established assembly area where a census was taken and the psychological orientation and MED/CAP programs were conducted. A messing facility was established and meals consisting of rice, soup, and hamstock were prepared by local Vietnamese and distributed to all inhabitants during the two day period. The operation commenced at 270530H, terminated at 281400H, and resulted in the discovery and destruction of four tunnel/cave complexes as well as two CHICOM grenades rigged as mines. In addition, three VC were discovered in a tunnel and killed. Four CHICOM grenades, 175 rounds .30 caliber ammunition, one M-1 rifle, medical supplies, and assorted documents were captured.

7. At the end of the reporting period, the 3d Battalion, 1st Marines in cooperation and coordination with the 59th Regional Forces Battalion and units from 51st ARVN Regiment, continued its program of aggressive patrolling and ambushing in order to ensure positive security and pacification of the battalion TACR.

B. Training

1. Training consisted primarily of on-the-job training. Instruction/application was conducted on basic communications, forward observer procedures, and weapons training for rifle and weapons platoons. Crew-served weapons training consisted largely of techniques of fire and gun drill. Special emphasis was focused on physical conditioning to acclimate recent replacement personnel.

2. The combined rifle and pistol range located adjacent to the battalion command post was utilized by rifle company replacements and personnel from staff sections to zero weapons and for familiarization firing. Additionally, a three hour presentation/application on marksmanship training was conducted for eighteen Popular Force troops on

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14 September 1966.

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3. Formal school training included Land Mine Warfare School conducted by Company B, 3d Engineer Battalion. This presentation/application period placed special emphasis on mine and booby trap detection and destruction. Another six hour course of instruction was attended by fourteen selected personnel to give the companies the capability of blowing mines and booby traps in place in the absence of engineer personnel. Additionally, nine enlisted personnel attended the in-country Vietnamese language School during the month.

4. Critiques on all phases of operations were held by subordinate unit leaders. In this manner, lessons learned were developed and discussed in an effort to profit from previous operations and to improve future operations.

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C. Chronological Narrative of Significant Events

SEPTEMBER

1. At 010100H, vicinity BT 055705, Company M patrol detonated a U.S. M-16A1 anti-personnel mine resulting in one USMC KIA, one USN WIA, and four USMC WIA, (MEDEVAC).
At 010625H, vicinity AT 962687, combined USMC/RF platoon detonated a U.S. M-16A1 anti-personnel mine resulting in one USMC KIA, and three USMC WIA (MEDEVAC).

At 010725H, vicinity BT 077705, C&K ambush fired on four armed VC resulting in two VC WIA probable. A thirteen year old boy who shouted warning to the VC was apprehended and forwarded to ITT as a VCS.

At 011135H, vicinity AT 960683, Company I/RF search and clear force discovered and destroyed four CHICOM grenades rigged as mines.

At 011612H, vicinity BT 090690, Company K patrol apprehended four Vietnamese with improper identification; VCS forwarded to ITT.

At 011630H, vicinity BT 088692, Company K patrol apprehended one Vietnamese male with improper identification; VCS forwarded to ITT.

At 011800H, vicinity BT 042692, Company M patrol discovered and destroyed two CHICOM grenades rigged as mines.

At 012335H, vicinity BT 036678, 4th Bn. 51st ARVN, participating in County Fair, received five grenades in their CP sustaining three WIA, (MEDEVAC). SAF returned, area searched with negative results.
4. At 041300H, vicinity BT 090690, patrol apprehended three Vietnamese with improper identification; VCS forwarded to ITT.

At 041325H, vicinity BT 075700, patrol detonated M-26 grenade rigged as mine sustaining two USMC WIA, (MEDEVAC).

At 041500H, vicinity AT 966691, Vietnamese male pointed out to patrol location of two M-26 grenades and one 60mm mortar round rigged as mines; all three blown in place. Vietnamese rewarded in accordance with 3d Marine Division reward program.

At 041515H, vicinity AT 983694, patrol apprehended three Vietnamese with flag and documents confirmed to be VC by interpreter; VC and captured material forwarded to ITT.

