INTELLIGENCE

A. ENEMY

1. General. During this reporting period the 3d Battalion made 17 contacts with the enemy. There was one daylight contact and 16 night contacts of which one was enemy initiated. The Battalion accounted for six enemy KIA, 12 detainees, and no POW's. Weapons captured were one AK-47 (Assault Rifle), and one Soviet 7.62 millimeter pistol.

2. Enemy Situation. The active enemy units operating in the 3d Battalion's AO make up the Northern Wing, which is subordinate to the Frontline. Units of the Northern Wing are the:

(a) C-31 Independent (Doc Lap) Company. This unit has an estimated strength of 75 personnel. They have probably moved north of the Song Gu De and are operating from the vicinity AT8990.

(b) C-7 Company. This unit, with an estimated strength of fifty to sixty (50-60) personnel, is also believed to have moved north and is now operating from the vicinity AT8287.

(c) 573 Artillery Battalion. This unit, with 122mm and 140mm rocket capability, is assigned the mission of providing the Northern Wing with artillery support, both rocket and mortars, in coordinated attacks against selected ground installations in the AO.

(d) T-87 Sapper (Main Force) Battalion. This unit, with an estimated strength of 100 personnel is presently operating from the vicinity AT8589.

(e) Q-85 Armed (Local Force) Unit. This unit has an estimated strength of 200 personnel. This unit is presently operating from the vicinity AT9084.

(f) Q-90 Sapper (Local Force) Unit. This unit has an estimated strength of 65 personnel. This unit is presently operating out of a base camp area in the vicinity of AT8391.

3. Enemy Mission. The mission of the enemy is to maintain reconnaissance patrols, harassing attacks and supply runs while building up units on the perimeter of the 1st Marines AO. The small patrols, usually six to eight men, attempt to make liaison with the Viet Cong Infrastructure to coordinate guerrilla action and logistical support. The main areas of interest are the villages of Hoa Vinh, Hoa Miep, and Hoa Lac. Associating closely with the villagers, therefore being the greatest hindrance to the enemy's mission, are the combined units of CAP's and CUPPS's. The disruption of these programs would be extremely advantageous to the enemy.

At present the enemy appears to be content to protect his outlying units with an anti-reconnaissance screen while proselytizing the villagers and harassing the CVN troops of the combined unit programs.

4. Enemy Trends and Capabilities. The trends indicated by the enemy sightings and contacts are two fold: (1) a massing of units around the perimeter of the 1st Marines AO, (2) a continuation and increase in the use of small patrols to make liaison with the Viet Cong Infrastructure, to pick up supplies and launch harassing attacks.

Spotting made by reconnaissance teams on the fringe of the AO reveal that there are fresh, well equipped troops in the area. A concentrated anti-reconnaissance effort is being put forth. There appears to be a well developed supply system leading to troop concentrations along the natural avenues of approach to the lowlands.

The enemy is capable of rapid movement and deployment all along the AO using excellent cover and concealment in the mountain canopy by day and natural avenues for night movement.

The enemy will attempt to maintain his anti-reconnaissance efforts and increase his activities into the villages with hopes of extending his sphere of influence.

6. Weather.

The temperatures during this reporting period ranged from a high of one hundred (100) degrees to a low of seventy-five (75) degrees. The mean temperature for the month was eighty-eight (88) degrees and the relative humidity was sixty-nine (69) per cent. Rainfall for the month totaled one and eleven one-hundredths (1.11) inches.

7. Terrain.

a. In the Hoa Lac, Hoa Vinh, Hoa Thanh area the terrain is mostly covered by rice paddies. The hamlets and villages are on higher dry ground. There are several uninhabited hamlets with the remains of a few concrete houses. These areas provide good cover and concealment and storage sites for the enemy.

b. The area South and Southwest of Hill 190 and Hill 124 is characterized by low, rolling hills. Vegetation consists of low trees and bushes. Movement in this area is fairly easy. The ability to maneuver troops in this area is very good.

c. The major portion of the AO (Northwestern area) consists of extremely rough, steep, mountainous terrain. Movement in this area is greatly restricted, especially for large units. Unless stream-beds or trails are followed, movement is reduced to one-hundred to three-hundred (100-300) meters per hour. Cover, concealment, and water are abundant.

Narrative Summary

During the month of July, the Battalion continued its emphasis on small unit (squad and platoon) day and night combat patrols/ambushes within the area of operations. Most contact with enemy forces was with small three to five men groups in the area of "The Claw" (AT9183). Training in the form of combined operations and patrols was conducted with the 1/25th Regional Force Company Group.

