





#### PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

#### CONFIDMITIAL

#### 2. INTELLIGENCE.

a. General. A directive, number 4/CT dated 22 Jan 1970 issued by the Current Affairs Committee, Quang Nam Province, Region 5, directed that all military units and districts should provide for their own previsions for five months. This forced concentration of the enemy's efforts on the collection of rice and food stuffs was expected to create a low level of enemy activity, but the opposite proved true.

The first quarter of March started with a terrorist attack on a group of civilians and men-CAP PFs eating in a house 500m E of Dai Loc District Headquarters. The results of this attack on the first by satchel charge, were 3 VN civilians KIA, 3 non-CAP PFs WIA(E) and 12 VN civilians WIA(E). CACO 2-2 handled the medevac of the wounded and CAP 2-2-1 swept the area with negative results. On the second, the VC initiated an attack on CAP 2-3-2 in Dien Ban District with SAF, RPG fire and AWF resulting in 2 USMC WIA(E), 2 PF (WIA(E) and 1 USN WIA(M). This attack preved to be the start of a high amount of enemy activity in Dien Ban District. This District during March, had the highest amount of both enemy initiated activity, and sightings by friendly forces, of all the Districts protected by 2d CAG units. On the 4th, two PFs of CAP 2-3-1 were WIA(E) when an M-26 grenade expleded as they moved their bicycle to leave the CAP day haven site 800m E of Dien Ban District Headquarters. The M-26 had been buried beneath the wheel of the bicycle, set to explode when the bicycle was moved. On the 5th, CAPs 2-4-1 and 2-4-4 assisted 2 nen-CAP PF platoons in a sweep of Cam Thanh Island. The sweep discovered and destroyed what appeared to be an enemy base camp for rice collection. The approaches to the bunker complex was mined with ever 40 artillery shells-booby trapped, rigged with trip wires. Recovered from the enemy were 400lbs. of rice, 400 lbs. of vegetables, documents and a large assertment of clothing, 782 gear. Also captured were 2 flags, one Russian and 1 VN labor party flag. The foodstuffs were distributed to the willagers and the decuments turned ever to District Headquarters. 1 non-CAP PF received wounds from a 105mm rd. beeby trap that he triggered accidently and another non-CAP PF was KIA when his platoon received SAF from an USEF as the PF platoon attempted to leave the island. CAP 2-7-6 on the 7th killed 1 VC as the VC was emplacing a M-26 grenade rigged with a trip wire. On the 8th a CAP 2-1-7 ambush initiated SAF en an estimated 5 enemy 8 km. W of Hea Vang District Headquarters. A sweep of the area produced the first NVA KIA during the menth, plus an AK-47, 2 RPG rounds, 7 chicem grenades and several documents.

During the second quarter of March both contact with the enemy and sightings of the enemy increased over the first quarter of March and the same time period of the previous menth. Again, as in the first quarter of the month Dien Ban District saw the most activity.

COMPLICATION

On the 9th, a CAP 2-3-4 ambush initiated SAF on 5 VC, 2.5 km SE of Dien Bam District Headquarters. The enemy returned fire then fled S and NE, leaving behind, 2 VC KIA, 1 AK-47, 1 RPG rocket lamncher, 4 RPG rounds plus miscellaneous documents. In Dien Bam District, on the 12th, two VN civilians were wounded when 3 VC threw an M-26 grenade at a civilian bus moving N on QL#1. CAP 2-3-7 handled the medevac for the two VN civilians. On the 13th, the CAPs of 2d CAG had seven separate contacts with enemy between 1800H and 2200H. 2-9-2 accounted for the capture of 400 AK-47 rds., 40 M-16 rds, 6 SA magazines, the destruction of 3 bunkers and 2 SFDs after they had called an artillery mission on 15 VC an this date. On the 14th 2-9-1 accounted for 4 VC KIA in a long range sniper activity conducted by 2-9-1. On the 17th a CAP 2-3-7 patrol working an area belived to be the location of an enemy mine factory, discovered and destroyed 6 bunkers, 10 nonelectrical blasting caps, 6 feet of detenating cord, 8 feet of time blasting fuse in an area 4.5 km NW of Dien Bam District Headquarters.

On the 17th a CACO 2-1 unit, CAP 2-1-1 had contact with NVA treeps. The ambush initiated erganic weapons fire on 6 NVA moving N approximately 4 km NW of Hieu Duc District Headquarters. Two USMC were WIA(E) in the contact. A sweep produced 1 NVA KIA, 1 NVA WIA who was taken prisoner, 1 AK-47 and several documents. The POW stated that he was from the 31st NVA Regiment, which was werking on resupply during this period.