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- 5 At 051400H, vicinity BT 072684, member of patrol wounded when he stepped into punji pit mined with CHICOM grenade; one USMC WIA. (MEDEVAC). An additional CHICOM mine was discovered and destroyed.

At 051420H, vicinity BT 035667, patrol received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). Patrol returned fire and continued mission.

At 051430H, vicinity AT 960685, patrol searched house apprehending three VCS and confiscated visual aids depicting an M-1 rifle and ERC 10 radio. Additional assorted documents and trip wire were found; VCS and material were forwarded to ITT.

At 051540H, vicinity BT 039675, patrol received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA, (MEDEVAC). Patrol returned fire and searched area with negative results.

At 051635H, vicinity BT 058708, Marine on patrol stepped on home made mine device consisting of 30 caliber casing filled with C-3 resulting in one USMC WIA, (MEDEVAC).

At 051730H, vicinity BT 039675, patrol received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA, (MEDEVAC). Patrol returned fire and searched area with negative results.

- 6 At 061035H, vicinity BT 045674, patrol received SAF sustaining one USMC WIA, (MEDEVAC). Patrol returned fire and searched area with negative results.

At 061145H, vicinity AT 967662, patrol received SAF from approximately two VC. Patrol returned fire resulting in one VC KIA. VC's weapon, bolt action Soviet 7.62mm carbine (serial number T0913), recovered.

At 061430H, vicinity BT 082688, patrol member detonated M-26 grenade rigged as mine. Immediately upon detonation of mine patrol received SAF and four M-26 grenades from estimated five VC resulting in one USMC KIA, and four WIA (MEDEVAC). Patrol returned SAF and called artillery on VC positions. Follow up search revealed no evidence of VC casualties.

- 8 At 081915H, vicinity BT 058717, Company L patrol discovered and destroyed used smoke grenade, packed with explosives and rigged with trip wire; blown in place.

- 9 At 090750H, vicinity BT 057712, patrol discovered two Vietnamese; approximately twenty-four to twenty-six years old hiding in house; VCS forwarded to ITT.

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At 090955H, vicinity AT 978675, Marine on patrol tripped an unknown type mine; no casualties. Further search of area revealed no additional mines.

At 091300H, vicinity BT 043664, Company L received SAF from four VC while deploying into blocking positions. Returned SAF; Marine helicopter on station attacked the VC and accounted for one VC KBMA.

At 091625H, vicinity BT 045676, Company M patrol received SAF and one round M-79 resulting in three WIA (MEDEVAC). Returned fire and searched area with negative results. One USMC WIA subsequently died of wounds.

At 091635H, vicinity BT 045676, Company L patrol received SAF from snipers resulting in one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). Returned fire and searched area with negative results.

At 091800H, vicinity BT 045658, Company L discovered and destroyed eight punji pits, four of which were mined with CHICOM grenades with pull wires.

At 092030H, vicinity BT 036684, Company M squad ambush received SAF. As ambush was shifting to new ambush site, VC opened up with SAF; three mortar rounds impacted within the ambush resulting in one USMC KIA and two USMC WIA (MEDEVAC).

10 At 101250H, vicinity BT 047672, patrol discovered and destroyed one CHICOM grenade rigged as a mine.

11 At 111045H, vicinity BT 036676, patrol received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (NONEVAC). Patrol returned fire and searched area with negative results.

At 111615H, vicinity BT 074701, Company K CP received SAF and sustained one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). Returned SAF and 106 mm fire. Search of area revealed one VC KBGF (confirmed).

At 111825H, vicinity BT 063682, patrol received SAF and one round M-79. Returned SAF, M-79 and 3.5mm rocket fire. One VC seen to fall. Villager stated VC carried body off; one VC KBGF (probable).

12 At 120355H, vicinity BT 044686, patrol member detonated a pressure type anti-personnel mine, resulting in one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC).

