
### PART II SECTION B INTELLIGENCE

### A. ENEMY

- 1. General. During this reporting period the 3d Battalion made 10 contacts with the enemy. There were three daylight contacts, one of which was enemy initiated; and seven night contacts, of which one was enemy initiated. The battalion accounted for three enemy KIA, and no PWs. There were two weapons captured during the reporting period.
- 2. Enemy Situation. Active enemy forces operating within the 3d Battalion TACR are made up of units subordinate to the Northern and Central Wings which are subordinate to the Front Four. Units believed to be operating within the AO are:
- a. 31st NVA Regiment. Numerous Agent reports indicate elements of the 31st NVA Regiment are operating in the western and southern portion of the AO. While a PW report in June of this year placed the Regimental Headquarters vicinity AT8062, the 31st's operating area extended as far north as Da Nang during TET of 1968.
- b. 575th Rocket Battalion (Arty). This unit, with 122mm and 140mm rocket capability, has an estimated strength of 150. According to recent reports, operating areas for up to company size elements of the Battalion include the southern and possibly central portion of the 3/1 TACR. Further, the 575th Rocket Battalion has operated with the 31st NVA Regiment since October 1969. Therefore, it is probable that up to company size units of the Battalion are located and operating jointly with elements of the 31st NVA Regiment in the central, southern, and western portions of the 3/1 TACR. The 575th Rocket Battalion is independent and subordinate to Front Four.
- c. Q-84 Armed Unit. This unit, with mortar capability (NFI), has an estimated strength of 50. It was reported operating in the vicinity AT9069 by a PW in April 1970.
- d. Q-85 Armod Unit. This unit has an estimated overall strength of 200. It consists of headquarters elements plus the T-87 Sapper Company and the Hai Van Engineer Company, both of which were downgraded from battalion to company size in early 1970 and subordinated to the Q-85th.



- e. Guerrilla Units and Local security forces from Hoa Hiep, Hoa Vinh and Hoa Lac villages, normally numbering no more than 20-40 personnel are believed operating from mobile bases in the mountains north of the Song Cu De. In addition, a tentatively identified 1st Independent Company (Possibly subordinate to VC Area 1 Headquarters) is thought to be operating in the Ti Tou Mountain area just west of Kim Lien with the mission of providing security for movements of rice and other supplies to base camps in the Hoa Hiep Mountains. WC Infrastructure, local security forces, and squad size elements of main force units are probably operating in the CACO area and foothills east of OP Reno.
- 3. Summary of Enemy Activities. During December, the enemy contimued to avoid engagements with friendly forces while conducting rice collection and resupply activities in Kim Lien (H) of Hoa Hiep (V). Hoa Vinh (V), True Dong (H), and nearby areas of Hoa Phu (V), and possibly the Quan Nams (H) of Hoa Loc (V). Overall enemy activity decreased to less than 50 percent of that reported during November. This is believed mostly attributable to extended friendly counter operations north and east of Hill 190; Population Control measures in the Quan Nams (H); wide ranging patrols south of Hill 190 and in the Rocket Ridge Area; extended patrolling west and south of OP Reno; and PF operations in the Hoa Phu (V) area. Agent reports during early and mid December indicated a possible step up of enemy activity to correspond with the WC Commemorative dates of 19, 20 and 22 December. However, this did not materialize. Ememy activity reached its lowest ebb during the last week of the month which corresponded to the Christmas and New Year's Holiday periods. No violations of the two 24 hour cease fire periods were reported, which may be related to the large number of Vietnamese Catholics who reside in the populated areas of the TAOR.
- the Enemy Missions. The enemy's mission appears essentially unchanged with primary emphasis continuing to be on avoiding contact while replenishing supplies and improving his infrastructure. Proselytizing and propagandizing continue but no large scale efforts in this respect have been noted, possibly because of continued U.S. and CVN pacification activities in the populated areas. The enemy still has the mission of disrupting and discrediting the pacification program but has made little if any progress within the 3/1 TAOR during the reporting period. No direct evidence is available indicating VC plans to commemorate the TET Holiday Season with stepped up attacks on isolated FWMAF positions, or a general offensive as has happened in the past. However recent agent reports referring to a "Winter Offensive" (no date given), and discovery of






additional cache sites in proximity to Northern Artillery Cantonment strongly suggest the VC plan some manner of increased activity in the near future. The TET Season could logically serve as a focal period for peak activity during conduct of such an offensive campaign.