On the 18th in Dien Ban District CACO 2-3's units made a highly important contact with the enemy. A CAP 2-3-2 patrol base received small arms fire from an USEF, 2.1km NW of Dien Ban District Headquarters. The enemy withdrew N when the CAP returned fire. The CAP reacted to a firefight to Their NE, arriving to discover 4 PF KIA, 2 PF WIA(E), all the bodies were weaponless. At this time the patrol received SAF from 30 VC in houses and treeline to the N. The enemy again fled when the Marines and PFs returned fire. Two PFs were KIA in this contact. A sweep of this area produced 48 ARVN uniforms rumpled and thrown on the ground, all uniforms were without unit identification. This attack by the enemy was planned and well thought out. The incident is similar in plan to an incident of the 7th Feb 1970 in which 3 armed VC dressed in PF uniforms kidnapped a VN female from Trung Tay Hamlet in Hea Vang District. It is also significant due to the size of the enemy force.

Hea Vang District and Dien Ban District had a large turnover in VCS captured during March. These two Districts cover areas controlled by CACO 2-7 and CACO 2-3. In the 3rd quarter of March these two units captured an extraordinary amount of VCS. On the 20th a CAP 2-7-6 patrol on a combined operation with 2 platoens of the 51st ARVN Regiment apprehended 17 VN makes in possession of 18 M-26 grenades, 15 chicom grenades and 3 blasting caps. All ordnance was destroyed in location. These VCS were turned over to Hea Vang District Headquarters. CAPs 2-7-1, 2-7-2, 2-7-4 in combined force with NPFF apprehended 192 VN civilians 5.8 km NW of Dien Ban District Headquarters. The NPFF classified the VN civilians as 180 VCS, 11 VCI and 1 NVA. All were delivered to District Headquarters for further inter-

regation. On a medevac mission by vehicle 1 USMC was KIA, 1 USMC WIA(E) and 1 USMC WIA(M) when they drove into an ambush while carrying a sick VN civilian back to CACO 2-7. Their vehicle received heavy repairable damage from the incoming ChiCom grenades, and AWF. The medevac team returned SAF causing the enemy to flee in an unknown direction. On the 25th personnel from CACO 2-1 again had contact with NVA. The CAP 2-1-1 ambush initiated SAF on 7 NVA 100m from their position, the enemy returned heavy SAF then fled south. A sweep of the area of contact produced 2 NVA KIA, and 1 NVA WIA was taken prisoner and 1 AK-47. The POW revealed that he and his fellow men were part of a 49 man group, broken down in 7 men fighting teams, and that they carried radios for communication. This 49 man group is part of the 31st NVA Regiment.

Enemy initiated contact, friendly sightings of enemy movement, apprehension of VCS and enemy terrorist attacks continued to be at a high level in the final quarter of March. On the 26th a CAP 2-4-1 patrel apprehended 19 VN civilians carrying digging tools in a restricted area 2.5 km. NE of Hieu Nhom District Headquarters. They were classified VCS and taken to District Headquarters. The CAP patrol returned to the area to seek further VCS. 2 VC in a treeline initiated contact with a command detenated 105mm round. The patrol returned SAF causing the VC to flee SW. A sweep of the area disclosed 1 105mm round and 1 155mm round with pressure relace type triggering devices, these were destroyed in place. The explosion of the 105mm rd resulted in 1 PF KIA, 1 HSMC WIA(E) 1 PF WIA(E). It is thought that in this case that the 19 VN civilians were local force, low level VC cadre. At the same time CAP 2-2-4 in ambush site received 2 60mm mertar rounds. 2 VN civilians were KIA and 2 VN civilians WIA(M) from a satchel charge threwn at them by VC. PsyOps was notified. After a firefight on the 28th between CAP 2-9-2 PF's and 3 VC a 2-9-2 reaction force while sweeping through an area 1.9km NW of Duc Duc District Headquarters received SAF from an USEF in a treeline to their N. The patrol returned fire, and called an articlery mission causing the enemy to flee in an unknown direction. A sweep of the area produced 6 VC hiding in the brush and 1 AK-47. The VC POWs were turned ever to District Headquarters. Also on the 28th CAP 2-1-4 initiated SAF on 5 NVA moving W. The enemy returned fire and fled W. A sweep produced 1 NVA KIA, 1 NVA POW and 2 AK-47s. The NVA POW stated his unit is a supply unit for the 31st NVA Regiment, he was delivered to District Headquarters for further interregation. On the 30th a CAP 2-3-1 patrol apprehended 20 VN females and 11 VN males without preper identification. After questioning at District Headquarters 14 VN males and 3 VN females were retained as VCS. A terrorist indident on the 31st closed the menth out. CAP 2-3-7 rendered first aid and medevaced 4 VN civilians who received fragmentation wounds from 2 ChiCom granades thrown by 2 VC 4 km NW of Dien Ban District Headquarters. PsyOps was notified.

c. Enemy Plans and Pelicies. There was a neticable increase in enemy initiated ground activity during March ever that of February.

