PART II  
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During this reporting period the battalion maintained an overall combat readiness posture of category 2. Problem areas were: (1) Shortage of Field Grade Officers which was partially alleviated upon receipt of one (1) LtCol and one (1) Major, and one (1) Captain being promoted; (2) combat equipment losses increased and at the end of this period were at 15% with no information available as to replacements; (3) critically needed spare parts have not arrived as anticipated.

The Battalion continued it's support of the 1st and 7th Marine Regiments along with the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines during this period. One (1) platoon remained under the operational control of the 196th Light Infantry Brigade in the Chu Lai TAOR. Technique of employment consisted of one platoon (10 LVTP5's) in support of each infantry battalion in the Da Nang TAOR. As detailed in enclosure (2), this included logistic, reaction and combat support missions.

Operations for the month were highlighted by the battalion participating in Operations "Arizona" and "Brown". Thirty-four (34) vehicles were provided for "Arizona", (the largest contingent of LVT's employed during the past year on a single operation) consisting of twenty-nine (29) LVTP5's two (2) LVTP5 CMD's, two (2) LVTE1's and one (1) LVTR1. Ten (10) LVTP5's were employed on "Operation Brown".

As the operations commenced, the LVT's transported the blocking, sweeping and command groups into position, affording them unimpeded movement and increased impetus. After the command group was positioned, the LVT's were deployed in support of the sweeps, and to augment the command groups' perimeter of defense. During periods of heavy contact LVT's were maneuvered to provide cover and evacuation for casualties to a secure helicopter landing zone.

Throughout the operations, the LVT's were subjected to sporadic small arms and automatic weapons fire. On one occasion, a five (5) vehicle column while displacing L Company, 3/7, to a forward position, came under heavy small arms, automatic and antitank fire. The infantry dismounted but were unable to move. Three (3) LVT's immediately assaulted the high ground (Hill 11) and encountered an enemy squad in fortified positions. As the LVT's reached the crest of the hill the enemy broke contact and began to flee. The LVT's continued the assault, overran their positions, and pursued them accounting for three (3) KIA and four (4) WIA.

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ENCLOSURE (1)

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Camp development has continued. Two (2) projects of primary concern are the remodeling of the messhall and rewiring of the electrical power distribution system. Both projects are awaiting scheduling at Public Works. General improvements have been made on the roads and drainage system. New bunkers have been constructed using battalion resources and continued emphasis is being stressed to further improve the battalion's defenses.

1. TOPICS.

a. Personnel and administration.

(1) During the reporting period three (3) MC Officers, 0 Navy Officers, thirteen (13) MC Enlisted and 0 Navy Enlisted rotated to CONUS. Two (2) MC Officers, 0 Navy Officers, sixty-seven (67) MC Enlisted and two (2) Navy Enlisted replacements were received.

(2) During the reporting period the battalion had the following casualties: Four (4) KIA and thirty-nine (39) WIA.

b. Intelligence.

(1) Normal administrative and combat intelligence functions were carried out during the month.

(2) Fifteen (15) LVT's were mined during this period, resulting in three (3) vehicles being completely destroyed, seven (7) requiring evacuation to CONUS, three (3) second echelon maintenance, and two (2) receiving minor damage to the suspension systems.

(3) There were twelve (12) other contacts consisting of five (5) enemy ambushes and seven (7) incidents of sniper fire.

(4) The battalion patrols and ambushes encountered no hostile activity and observed nothing unusual in the assigned sectors of responsibility. Inhabitants of the hamlets around the battalion perimeter have displayed a spirit of friendliness and cooperation.

c. Training.

(1) Formal training was conducted throughout the month on the M16, FAM Firing of all personnel with the M16 was accomplished this month in conjunction with operational commitments.

(2) OJT and normal maintenance procedures were conducted this month.

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d. School.

(1) Twenty-five (25) personnel attended M16 class on 1 June held by the contact team from III MAF.

(2) One (1) Officer, one (1) Staff and three (3) Enlisted attended a school at 1st FSR on the M16.

(3) One (1) Cpl attended Vietnamese Language School.

(4) Two (2) Supply personnel attended course on MUMMS at III MAF.

(5) Three (3) personnel attended Motion Picture Operations School at III MAF.

(6) Three (3) teams were trained in the installation of the new family of radios. Eleven (11) of the radios have been installed.

e. Special Operations.

(1) Enclosure (2) contains the Battalion's Sit Rep's for 1-30 Jun 67.

f. Logistics.

(1) Significant Events.

(a) Supply support, with the exception of LVT parts, has generally improved during this period. Critical spare parts listings are being revised, updated, and resubmitted in an attempt to alleviate the problem.

(b) The period ended with an LVT deadline of less than 10%. FY-67 R&E Program concluded with a total of fifty-one (51) LVTP5A1's, three (3) LVTP5A1 (CMD's), three (3) LVTR1A1's received under this program.

g. Civic Action.

(1) MEDCAPs and DENTCAPs were conducted in the hamlets of Binh Thai, Cam Bac, and Pho Hoa. A total of 706 villagers were treated. The MEDCAP to Pho Hoa continued to be jointly administered by this battalion and the ARVN.

(2) On Tuesdays of each week in June a meeting was held with the village chief of Hoa Tho and the Hamlet Chiefs of Binh Thai and Cam Bac.

(3) A third communal head in the hamlet of Binh Thai was completed on a self help basis.

(4) Seven hundred twenty-five (725) gallons of garbage was provided for the battalion sponsored pig farm. Other items distributed were three