### 5. Enemy Vulnerabilities, Capabilities and Probable Courses of Action

- a. Vulnerabilities. The enemy remains vulnerable to detection and destruction of massed forces and interdiction of supply/commo-liaison routes. His morale frequently reported as low at the local level, remains vulnerable to friendly psychological operations. The W Infrastructure, while well organized and effective, remains vulnerable to friendly counter-intelligence efforts.
- b. Capabilities and Probable Courses of Action. The enemy rotains the capability of conducting multi-company and possibly battalion size attacks utilizing forces located within the 3/1 TACR. Employment of large masses of troops and supporting arms is severely limited however, due to friendly observation and interdiction. The enemy is expected to continue moving in small units to avoid detection, and at the same time maintain token pressure on friendly forces by limited harassment of U.S. and RF/PF Units. Food and supply replenishment, as well as taxation, propagandizing and proselytizing will continue through intimidation of the local populace by the WC Infrastructure. While the enemy may have every intention of implementing a general offensive as suggested in paragraph 4 above, it is well known that his expectations frequently exceed his capabilities and/or actual accomplishments. It is therefore considered unlikely that anything further than isolated small scale attacks will be conducted especially in view of continued friendly counter operations and activities as described in paragraph 3 above.
- 6. Weather. Weather during the reporting period was characterized by higher than normal rainfall totaling 11.2 inches compared to the yearly average of 8.8 inches. Humidity averaged 89 percent compared to the yearly figure of 82 percent. Temperatures were normal with a mean high of 73 degrees and a mean low of 71 degrees. Except during brief periods of heavy precipitation, friendly operations were not unduly restricted by weather conditions. Flooding occurred along the Song Tuy Loan during these periods, temporarily restricting foot movement in the river lowlands.
- 7. Terrain. Configuration of terrain and man-made features remains unchanged. Brief periods of flooding brought about by seasonal rains and high tides temporarily restricted foot movement in the lowlands and paddy areas of the Song Tuy Loan.



### PART II SELTION C NARRATIVE SUMMARY

A. During the month of December, the Battalion continued its emphasis on Company and Platoon mobility and small unit day and night combat patrols/ambushes. Activities were focused on known/suspected enemy rocket/mortar sites and enemy infiltration routes. The majority of contact was made in the Ti Tou area of the northern AO west of Kim Lien Hamlet.

On 23 December, in two separate contacts in the Ti Tou area, elements of Company India inflicted two VC KIA on the clusive enemy. Numerous other sightings were made in the area near the close of the month and by 31 December Company India had established a protective cordon around the village of Kim Lien in an attempt to deny enemy access for food collection and propagandizing purposes. On 16-21 December, two platoons of Company India conducted a sweep in the northern Arizona Territory south of Hill 37. Numerous caches containing supplies and documents were discovered and twelve detainees were turned over to higher headquarters for further interrogation. During the month of December, Company India also provided one platoon as the Regimental quick reaction force for a period of 15 days.

Company Kilo continued Operational control of CUPP 4-2 concentrating the majority of the CUPP activities in the Area of "The Claw" (AT9183). The majority of Company Kilo patrols began penetrating into the mountainous regions to the west of Hill 190 in an attempt to uncover enemy base camps and harbor sites.


Company Lima continued patrolling of the foothills south and west of OP Reno with continued emphasis on uncovering rocket sites and caches near the Song Tuy Loan.

