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INTELLIGENCE

A. ENEMY

1. General During the reporting period contact with enemy was generally light and limited primarily to snipers and small groups ranging in size from one to ten persons.

Four instances occurred in which elements of the Battalion received light to moderate mortar fire while dispersed in their respective defensive positions during the hours of darkness.

The most significant contact was a coordinated mortar and ground attack against a platoon of Kilo Company during the early morning of 7 June. The enemy estimated at company size, commenced their attack with the employment of a CS agent followed by a 60mm mortar attack and ground assault using RPD's (LMG's) and B-40 rocket launchers. The attack was two pronged and launched from the NW and SE of the Marines position. The defensive wires were breached with the enemy entering the perimeter and engaging in close combat. The encounter was brief and fierce with the enemy force breaking contact and withdrawing to the NW and SE. Of particular note was the enemy's use of English in giving commands and the similarity of their tactics with those of the Free World Forces. For this single action the Battalion was credited with thirty-five (35) enemy KIA's.

Additionally, on 26 June, at approximately 0900H, elements of M/3/1 observed, pursued, took under fire and killed one VC/NVA believed to be a company grade officer. KIA was armed with a relatively new Walther PPK 7.65 pistol in a new leather holster.

Overall the Battalion was credited with seventy (70) VC/NVA KIA's during the period and captured items of equipment/material consisted primarily of ammunition/ordnance, personal items, propaganda/documents, assorted clothing and six (6) individual weapons including two (2) pistols. Also, one (1) fabric flag; red with a yellow hammer and sickle affixed, was captured.

Several reports of enemy multi-battalion movement were received during the reporting period. Also, several reports of enemy platoon and company size units with rockets and the mission of attacking Da Nang and Marble Mountain Air Facility were reported.

Enemy units known to operate in and near the Battalion's TAOB are the VC V-25th BN, the R-20 BN, elements of the V-89 Sapper BN and local guerrillas. Units not confirmed but reported in the TAOB were elements of: 141st NVA Regt; 36th NVA Regt; 125th NVA Regt 3rd Quang Da BN; 341st NVA Regt; and two (2) separate Battalions (nfi).

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(1) On 19 June, CITE reported the presence of four (4) to five (5) guerrillas in Bich Nam (2) (HF 001638) with the assigned mission of disrupting the forthcoming elections. Based on this information an operation was conducted employing L/3/1 and A/1/1 which resulted in the hamlet being cordoned-off and the killing of four guerrillas, one of whom was the village VC Autonomous Chief. Additionally, two (2) persons were detained, one (1) of them was believed to have been an Economic Cadre.

(2) On 26 June, a VC/NVA turned himself into the Village Chief of Nui Kim Son (HF 075708) under the provisions of the Chieu Hoi Program. He was subsequently exploited by the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines which resulted in the finding of three bunkers containing assorted clothing, medical gear and a female member of the VCI he had known previously.

B. WEATHER

1. The temperatures for the month ranged from an average high of 93° to an average low of 78°. Precipitation was recorded at less than .03 inches.

C. TERRAIN

1. The terrain within the TAOR varies from generally flat and interspersed with rice paddies, treelines and dikes to the coastal plain where more sandy areas are apparent. Impairment of vehicular trafficability (wheeled and tracked) during the hot months will be negligible except in the coastal areas where some bogging down may occur. Foot movement in the areas will be restricted primarily because of the heat.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

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PART II OPERATIONS

A. ORGANIZATION AND DISPOSITION

During the month of June, the 3rd Battalion continued its primary mission of providing defense for the Eastern TAOR of the 1st Marine Regiment's TAOR through extensive patrolling activities and search and clear operations. During this period, the 3rd Battalion conducted numerous combined operations with ARVN and Regional Forces. The 3rd Battalion utilized Task Force Kilo from the Quang Da Special Sector four times during the month in operations directed at uncovering the VCI within the TAOR. Throughout the month, the 3rd Battalion was tasked with the tactical responsibility of the Eastern TAOR of the 1st Marine Regiment and the defense of its vital bridges in support of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, from 1 June to 22 June, (time period 3rd Battalion had responsibility for the entire TAOR)

As of 1 June the disposition of forces under the 3rd Battalion's tactical control were as follows:

1. Company "I" operated with one (1) platoon at Cau Do Bridge (AT99 9707), one (1) platoon at Cam Nam (BT013703), and one (1) platoon at Christmas Island (BT035720).

