
#### e. Personnel Summary






#### PART II SECTION B INTELLIGENCE

#### A. EMEMY

- 1. General. During this reporting period the 3d Battalion made 23 contacts with the enemy. There were two daylight contacts, one of which was enemy initiated; and 21 night contacts, of which nine were enemy initiated. The battalion accounted for three enemy KIA, and no PW's. There were three weapons captured and two weapons confiscated during the reporting period.
- 2. Enemy Situation. Active enemy forces operating within the 3d Battalion TACR are made up of units subordinate to the Northern and Central Wings which are subordinate to the Front Four. Units believed to be operating within the AO are:
- a. 575th Rocket Battalion (Arty). This unit with 122mm and 140mm rocket capability, has an estimated strength of 150. According to recent reports, operating areas for up to company size elements of the battalion include the southern portion of the 3/1 FACR. The 575th Rocket Battalion is independent and subordinate to Front Four.
- b. Q-84 Armed Unit. This unit with mortar (NFI) capability has an estimated strength of 50. It was reported operating in the vicinity AT 9069 by a PW in April 1970.
- c. Q-85 Armed Unit. This unit has an estimated strength of 200. The unit consists of headquarters elements plus the T-87 Sapper Company and the Hai Van Engineer Company, both of which were downgraded from battalion to company size in early 1970 and subordinated to the Q-85th.
- d. 31st NVA Regiment. Recent intelligence reports indicate elements of the 31st NVA Regiment are operating within the southern portion of 3/1's AO. While a FW report placed the regimental HQ vic AT 8062 in June of this year, the 31st's operating area extended as far north as Da Nang during TET of 1958. Further, the 575th Rocket Battalion has operated in support of the 31st NVA Regiment since October 1969. Therefore, it is probable that up to company size units of the 31st NVA Regiment are located and operating jointly with elements of the 575th in the south and western portions of the 3/1 TAOR.

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

- e. Village Guerrilla Units, normally numbering from 20-50 personnel from Hoa Hiep, Hoa Vinh and Hoa Lac villages are believed to be operating from mobile base areas in the mountains north of the Song Cu De.
- 3. Summary of Enemy Activities. During the reporting period, the emmy continued his previously established pattern of avoiding meeting engagements with friendly forces while conducting rice collection and tax procurement in the lowlands. Enemy-initiated activity was directed primarily against friendly patrols in the Hoa Lac (V) area south of the Song Cu De, and against friendly patrols and positions south and west of OP Reno in the southern portion of the TAOR. The overall decrease in enemy activity compared to the previous month is believed attributable to two prime factors. First, that extensive flooding during late October destroyed much of the enemy's food supply in the lowlands, particularly south of the 3/1 TAOR, thereby resulting in widespread efforts on his part to replenish lost stores. Second, friendly operations within the 3/1 TAOR increased and became more widespread, extending into areas that had previously afforded the enemy relatively secure sanctuary. The most notable examples within this category included an operation into the Hoa Hiep Base area north of the Song Cu De; operations in the Kim Lien (H), Hoa Hiep (V) areas; increased restrictions on the movement of supplies/ WCI in the Quan Nams (H) of Hoa Lac (V) as the Population Control Program there became more effective; stepped up and more aggressive friendly patrolling throughout the TAOR; and increased emphasis upon achieving thorough coverage by air strikes and artillery on known or suspected targets. These factors are believed to be substantially responsible for disrupting enemy offensive intentions and causing him to be increasingly reluctant to meet and engage friendly forces or to attempt anything larger than limited, isolated harassment of friendly positions and patrols. It is to be noted that two incidents of terrorism occurred in Kim Lien (H). No such activity has been reported recently within the 3/1 TAOR. It is very unusual within this area and probably reflects VC reaction to friendly pressures within Kim Lien (H) and surrounding vicinity.
- 4. Enemy Missions. The enemy's mission remains essentially unchanged with primary emphasis upon avoiding contact while replenishing supplies. Clearly illustrative of this is the fact that extensive enemy rice collection still occurs within the Hoa Hiep (V) area in spite of recent friendly operations in that vicinity which have accounted for the deaths of at least two key rice collection coordinators and generally disrupted enemy activity there. The enemy's efforts in the Hoa Lac area, are believed hampered by friendly patrols and population control measures. Proselytizing and propagandizing appear to continue, but no large scale enemy efforts in this regard have been noted, possibly because of continued U.S. and RF/PF pacification activities in the populated areas.


