A. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

1. Awards

There were four Navy Commendation Medals and five Vietnamese Crosses of Gallantry awarded at ceremonies by the Commanding officer. There were five end of tour award recommendations submitted. Major General YOUNGDALE presented two Bronze Star Medals, one to a Marine and one to a Navy Corpsman, who were hospitalized at the Naval Support Activity Hospital, Da Nang.

2. Legal and Discipline

During this reporting period there were nine Company Commander office hours, five Battalion Commander office hours, two Summary and two Special Courts-Martials conducted. One investigation was conducted and there is one investigation pending. Two Article 32 investigations were ordered and both are in process.

3. Postal

All Marines continued to receive mail on a timely basis. It is noted that on various occasions there was a period when mail was not available to this organization. This was generally letter mail. Packaged mail was received regularly.

4. R&R Quotas

There were a total of 70 quotas received and utilized, they covered all the major R&R cities.

5. Promotions

There were forty five Marines promoted to Corporal and forty to Lance Corporal during this reporting period. Major General YOUNGDALE, Commanding General, 1st Marine Division meritoriously promoted one hospitalized Marine to the next highest rank and recommended to SECNAV that a corpsman which was also hospitalized be likewise promoted.

6. Pay and Allowances

A full pay day was held during the reporting period and those who were not available for this regular pay day received special payments by the Disbursing Officer.

7. Post Exchange

This service caused no problems during the reporting period. Mobile exchanges and Sundry Packages were provided for the Marines in the field.

8. Religious Services

a. Divine Services

During this reporting period, Divine Services were held by the Battalion Chaplain to include all companies in the field, the Battalion Command Post and CAP units stationed in this battalion's TAOR on a weekly basis. The Chaplain also visited wounded Marines who were hospitalized at Cam Ranh Bay, RVN.

b. Personnel Response

Visits to the hospital facilities were made by the Chaplain weekly. The facilities include: Naval Support Activity, Da Nang, and 1st Hospital Company.

c. Counseling

The Battalion Chaplain was available to all Marines and Corpsmen for counseling in the field as well as at his office in the Battalion Command Post.

d. Liaison

The Chaplain continually coordinates religious affairs with neighboring units, and with the Division Chaplain's Office.

B. INTELLIGENCE:

1. Recapitulation of Enemy Activity

During the month of August 1968 enemy activity in the 3/1 TACR was light. Sightings of small enemy units centered around the Hill 190 area the beginning of the month, shifted to the Nam C area during the latter part of the month. The most significant events of enemy activity during the reporting period were the reported movement of an estimated two Platoons of VC through Nam-O Village (AT 9383) the night of 23 August, a mortar attack on the 35th Engineers camp (AT 9284) the night of 23 August and the night attack on CAP 2-8-2 (AT 9079) on the 27th of August 1968.

There were four (4) instances of mining and four (4) of booby traps. Intelligence reports from 7th Marines, 5th CBT, and POW interrogations indicate that the Q-90 VC Battalion, located in the Nam-O Mountains, is the unit primarily responsible for the enemy activity in the TACR.

2. Surveillance and Reconnaissance

Surveillance in the TACR is conducted primarily from the Esso Plant and Hill 190 positions. The Battalion has 20-Power ship's binoculars which are fully utilized for this purpose.

Reconnaissance in the TACR is conducted by patrols from 1st Reconnaissance Battalion and are concentrated to the north and west of the actual rocket/mortar belt. They have reported numerous incidents of small unit sightings, but none of large forces moving in the Nam-C mountains/ Elephant Valley areas within the TACR.

3. Weather and Terrain

Weather remained clear and hot for the majority of the time. Heat casualties were suffered only when units were forced to move quickly over unfavorable terrain.

Terrain varies greatly in the TACR. Approximately one-half of the area is flatland offering few obstacles to movement of infantry. Rice paddies and rivers in this area limit the use of tracked vehicles. The rest of the TACR is composed of foothills and mountains. The dense vegetation in the higher hill masses limits movement and observation. There are numerous trails, but the use of these trails increase the probability of ambush.

