



#### PART II SECTION B INTELLICENCE

#### A. EVENTY

- 1. General. During this reporting period the 3d Battalion made 29 contacts with the enemy. There were three daylight contacts, one of which was enemy initiated; and 26 night contacts, of which lit were enemy initiated. The Battalion accounted for one enemy KIA, and no POWs. There were no weapons captured during this reporting period.
- 2. Enemy Situation. Active enemy forces operating in the 3d Bat-talion's AO are made up of units subordinate to the Northern and Central Wings which are subordinate to the Front Four. Units believed to be operating within the AO are:
- a. 575th Rocket Battalion (Arty). This unit with 122mm and 140mm rocket capability, has an estimated strength of 150. Up to company size elements of the Battalion have reported recently in the southern portion of the AO. The 575th Rocket Battalion is independent and subordinate to the Front Four.
- b. Q-84 Armed Unit. This unit, with mortar (NFI) capability, has an estimated strength of 50. It was reported operating in vic AT 9069 by a PW in April 1970.
- c. Q-85 Armed Unit. This unit, with an estimated strength of 200, consists of the T-87 Sapper Company and the Hai Van Engineers Company. Both were downgraded to company size in early 1970 and subordinated to the Q-85th. The Battalion has recently operated in the vic AT9084.
- d. 31st NVA Regiment. Recent intelligence reports indicate elements of the 31st NVA Regiment are operating within the southern portion of 3/1's AO. While a PW report placed the regimental HQ vic AT 8062 in June of this year, the 31st's operating area extended as far north as Da Nang during TET of 1968. Further, the 575th Rocket Battalion has operated in support of the 31st Regiment since October 1969. Therefore, it is possible that up to company size elements of the 31st NVA Regiment are located and operating in the South and Western portion of the 3/1 TAOR.




- 3. Summary of Rhemy Activities. During the reporting period the enemy continued previously established pattern of avoiding meeting engagements with friendly forces while conducting rice collection and tax procurement in the lowlands. Enemy-initiated activity was directed primarily against friendly patrols in the Hoa Lac (v) area east of Hill 190 and against friendly defensive positions south of OP Reno in the southern portion of the TAOR. The increase in enemy initiated contacts over the previous reporting period is attributed to anti-patrol activity in the Quan Nams (h) of Hoa Lac (v) where his rice collection efforts have been disrupted, and harassing attacks (grenade/mortar) in the southern reaches of the TAOR. These attacks south of OP Reno are believed to be diversionary in nature while commo/liaison and possibly rocket related activity takes place in the lowlands along the Song Tuy Loan. A launch site believed to have been used on 21 Oct in a 6-round rocket attack against DA NANG was discovered just inside the TAOR vic (AT903714).
- 4. Enemy Missions. The enemy's mission remains essentially the same with primary emphasis upon avoiding contact while replanishing supplies. His efforts in the Hoa Lac area have been disrupted by friendly patrols and population control measures instituted during the month, and limited enemy harassment of patrols in that area has increased. Proselytizing and propagandizing appear to continue but no large scale enemy efforts in this regard have been noted, possibly because of continued U.S. and RF/FF pacification efforts in the populated areas. Cadre meetings are believed to occur on an irregular basis at hamlet level with key local officials and limited W. Main Force/NVA representatives present. Probably no more than 5-15 people attend such meetings. Only one report of enemy Fall-Winter campaign plans has been received. A volunteer informant to Company "C", 5th Special Forces, DA NANG stated that enemy intentions were to conduct a Fall - Winter campaign from Soptember through October, possibly code named 31/K 700, and a Winter -Spring campaign in three phases from 10 October - 15 December. Emphasis was placed on increased mortar attacks on DA NANG, Hoa Vang (D) and nearby areas (NFI),

#### 5. Enemy Vulnerabilities, Capabilities and Probable Courses of Action

a. Vulnerabilities. The enemy remains vulnerable to detection and destruction of massed forces and interdiction of supply/commo-liaison routes. His morale, frequently reported as low at the local level, remains vulnerable to friendly psycological operations. The VC Infrastructure, while well organized and effective, remains vulnerable to friendly counter-intelligence efforts.