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
Cadre meetings apparently occur on an irregular basis at hamlet levels with key local officials and limited VC Main Force/NVA representatives present. Probably no more than 5-15 people attend such meetings. A report from 1st MI Battalion, Da Nang, states the VC plan a general offensive prior to Christmas with the stated objective of overrunning and holding designated targets until a cease fire is declared. The offensive was referred to as Toan Thang (Entire Victory) and is the second such report to have been disseminated from the 1st MI Battalion.

#### 5. Enemy Vulnerabilities, Capabilities and Probable Courses of Action

- a. <u>Vulnerabilities</u>. The enemy remains vulnerable to detection and destruction of massed forces and interdiction of supply/comm-liaison routes. His morale, frequently reported as low at the local level, remains vulnarable to friendly psychological operations. The VC Infrastructure, while well organized and effective, remains vulnerable to friendly counter-intelligence efforts.
  - b. Capabilities and Probable Courses of Action. The enemy retains the capability of conducting multi-company and possibly battalion size attacks utilizing forces located within the 3/1 TAOR. Employment of large masses of troops and supporting arms is severely limited however, due to friendly observation and interdiction. The enemy is expected to continue moving in small size units to avoid detection, and at the same time maintain pressure on friendly forces by harassment of U. S. and RF/PF Units. Food and supply replenishment, as well as texation and proselytizing will continue through intimidation of the local populace by the VC Infrastructure. While the enemy may have every intention of implementing a general offensive as described in paragraph 4 above, it is well known that his expectations frequently exceed his capabilities and/or actual accomplishments. It is therefore considered unlikely that anything further than token activity will be effected especially in view of the friendly-initiated limiting factors cutlined in paragraph 3 above.
  - 6. Weather. Weather during the reporting period was characterized by unscassonably low rainfall totaling 10.3 inches compared to the yearly average of 15.2 inches. Humidity averaged 83 percent compared to the yearly figure of 75 percent. Temperatures were normal with a mean high of 79 degrees and a mean low of 71 degrees. Except during brief periods of heavy precipitation, friendly operations were not unduly restricted by weather conditions. Flooding during the latter half of the previous reporting period, and extending briefly into November, is believed to have seriously affected enemy supplies. Continued, seasonal rains have probably served to hamper, but not prevent, his replemishment efforts.




7. Terrain. Configuration of terrain and man-made features remains unchanged. Brief periods of flooding brought about by seasonal rains and storm-related high tides temporarily restricted foot movement in the river lowlands and paddy areas. Overall trafficability has been slightly better than is considered normal for this time of year, owing to the lesser degree of rainfall.



#### PART II SECTION C NARRATIVE SUMMARY

A. During the month of November, the Battalion continued its emphasis on Company and Platoon mobility and small unit day and night combat patrols/ambushes. Activities were focused on known/suspected enemy rocket and mortar sites and enemy infiltration routes. The majority of contact was made in the area of Ap Quang Nam (1) and the area west of OP Reno.

On 8 November, Company Kilo conducted a heliborne assault into the Ti Tou area with the mission of conducting a reconnaissance in force. The reconnaissance in force terminated on 21 November 1970. On 16 November, one platoon, Company Kilo provided a blocking force while one platoon of Company India conducted a heliborne assault into the foothills west of Kim Lion Village in search of a suspected enemy base camp. Mumerous rest areas were discovered, but the enemy remained elusive and no major contacts were encountered. On 21 November, Company Kilo, Company Lima(-), and the Battalian Command Group participated in a joint cordon and search of Kim Lion Village with elaments of the 1/25th Regional Force Company Group. The corden and search terminated on 23 November 1970. Company India and the 1/158th Degional Force Company conducted day and night patrols/ ambushes in the Ap Quang Nam area until 26 November when Company Kilo assumed control of Company India's Area of Operation. On 26 November, Company India assumed its present area of Operation north of the Song Cu De River. Company Lima conducted numerous day and might combat patrols/ ambushes west of OP Reno throughout the month.