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- 13 At 131230H, vicinity AT 976672, patrol received SAF from approximately two VC; returned SAF and searched area apprehending one VCS. VCS forwarded to IPT.
- 14 At 140815H, vicinity BT 068685, engineer road clearing team received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (1EDEVAC). Company E patrol searched area with negative results.
- 15 At 150645H, vicinity BT 058710, Company M patrol apprehended one male VCS. Simultaneously, the patrol commenced physical pursuit of another VCS. While in pursuit, the original VCS tripped a grenade rigged as a mine resulting in wounds to himself and one Marine; both were evacuated.
- At 151120H, vicinity BT 033677, Company L patrol received SAF and AMF resulting in one USMC WIA (1EDEVAC). 1EDEVAC helicopter received SAF as it approached landing zone. Escort gunship delivered suppressing fires; VC fire ceased and 1EDEVAC completed.
- At 151255H, vicinity BT 035678, patrol searching large haystack discovered one CHICOM grenade and assorted medical supplies. Owner of haystack apprehended and forwarded to District; material forwarded to Regimental S-2, grenade destroyed.
- At 151345H, vicinity BT 009695, patrol searching isolated house discovered suspected CHICOM papers, 782 gear, and American documents depicting assembly and nomenclature of the M-14 rifle. Material forwarded to Regimental S-2.
- At 151350H, vicinity AT 957682, patrol discovered and destroyed two explosive devices, one a CHICOM grenade rigged as a mine in a punji pit, the other a star cluster casing filled with glass and explosives and sealed with wax.
- At 151825H, vicinity AT 965669, Marine on patrol detonated home-made mine, resulting in one USMC WIA (1EDEVAC). Additionally, two punji pits discovered, one with a .30 caliber cartridge rigged to detonate when stepped on; both destroyed.
- 16 At 160845H, vicinity BT 046659, Company K enroute to blocking position received SAF. Simultaneously, a pressure type mine was detonated resulting in one USMC WIA (1EDEVAC).

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At 161050H, vicinity AT 960660, Company I patrol discovered and destroyed one CHICOL grenade rigged as a mine and one homemade mine consisting of a piece of bamboo filled with blasting powder and rigged with trap wire.

- 18 At 181220H, vicinity AT 976688, Company I patrol received SAF from estimated three VC resulting in two USMC WIA (MDEAVAC). VC broke contact; area searched with negative results.

At 181255H, vicinity BT 080689, Company I patrol engaged by eight to ten VC resulting in one USMC MIA, four USMC WIA (MDEAVAC), one of whom subsequently died of wounds. Artillery fire delivered on VC positions; search of area revealed one VC MIA. Blood trails indicated two VC MIA (probable).

At 182130H, vicinity BT 040722, Company I patrol received SAF from estimated three VC. Patrol returned SAF; search of area revealed one VC MIA. VC weapon, a 9mm pistol, was recovered.

At 182210H, vicinity BT 032713, Company I observation tower security element received two hand grenades and SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (MDEAVAC). Returned SAF and searched area with negative results.

- 19 At 191900H, vicinity AT 975665, Company I command post apprehended two Vietnamese males near perimeter. They had in their possession assorted papers, including sketch map and a large sum of money; VCS forwarded to ITT.

At 191905H, vicinity AT 052692, Company I Command Post received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (MDEAVAC). Perimeter returned fire; search of area produced negative results.

- 20 At 201100H, vicinity BT 974675, Company I patrol member stepped into punji pit resulting in one USMC WIA (MDEAVAC).

At 201115H, vicinity BT 082692, Company I patrol apprehended two Vietnamese youths, ages fifteen and eighteen, attempting to evade the patrol. Both forwarded to ITT.

At 201830H, vicinity AT 973684, Company I patrol challenged three Vietnamese who were attempting to evade patrol. After warning shot failed to stop fleeing Vietnamese, patrol fired.

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one rd. SAF, wounding one VCS, (MED-VAC), and capturing other two. Search of VCS revealed one M-26 grenade and large amount of money. VCS forwarded to IPT.

- 21 At 210910E, vicinity BT 049677, Company M patrol received SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (MED-VAC). Returned fire and searched area with negative results.

At 211310E, vicinity AT 965673, Company I patrol received SAF resulting in two USMC WIA (MED-VAC). Returned SAF and searched area with negative results.