C. OPERATIONS

1. Organization and Disposition of Forces

The battalion continued to perform its primary mission of providing defense for the Da Nang TAOR through extensive patrolling activities. During the 31 day period, 1603 small unit combat patrols were run, 887 of which were at night, involving one or more ambushes in each. Initial disposition of forces was Co I at Nam O Bridge (AT 931838) and Esso Fuel Storage Plant (AT 937866); Co L at Dai La Pass (AT 938752); and Co M at Hill #190 (AT 892822). Co B, 1/27 and Co H, 2/7 became OPCON to 3/1 as of 111600H August 1968. Those two companies augmented the battalion in "Operation DODGE VALLEY." Co B and Co. H were returned to their parent commands on 161730H August 1968. On 171600H August Co. I, 3/5 was passed OPCON; to its parent command, I 3/5 was OPCON to this command from the previous month. OPCON was reassumed of K, 3/1 as of 211045Z August 1968. OPCON of Co H, 2/7 was assumed as of 281800H August 1968.

The Battalion used Sniper Teams on two occasions during the month.

2. Training

The battalion conducted the following during this period.

a. Orientation/Indoctrination

A formal orientation/indoctrination program was conducted for 132 personnel. Lectures were presented by the Battalion Commander, all staff sections, Supply Officer, Air Liaison Officer, Medical Officer, Chaplain and Communications Officer. Special emphasis were placed on orders which govern the actions of the individual Marine, the personal response program, the conditions in the AO under which Marines will serve, and the goals and missions of this battalion, one full day of training was devoted to care and cleaning, safety features, familiarization firing, and zeroing of the M16A1 Rifle.

b. Mines and Demolitions

The 1st Engineer Bn. Land Mine and Booby Trap Warfare course provided a 3 day course for 42 replacements. In addition a one day course, which includes demolitions, was conducted by the engineers at each of the company and platoon combat bases.

c. School Quotas

Quotas were received and filled for formal training in Okinawa and in country schools. This training includes the following.

d. The Battalion Weekly Training Schedule was published and followed during this period (See Part IV).

3. Tactical Operations

During the month of August 1968, Third Battalion, 1st Marines participated in "Operation Dodge Valley." The operation consisted of securing a landing zone and establishing a perimeter for the landing of the 21st ARVN Ranger Battalion, who conducted a sweep down the Song Thuy Loan Valley. (See Part IV).

4. Artillery and Naval Gunfire.a. Artillery

Fire support for the period was limited primarily to non-observ fires on acquired targets or harassment and interdicting targets on likely areas of enemy activity. Round expenditures were as follows:

b. Naval Gunfire

Naval gunfire and reinforcing artillery supplemented this support on occasions by firing acquired and interdiction targets for which we do not have an accurate record of expenditures. Fire support for Operation Dodge Valley is included. (See Part IV "After Action Report").

5. Air Support/Defense

a. Fixed Wing

Flare ships were used on four separate occasions within the Battalion TAOB. On each occasion they provided excellent support. AO's were provided a total of 22 times during the month and proved to be a timely and valuable source of visual reconnaissance. During the August offensive AO's were on station at first light and at sundown to check for signs of enemy activity. Seventy-one TRQ-10 missions were dropped by fixed wing aircraft on suspected enemy positions.

b. Helicopter Support

Helicopters provided a total of thirty-three resupplies during the month for battalion units in the field. On sixteen occasions helicopters provided medevac support. They acted promptly according to priority. Helicopters were used on two occasions for visual reconnaissance by company commanders in the field to check out their areas. The helicopter support provided during the month of August was excellent.

D. LOGISTICS:

1. Engineer Assistance and other Construction.

During this reporting period seven Engineer Assistance Requests were completed. Work orders for minor repairs of buildings within the Command Post were completed. Fluorescent light fixtures were installed in the COC Bunker. The minefields were completed around Nam O and White Bridges

2. Supply

a. During August 65% of this battalion's monsoon requirements were received. The remaining monsoon requirements are expected to be released during early September.

b. Class I, III, and IV supply support continues to be sufficient. Class II type 2 supply support improved but still remains a problem mainly in obtaining spare parts for motor transport.