- b. Capabilities and Probable Courses of Action. The enemy retains the capability of conducting multi-company and possibly Battalion size attacks utilizing forces located within the 3/1 TAOR. Employment of large masses of troops and supporting arms is severely limited however, due to friendly observation and interdiction. He will continue to move in small size units to avoid detection, and at the same time will maintain pressure on friendly forces by harassment of US and RF/PF Units. Replenishment of supplies as well as taxation and preselytizing will continue through intimidation of the local populace by the VC Infrastructure.
- 6. Weather. Weather during the reporting period was characterized by unsecsonally low rainfall and humidity during the first half of the month. On 17 October, typhoon JOAN and accompanying thunderstorm activity made landfall south of DA NANG. Winds reached approximately 50 knots in the 3/1 area but did little damage. During the remainder of the month rainfall and humidity were more in keeping with yearly seasonal averages. Typhoon KATE brought winds, high tides and heavy rainfall in the Hoi An area on 25 October. Wind velocities reached more than 60 knots causing extensive roof and small building damage to cantonments and Victnamese structures in surrounding community. Flooding from rain and high tides was extensive but no civilian evacuation was conducted within 3/1 TAOR. The temperatures during this reporting period ranged from a high of 89 degrees to a low of 69 degrees. The mean temperature for the month was 77 and the relative humidity was 78.6%. Rainfall for the month totaled 23.48 inches.
- 7. Terrain. Configuration of terrain and man-made features remains unchanged from the previous month, save for periods of flooding brought about by seasonal rains and storm-related high tides. Overall trafficability to foot movement in the river lowlands and paddy areas has been generally more restricted but not impassible, except during exceptionally high water. Only one such period occurred as typhoon KATE made land-fall near the DA NANG area on 25 October. The last week of the month saw the most severe flood conditions on 29 and 30 October during heavy rains in the aftermath of KATE. By the 31st, the waters had begun to subside as a general clearing in the weather began. The main LOC to Hill 190 was briefly considered closed during peak waters on 30 October but was not completely impassable. Travel in the low regions for troops was unfeasible, except by boat, during the high water period.



#### PART II SECTION C MARRATIVE SUMMARY

A. During the month of October, the Battalion continued its emphasis on small unit day and night combat patrols/embushes. Long duration patrols characterized the Battalion's operations during the period. Activities were focused on known/suspected enemy rocket and morter sites. The majority of enemy contact made was in the area of Ap Quan Nam (1) and (2). Company "I" and the 1/158th Regional Force Company conducted day and night patrols/embushes in this area. CUPP 4-1, made up of Marines from Company "I" and the 43rd Popular Force Platoon conducted day and night activities in the vicinity of grid square 9078 from 1 October to 10 October. On 10 October, the CUFP 4-1 was disestablished.

On 19 October, a Population Control Operation commenced involving the 1/158th R. F. Company and Company "I". Elements from each company are implementing a joint detailed census program with a schematic layout of each house and surrounding area in Ap Quan Nam (1) and (2). In addition a series of strategically located checkpoints have been established in order to control movement and possible Viet-Cong infiltrators into this

During the period 1 October to 31 October, Company "I" conducted 164 day patrols and 274 night activities. Company "K" conducted 57 day patrols and 63 night activities. Company "L" conducted 78 day patrols and 110 night activities.

S-3 personnel conducted 198 hours of instruction during the period 1-31 October 1970.

#### B. AIR SUFFORT

#### FIXED WING

The First Marine Air Wing supported the Battalion with a total of 31 fixed wing air strikes, which breaks down into 21 close sir support strikes, five Beacons, and five TPQ - 10 strikes. Twenty one Forward Air Controllers (sirborne) utilizing OV - 10 aircraft also flew in support of 3/1. Fixed wing aircraft dropped a total of 283,500 pounds of ordnance (174,000 pounds CAS, 66,500 pounds BCN, and 43,000 pounds TPQ - 10). There was a total of 65 2.75 inch rockets and 625 rounds of 20mm ammunition expended on targets throughout 3/1's TAOR. This ordnance resulted in two enemy killed by air, four secondary explosions, three secondary fires, one bunker destroyed and 400 meters of treeline destroyed. These strikes also uncovered several bunkers and trails for exploitation by the Battalion's ground forces. Poor weather caused most of 3/1's fixed wing air support missions to be cancelled during the last two weeks of October.