During the period 1-30 November, Company India conducted 78 day patrols and 156 night activities. Company Kilo conducted 46 day patrols and 61 night activities. Company Lima conducted 68 day patrols and 99

night activities.

In the Population Control program, compilation of charts, diagrams, and a detailed house to house census neared completion. Overall progress was temporarily delayed due to inclement weather, a change of company TAON's, and a target date of 15 December was established. Blacklists of known or suspected VC/VCI were provided each check point during the last week of November. By month's end, all personnel traffic entering or leaving Quan Nam's 1 and 2 was effectively channelized along designated routes.


B. AIR SUPPORT

#### FIXED WING

The First Morine Air Wing supported the Battalion with a total of 94 fixed wing air strikes, which breaks down into 33 close air support strikes, and 61 TPQ-10 strikes. 42 Forward Air Controllers (airborne) utilizing OV-10A aircraft also flew in support of 3/1. Fixed wing air-

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craft dropped a total of 499,500 pounds of ordnance (197,500 pounds CAS, and 302,000 pounds TPQ-10). There were a total of 109 2.75 inch rockets, 5,320 rounds of 20mm ammunition, and 10,500 rounds of 7.62mm ammunition expended on targets throughout 3/1's TACR. This ordnance resulted in 12 secondary explosions, six secondary fires, one bunker destroyed, one cave destroyed, 1,300 meters of treeline destroyed, and 100 meters of trail destroyed. In addition, these strikes uncovered several bunkers, trails and cave complexes for explcitation by artillery and the Battalion's ground forces. Monsoon weather caused cancellation of many fixed wing air support missions.

#### ROTARY WING AIRCRAFT

50 medevacs were completed during the month or November which evacuated 25 emergency, 13 priority and 12 routine casualties. The average time for emergency modevacs from initial call until the time the helicopter was over the LZ was 23 minutes. It took an average of 23 minutes once the helicopter was on station to get the casualty aboard and complete the mission for an average time of 46 minutes from the time the mission was called until completion. This is a commandable accomplishment considering the hazardous flying conditions that existed during many of the medevacs this month. Several night medevacs were evacuated under extremely low ceilings and minimum visibility conditions.

Rotary wing aricraft lifted a total of 229,280 pounds of cargo both internally and externally loaded in conjunction with resupply of the Battalion. During the month of November, the First Marine Air Wing helilifted 784 passengers in support of 3/1.

#### C. ARTILLERY

lst Battalion, llth Marine Regiment continued to provide artillery support for the Battalion during the month of November. Battery "C", lst Battalion, llth Marines provided all direct support artillery. General support artillery came from Battery "L" (155 self-propelled Howitzer) 4th Battalion, llth Marines and Platoon "A", 3rd 8 inch Howitzer. In addition, 2nd Battalion, 94th Artillery (U.S. ARMY) provided artillery in general support of 3rd Battalion(-), lst Marines.

The Fire Support Coordinator worked closely with S-2 to provide fire support on intelligence targets. Pre-emptive artillerv was fired on known or suspected targets, the emphasis of which was on infiltration routes.

The Fire Support Coordination Center cleared 1515 missions for the month of November.

Forward Observers, while operating in the field, conducted Forward Observer classes for small unit leaders. The Fire Support Coordinator conducted classes for the Battalion's NCO School and for new arrivals in country.

The Battalion provided supporting artillery for the Vietnamese Military in addition to it's own forces.



