4. Important Visitors







- 1. LCpl P. Hendrickson was sent to Basic Infantry Weapons Repair School.
- m. Cpl E. Tafoya, LCpl R. Goetzman attended NBC School in Japan.

2. Civic Affairs

- a. The road project which had been undertaken on the island of Ky Hoa was completed on 7 August 1968. Although it is rough and only a base, it is quite an improvement over the former road and bicycle travel is now possible on the hard surface laterite.
- b. Enough cement for 9 wells was acquired through CORDS in Tam Ky. At present, 6 of the 9 wells have been completed.
- c. Construction of a pig pen has been completed at Hoa My Hamlet. The pen now has four separate stalls with feeding troughs, 2 small pools and a larger walking area. The Chu Lai veterinarian vaccinated all the Yorkshire hogs on the island against cholera.
- d. Building materials and bricks have been delivered to Hoa Trung (BT489141) for the construction of a dispensary. Construction should commence this week with completion approximately 1 month from today.
- e. A total of 765 Vietnamese were treated by MEDCAP and DENTCAP teams during the month.
- 3. Motor Transportation. A total of 32,368 miles were driven in support of 2d LAAM En for the month of August. In addition, 2,053 miles were driven in support of the Chu Lai Combat Base. A grand total of 3334 short tons were hauled during the month.