At 211905, vicinity AT 978682, Company I CP received SAF and thirteen rounds of 60mm mortar fire resulting in four USMC WIA (MED-EVAC). SAF and 60mm mortar fire was returned; search of area produced negative results.

- 22 At 221230H, vicinity BT 085695, Company K CP received heavy volume SAF resulting in one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). Returned fire and searched area with no additional contact established.

At 221830H, vicinity BT 084697, 3d Platoon, Company K CP received AWF and SAF from 500 meters resulting in one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). Returned SAF, 106mm, and M-79 fire resulting in two VC WIA confirmed; observation post saw two bodies being carried away. Search of area failed to reestablish contact.

- 23 At 231225H, vicinity BT 038692, Company M patrol apprehended one VCS. While returning to CP, VCS tripped a mine resulting in wounds to himself and two Marines (all MEDEVAC).

At 231430H, vicinity AT 978667, Company I patrol discovered and destroyed a 4.2 mortar round and a punji pit with explosive device. Both devices rigged as mines.

At 231630H, vicinity 978677, Hoa Thai Village Chief, in cooperation with Company I, apprehended nine Vietnamese women and one Vietnamese male he considered to be VCS, plus one additional Vietnamese woman he stated was VCC; all were forwarded to Regimental S-2.

At 231715H, vicinity AT 981687, Company I patrol discovered and destroyed six punji pits. In the same area, a Vietnamese male, whose name appears on blacklist, was apprehended and forwarded to Regimental S-2.

- 24 At 240920H, vicinity BT 053668, Company M patrol received SAF. Patrol returned SAF resulting in one VCS WIA (MEDEVAC). who attempted to escape the area by running.

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At 241430H, vicinity BT 049670, Company I patrol apprehended two Vietnamese females. One woman's name appeared on the VC Black List and the other admitted her brother and father were VC. Both were forwarded to ITT.

At 241645H, vicinity AT 967678, Company I/RF patrol apprehended Vietnamese male attempting to evade patrol; forwarded to ITT as a VCS.

At 241830H, vicinity BT 072702, 3d Platoon, Company K CP received SAF and three rounds M-79 from approximately four snipers resulting in one USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). One ten year old girl was wounded (MEDEVAC) by an incoming M-79 round. Company K returned fire and searched area with negative results.

25 At 252015H, vicinity AT 973664, 3d Platoon, Company I, perimeter observed movement to front and fired two rounds SAF resulting in one VC WIA (MEDEVAC).

26 At 260114H, vicinity BT 078710, Company K CP received heavy volume of SAF and ten grenades resulting in nine USMC WIA (five MEDEVAC). Returned SAF, M-79 and 81mm mortar fire. Search of area revealed two pools of blood, indicating two VC WIA (probable); discarded bloody shirt, trousers, and CHICOM grenade found by searching element. Subsequent report received from intelligence sources of Hoa Long Village Chief indicated that twelve VC had taken part in the attack, and that three had been killed by marine fire.

At 261730H, vicinity AT 978678, Company I patrol discovered and destroyed two punji pits with M-26 grenades rigged as mines.

At 261945H, vicinity BT 077004, Company E while holding I.D. check, detained three suspects who claimed each other were VC. All were forwarded to ITT as VCS.

27 At 271145H, vicinity BT 048694, Company L blocking force received sniper fire resulting in two USMC WIA (MEDEVAC). Returned SAF and checked area with negative results.

At 271200H, vicinity AT 960683, Company I patrol discovered and destroyed a M-26 grenade rigged as a mine.

At 271230H, vicinity AT 996698, Company L patrol searched house and found assorted medical supply items and material for rigging mines. Three Vietnamese living there apprehended and forwarded to Regimental S-2 as VCS.

At 271300H, vicinity BT 041695, Company I/RF patrol, while searching hamlet during conduct of County Fair, discovered and destroyed three caves, four feet, by four feet by fifteen feet. One had underwater entrance.