During the period 1-31 December, Company India conducted 64 day patrols and 97 night activities. Company Kilo conducted 76 day patrols and 119 night activities. Company Lima conducted 67 day patrols and 103 night activities.

The Population Control Program within Quan Nam (1) and (2) of Hoa Lac(V) became fully operational as the census was completed on 20 December. Its effectiveness has been clearly demonstrated by the lack of significant sightings or contacts in the Quan Nam(H) and Claw areas since mid-November.

Due to the success of the Population Control Program in Hon Lac, action has been initiated to effect similar control measures within Kim Lien(H) of Hoa Hiep(V), a known supply distribution point for VC units operating out of the Hoa Hiep Mountains.

### B. AIR SUPPORT

### FIXED WING

The First Marine Air Wing supported the Battalion with a total of 38 fixed wing air strikes, which breaks down into ten close air support strikes, and 28 TPQ-10 strikes. 16 Forward Air Controllers (Airborne) utilizing OV-10A aircraft flew in support of 3/1. Fixed wing aircraft dropped a total of 269,750 pounds of ordnance, (94,750 pounds CAS, and 175,000 pounds TPQ-10). There were a total of 18-2.75 inch rockets, 1,500 rounds of 20mm ammunition, and 2,000 rounds of 7.62mm ammunition expended on targets throughout 3/1's TAOR. This ordnance resulted in five secondary explosions, four secondary fires, one bunker destroyed, one but destroyed, one 50 cal. pit partially destroyed, and 700 meters of treeline destroyed. TPQ-10 strikes were used on 5-2 intelligence targets in areas not covered by the Battalion ground forces. The marked decrease in the air support received during the month of December from that received during November reflects a general reduction in all supporting arms during the month.

### ROTARY WING AIRCRAFT

32 medevacs were completed during the month of December which evacuated 21 emergency, six priority, and five routine casualties. Of the 32 medevacs, 12 were Marines, and 20 were Vietnamese Military and civilians. The average time for emergency medevacs from initial call until the time the helicopter was on station over the LZ was 12 minutes. It took an average of nine minutes once the helicopter was on station to get the casualty aboard and complete the mission for an average time of 21 minutes from the time the mission was called until completion. This is a 25 minute improvement over the month of November. Good weather and fewer night medevacs accounted for the marked improvement over the month of November.


Retary wing aircraft lifted 88 loads totaling 110,875 pounds of cargo both internally and externally loaded in conjunction with resumply of the Battalion. During the month of December, the First Marine Air Wing helilifted 576 Marines in support of 3/1

#### C. ARTILLERY

From 1 December to 31 December 1970, 3d Battalion(-), 1st Marines received direct support from Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. General support was provided by Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, "A" Platoon, 3rd Eight Inch Howitzer Battery, and Naval gunfire. The Battalion's organic weapons, 81mm mortars and 106mm recoilless rifles,

attacked targets of opportunity and intelligence targets.

Supporting arms accounted for one enemy KIA, occurring on 7 December 1970 at grid (AT894849). Two to three VC/NVA were observed near a stream. The Forward Observer called a 105mm fire mission on the three personnel resulting in the spotting of one enemy KIA lying in the stream.

Rocket suppressive fires were directed on known and suspected rocket sites during the month, with increased round expenditures during high threat periods. No rocket launches occurred within the Battalion's TAOR.

Reconnaissance teams observed heavy damage by artillery in enemy base camp areas in the vicinities of grids (AT818835) and (AT810880).

During the month, the Division Fire Support Coordinator inspected the Battalion FSCC and found no discrepancies. A total of 170 man-hours of training were conducted, including Forward Observation Techniques, Use of Supporting Arms, and Fire Direction Procedures. The latter was given to the 81mm mortar platoon's Fire Direction personnel. Forward Observers in the field instructed infantry small unit leaders in the use and adjustment of mortar and artillery fire.