A Company Reconnaissance in Force (RIF) of the Hoa Van Valley (AT8282) was conducted from 23 July to 26 July. On 23 July, Company "K", was helilifted into their respective landing zones and a Fire Support Base of one Section, 81mm Mortar was positioned on Dong Den (AT837828). A Reconnaissance in Force was conducted on the 23-25th and the Company was extracted from (AT8280) on the 26th. No contact was made with enemy forces during the operation, however, numerous trails, a man made well and fighting holes were sighted. On 27 July, Company "K" resumed its AO.

Company "I" conducted 167 day patrols and 210 night activities during period 1-31 July.

Company "K" conducted a four day company size Recon in Force, 56 day patrols and 58 night ambushes. Additionally a ten-day training cycle for all Platoons was conducted at Camp 14 during period 1-31 July.

Company "L" conducted 39 day activities and 57 night ambushes during period 1-31 July.

S-3 personnel conducted 32 hours of instruction during period 1-31 July. The end of the month of July found the battalion better trained in all respects and more confident in its ability to plan, organize and conduct larger-scale operations as well as small-scale squad/Platoon activities.

B. AIR SUPPORT

FIXED WING

The First Marine Aircraft Wing supported the battalion with a total of 78 fixed wing air missions (13 Beacons, 45 Close Air Strikes and 20 TPQ-10 strikes) and 37 forward air controllers (airborne) utilizing OV-10 Aircraft. These aircraft dropped a total of 823,500 pounds of ordnance (496,500 CAS, 163,000 Beacon and 164,000 TPQ-10). There was also a total of 14-2.75" rockets, 6000 rds 20mm, 6000-7.62mm and 16 CBU-25's expended. This ordnance resulted in eight secondary explosions and seven secondary fires.

ROTARY WING AIRCRAFT

Nine medevac's were completed which evacuated seven emergency, four priority, and one routine. The average time for emergency medevacs from initial request until the time the helo was over LZ was 11 minutes. It took an average of 16 minutes once the helo came on station to get the man on board and complete the mission, making an average time of 27 minutes from the time mission was called until completion.

There was a total of 25 visual reconnaissance missions flown utilizing CH-46 and UH-1E Aircraft.

There was a total of three trap drop missions flown utilizing UH-1E aircraft for a total of four drops and 32 weapons expended on grid AT913837.

TRAINING

1. THE BATTALION CONDUCTED THE FOLLOWING TRAINING DURING JULY.

a. A Battalion Indoctrination school was held for a period of five days. 174 personnel attended.

b. A Battalion Orientation Briefing for Officers and Staff NCO's was held for a period of two days. Six personnel attended.

c. Company Training: All Companies conducted training in a weekly schedule and included Drug Abuse, Rules of Engagement, Personal Response and First Aid as subjects.

LOGISTICSA. ENGINEER ASSISTANCE AND OTHER CONSTRUCTION

1. During the reporting period 12 Engineer Assistance Requests were submitted for the upgrading of existing facilities. Of those three were completed by engineers and three were completed under the Battalion-Self-Help Program, as materials became available. Monsoon preparations are still in progress within all cantonments in the Battalion A0. This Battalion, supported by First Engineers upgraded Marine positions at Hai Van Pass, Thua Thien Province, RVN in preparation for it's turnover to the AFVN on 1 August 1970.

B. SUPPLY

1. During the period 23 July to 26 July this organization supported a Company Reconnaissance-in-Force Operation. No unusual experiences occurred.

2. Supply support has been sufficient with the exception of Class IX spare parts for Motor Transport equipment. Parts for M274A2, M151A2 and the HPCU have been on order for periods in excess of three months and are still forthcoming.

MEDICAL/DENTAL AFFAIRSA. PERSONNEL

1. On 31 July 1970 the total strength was one Medical Officer, one Chaplain, and 42 corpsmen. During this period there were nine corpsmen transferred to other commands for separation. There were two corpsmen MIA's and negative KIA's for this period.

B. PATIENT LOAD

1. For this period 408 patients were seen at the Battalion Aid Station for an average of 14 patients per day.

2. There were 14 diagnosed with V. D., none with diarrhea, none with upper respiratory infections, 10 with Fever Unknown Origin, 42 with skin disorders and one with malaria.