During the menth VC/VCI activities were directed towards disrupting the CAP program by attacks by fire on CAP units and heavy mine emplacements. Routes used by the VC/NVA to haul rice were mined to prevent rapid access by Allied troops. The enemy also made use of snipers to held off Allied patrols.

E. WISSING STREET

#### CONTRACT OF ALL

As in February the enemy employed SFDs directed both against military and civilian targets. SFDs were used in an attempt to demoralize military forces and to show the VN civilians that the GGVN could not protect them. Terrorist activity was directed against civilians in an effort to frighten them into support of the VC/NVA program.

- d. Interrogator/Translator. During the menth of March, 267 detainees, 24 POWs were turned ever by the CACOs to their respective District Headquarters for processing through the DIOCC. Feedback of information produced as a result of these interrogations was provided 2d CAG and the capturing CACOs.
- e. Counter Intelligence. Timely and accurate counter-intelligence support was supplied to 2d CAG by the 3rd, 5th, and 9th Counter Intelligence Teams. Blacklists, agent reports, and interregation reports were produced to augment the counter intelligence activities of the DIOCCs.
- f. Interpreters. Interpreters were employed by the 2d Combined Action Group during the menth of March. 6 were assigned to the CACOs and 1 remained at 2d CAG Headquarters.

#### OPERATIONS

a. General. March saw the units of 2d CAG experience constant small attacks by fire, and enemy patrols making squad size probes into CAP TAOC. Both combined operations with ARVN units and individual CAP sweeps produced a record amount of VCS apprehended. Most of these VCS were apprehended when it was discovered that they lacked identification and/or were unfamilar to the PFs who lived in these areas.

The first quarter of March saw the start of the enemy's activities being aimed at denying Allied Ferces and VN civilians free use of transportation routes. The enemy attempted this denial through the use of terrorist attacks combined with heavy mining of reads and trails. In answer to this threat the CAPs of 2d CAG increased day patrols, seeking surprize firing devices and night ambushes established on routes of access to major reads and trails. Also increased was the amount of VIP ordnance turned in during March which was am indication of the increased amount of enemy emplaced mines and booby traps. On the 3rd 3 Marines were taken under fire by an enemy ferce of unknown size as they attempted to return by read from CACO 2-4 to their CAP, CAP 2-4-1. An 81mm mortar mission from District Headquarters silenced enemy fire. On the 4th a CAP, 2-7-2 after a short fire fight swept the area of contact finding I unemplaced 12 lb box mine rigged for command detonation. The blood trails around the mine indicated that the CAP patrol had interrupted the enemy in the act of emplacing this mine. The mine was appreximately 200 meters to the east of QL#1 on a well used civilian trail. The mine was destroyed in place. CAP 2-8-4 while on patrol the 5th of March captured 2 VC who were unarmed and dressed in civilian clothes. The two VC were following the patrol in an attempt to discover the CAP's pattern of movement and, or their strength and alertness. CAP 2-4-1 personnel were again taken under fire by the enemy on the 6th as they attempted to use the read to reach CACO 2-4. The Marines returned fire causing the enemy to flee. The read between the CAP and the CACO is heavily mined and dangerous for vehicle traffic, and has been such for ever 4 monthes. During March the enemy increased his efforts to make foot travel between this CAP and the CACO difficult. Also during the month CAP 2-4-lexperienced many attacks by fire in which the enemy once fired upon melted away. On the 8th a PF and Marine were WIA(E) after the PF tripped a SFD rigged with a trip wire on a trail in CAP 2-3-6 TAOC, 3 km NW of Dien Ban District Headquarters.

The second quarter of March saw the enemy increase his efforts to disrupt the Pacification Program of 2d CAG through attacks on lines of ground communication, resupply and access. On the 12th a non CAP USN was WIA(E) when the road roller that the USN was driving was destroyed by a command detenated 30 lb box mine on QL#1 2 km NW of Dien Ban District Headquarters. CAP 2-3-2 handled the medevac of the USN and VN civilian. On the same day 2 VN children were WIA(E) when 3 VC threw an M-26 grenade into their bus on QL#1 3.5 km NE of Dien Ban District Headquarters, in CAP 2-3-7 TAOC. On the 14th 1 VN


female was WIA(E) when she tripped a 105mm round rigged with a trip wire, just eff the main read connecting 2-4-1, 2-4-3, with CACO 2-4. 2-4-1 handled the Medevac.