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PART II SECTION D TRAINING

#### 1. THE BATTALION CONDUCTED THE FOLLOWING TRAINING DURING NOVEMBER.

- a. One Battalion Indoctrination class was held for a period of four days. A total of 20 personnel attended.
- b. A contact team from the 1st Engineer Battalion conducted three, two hour classes on Landwine Warfare. A total of 150 Marines from the Battalion attended the classes.
- c. The Battalion held one class on Communications every day for a period of five days. A total of 13 Marines attended. One Vietnamese Language School was held by the Battalion for a period of 21 days with eight Marines satisfactorily completing the course with a 500 word vocabulary.
- d. Company Training: All companies conducted training on a weekly schedule which included familiarization firing, handling of POW's, conduct of patrols, patrol leader's orders, and weapons safety.
- e. The Battalion Rifle Range was used to instruct replacement personnel in the Quick Fire/Quick Kill method of engagement. A total of 20 replacement personnel were instructed in this method. A total of 16 replacement personnel fired the .45 caliber pistol for familiarization. The range was utilized for personnel to fam fire and place battle sights on their weapons. A total of 280 personnel from various organizations utilized the range. Also 26 Marines fam fired the M-60 machine gun.






a. The Battalion assisted in transporting six truck loads of food and supplies for Refugee Hamlets.

- 2. There were 14 diagnosed with V.D., 12 with Diarrhea, nine with Upper Respiratory Infection, eight with Fever of Unknown Origin, 38 with skin disorders, and seven with Malaria.


#### C. MEDCAP/DENTCAP

As of 30 November 1970, the Communications Platoon consisted of one Officer and 78 Enlisted Marines.


#### B. EQUIPMENT

- Ol November 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- O2 November 1970 1825H. Company Kilo CP AT85278h reported an air strike at grid AT827772 resulted in one secondary explosion.

  Artillery mission was called by Company Kilo resulting in eight secondary explosions.
- 03 November 1970 0700H. Third Platoon, Company India conducted cordon and search of Quang Nam Hamlet in coordination and cooperation with the 1/158th RF Company and local Vietnamese officials. Seven detaineds were apprehended and turned over to the 3rd CIT. One M-1 Carbine magazine was captured.
  - 2035H. Company India, Special Activity (I-42A), while set in ambush site at grid AT915821 spotted two VC/NVA at grid AT914821 moving to the northwest at a range of 100 meters. RF's with the unit opened fire with small arms and enemy fled to the northwest. CUPP 42 provided 60mm illumination and Company India on Hill 190 provided search lights. Unit swept area under illumination without further findings or centact.
- Oh November 1970 2h00H. 5th CIT reported two NVA and one VC entered home of hamlet Chief Cung (Kim Lien Hamlet), AT926856, and assassinated the Assistant Hamlet Chief. Also killed were two PSDF and one civilian. The same evening, three enemy returned to the house and threatened all personnel who were in the area to the effect that anyone carrying weapons for the Government would be subject to the same type retaliation.
- 05 November 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- 06 November 1970 0300H. 5th CIT reported that 27 NVA and three VC entered Kim Lien Village AT924856 and collected 400 pounds of rice. Approximately five enemy proceeded to the home of Group Family Leader Le Man. Le Man was kidnapped and the VC/NVA departed the area.