2. Company "K" operated with one platoon at the Leprosarium (BT099 664), one (1) platoon at "No Name Island" (BT083673) until 7 June when it displaced to the Battalion C.P. and one (1) platoon at the Battalion C.P. (BT035720).

3. Company "L" operated with one (1) platoon at Tu Cau Bridge (BT032648), one (1) platoon at Man Quan (2) (BT043687), and one (1) platoon at Tower #1 (BT056655).

4. Company "M" operated with one (1) platoon at Binh Ky (BT050696), one (1) platoon at Hoa Binh and Tower #4 (BT056718), and one (1) platoon at Tower #2 (BT068688) and Tower #3 (BT069700).

5. Company "A" 1/1 operated with one (1) platoon at Ha Dong Bridge (AT990642), one (1) platoon at Ft. Apache (AT972642), and one (1) platoon outposted along Anderson Trail.

On 5 June, 3rd Battalion assumed OPCON Task Force Kilo (Co. "C" 1/7 and 3rd Co. 21st Rangers) for an operation in the Man Quan area. The operation commenced at 0600H with one (1) platoon from Company "M" and one (1) platoon from Company "L", occupying a blocking position north of Man Quan (2) at the 69 grid line. Task Force Kilo swept to the North from Tu Cau Road. Task Force Kilo was supported directly in the field by 3rd Battalion Air and Artillery liaison units. The overall operation was under the direction of the Commanding Officer, 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. This operation was directed at uncovering the VCI in this area, a thorough search of the area was conducted by Task Force Kilo. The operation was completed at 1200H with no enemy sightings, nor significant findings.

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On the morning of 6 June, the Liaison unit from Company "M", along with the 157th and 170th Regional Force Companies, searched the village of Ngan Cau (2) (BT064660). The sweep force established contact with two (2) VC in the village. The ensuing fire fight resulted in two (2) VC KIA's and the detaining of four (4) VC suspects. The sweep force also captured one (1) M-16 rifle, one (1) SKS rifle and one (1) roll of communication wire.

At 1500 on 7 June, Company "L" 3/7 was assumed OPCON by 3rd Battalion. Company "L" which operated with one platoon at Man Quan (2) (BT 043687), and one (1) platoon patrolling from the 3rd Battalion C.P. The platoon operating out of the C.P. also took the responsibility for the ambushes along the MSR north of the Battalion C.P. These ambushes were directed at preventing mining of the MSR and to interdict enemy movement across the TAOR.

On 7 June, Task Force Kilo Co. "C" 1/7 and 3rd Co., 21st Rangers) was again assumed OPCON by 3rd Battalion for an operation of one day duration in Cam Sa (1) (BT085645). The sweep and block operation commenced at first light with Company "K" assuming a blocking position on the Southeast and Task Force Kilo sweeping from the West. This operation was directed at uncovering the VCI in the area of operation. In the early afternoon, Task Force Kilo established contact with an estimated twenty (20) VC in fighting holes along a treeline. Task Force Kilo received a heavy volume of automatic weapon fire. They returned fire and called an 81mm Mortar fire mission on the treeline. Air strikes were then directed on the enemy position. This action resulted in thirteen (13) VC KIA's, and the capture of a Russian flag, documents, one (1) 9mm pistol and several AK-47's. The operation was secured at 1800H to allow Task Force Kilo to return to the city of DaNang and assume its primary mission.

On 8 June, Company "A" 1/1 while OPCON to the 3rd Battalion conducted a cordon and search operation of the Village of Tanh Hanh (AT 996655). This operation was directed at uncovering the VCI in this village. While setting the cordon three (3) VC were spotted trying to leave the area. Alpha Company opened fire with organic weapons resulting in two (2) VC KIA's and the capture of one (1) M79 and one (1) .45 caliber pistol, numerous documents and medical supplies. The operation was secured at 1000H with no further sightings.