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At 271400H, vicinity BT 069600, Company L patrol received SAF from approximately ten VC concealed in dense vegetation resulting in four USMC WIA, (MDEWAC). Company L (-) with 1st Platoon, Company K, dispatched to area. VC broke contact under fire; search of area by Company L failed to reestablish contact. Six punji pits, three of which were mined with grenades, were discovered and destroyed. A mine was discovered and destroyed.

- 28 At 280935H, vicinity BT 046698, during County Fair operation, a combined USMC/RF search team killed three VC armed with CHICOM grenades and one M-1 rifle.

At 281135H, vicinity BT 086691, Company K patrol received SA and M-79 fire from estimated twelve VC resulting in one USMC WIA, (MDEWAC). Returned SA and 106mm fire. VC broke contact and patrol continued sweep with no additional contact established.

At 281830H, vicinity BT 084690, Company K defensive position observed six to eight VC at long range moving away from the position. VC taken under fire with two rounds of 106mm and four rounds 4.2 howtar. Search of area following morning revealed one VC KIA KBGF (CONFIRMED).

- 29 At 290830H, vicinity BT 086694, Company K patrol apprehended two Vietnamese males attempting to evade patrol; one subsequently released and the other was forwarded to ITT as VCS.

At 290835H, vicinity 086694, Company K patrol received SAF from approximately seven VC resulting in one USMC WIA, (MDEWAC). Returned SAE, M-79, and 106mm fire; searched area with negative results.

At 291700H, vicinity BT 070696, two vehicles stopped to investigate a mine discovered in road, and were taken under fire by four VC resulting in one USMC WIA (MDEWAC). SAF was returned and the VC broke contact. The mine, determined to be an M-16 packed in twenty pounds of explosive and glass, was removed and destroyed.

- 30 At 301030H, vicinity BT 078683, Company L, while sweeping through heavily wooded area, received SAF resulting in two USMC WIA (MDEWAC). Returned SA and M-79 fire; searched area with negative results.

At 301120H, vicinity BT 074665, Company L patrol discovered and destroyed four punji pits, one of which was mined with a CHICOM grenade and one with an M-79 round.

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At 301400H, vicinity BT 055705, Company 1 patrol discovered and destroyed two caves. In the same vicinity, one suspicious Vietnamese male, whose name appeared on the black list, was apprehended and forwarded to IPT as a VCC.

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At 301630H, vicinity AT 974651, four Reconstruction Development Cadre (RDC) observed four VC armed with rifles. RDC took VC under fire with SAF. As VC fled they dropped an M-14 rifle which was recovered by the cadre.

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SECTION V. LOGISTICS

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A. Significant Events

1. During the period the average supported strength of the battalion was 1000 men.
2. On 15 September, a new water point was established, located within the battalion command post.
3. Mobile Construction Battalion Six commenced installation of metal roofing on the strongbacks within the battalion command post. As of 30 September, roofing for fifty percent of the strongbacks within the battalion CP had been completed.
4. Construction of the ammunition storage area is still in progress.
5. Rebuilding of the battalion helo landing site was completed on 17 September.
6. Construction of the battalion showers was completed on 30 September.
7. On 26 September, two 4.2 Howtars from 1/11 moved into the battalion command post.

B. Supply1. General

a. In accordance with the current 3d Marine Division directive, Phase II Excess Program is now under way. At the completion of this program, an inspection team from Division Supply will be notified of the Battalion Supply Excess Status and an informal inspection will be held. This program will help alleviate any excesses which might exist.

b. Battalion Supply has transmitted to all companies a directive concerning the possession and recording of lightweight jungle utilities and boots. It has been directed that the issue of utilities be annotated on individual records, and that the utilities are not to leave the Republic of Vietnam.

c. Current updating and refinement of records is being given primary emphasis at this time. This includes vital data for timely submission of requisitions, re-order levels, dead files, etc.

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2. Current Projects. Battalion Supply was directed by CG 3d MarDiv msg 090653Z to collect all Marine Corps casualties' weapons and equipment from Naval Support Activity Hospital and to report weapon serial numbers to the 3d Marine Division Supply Officer. The above message directs units to drop from their accounts by Special Adjustment, weapons belonging to their unit. Battalion Supply will in turn take up the weapons on the account and/or turn them in to FISC-A as excess.