3. Maintenance

E. CIVIL AFFAIRS/PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE**1. Construction**

Projects under construction consisted of periodic inspection of progress made in completing refugee hamlet at Nam My, Hoa Loc (AT 898817). Assistance was in the form of two truck loads of lumber and 100 ammo (155mm) boxes. The project is now approximately 75% completed.

2. MedCaps.

MedCaps activities accounted for 702 civilians treated. Weekly MedCaps were held at Nam My refugee hamlet (AT 898817), Go Dau hamlet (AT 922840), and Tugn Son Hamlet (AT 898775). A platoon from "Lima" Company held a MedCap at (AT 920748 - 918740).

The two Vietnamese girls being trained as nurses were a great asset at all of the MedCaps held by BAS personnel.

3. Psychological Operations

Psyops activities included 60 requested leaflet air drops. Hand distribution of leaflets totaled 21,600 for the month. Movies were shown at Kim Lien and Ngai Tay hamlets for a total of 5 hours. The Battalion S-5 conducted 14 hours of broadcast operations. The themes of Psyops for the month were; "Americans are Friends", "Chieu Hoi", "Rice Denial", and "Rewards."

F. COMBINED ACTION GROUP1. Operations

For the month of August 1968 the four CAPs of CACO 2-8 made a total of 179 daytime patrols, 115 nighttime patrols, 133 nighttime ambushes, and 98 nighttime LP's. In addition to these combined Marines and PF activities, the PF's made 23 daytime patrols, 19 nighttime patrols, and 4 nighttime ambushes on their own. There were no enemy confirmed during August.

2. Training

All personnel arriving at CAG must attend a three (3) week orientatio school which teaches them about the CAG program and prepares them for the type of duty which will be required of them in a CAP. In addition to this school there is a three (3) day Vietnamese language school which the men in the CAP's may attend. These two schools work on a quota system. In addition to these formal schools each CAP commander is responsible for holding classes in his CAP with both the Marines and PF's on such subjects as language, radio procedure, calling in fire support, patrol procedures, first aid, and any other subjects which the CAP commander feels are necessary.

G. MEDICAL/DENTAL AFFAIRS1. Personnel

On 31 August total strength was 02 Officers and 54 Corpsmen. During this period 6 Corpsmen were transferred to other commands for duty and 2 Corpsmen were transferred to other commands for temporary duty under treatment. There was one (1) Corpsman MIA for the period. There were 16 Corpsmen and one (1) Medical Officer received on board for duty during the period.

2. Patient Load

For this period 745 patients were seen at BAS sick call for an average of 24 patients a day.

3. Referrals/Dentcaps

- a. Medical aid was given to 286 Vietnamese civilians by the BAS
- b. There was no DentCap

4. Sanitation

Sanitary conditions within the Battalion CP and Company CP's have continued to improve. (Community dumps located in close proximity to the Battalion CP could present a sanitation problem.)

H. COMMUNICATIONS

1. Personnel

As of 31 August 1968 The Communication Platoon has one officer and 68 enlisted on its rolls.

2. Equipment

a. As of 31 August 1968 T/E Communications equipment was on hand or on order.

b. At the present time ANGGC-3 has been deadlined in excess of 30 days. Equipment has been evacuated to Okinawa. The deadlining of this equipment greatly impairs the over all efficient operations of the Message center.

c. The Battalion at present is short 3 radio sets AN/PRC-25. These radios have been placed on requisition.

d. Tape antennas with bases remain in short supply.

3. Message Center

The Message Center processed 44 outgoing messages and 920 incoming messages during August.

4. Operations

The Battalion participated in Operation Dodge Valley.

5. Training

The communications platoon conducted training on equipment and procedures during the month of August. Training was conducted on the telephone directory, and field wire laying equipment. Training was conducted on the radio set AN/MRC-87, and Telephone Terminal Equipment AN/MRC-62. The radio platoon also assigned one E-3/E-4 to each line company to conduct training. Message Center training was conducted. Commtac Publications, ACP-117 US SOPP 2 was studied and reviewed.