The Battalion now has two Officer Forward Observers. The Officers operate with the two mobile companies, while a corporal scout observer




PART II SECTION D TRAINING

### 1. THE BATTALION CONDUCTED THE FOLLOWING TRAINING DURING DECEMBER:

- a. Two Battalion Indoctrination classes were held for a period of four days each. A total of 58 personnel attended.
- b. A contact team from the 1st Engineer Battalian conducted three, two hour classes on Landmine Warfare. A total of 88 Marines from the Battalian attended the classes.
- c. The Battalion held one NCO class for a period of seven days. A total of 19 Marines attended.
- d. Company Training: All companies conducted training on a weekly schedule which included familiarization firing, handling of POW's, conduct of patrols, patrol leader's orders, and weapons safety.
- e. The Battalion Rifle Range was used to instruct replacement personnel in the Quick Fire/Quick Kill method of engagement. A total of 58 replacement personnel were instructed in this method. A total of 16 replacement personnel fired the .45 caliber pistol for familiarization. The range was utilized for personnel to fam fire and place battle sights on their weapons. A total of 345 personnel from various organizations utilized the range. Also 26 Marines fam fired the 16 60 machine gum. Replacement personnel fired the M-16 with a starlight scope mounted.


1. There were five MEDCAPS and four DENTCAPS held during the month of December.


### B. EQUIPMENT




## PART III SECTION A SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- Ol December 1970 1245H. Led by 3d CIT informant, a tunnel search and clear operation was conducted at vicinity (AT9168CL) by 3d CIT elements supported by a Company Kilo squad and Engineers. Unit found one tunnel camouflaged with foliage and a lid type door similar to a spider hole. In the tunnel was one U.S. Semi-automatic carbine with magazine and 30 rounds. Also found in tunnel were one NIF flag, 35 propaganda (VC) leaflets written in Vietnamese and English, one rice ration, and one rain cape. In adjacent area (50 meters west) unit found two food buckets, one rain cape and miscellaneous eating utensils. Unit destroyed tunnel. Documents and equipment along with the weapon were retained by 3d CIT.
- 02 December 1970 1320H. Company Kilo CP received one small arms round believed to have been fired from a carbine. Round was fired from 250-300 meters to the northeast of Company Kilo position at grid (AT885772) and impacted approximately 20 meters from the friendly position. One squad swept area temporarily detaining 15 civilians for questioning. All civilians carried valid I.D. cards and had no weapons. All detainees were released.
- O3 December 1970 2035H. First Squad, First Platoon, Company India, while in ambush site at (AT879857) heard movement approximately 25 meters to the west. Unit waited until enemy was within ten meters then threw four M-26 frag grenades. One enemy was seen floeing to the west. Moaning and screeming was heard as though enemy was wounded. Shortly after throwing the grenades, unit received one incoming round, believed to be an M-79, from the east. Unit called for basketball illumination and an HE fire mission. A reaction force was sent out from India's position to aid in sweep of area with negative findings.
- Oh December 1970 1125H. First Squad, First Platoon, Company India while on patrol at (AT885860) located a harbor site 30 feet by 15 feet which probably accommodated 10-12 personnel. Unit checked area thoroughly finding two cooking areas, Chieu Hoi Pamphlets, empty C-4 packets, and one empty tin foil container. Three well used trails were leading from harbor site toward the southeast. Equipment found was turned over to S-2.




- O5 December 1970 1130H. A team from 1st Engineers was led by a Vietnamese youth to the location of one 81mm illumination dud round at (AT939791). Engineers destroyed round in place and paid youth 100 VN\$. Engineers were then approached by two Vietnamese children at (AT938788), who directed them to one M-26 grenade, and one M-79 high explosive round. Ordnance was destroyed in place and youths were paid 200 VN\$.
- 06 December 1970 0610H. A team from 1st Engineers (Road Sweep Team) located one ten pound metallic mine laying along south shoulder of road on top of ground at (AT934793). Unit destroyed the mino in place with C-4.
- O7 December 1970 1400H. Second Squad (Rein), Second Platoon, Company India while on patrol at (AT888863) sighted one VC/NVA at (AT894847). Enemy was wearing black pajamas and was running southeast towards a ravine. Unit called a fire mission (105mm) at grid (AT894847). One round was observed impacting directly on fleeing enemy. After end of mission, one body was observed through sniper scope lying lace down in streambed.
- 08 December 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- 09 December 1970 0315H. First Squad, First Platoon, Company Lima at (AT85873L), received one incoming chicom landing approximately five meters southwest of the unit's position. One USMC personnel received minor injuries.