At 1600H on 8 June, the 3rd Battalion conducted air strikes on the deserted PPB at No Name Island (BT083672). The air strikes were designed to completely destroy this base and deny its use to the VC. Two (2) flights were run with the aircraft dropping a total of three thousand (3,000) pounds of Napalm, two thousand five hundred (2,500) pounds of Snake-Eye, and five thousand (5,000) pounds of General Purpose bombs. The air strikes resulted in eighty five percent (85%) destruction of the PPB. Artillery TOT's were fired to complete the destruction of the PPB.

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On 11 June, Task Force Kilo (Co. "G" 1/7 and 3rd Co., 21st Rangers) was assumed OPCON by 3rd Battalion for a sweep and block operation in the Tra Khe (1) and (3) and Tra Lo (center coordinates BT079680). Task Force Kilo was augmented by one platoon from Mike Company, one platoon from 3rd Amtrac Battalion, and one team of Scuba divers from the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. Task Force Kilo (Rein) under control of the 3rd Battalion Operations Officer, commenced the sweep from the south, along the "Finger Lake" (Song Can Bien) to the north. The platoon from 3rd Amtrac Battalion formed a block at the 70 grid line on the north. The operation was completed at 1700H with no enemy sightings nor significant findings.

At first light on 13 June, Task Force Kilo (Co. "G" 1/7 and 1st Co., 21st Rangers) commenced a sweep of the southern sector of the 3rd Battalion TAOR. Shortly after the start of the sweep, Task Force Kilo established contact with six (6) enemy at BT072634. The action resulted in five (5) VC KIA's, one (1) WIA, who was detained, and the capture of numerous documents and miscellaneous 782 gear. The 21st Rangers suffered two (2) KIA's and one (1) WIA in this action. Throughout the remainder of the sweep, Task Force Kilo uncovered many dud artillery rounds and surprise firing devices. These were all destroyed in place.

On 14 June, Task Force Kilo was OPCON to 3rd Battalion for a cordon and search operation in Cam Sa (1) (BT085645). Company "K" 3/1 and a CIT team further augmented the Task Force. This operation was directed at uncovering the VCI in this village. In a day long operation, CIT screened seventy five (75) VN civilians, of which seven women were detained. After interrogation it was determined that six (6) women were guerillas and one (1) woman was the area comm-liaison.

On 15 June, Company "K" and Company "M" rotated company TAOR's. Company "K" assumed Company "M's" positions at Binh Ky, and Towers #2, #3, #4, and III MAF POW Compound. Company "M" relieved the Company "K" position at the Leprosarium (BT099666).

At first light on 19 June, a cordon and search of the village of Ha Tay (BT012642) was conducted by Company "A" 1/1, along with one squad from Company "L" 3/1 and a CIT team. When the cordon was being set in at 0200H, three (3) VC attempted to break out of the cordon in the sector manned by the Company "L" platoon. The VC were taken under fire with small arms and returned fire with small arms and grenades. This action resulted in two (2) VC KIA's and the capture of two (2) AK-47's and numerous documents. The Company "L" platoon suffered one (1) KIA and one (1) WIA. The search of the village at first light accounted for one hundred and thirty (130) civilians screened by CIT with two civilians being detained as VC suspects. This operation again was directed at uncovering the VCI in this village.

Also on 19 June, Company "L" 3/7 moved out of the Battalion C.P. at 0400H to assume a blocking position at the 68 grid line for the 4th Battalion, 51st ARVN Regiment sweeping to the north from the Tu Cau Road. The ARVN force were in search of an NVA Recon Company which had previously been located in this area. The operation was secured at

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1600H with no enemy sightings.

At 1200H on 22 June, Company "L" 3/7 passed OPCON from 3/1 to 3/7. Company "I" was relocated at the 3rd Battalion C.P. The PPB at Man Quan (2) was vacated by Company "L" and the position destroyed.