6. Support

A Contact Team from Maintenance Bn, 1st FSR repaired Generators at Nam O Bridge and Hill 190.

02100H Lima Co. 2nd platoon accidentally tripped a booby trap at AT 890813 resulting in 5 medevacs.

031405H Vietnamese boy informed CAP 282 of a mine at AT 888795. The CAP destroyed the mine and rewarded the boy.

051640H India Co. located a dud 500 lb. bomb at AT 849789. Unit destroyed same in place.

061515H Lima Co. observed 2 explosions at AT 898818. The reactionary platoon found 1 35 yr. old civilian, and 1 male boy 10 yrs. injured.

061350H India Co. patrol came upon two VC picking bananas at AT 911871. The patrol opened fire with M-16's and found one expended belt of M-60 ammo.

071200H India Co. 3rd platoon while on assigned patrol hit a booby trap at AT 875775 injuring 3 personnel.

090035H Two men from Lima Co. 1st platoon were sent out from their ambush site to check out suspicious movement at AT 903800. 1 man tripped a surprise firing device resulting in a slight wound.

091650H A patrol from Lima Co. 3rd platoon tripped a booby trap at AT 901806 believed to be from an M-26 grenade. One casualty was medevaced by LVT to BAS.

091830H The Navy Harbor Security Boat spotted 4 Vietnamese working at AT 943873. After a short fire fight suspects ran into the railroad tunnel. 15 civilians and a squad of ARVN came out the southern end when forced by India Co. 2nd platoon. It is believed that it was the ARVNS who returned fire at the boat.

110950H India Co. 2nd platoon discovered a trip wire to an M-26 grenade at AT 884764. They blew it in place and proceeded.

121005H Troop lift for "Operation Dodge Valley" commenced with assault elements of H, 2/7 touching down in the LZ (AT 823756) at 1008 with negative contact.

122245H A squad ambush from Bravo Co. 2/7 spotted 5 men AT 820754. They opened fire with claymores and small arms fire killing 3 VC.

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192250H Hotel Co., 2/7, received 5 incoming grenades at AT 822757. There were no friendly casualties or evidence of enemy casualties.

161945H Mine at AT 925843, North minefield, exploded. India Co. saw 3 men running S/W towards hamlet. They swept hamlet and set up ambush with negative results.

162100H Mike Co. spotted movement coming towards ambush AT 888814.

201140H Corpsman at Esso Plant shot himself in the right thumb with a 45 Cal. while cleaning.

210830H Small Vietnamese boy turned in a 60mm HE round to Mike Co. and was rewarded with 500\$VN.

211430H Kilo Co. received five rounds of what was believed to be 75mm RR from AT 145548 while returning from a working party. One Marine died of wounds, 15 were evacuated.

211640H 10 year old boy gave two M-16 magazines to Lima Co. and was rewarded 100\$VN.

220800H Vietnamese turned in 150 rounds of 5.56 and 2 magazines to Mike Co. and was rewarded with 100\$VN.

230310H CAP-282 received 30 mortar and 500 small arms fire resulting in 1 USMC KIA.

230920H A ARVN truck struck a 30 lb. box mine at AT 932791. Truck was totally destroyed.

231250H A jeep from Bulk Fuel Co. struck a 40-50 lb. box mine in trash dump at AT 932791 resulting in 3 KIA and 1 jeep destroyed.

231430H India Co. 1st platoon found 4 satchel charges launchers, 4-60mm base plate impressions, aiming sticks, and some marijuana at AT 923847.

231545H India Co. found a B40 booster at AT 928838.

241010H Truck from H&S Co., 1st Maintenance Bn, detonated a 20 lb. box mine at the dump at AT 935792.

251445H to 251750H 3/1 and ARVN Cav blocked village for national Police Field Force sweep and search of Nam O village. Police detained 22 suspects.

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261445H Patrack Detonated a 40 lb. box mine at AT 894825 resulting in one USMC KIA and 5 USMC IA.

271414E Kilo Co. found two Clay Rounds at AT 875817 and 875814 respectively.