  Personnel was treated by corpsman and returned to duty. Unit swept area without further sightings or contact.
  - 0745H. Led by 3d CIT informant, a search operation was conducted by First Platoon, Company Kilo and 3d CIT elements at grid (AT918794). Unit located three cache sites approximately three feet by two feet and covered by sand. Two were empty and the other contained one M-79, four M-79 rounds, and two M-26 grenades. Ordnance was blown in place and M-79 was sent to Battalion Armory.
  - 1615H. One Vietnamese child brought five 50 caliber rounds to the Battalion rear gate at (AT940783). Child was paid 40 VN\$ for ordnance which was turned over to S-4 to be destroyed.
- 10 December 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- 11 December 1970 0001H. Negative contact.







12 December 1970 - 1755H. Third Platoon, Company Kilo CP at (AT858785) observed an explosion 600 meters to their east and believed it to be 81mm or 82mm mortar round. Check of all friendly units revealed no rounds expended in that area. Unit had no indications as to the origin of the rounds.

13 December 1970 - 0001H. Negative contact.

14 December 1970 - 0740H. Road Sweep Team from 1st Engineers located one ten pound metallic mine laying off road at grid (AT925794).

Where ran from cannister to rice paddy. Engineers destroyed mine in place with C-4. Explosion caused a two foot by two foot by one foot crater.

15 December 1970 - 1500H. Seven Vietnamese children approached a squad from Company Lima (AT875722) and turned in 200 rounds of 50 caliber ammunition, 150 rounds of 5.56 ammunition, 18 rounds M-79 illumination, seven rounds M-79 HE, one M-26 grenade, and one trip flare. Youths said they would return to same place to be paid and to turn in more ordnance on the next day at 1500H. In view of recent intelligence report of sapper trained Vietnamese children, unit exercised extreme care in handling the ordnance which was blown in place immediately. Unit reported that children did not return to area on the next day.


16 December 1970 - 0515H. A special unit from Third Platoon, Company Kilo at (AT917828) observed six enemy through starlight scope at a distance of 500 meters to the west. Four enemy were carrying weapons. Squad leader brought enemy under small arms fire and called 81mm morter fire mission.

Two enemy were observed wounded or killed by mortar fire and were being dragged to the west by companions. Unit swept area under 81mm illumination with no findings and again swept area at first light finding drag marks. No further signs of enemy were found.

17 December 1970 - 1230H. First Platoon, Company Kilo, while on patrol at (AT847817) found a base camp area for 50-60 personnel. Within the base camp, unit found ten huts, and one bunker. Area appeared to have been abandoned for one month. Majority of area had been destroyed by artillery and three damaged AK-47 magazines were found and sent to S-2.