C. MEDCAP/DENCAP

1. There were three MedCap and no DenCap held during the month of July.

D. SANITATION

1. Weekly sanitation inspections were conducted throughout the Battalion and outlying areas during the month of July. These areas were found to be satisfactory overall. The problem of the head barrels not being burned properly and emptied frequently still remains. The Battalion is taking corrective measures on these situations.

COMMUNICATIONS

A. PERSONNEL

As of 31 July 1970, the Communications Platoon consisted of one Officer and 75 enlisted personnel.

B. EQUIPMENT

Generator Section received one PU-667 skid mounted generator. A change of T/E now authorizes this battalion five skid mounted generators. The Tech Shop processed 186 TERO's, of which 85 were incoming and 101 were completed. 14 pieces of equipment were evacuated to DX, with 34 returned to this unit. FSR completed and returned 20 pieces to us. 12 pieces were turned into FSR for repair. Message Center processed 1069 incoming and 87 outgoing messages. A new type battery for the AN/PRC-77/KY-38/AN/PRC-25 has been issued in lieu of the BA-386. The replacement is the BA-4386 and has already proven reliable for three to four times as long as the BA-386.

C. OPERATIONS/TRAINING

Personnel of the Communications Platoon participated in several short range patrols, ambushes and one company size operation. Two hours of MOS technical training a week has been integrated into the training program. Continual progress in preventive maintenance and transmission security is being made daily.

011525H. Second Squad, Second Platoon, Company "I" at coordinates AT892820, destroyed a 1000 lb. bomb with the help of an EOD Team.

012200H. Company "I", O P. Robin at coordinates AT907820 spotted two VC/NVA at coordinates AT907821 moving from the southwest toward Quan Nam. Due to the location of Activity II2A, supporting arms were not used. Instead II2A swept the area under illumination with negative results.

022125H. Third Squad, Second Platoon, Company "I" at coordinates AT883817, while enroute to ambush site, spotted two enemy at coordinates AT883817, two hundred meters to their west. Activity opened up with small arms fire and swept area with negative results.

030120H. Second Squad, Second Platoon, Company "L" at coordinates AT891831, while in ambush site observed three VC/NVA in a treeline at coordinates AT886837. Activity called in 81mm fire mission, swept area with negative results.

032010H. Third Squad, Second Platoon, Company "L" at coordinates AT911848, activity enroute to ambush site spotted six VC/NVA at coordinates AT910850. The VC/NVA initiated contact, activity returned fire with small arms and the enemy broke contact. Ten minutes later the activity reestablished contact. They called in supporting arms and also a reactionary force was sent to reinforce the activity. Both activities linked up on sweep of area, with negative results.

072015H. Company "I" CUPP unit, while set in ambush site at coordinates AT903832 observed two VC/NVA moving west at coordinates AT903831. Activity opened fire with small arms and swept area with negative results.

082035H. Third Squad, Second Platoon, Company "L" while moving into ambush site at coordinates AT921857 observed five enemy moving northwest at coordinates AT920858. Activity opened fire with small arms, called in 81mm fire mission and swept area with negative results.

Woman told activity that enemy moved through coordinates AT820800 south to coordinates AT830750 to pickup point at coordinates AT866760. Enemy used this route every five days to pickup food. Third Squad, Second Platoon, Company "L" while in ambush site at coordinates AT915859, received four RPG's and small arms fire from an estimated 15 enemy at coordinates AT914859 and AT915860. Area was swept with negative results, and the reactionary force I2L set up an ambush in area.

270010H. Company "I" CUPP Unit while in ambush site at coordinates AT908823 spotted five VC/NVA to their north at coordinates AT908825. Activity opened up with small arms fire, swept area with negative results.

270850H. 3d Battalion, 1st Marines OP2 at coordinates AT924783 observed 10 Vietnamese near perimeter wire. The Vietnamese appeared to be picking up C-Rat cans and cutting grass. Activity tried to halt them for questioning, all but nine ran away. Nine were detained, seven of the nine were released, and two held for questioning by CIT.

272010H. Company "I" at coordinates AT898822 had sensor activations. OP Robin observed seven enemy with weapons, pack and uniforms at coordinates AT899825. Activity called in 60mm fire mission trying to force enemy into I42A ambush site at coordinates AT909822. I42A observed enemy approaching and opened fire with small arms. Enemy returned fire. Activity swept area and found one VC/NVA KIA, in black shorts and cartridge belt, one US battle dressing, two pieces, four feet by six feet, of green plastic.

272140H. Second Platoon, Company "L" at coordinates AT928841 observed two enemy through a starlight scope crossing the river from south to north at coordinates AT908834. Activity called 81mm fire mission.