3. Problem Areas

a. End Items: The listed items are in critical shortage at present. High priority status has failed to produce these items.

b. Although not considered critical, this command has been unable to obtain small size jungle utilities, metal chevrons, and air mattresses.

c. Supply Personnel: The Table of Organization authorizes twelve enlisted personnel in the supply section. Currently, there are eight enlisted with a reduced skill level which has caused some delay in record keeping and an overall decrease in efficiency.

C. Transportation

1. Organic

a. During this period, organic vehicles were utilized to provide support within their capabilities to the battalion.

b. The number of M274's deadlined due to engine trouble has remained the same. At the end of this reporting period nineteen M274's are available for service.

c. During May 1966, five M274's were Code A'd. One replacement has been received and the battalion is still awaiting the additional four.

2. Support Vehicles

a. Support from the 3d Motor Transport Battalion has been outstanding. We normally receive six housekeeping trucks, however, during this reporting period we have been receiving only five, due to the increased Rough Rider commitments placed upon that unit.

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b. Helicopter support utilized to supply the battalion posts and observation posts has been satisfactory.

c. Logistic support provided to the island platoon positions by LVT, has been satisfactory.

D. Maintenance

1. Second and third echelon maintenance is being provided expeditiously with no significant problems encountered.

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SECTION VI. COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS

A. General. During September, the Communications Platoon has completed the installation of the field wire, radio, and communications facilities within the battalion command post. The waterproofing of communications equipment was ninety per cent completed, and all wire construction and telephone pole installation was completed.

B. Equipment

1. On 30 September 1966, all T/E communication equipment was on hand (or on order).

2. The battalion used an average of fifty-six AN/PRC 25's, four AN/PRC 10's, one AN/PRC 47, six AN/PRC 6's, and two AN/PRC 41 radio sets daily during the month. The battalion had one ID-292 channel alignment indicator for the AN/PRC 6 radio, three AN/PRC 10 radios, eight AN/PRC 25 radios, and four H-138 hand sets for the AN/PRC 25 radio turned in for repair.

3. The battalion utilized a total of four SB-22 switchboards, forty-nine TS-10 sound powered telephones, 53 EE-8/TA-312 telephones, six TA-221 operators packs for the SB-22 switchboard, one EE-8 telephone, two RL-31 reel units, and two H-144 headsets for the SB-22 switchboard were turned into the battalion maintenance shop for repair.

E. Operations/Training1. Operations

a. Radio communications for combat operations conducted within the battalion tactical area of responsibility were extremely effective with no major difficulties encountered.

b. Wire communications to Regiment improved greatly after a fifteen pair plastic insulated cable was installed under water, approximately 1500 meters west of Cam Nai bridge by the battalion wire section.

2. Training

a. The following training was conducted:

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(1) Eight rifle company marines were given thirty-six hours of on-the-job training and forty hours of instruction in voice radio procedures and the techniques of operating the AN/IRC-25 radio.

(2) Two 2533 radio telegraph operators were given 160 hours of cross training as 2543 message center men.

(3) The Communications Platoon had three hours of instruction on first aid, which included techniques for caring for a man suffering from electrical shock, combat wounds, and heat exhaustion.

(4) Sixteen officers and thirty-seven enlisted members of the battalion attended a one hour lecture on communications security given by a contact team from 1st Radio Battalion, FMF.

(5) Thirteen battalion radio operators attended a four hour lecture on the new series of FM radio equipment conducted at the First Marine Regiment's Command Post by a contact team from III MAF.

F. Combat Operations. The Communications Platoon did not participate in any major combat operations that required it to deploy as a platoon. However, communications personnel assigned to rifle companies participated in all platoon and company size search and clear operations.

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UNCLASSIFIEDSECTION VII. FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION, NAVAL GUNFIREA. Artillery

1. General. Although the battalion was not involved in any major operation, the use of artillery against targets of opportunity was greatly increased. There was a continued use of artillery in a harrassing and interdiction role to harrass suspected assembly areas and inhibit enemy movement within the tactical area of responsibility.