- 17 December 1970 2010H. Company Kilo CP while firing 106 RR beehive rounds from (AT897822) and at grid (AT875834) observed one secondary explosion. 81mm mortar and 105 Artillery fire missions were called with no further observations of secondary fires.
- 18 December 1970 1715H. Third Platoon, Company India at (AT903867) received six small arms rounds from the northeast approximately 150 meters away. Unit observed four enemy fleeing to north and wearing dark clothing. Unit opened fire with small arms and M-79 rounds. An immediate search revealed numerous blood trails and one VC bush cover damaged by small arms fire.
- 19 December 1970 2130H. One squad from the Second Platoon, Company Kilo (AT915821) observed movement 400 meters west of ambush site and estimated eight persons were moving east towards killing zone. When personnel came closer, the squad leader noticed that none were carrying weapons and directed squad to attempt to detain personnel rather than open fire. Marines detained three male adults and one male youth aged 11 years at (AT912808). A second squad from the Second Platoon, Company Kilo positioned nearby maneuvered to assist and they observed four boats in flooded rice paddies moving west at (AT914807). Boats were ordered to stop and two did stop while the other two fled to the west. Four male and three female youths were detained from boats and squad did not fire on fleeing personnel due to the fact that none had weapons, but notified Popular Force troops in the Village of Hoa Vinh. An estimated 15-20 persons avoided detention. Detainees were sent to Regiment for interrogation.
- 20 December 1970 0001H. Negative contact.
- 21 December 1970 0030H. First Squad, First Platoon, Company Lima, while set in ambush site at (AT881715) heard movement approximately 100 meters to the unit's northeast. Unit initiated ambush with small arms fire and M-79. No return fire was received from the suspected enemy who field to northeast. Unit called an 81mm illumination mission and swept area without further evidence of enemy in the area.



- 22 December 1970 0715H. 1st Engineers Road Sweep Team located one metal cylinder with cone shaped top at (AT939791). Device was laying on top of the ground in the center of the road. Engineers carefully probed the area, moved the device off the road, and destroyed it with C-4. The explosion caused a one foot by one foot by one and one-half foot crater.
- 23 December 1970 0545H. First Squad, Third Platoon, Company India, while in ambush site at (AT908837), observed four enemy with packs and rifles approaching ambush site from east at approximately 20 meters. Squad initiated small arms fire on enemy. Enemy returned 15-20 rounds of AK-47 fire and fled to east. Unit swept area under 81mm mortar illumination and found no signs of enemy. Search was again conducted at first light finding one dead VC with AK-47 and assorted equipment and documents. A search also revealed bags of rice, tobacco, and some equipment that had been discarded by fleeing enemy. Footprints indicated total enemy strength of 20 to 30 personnel. Chieu Hoi appeal was made by loudspeaker at 1000H with negative results.
  - 1800H. First Squad, Second Platoon, Company India, while enroute to ambush site at (AT903865), spotted two enemy carrying rifles and wearing dark clothing approximately 50 meters to the unit's southeast. Enemy spotted Marine unit and fled into brush to northeast before unit was able to initiate small arms fire. Unit swept area but was unable to close with the enemy.
  - 2000H. Company India CP (AT906848) observed four enemy approaching from south at approximately 100 meters. Enemy wore black clothing and were carrying rifles. Company lines initiated contact with M-16 and M-79 fire and enemy returned approximately 15 rounds AK-47 fire and fled to south. With aid of 81mm illumination the Marines swept area and found one dead enemy with AK-47 and equipment. Area was reswept at first light finding numerous blood trails leading to the south.
- 24 December 1970 0230H. Company India CP at (AT906848) heard movement 30 meters to their south. No enemy were spotted so unit called an 81mm illumination fire mission and swept the area finding numerous footprints in the mud, but could not make contact with the enemy.






- 25 December 1970 1500H. Company India, Special Activity, at (AT882851) while on patrol found two well used foot trails. One trail ran from (AT882851) to (AT885851), the other trail ran from (AT894843) to (AT896843). On first trail unit found fresh footprints, several small rest sites and 15 empty mackeral cans. On the other trail unit found several bootprints, one pack (Non-U.S. Manufacture), and several bloodsoaked bandages. The area was thoroughly searched without any further findings.
- 26 December 1970 1230H. Company India, while enroute to resupply, was approached by Vietnamese civilians who turned in one chicom grenade at (AT922851). Vietnamese were paid and the chicom was turned over to S-2.

Unit fired 20 M-79 illumination rounds, one W.P. and seven H.E. 60mm mortar rounds. Company Kilo CP fired five 81mm illumination rounds to aid the unit. Unit called 105mm fire mission on routes of escape and swept the area at first light without further sightings or contact with the enemy.