The pattern set by the enemy in the first half of March continued into the second half of the Month. In Hieu Duc much contact was made with NVA troops. These enemy forces were moving in squad to (5) man team size units. All POWs taken by 2-1 units reported that they were from the 31st NVA Regiment. The sightings and centact with these small units of NVA substantiates agent reports that some NVA units are breaking down into smaller units to wage guerrilla type warfare. On the 24th a CACO 2-7 vehicle while en a medevac mission with a VN civilian aboard was ambushed on QL#1 6.5 km NE of Dien Ban District Headquarters. The ambush resulted in (1) USMC KIA, (1) USMC WIA(E), and (1) USMC WIA(M). The enemy fled when the Marines returned their fire. On the 26th, the same day that 2-4-1 captured 19 VCS with digging tools around an area with emplaced SFD, CAP 2-4-2 detenated 2 unknown type SFDs by igniting a brush fire. On the 31st CAPs 2-7-1, 2-7-2, and 2-7-4 with NPFF discovered (8) 60mm rounds and apprehended 2 VN civilians without identification in the vicinity of ST 045629. The 60mm rounds were destroyed in place and the VCS taken to District Headquarters. The capture of the two VCS and (8) 60mm rounds probably prevented injurys to Allied Forces and civilians if these 60mm rounds had been emplaced as booby traps.

- b. Mebility. At the end of the reporting period 2d CAG had (35) mebile CAPs and (1) static CAP.
- c. Training. Training plans for the month of March were submitted for appreval to the Commanding Officer, 2d CAG by all CAG's in accordance with Group Bulletin 1500. Emphasis was on care, cleaning and safety in the use of weapons. Handling of booby traps was also discussed.
- d. Inspections. During March a regular schedule of Staff Inspections were conducted throughout the CAPs. These inspections consisted of detailed critiques of undesirable trends and were submitted to CACOs so they could take corrective action. Also inspected were records being kept and coordination accomplished on both the CACO and CAP levels. Supply and communication inspections were also conducted in order to evaluate the state of readiness at the CAP and CACO level, based on usage data compiled at 2d CAG Headquarters.

#### e. Conferences/Meeting

- (1) Staff Cenference. 2d CAG Headquarters continued to held weekly staff meetings where matters of multiple staff comnizance were discussed.
- (2) Combined Action Company C.O. (s Meeting. During the month of February a meeting was held on a weekly basis for all Compined Action Company Commanders and the Headquarters Staff. These meetings are specifically designed for the purpose of working out problems of support and coordination in

addition to promulgating command guidance. At each of these meetings the individual CACO CO or his representative gave a projection from the DIOCC (District Intelligence/Operations Control Center) concerning intelligence in their area for the coming week.

(3) CAP Commanders Conference. During March the CAP Commanders Conference discussed, handling of classified material, radio procedure and security, giving away food te villagers, how to handle this distribution of excess food, and the responsibilities of the CAP Commander. All agenda items were submitted by the individual CACO Commanders several days prior to the scheduled conference for review. These items were put in a logical order of discussion then distributed to the CAP Commanders at the meeting.

#### f. Special Operations

- (1) <u>Kit Carson Scouts</u>. In March 2d CAG employed (9) Kit Carson Scouts. They participated in 165 day and night patrols, assisted with 5 classes, and conducted 15 PsyOps breadcasts, accounted for the capture of 4 VCS, and helped discover 4 cave and tunnel complexes. At the end of the period (1) Scout was WIA(E) and (1) Scout marked as U.A.
- (2) Scout Dogs and Handlers. During the month of March, 2d CAG de-
- g. Voluntary Information Program. The total amount of funds expended as rewards to Vietnamese during March for information on enemy activity and equipment, ordnance locations was 131.445\$VN.
- h. Artillery Support. During March 2d CAG units called in (23) artillery fire missions, (6) 81mm mortar missions and (1) 60mm mortar mission on enemy positions and routes of withdrawal.

#### i. Air

- (1) Fixed Wing. In March 2d CAG employed no fixed wing support fire.
- (2) Flareships and Gunships. During March (2) Gunship missions were flown in support of 2d CAG units.
- (3) Medical Evacuation Missions. A total of (26) medical evacuation missions were requested/controlled by 2d CAG units during March. These missions included medevacs for Vietnamese civilians and PFs as well as Marines.