- 06 November 1970 1626H. First Squad, Third Platon, Company India at grid AT848844 received four WP and six HE rounds resulting in two KIA, three emergency medevacs, one routine medevac, and five casualties of non-medevac nature. Preliminary investigation reveals mission called by recon on Marines mistakenly identified as enemy. Unit moved into recon haven without prior coordination with 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. Mission appears to have been erroneously cleared by 1st Marines' FSCC under the Rules of Engagement.
- O7 November 1970 0200H. First Platoon, Company India, while set in ambush site, spotted 10 to 15 NVA going into northwest end of Kim Hen Village at grid AT920858 approximately 30 meters away. At the same time another segment of the ambush spotted six NVA moving out of the village approximately five meters away. All enemy were carrying weapons and were wearing green trousers. Unit opened fire with small arms, M-79, claymores, and M-72 LAAW's. NVA returned fire with AK-47 rifles and mortars. Unit swept area under aircraft illumination finding two AK-47 rifles, one pistel (K-54), two chicoms, and three VC/NVA KIA. Unit set up a 360 degree perimeter for the night and reswept area in morning finding three bags of rice, two AK-47 magazines, one M-26 grenade and several documents. Equipment and documents were turned over to S-2.
  - 0840H. Third Platoon, Company Lima while on patrol in area of grid AT860718 found two 82mm mortar rounds, one can for transporting mortar fuzes, and one pit 10 feet in diameter and circular in shape with one aiming stake set on an azimuth of OP Reno. Also found were three fighting holes, one reinforced bunker, and one meat can. 82mm mortar rounds were destroyed in place.
  - 1200H. Third Platoon, Company Lima, while on patrol at grid AT862717 found three fighting holes three feet by three feet by four feet all of which were not reinforced. Unit destroyed fighting holes.
  - 1400H. Third Platoon, Company Lima, while on patrol at grid AT863719, found one non-booby trapped bear trap lying on trail that had been previously cut by this Lima Unit. Bear trap was turned over to S-2.






- 14 November 1970 2130H. Third Squad, Third Platoon, Company India while set in ambush site at grid AT885817, spotted two enemy 50 meters to their southwest and were carrying weapons. Unit opened fire with small arms but did not receive return fire. Enemy fled to the southwest and unit immediately swept area without further contact or sightings.
- 15 November 1970 1500H. Third Squad, Third Platoon, Company Kilo, at grid AT882896 located small base camp with large cooking fire still burning. Unit searched area and found one AK-47 magazine with rounds in good condition, cooking pots, one NVA shirt, one pair shorts, two sandbags full of wet clothes, one pair of USMC bush gloves, one calendar, 10 pounds fresh greens and assorted vegetables, and 20 AK-47 rounds scattered around area. Unit continued to search area with aid of OV-10 aircraft. The aerial observer reported enemy fleeing northwest, southeast, and southwest. Unit received several AK-47 rounds from each direction as enemy continued to flee. Unit searched area with no further contact or findings. Captured equipment was sent to S-2.
- 16 November 1970 0930H. Second and Third Squad, Third Platoon, Company Kilo at grid AT886898 while moving into ambush site, prep fired area to their west which looked like possible enemy ambush site. Unit received approximately 20 rounds AK-47 fire in return. Unit opened fire with small arms and enemy broke contact. Swept area with no further contact of sightings.
  - 1020H. 3rd CIT Sub-Team "B" at grid AT930792 found one cache containing 12 60mm mortar rounds located in a spiderhole with a false bottom. Also found hale with two small bags of rice, one M-26 booby trap with trip wire, tunnel with additional cache markers. Further search revealed two 60mm illumination cannisters with trip wire running from them, located near a bamboo gate. Three booby traps were blown in place and the tunnel with remaining gear was destroyed.

- 19 November 1970 2130H. Company India, Special Activity (I-42A), while in ambush site, spotted two enemy approximately 200 meters to their west, moving northeast. One enemy was observed carrying an unidentified weapon. Unit opened fire with small arms and M-79 and enemy fled southwest.

  Area was swept without further contact or sightings.
- 20 November 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- 21 November 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- 22 November 1970 2020n. Second Squad, Third Platoon, Company India, while set in ambush site at grid AT890822 heard a sound like a possible grenade landing approximately 15 meters outside position. It was believed to have come from the west at a range of approximately 50 meters. Unit threw two M-26 grenades to the west in the area of possible enemy activity. Swept area under 60mm illumination finding one dud M-26 grenade. Unit found nothing further.

- 30 November 1970 OOLOH. Two USNC personnel who were on line watch on OP Reno at grid AT885746, heard movement southeast of position. Upon turning on flashlight to observe area, one personnel received sniper round that went through his left hand and lodged in the second Marine's right thigh. Priority medovac was called for both Marines and area was swept with no further contact or sightings.