272200H C-292 received 50 incoming mortars and 10,000 small arms rounds from a force estimated at 100. They laid down a defensive base of fire and called for a reactionary force and illumination flares. Three IF's were wounded.

281945H Lima Co. observed rocket firings at AT 835810.

290150H Kilo Co. received 4 incoming mortars from AT 882574. They returned fire with negative results.

291710E A VC climbed over the fence at Nam O Bridge minefield and detonated a mine and was killed.

301305H India Co. found an M-26 booby trap with trip wire across trail at AT 18833.

(a) LFP - The Battalion used five two-plane flights of Marine A-4 Aircraft to prepare the area for troop landings. The tactical air controller Airborne, Cowpoke 1-6, was on station from 120830H to 120940H. Flights were late arriving on station; consequently, the landing zone prep was 40 minutes late, starting at 0910 vldc 0830 as planned. Artillery fires were delayed 10 minutes, from 0930 to 0940 to allow the aircraft time to complete the ordnance drop. 100% of the bombs dropped were on target and 80% of the target was covered. (Bombs used were 750 lb. daisy cutters, and 500 lb. general purpose. The only fixed wing pre-planned for the operation were the TACA and strike aircraft used for the LFP. Close air support aircraft were available but were not used.

(b) AO's - The battalion used approximately 12 flights of O-1, O-2, and OV-10 aircraft. The aircraft were used primarily for visual recon and aerial guidance, with one aircraft being used the first day for LFP. Availability of AO's was excellent during the operation. AO's were requested from Moveable over the TACP Local Net.

(2) Helicopter

(a) Transports - The helilift was conducted by HMM-164 using the CH-46 aircraft. Punctuality of helicopter support was outstanding. 542 combat loaded troops were lifted in two hours and ten minutes. Four flights of two CH-46 aircraft each were used to resupply the battalion during the four days. All resupplies were requested by the HST over the HST Local Net.

(b) Medevac - Two medevac missions were flown by H-34's and one was flown by a CH-46. All medevacs were on a priority basis with reaction time satisfactory on all three. The third medevac was delayed two hours due to inability of the H-34 to lift the casualty. A CH-46 was subsequently requested. All medevacs were requested over the TACP Local Net.

(c) Gunships - Every troop lift, medevac, and resupply flight was escorted by Huey Gunships. There were no fire incidents.

b. Artillery

(1) During the operation both direct support and reinforcing artillery were utilized. There were no substantial contacts; missions were restricted to objective prep fires and H&I's. The following batteries fired in support of the operation:

c. 81mm Mortars

(1) Two sections of 81mm mortars accompanied 3/1 on this operation and were employed as a 4 gun battery which moved with the battalion CP. A total of 137 rds were fired on prep & H&I fires.

7. Intelligencea. Enemy Strength and Capabilities Prior to the Operation

(1) Enemy forces in the operational area were believed to be 402nd Sapper Battalion and the 3rd Battalion, 368B Arty Regt. This estimate was based on 7th Marines COB and APD Mode II readings taken 9 August 1968, and the fact that reconnaissance insert, TRAILER PARK, was extracted under fire on 9 August and an attempted re-insertion on 10 August was aborted due to ground fire.

b. Enemy Strength and Capabilities During the Operation

(1) During the period 12 to 16 August 1968 enemy contact was limited to two small unit contacts on 12 August. The first occurred at 122245H when a B/1/27 squad ambushed an estimated 5 enemy, resulting in 3 enemy KIA and the second occurred at 122330H, when H/2/7 received approximately 5 incoming hand grenades.

c. Terrain and Weather

(1) The terrain in the operational area is roughly dissected with canopy from 100 to 150 feet and dense undergrowth. The dense undergrowth and slope present a definite obstacle that greatly reduces rate of movement.

(2) Weather was marked, during the period 12 to 16 August, by daily rains of 5 to 20 minutes duration, but did not adversely affect the operation.

8. Mission

a. To secure a landing zone at AT 823756 for the 21st ARVN Ranger Battalion.

b. To find, fix and destroy the enemy in the vicinity of grid square AT 8275.

c. On order establish a blocking position in the vicinity of AT 823745.

d. To be prepared to continue the attack on order.