Activity opened fire on the enemy, then six to eight or more VC/NVA returned fire at coordinates AT905817. Activity returned fire and enemy broke contact fleeing to the east. Swept area with negative results.

310600H. Company "I" CUPP Unit swept area of previous contact at coordinates AT905818, finding one homemade pack, one four by six feet piece of plastic, two lbs bag of candy, 15-20 lbs polished and unpolished rice, two packs of VN cigarettes and one tobacco pouch with cigarette paper. All items turned in to Battalion S-2.

a. Enemy Forces

(1) No change, except intelligence indicates that the Hoa Van Valley is being used by the enemy as a harbor site and forward storage area for rockets.

b. Friendly Forces

(1) 1st Marines continues present mission.

(2) Air Support

(a) 1st Marine Aircraft Wing provides fixed and rotary wing support.

1. Fixed Wing LZ prep on D-1 and D-DAY.
2. Heliborne assault on D-DAY, H+1 hours.
3. Helicopter resupply on D+1 and D+2, if required.
4. Helicopter extraction on order on D+3.

(3) Artillery Support

(a) 11th Mar provides general support reinforcing fires.
 (b) Battery "C", 1/11 provides direct support.

c. Attachments and Detachments: None

2. MISSION. 3rdBn, 1st Marines on D-DAY at H-Hour conducts a heliborne assault and reconnaissance in force of the Hoa Van Valley to locate enemy basecamps and equipment.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. On D-1, Co "K", 3rdBn, 1st Marines redeployes to 3/1 CP via helicopter and Co "I" positions one squad (Rein) on Hill 124 to replace Co "K". Section, 81mm Mortar Plt is positioned on Dong Den (vic AT837828). On D-DAY, one Plt, Co "K" conducts a heliborne assault into LZ Bluejay and one Plt to LZ Finch and establishes blocking positions. Simultaneously Co "K(-)" is helilifted to Dong Den and conducts RIF through the Hoa Van Valley (CM AT8282). Upon completion of RIF of Hoa Van Valley, Co "K" conducts RIF of terrain within assigned AO. (See Annex A, Opn. Overlay) Co "K" extracted approximately 261500H and on 27 July forces are repositioned.

b. Company "I"

- (1) Continue present mission IAW Ref. (b) and (c).
- (2) Deploy reinforced squad to Hill 124 on D-1 for duration of operation.

c. Company "K"

- (1) On D-1 relinquish AO to Co "I".
- (2) On D-DAY (H+1) helilift one platoon (Rein) to LZ Bluejay and one platoon to LZ Finch and establish blocking forces. Co "K(-)" lands at Dong Den and conducts recon in force of the Hoa Van Valley. (See Annex A-Opn Overlay)
- (3) Upon conclusion of RIF of Hoa Van Valley establish Combat Patrol Base and conduct RIF in AO.

d. Company "L"

- (1) Continue present mission IAW Ref (b) and (c).

e. 81mm Mortar Plt.

- (1) Provide section 81mm Mortars in Direct Support Co "K". Position section on Dong Den on D-1.

f. Reserve

- (1) Reinforcing units are available from resources external to the battalion to act as reserve.

g. Coordinating Instructions.

- (1) D-Day, H-Hour: 230600H July 1970.
- (2) Duration: approximately 4 days.
- (3) Artillery support requested IAW current Bn SOP.
- (4) Helicopter support requested IAW current Bn SOP.
- (5) Medevac procedures IAW current Bn SOP.
- (6) Employ 60mm mortars at Company Commander's discretion.
- (7) Starlight scopes and 150' nylon rope mandatory for each platoon.
- (8) Carry MK115 Ordnance Detector.
- (9) CO, Co "K" acts as Fire Support Coordinator for 81mm fire support within Co "K" AO. Coordination of other fire support remains with CO, 3/1.
- (10) 81mm Mortar Section on Dong Den provides aircraft watch during daylight hours.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS.

- (a) Carry four days class I and V.
- (b) Resupply available on 24 and 25 July upon request.
- (c) Flak jackets and helmet will not be worn.

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS/ELECTRONICS.

- (a) 3rd Bn, 1st Marines establishes a radio relay on Dong Den (vic AT837828) with station on Bn Tac (Primary), Callsign Donny Brook X-Ray.
- (b) SitReps and PosReps every two hours.
- (c) Report night positions by 1800H.
- (d) Emphasize comm security.