On 23 June, Task Force November (Comprised of one (1) platoon from Company "L" and a Vietnamese Regional Forces unit) commenced a search and clear operation in the Western Sector of the 3rd Battalion TAOR. The sweep commenced at Tu Cau Road and proceeded north to approximately the 70 grid line. At conclusion of the sweep, the Task Force returned to the vicinity of BT056665 and established a PPB to conduct operations and train the RF unit in patrols and ambushes. For the remainder of the month, Task Force November operated out of this position conducting day and night patrols and ambushes with the RF unit. On the same day Company "I" sent one platoon to the vicinity of An Luu (BT040676) to conduct joint operations with a unit from the 157th RF Co. They established a joint PPB and conducted day and night patrols and ambushes.

On 24 June, Company "L" and Company "I" rotated TAOR's. Company "I" relieved Company "L" of responsibility for Tu Cau Bridge (BT032648). Company "L" returned to the Battalion C.P. to operate as the Battalion Mobile Reaction Company. Company "L" also retained the responsibility for manning Tower #1 (BT056655).

B. AIR SUPPORT/DEFENSE

1. Medevacs

During the month of June, 3rd Battalion called in sixty (60) medevacs for one hundred and thirty three (133) personnel. The Marine Corps Medevacs were broken into forty four (44) emergency, twenty six (26) priority, and nineteen (19) routine, thirteen (13) of the routine being KIA's. The ARVN's had twenty one (21) emergency, nine (9) priority; there were three (3) VC/NVA medevaced, two (2) being emergency and one (1) KIA. Due to the close proximity between the Battalion TAOR and Marble Mountain Air Facility, the medevacs were executed in minimum time, with approximately, twenty five (25) minutes required for an emergency medevac. Of the one hundred and thirty three (133) medevaced, forty nine (49) were victims of booby traps.

2. Logistics

Although the majority of the Battalion logistical resupply was run by vehicle, some Battalion units were accessible only by air, Crows Nest (BT070705), Alpha-6 (BT068705), and the Leprosarium (BT099644) were resupplied by helicopter every three (3) days. These resupplies were usually run by two (2) CH-46's from Marble Mountain Air Facility and took approximately one (1) hour to complete. No unusual difficulties were encountered during the month.

ENCLOSURE (1)

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3. Fixed Wing

When the second platoon, Company "K" CP at No Name Island (BT083675) was attacked by enemy forces, shortly after midnight on 7 June, a Spooky Gunship and a Basketball Flare Ship were called in. The following day, 8 June, a flight of F-4 Phantoms destroyed the CP at No Name Island with bombs and napalm.

4. Reconnaissance Flights

There were five (5) VR flights during the month of June.

C. ARTILLERY

Artillery forward observer teams and Battalion FSCC personnel were provided to 3rd Battalion by Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. During the month, direct artillery support was provided by Battery "A", Battery "B", Battery "C", and Whiskey Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. General support artillery was provided by Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and 3rd 8 in. Howitzer Battery, 1st Force Artillery Group.

During the month of June, several introductory classes on supporting arms were conducted for personnel newly arrived in RW. A thirty (30) minute lecture followed by an 81mm mortar fire mission proved very successful in demonstrating the availability and uses of supporting arms. These introductory classes are supplemented by further instruction in call for fire and adjusting procedures once the personnel have reached their companies.

Ammunition expenditure for the month showed a significant increase in comparison to a corresponding period in the previous month. This may be attributed to a greater familiarity with the battalion area of operations which allowed more precise targeting of unobserved fires and an increased confidence on the part of field units in the application of observed fires. The greater volume of artillery support was concentrated in the area to the south of the Battalion combat base and also in the No Name Island area to the northeast of the combat base with special emphasis placed on known infiltration routes and assembly areas.

TRAININGTHE BATTALION CONDUCTED THE FOLLOWING TRAINING THIS PERIOD

1. A formal Oreintation/Indoctrination Program was conducted for one hundred and ninety six (196) personnel. Lectures were presented by the Battalion Commander and all the staff sections, including the Supply Section, Air Liaison Officer, Medical Section, and Communications Officer. Special emphasis was placed on orders which govern the actions of the individual Marine, the Personal Response Program, the conditions in the AO in which the Marines will serve, and the goals and mission of the Battalion. One full day of training was devoted to care and cleaning, safety features, familiarization firing, and zeroing of the M16A1 Rifle. The Quick Fire/Quick Kill firing method was also presented. A "Training Platoon" syllabus was originated for the platoon assigned to the III MAF POW Compound. This ensures a formal training program for at least one platoon at all times. The companies conducted normal training as operational commitments permitted.