2. Significant Events. One platoon of 4.2 Howtar Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines displaced to 3d Battalion, 1st Marines Command Post. This displacement was executed to increase the fire support capability within the eastern sector of the TAOR.

B. Air Defense

1. The defensive measures employed by the Battalion were passive. No organic weapons were utilized for active air defense.

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SECTION IX MEDICAL/DENTAL AFFAIRSA. Patient Load

1. During September a total of 778 patients were seen at sick call, an average of twenty-five patients per day.
2. Eighteen patients were admitted at the Battalion Aid Station (BAS), with an average daily census of four in-patients.
3. Twenty-one cases of venereal disease were treated at BAS..

B. Medical Civic Action Program (MEDCAP). A two man MEDCAP team was sent to Regimental Headquarters area to continue MEDCAP operations in that vicinity. The BAS provided medical support for four county fair operations. Company corpsmen held sick call in villages in their area of responsibility as field operations permitted. A total of 5,207 Vietnamese civilians were treated.

C. Sanitation. Messing facilities are outstanding. New heads are being constructed and the overall sanitation condition of the camp is excellent.

D. Personnel. On 1 September, one medical officer and fifty-eight corpsmen were on board for duty. During the month, one medical officer and eighteen corpsmen reported aboard for duty, and twenty-eight corpsmen were transferred. One corpsman was killed in action and seven corpsmen were wounded. Total strength at the end of the month was two medical officers and forty-seven corpsmen.

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~~CONFIDENTIAL~~SECTION X. CIVIL AFFAIRS ~~UNCLASSIFIED~~

A. General. The civic action program utilized resources from Medical Civic Aid Program (MEDCAP), United States Agency For International Development (USAID), and various self help projects. During September, activities were concentrated primarily in the villages of Hoa Thai (BT 982680), Hoa Loi (BT 974 653), Hoa Chau (BT 014697), Hoa Long (BT 057745), Hoa Phung (BT 050700), Hoa Hai (BT 079704), Hoa Da (BT 035717), and Hoa Lan (BT 047678).

B. Significant Events

1. Medical/Dental. MEDCAP teams treated 5,207 villagers. No dental assistance was rendered.

2. Self Help. During September, the battalion provided the following materials and assistance to Nui Kim Son Hamlet under the joint USMC/Vietnamese Self-Help program.

a. Although the hamlet has over 2,000 inhabitants, there were no sanitary facilities. Urinals and a head were constructed and emplaced, and sanitation leaflets were distributed throughout the hamlet.

b. Insecticide and equipment were furnished for use in a fly prevention program.

c. Rat traps were constructed and rat poison furnished to reduce the rat population throughout the hamlet.

d. An English class was established; books were issued, and a schedule of three classes a week was instituted. Attendance is normally over fifty students.

3. United States Agency for International Development (USAID). On 16 September, the battalion procured twenty sheets of tin roofing from USAID and delivered them to the monastery of Nui Kim Son Hamlet.

4. County Fair. Four County Fairs were held in the tactical area of responsibility (TAOR).

a. 1 September; Thi An (BT 034674). 100 people were fed two meals of 100 pounds of rice and one case of ham. MEDCAP teams treated sixty-two women, twenty-eight children, and four men.

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b. 2 September; Khai Tay (BT 047667). Twelve people were fed one meal of five pounds of rice, six pounds of ham, and two gallons of soup. MEDCAP teams treated three women, four children, and two men.

c. 3 September; Tu Cau (1) (BT 036663). 115 people were fed two meals of 150 pounds of rice, forty pounds of ham, and twenty-four gallons of soup. MEDCAP teams treated forty-seven women, fifty-six children, and eight men.

d. 27-28 September; Ba Tung (2) (BT 043693). 105 people were fed four meals of 300 pounds of rice, two cases of ham, and one case of soup. MEDCAP teams treated thirty-one women, forty-three children, and eight men. The battalion was supported by the 59th Regional Force Battalion and a Psy War team from Hoa Vang District.