#### ROTARY WING AIRCRAFT

Thirty-five medevacs were completed during the month of October which evacuated 22 emergency, 11 priority, and two routine casualties. The average time for emergency medevacs from initial call until the time the helicopter was over the LZ was 39 minutes. It took an average of six minutes once the helicopter was on station to get the casualty aboard and complete the mission for an average time of 45 minutes from the time the mission was called until completion. This is a commendable accomplishment considering the hazardous flying conditions that existed during the last two weeks of October as a result of the monsoon rains.

Rotary wing aircraft lifted a total of 21/1,174 pounds of cargo both internally and externally loaded in conjunction with resupply of the Battalion. During the month of October, the First Marine Air Wing helilifted 379 passengers in support of 3/1.

#### C. ARTILLERY

lst Battalion, llth Marine Regiment continued to provide artillery support for 3d Battalion(-), lst Marine Regiment, utilizing "C" Battery in a direct support mission. General support fires came from "L" Battery (155 selfpropelled Howitzer), 4th Battalion, llth Marine Regiment. On the 26th of October, "C" Battery was decentralized from 1st Battalion, llth Marines. Naval Gunfire was also in general support for two days.


The fire support coordinator worked closely with the S-2 to provide fire support on intelligence reports. Pro-emptive fires were reduced from twelve rounds to three rounds per target, the emphasis of which were on known/suspected rocket and morter sites.

Forward observers conducted fire support classes for small unit leaders. The fire support coordinator conducted artillery indoctrination classes for the Battalian's NCO School and the new arrivals in country.





FART II SECTION D TRAINING

#### 1. THE BATTALION CONDUCTED THE FOLLOWING TRAINING DURING OCTOBER.

- A. Three Battalion Indoctrination classes were held for a period of four days each. Fifty six personnel attended.
- B. A contact team from the 1st Engineer Battalion conducted three, two hour classes on Land Mine Warfare. Thirty four personnel from Indoctrination School attended. Also a total of 83 Marines from the Battalion attended the classes.
- C. During the month of October, there were three Staff and Officer Schools held by the Battalion. The subjects covered were Malaria Prevention, Leadership and Responsibilities, and Command Policy.
- D. The Battalion held two classes on Communications for a period of six days each. Twenty two Marines attended. One Vietnamese Language School was held by the Battalion for a period of twenty-one days with 10 Marines satisfactorily completing the course with a 500 word vocabulary.
- E. A contact team from 1st Medical Battalion gave two classes on Malaria Prevention. A total of 253 Marines attended.
- F. A class on Human Relations was given by ADC Brigadier General SINNIONS. Twenty-one Marines attended.
- G. Company Training: All companies conducted training in a weekly schedule which included familiarization firing, handling of POW's, conduct of patrols, patrol leaders orders, and weapons safety.
- H. The Battalion Rifle Range was used to instruct replacement personnel in the Quick Fire/Quick Kill method of engagement. A total of 56 replacement personnel were instructed in this method. Thirty three replacement personnel fired the .45 caliber pistol for familiarization. The range was utilized for personnel to fam fire and place battle sights on their weapons. A total of 200 personnel from various organizations utilized the range. Also 95 Marines fam fired the M-60 machine gun.



#### A. ENGINEER ASSISTANCE AND OTHER CONSTRUCTION


1. During the reporting period five Engineer Assistance Requests were submitted for the upgrade of the Battalion Cantonments. One of these Engineer Requests was for the damage done by typhoch KATE. The "Self-Help Program" has rapidly repaired most of the damage, but still lacks materials in sufficient quantities to effectively complete restoration of all damaged areas.