#### 5. CIVIC ACTION/PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

- 1. During the month of March Civic Action NCOs from 2d Combined Action Group continued with their efforts to act as a liaison between hamlet, village, and District Officials in initiating civic action and community development. Attempts to obtain support from the GVN in the form of tin and cement for construction projects were successful in several cases. The CACOs continued to maintain effective coordination between the G-5's of the 1st Marine Division, Naval Support Activity, Force Legistics Command, 1st Marine Air Wing, and the 2d Republic of Korea Marine Corps Brigade. Coordination was also maintained with the S-5 sections of Battalien size units in whose TAOR's Combined Action Plateons of 2d Combined Action Group were operating. The Civic Action support from these units was effective. The continued coordination with MACV advisors and COORDs representatives has resulted in closer working relationships with District Officials and Revolutionary Development CADRE'S in promoting civic action.
- (a) An example of the civic action work that has been done to better Marine Vietnamese is that the Civic Action NCO's have been working with the people to complete their rice harvest. This has kept them quite busy, along with repairing homes which have been damaged due to enemy activity and repairing school houses. These projects have shown the Vietnamese that the CAP Marines respect them and are there willing to assist the people at all times.
- 2. Agricultural projects which are vitally important to the CAPs because of the importance they hold for the future of Viet-Nam people. During March Civic Action NCOs worked closely with the farmers experimenting with seeds, hoping to find those vegetables which the farmers will accept and start raising in quantity. The Civic Action NCOs for example, recived a large quantity of seeds of all types with instructions on growing them. These seeds were received from private groups, individuals in the States interested in the welfare of Viet-Nam. With many of the CAPs spending considerable time in the development of these vegetables crops, it was hoped that those most beneficial to the people would be identified so that the CAPs could narrow their attention to the crops best suited to the land, climate and farming methods available.
- 3. Cemmedities distributed during the month of March were as fellows: feed, 1989 lb., seap, 1246 lb., clething 450 lb., school refill kits, 75; persennel hygiene kits, 35; sewing kits, 148; midwife kits, 8; physical education kits, 7; masenary kits, 4.
- 4. During March, CAP personnel of the Group assisted the Vietnamese civilians in completing the following projects; 9 fences; 3 public heads; 14 wells; 4 dwellings; 2 pagedas; 3 boodhes; 3 bridges; 3 school class rooms; 4 family bunkers.

- 5. Medical assistance in support of Civic Action saw MedCaps resulting in the treatment of 19,769 Vietnamese civilians. 46 dental cases were treated. 64 Vietnamese adults and 31 children were medically evacuated during the menth.
- 6. CAP corpsmen continued to train Vietnamese civilians in the basics of first aid. During the month 54 such civilians were undergoing training. These aides assist in MedCaps and serve as interpreters for the corpsmen.
- 7. Psychological operations activities employed by 2d CAG during the month of March included the use of air-dropped leaflets and hand dissemination of leaflets and Vietnamese newspapers.
- (1) Approximately 30,000 "CAPs are here to help you" leaflets were air-dropped.
- (2) Approximately 40,000 "safe conduct passes" leaflets were airdrepped.
  - (3) 40,000 reward leaflets were air-dropped during the month.
- (4) Approximately 40,000 Vietnamese newspapers were hand distributed by CAP Marines.

  - (c) Taping of the handset cord was initiated and will be enforced to prevent future cord fraying.

#### 7. MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

a. General. During the month of March, Headquarters 2d Combined Action Group, Medical Section concentrated on an expanding MedCap capability at CAG level. Due to 2d CAG's unique position between two villages remote enough from Hoi An to warrant local medical attention, a tactical and civic action purpose is served.

Responsibilities of Corpsmen and procedures are being reviewed with all Corpsmen at CACO level in order to give a uniform everview presentation. Individual CAPs are inspected to determine the effectiveness of the individual Corpsmen's carrying out his responsibilities.

Although hampered by a continuing shortage of Corpsmen, maximum utilization of Corpsmen and trained Marine counterparts has preven effective and in some cases extremely so. Marine counterparts are trained in advanced and sephisticated first aid precedures and log maintenance so that in the event of a loss of the CAP Corpsman the medical capabilities are not lost.

Experience at 2d CAG HQ's has shown that the present T/O for HQ's medical personnel is not sufficient. A minimum of three permanent medical personnel is required to efficiently eperate this CAG Aid Station due to our unique position.



Three USMC from CAP 2-4-1 received SAF and M-79 fire from an USEF across a river at BT 178581, 2 km NE of Hieu Nhon District Headquarters. The bunkers and SFDs were destroyed. The rice and vegetables were delivered to District Headquarters for redistribution. The documents were delivered to District DIOCC for analysis.