2. Familiarization Firing of the M-16 was conducted at the Battalion Rifle Range for 196 personnel of the Battalion.

LOGISTICSA. ENGINEER ASSISTANCE AND OTHER CONSTRUCTION

During this reporting period no engineer assistance requests were completed. Since the Battalion has been located at the Cau Ha Combat Base it has initiated engineer assistance requests to improve living and working conditions. These engineer work requests are being coordinated with Alpha Company, 1st Engineers. At present the Battalion is awaiting replacement of seven (7) SEA Huts destroyed by enemy action while 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines occupied this Combat Base.

As a result of material deterioration and enemy action all major ammunition storage bunkers are beyond repair. The work order for new bunkers has been received and the work should be completed in late July. Further work requests for new sentry towers and a central draining system for the messhall, the laundry point and showers have been initiated. The Battalion continues to improve the Cau Ha Combat Base on a self-help program.

B. SUPPLY

1. Classes I, III, and IV supply support have been sufficient during June to meet the Battalion operational commitments. Class II support still remains a major problem area, especially motor transport spare parts. This problem is due to FLC's inability to supply essential spare parts. This in turn is affecting the Battalion's MARES and FORSTAT percentages.

C. MAINTENANCE

COMMUNICATIONS~~CONFIDENTIAL~~A. PERSONNEL

As of 30 June the strength of the Communications Platoon was one (1) Officer and seventy six (76) Enlisted. One radio operator tripped an SPD on 7 June and was medevaced out of country.

B. EQUIPMENT

Due to an electrical storm on the night of 17 June, electrical power service was interrupted from 1000 18 June to 1530 18 June. An NSA contact team was brought in to effect repairs on components damaged by lightning. Damage was extensive to the 100KW generator, not as extensive to the 150KW generator. After the repairs were completed a recommendation was submitted to NSA to replace the 100KW generator currently in use with another 150KW generator in order to meet increasing load requirements throughout the combat base. One radio handset and handset cord was destroyed when struck by lightning. No personnel suffered injuries due to lightning. (Radios continued to flow from this unit to the DA system with none returning.) The message center logged excessive down time due to the failure of on-line encryption equipment.

C. OPERATIONS/TRAINING

During the month of June, members of the Communications Platoon did not participate in any significant operations. A 25 pair cable was installed to link this unit with 2nd Battalion and Regiment. This provides reliable backup for the multi-channel integrated wire-radio system now in use. Members of the Communications Platoon also continued to replace much of the internal telephone wire with 25 pair cable, which facilitates better maintenance and trouble shooting. The Communications Platoon also began electrically grounding the towers in the combat base to minimize the effects of lightning damage.

A. PERSONNEL

1. On 30 June 1969, the total strength was two (2) Medical Officers and fifty-four (54) Corpsmen. During this period twelve (12) Corpsmen were transferred to other commands for duty. One (1) Corpsman was admitted to the hospital out of country. Eight (8) Corpsman were received for duty during this period. There were four (4) WIA's and no KIA's for this period of time.

B. PATIENT LOAD

1. For this period five hundred and seventy-three (573) patients were seen at BAS Sick Call for an average of nineteen (19) patients per day.
2. There were: Sixteen (16) patients diagnosed with V.D.; thirteen (13) patients diagnosed with diarrhea; five (5) patients diagnosed with upper respiratory infections; thirty (30) patients diagnosed with FUO; and one hundred and seven (107) patients diagnosed with skin disorders.

C. MEDCAP/DENTCAP

1. Medical aid was given to one thousand and one (1001) Vietnamese civilians by the BAS.
2. No dental patients were treated by the BAS during this period.
3. BAS Corpsman held a total of ten (10) MEDCAP/DENTCAP's for the month of June.

D. SANITATION

Sanitation inspections were held on consecutive Wednesdays during the month of June. Gradual improvements in the messhall were noted although major drainage problems remain. The company areas in the combat base were noted to have begun the screening of their billeting spaces. Rats were observed in increasing numbers in the last two weeks of the month and appropriate rat control measures were initiated, and are being rigorously pursued.