9. Concept of Operations

a. One rifle company conducted a helicopter assault and secured a landing zone at AT 823756. The remainder of the battalion landed and established perimeter security for the landing of the 21st ARVN Ranger Battalion. The 37th ARVN Ranger Battalion established blocking positions from AT 835720 to AT 845740; and the 21st Ranger Battalion conducted a sweep down the Song Thuy Loan Valley. The battalion established a blocking position in the vicinity of 829747 to assist the 21st Ranger Battalion sweep.

10. Execution

a. Planning began at 101905H August 1968 when the battalion was notified of the operation. On 11 August two planning conferences were held at 7th Marines CP. At 1600 OPCON was assumed of Co B, 1st Bn, 27th Marines and Co H, 2nd Bn, 7th Marines. L Hour was set at 121000H.

b. 12 August 1968

(1) 121005H the troop lift commenced with the assault elements of H 2/7 touching down in the LZ (AT 823756) at 1000 with negative contact.

(2) 121215H. The troop lift was completed. H 2/7, B 1/27, L 3/1, and the CP group were in the LZ with no enemy contact.

(3) 121222H. 21st ABVN Ranger Battalion began landing in the LZ.

(4) The night of 12 August local security patrols and ambushes were conducted.

(5) 122245H. Co B 1/27 squad ambush at AT 820754 observed 5 enemy moving down trail; the ambush opened fire with small arms and claymores, resulting in 3 VC/NVA KIA's. The enemy returned fire from the west resulting in 1 USMC KIA medevac.

(6) 122350H. Co H 2/7 defensive position at AT 824757 received 5 incoming grenades. The position returned small arms fire and grenades. There were no friendly casualties or evidence of enemy casualties.

(7) Both actions took place at short range. There were no communication problems during the action.

c. 13 August 1968 the battalion continued security of the LZ and conducted local patrols and ambushes. A resupply was effected.

d. On the 14th the battalion moved to blocking positions in the vicinity of AT 829747. There was no enemy contact. Local ambushes were established throughout the night.

(1) 141630H Co H 2/7 on patrol had one man injured by his machete and was medevaced.

e. During the 15th the battalion conducted search operations and established a night defensive position at AT 843728 with local ambushes.

f. On the 16th the battalion was picked up by trucks in the vicinity of AT 860745 and was returned to the command post.

(1) 161200H. The operation was terminated.

(2) 161600H. Co B, 1/27, and Co H, 1/7 chopped OPCON from the 3rd Bn, 1st Marines, to their parent organization.

11. Results. Operation DODGE VALLEY accounted for 3 enemy KIA. Friendly casualties were one WIA and one NBC, both medevaced. The mission assigned to the Battalion was accomplished.

12. Administrative Matters

a. Supply

(1) An LSA located at the 7th Marines Command Post at Hill 55 was operated by Shore Party, augmented by 3/1 support personnel. It supported the battalion with all classes of supplies. Resupply was requested through helicopter support teams which were attached to the companies and the Battalion Command Group. All classes of supplies were available and issued upon request.

(2) Resupply was accomplished by helicopter during every 24 hour period.

b. Casualties and Evacuation

(1) Priority casualties were evacuated by helicopter to either First Hospital Company or NSA Hospital, Danang.

(2) Routine casualties were evacuated by helicopter to the LSA.

(3) Equipment belonging to casualties was evacuated to the LSA.

c. Transportation. Transportation from 3/1 battalion area to the objective area was accomplished by CH-46. All tactical personnel movement during the operation was by foot. Resupply has been discussed in Para. 12a. The battalion returned to the 3/1 battalion area by vehicle at the conclusion of the operation.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques -- None.

14. Commander's Analysis. The operation was characterized by: lack of enemy contact; extremely slow movement through dense secondary growth and precipitous terrain; and considerable signs of VC presence, especially at the mouth of the Song Thuy Loan River. The map sheet was inaccurate in the area near the river.

15. Recommendations. None.