#### B. SUPPLY

- 1. Supply support in the areas of Class II, Type 2, i.e. administrative supplies, skivie shirts, BA386, BA4386 and BA30 batteries have continued to be difficult to obtain. Class IX spere parts for the M274A2 (LIVC) are again in short supply.

- a. Orphanages. Two truck loads of sour mild for hogs, two hundred pounds spoil corn for chickens, ten cases baby food, 37 rubber sandals, 48 bars of soap, 50 school books, six boxes "Bodybuild" (use as formula), and five loads of supplies were given to Phuoc Thanh Orphanage, in Hoa Khanh (V).
- b. Refugee. Took 95 bars of soap and 50 medium size tooth paste tubes to the Refugee Hamlet.
  - c. Miscellaneous. Nothing to report.

#### 3. EDUCATION

- a. Schools. One black board, three boxes of chalk, 50 school kits, 50 school books, one flag pole, and scrap wood material was given to Hoa Loc (V).
  - b. Scholarships, Nothing to report.

#### 4. Health

- a. MedCaps/DentCaps. MedCaps/DentCaps were responsible for treating over 400 civilians during October.
- 5. AGRICULTURE. The Battalion assisted in transporting 18 truck loads of vegatables to market for Quan Nam.

#### 6. PSYOPS

- a. Cultural Drama Team (CDT) performed once with approximately 350 Vietnamese in attendance.
  - b. Ground Broadcast Team (HB) attended six MedCans.
  - c. There were two movies shown with approximately 300 attendance.
- 7. SOCIAL. Members of this section/command attended three social meals.

#### PART II SECTION G MEDICAL/DENTAL AFFAIRS

#### A. PERSONNEL

1. On 31 October 1970 the total strength was two Medical Officers, one Chaplain and 46 corpsman. During this period there were eight corpsman transferred to other commands for duty and/or separation. There were four WTA for this period.

#### B. PATIENT LOAD

- 1. For this period 473 patients were seen at the Battalion Aid Station for an average of 15 patients per day.
- 2. There were 10 diagnosed with V.D., four with Diarrhea, nine with Upper Respiratory Infection, three with FUO, 42 with skin disorders and four with Malaria.

#### C. MEDCAP/DENCAP

1. There were four MEDCAPS and one DENCAP held during the month of October.

#### D. SANITATION

l. Weekly sanitation inspections were conducted throughout the Battalion and outlying areas during the month of October. The Battalion and outlying areas were found to be in excellent state of police. The condition with the head barrels has been corrected since last report.

#### A. PERSONNEL

As of 31 October 1970, the Communications Plateon consisted of one Officer and 65 enlisted Marines. On 28 October 1970 SSgt J.R. PHILLIPS reported in as Communications Chief as replacement of MSgt D.D. ANDERSON. MSgt ANDERSON is due to rotate from RVN on 1 November 1970.

#### B. EQUIPMENT

Two PU-667/G Generators have been invoiced to 1/11. Presently we have a PU-482/M - 30KW on temporary loan from Regiment, while our PU-482 is in FSR for repair. The tech shop processed 169 TERO's. There were 37 completed at 2nd echolon, 132 evacuated to FSR and 83 were completed. Message Center processed 92 incoming messages and 54 outgoing. Radio Section increased their allowance of AN/PRC-77 Radio's to 54 vice 36.

#### C. OPERATIONS/TRAINING

The Radio Section conducted 90 hours of Communication training to Company Radio operators with 22 Marines attending classes. Subjects taught were; Field Radio procedure, TACF procedure, Medevacs, Resupply, Artillery procedures, Comm Security, Antennas, Radio Equipment, and the use of the Whiz Wheel. Practical application was used as often as possible.

The Division Disaster Control net was activated for Typhoon condition one. A resupply net was activated and remoted from OP-3 with outstanding results. A preliminary CMMI inspection was conducted by Paginort.







Activity requested medical aid from Company CP. Bleeding could not be stopped, and unit requested emergency medevac. The medevac was completed at 2205.