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~~CONFIDENTIAL~~SECTION XI. PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE ACTIVITIES

A. General. Psychological warfare (PSYWAR) operations conducted during September were developed in conjunction with the Battalion Civic Action Program, and in support of the joint ARVN/USMC County Fair operations conducted on 1 to 3 September in the hamlets of Thi An (2), Khai Tay (3), and Tu Cau (1), vicinity coordinates BT 033673, BT 041668, and BT 037662 respectively. In addition, the psywar program was similarly coordinated and executed in the joint Regional Forces/USMC County Fair operation conducted on 27 and 28 September at Ba Tung (2), vicinity BT 042691. During these County Fairs, a series of psychological orientation lectures, consisting primarily of an explanation of the mission of ARVN and Marine forces, supplemented with detailed comments by political leaders from Hoa Vang District, were presented.

B. Significant Events

1. On 18 September, a psywar U-10 aircraft broadcast propaganda tapes within the tactical area of responsibility (TAOR). The theme of the tapes expounded the futility of the VC breaking with the government and continuing a war that could lead only to separation from family and certain death.

2. On 25 September, from coordinates BT 071702 to BT 067673, a PSYWAR broadcast team accompanied the daily main supply routes minesweeping detail. The broadcasts stated that the Marines are friends of the Vietnamese people, but will apply swift and certain retaliation if any fire was encountered. The broadcast declaration was supported by a 106mm recoilless rifle and a marine rifle squad.

3. On 26 September, a U-10 aircraft broadcast propaganda tapes within the TAOR. The theme of the broadcast emphasized the misery of family separation and the harsh living conditions imposed upon those joining the Viet Cong.

4. On 29 September, 140,000 leaflets were distributed throughout the TAOR. The leaflets emphasized that innocent civilians are being senselessly killed by VC mines and booby traps. The inhabitants were encouraged to inform the marines of VC booby traps and mines, and to support the government and the people.

Narrative Summary

1. Late Entries. At 102220H, vicinity BT 004697, Company L ambush received small arms fire. Fire not returned and ambush shifted to new site.

2. Contacts

a. At 110910H, vicinity BT 071701, Third Platoon Company K Command Post received small arms fire and three rounds M-79 from estimated three VC in tree line, vicinity BT 077699. Command Post returned small arms fire, one round M-79, and three LAAW's. Enemy fire ceased; searched area with negative results.

b. At 110945H, vicinity BT 071701, Third Platoon Company K Command Post received small arms fire from estimated two VC, vicinity BT 072698, as SNTOS were moving into position. One round M-79 was returned; patrol searched area with negative results.

c. At 111045H, vicinity BT 036676, Company M patrol received small arms fire from vicinity BT 036675, resulting in one Marine WIA ^{now MIA} and rendering a 3.5 inoperable. Patrol returned small arms fire; searched area with negative results.

d. At 111105H, vicinity BT 077708, Observation Post sighted two VC with weapons crouching in tree line. OP directed M-60 machine gun fire to fix enemy in place; 81mm HE fire mission promptly called in. Eight rounds 81mm fired but resulting smoke obscured VC; squad from Company K dispatched to immediate area; while at vicinity BT 071701, squad received two rounds M-79 and small arms fire from pagoda vicinity BT 076699. Squad returned small arms fire, two LAAW's, and thirteen rounds M-79. Enemy broke contact. Searched area with no additional contact established.

e. At 111110H, vicinity 085697, Second Platoon Company K received small arms fire from estimated six VC in three separate positions, vicinity BT 086692, BT 087694, and BT 084690. Returned small arms fire, two rounds 106mm HEFT, one round 60mm mortar, and sixty rounds .50 caliber machine gun fire. Enemy fire ceased; area searched with negative results.

3. Miscellaneous. At 140830H, vicinity BT 972663, one Vietnamese female, twenty-five years of age, came into Third Platoon Company I Command Post with wound which she claimed was inflicted by Third Platoon Company I perimeter fire last night while she was in hamlet of Le Son (1), vicinity BT 979664. Woman treated by corpsman and evacuated to Regimental aid station. Villagers of Le Son (1) later reported to investigating team that Vietnamese woman was wounded by VC.
