





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PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period the Battalion continued its support of the 5th and 7th Marine Regiments and 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marines. Technique of employment consisted of one platoon in support of each infantry Battalion in the DaNang TAOR, except 2/7 which is supported by a section and 3/5 which has no LVT's. On 14 January 1968 the 4th Platoon of Company "B" and the Company Command Group (-) was dispatched to join the 3rd Platoon of Company "B" at the 2nd ROKMC Brigade Headquarters, vicinity of Hoi An. On 17 January 1968 two LVTE1's were dispatched for the support of the 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines. On 18 January 1968 five LVTP5Al's of Company "A" were dispatched by LSU for the support of Task Force X-Ray.

During the reporting period the Battalion participated in two county fair type operations with Popular and ARVN Forces in the Battalion AOR. The results of these operations are included in the Intelligence Summary and attached Situation Reports.

On 30 January 1968 the Battalion provided one LVTP5Al Platoon and two Provisional Infantry Platoons for direct support of the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines. The results of the Battalions participation during the support of 3/5 are included in the Intelligence Summary and attached Situation Reports.

During the reporting period the Battalion hadcan average of 58 LVT's committed daily in general support of the First Marine Division. The missions and the number performed by the Battalion were: resupply (129), patrol (73), waterway denial and river patrol (4), blocking force (16), county fair (6), Med Evac (15), MedCap force (1), reaction force (26), search and destroy (10), security (52), administrative (11), recovery (19), mine sweep (31), troop movement (22). During the reporting period the LVTE1's fired 6 line charges. Vehicle utilization averaged 8.4 hours per day, carrying an average of 23 persons and 751 pounds of cargo per day.

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PART III SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. TCPICS

- a. Personnel and Administration
- (1) The personnel status as of 31 January 1968 was category II with a projection of remaining in a low category II provided projected replacements arrive on schedule.
- (2) During the reporting period 1 Marine Corps Officer, 1 Navy Officer, 63 Marine Corps Enlisted and 0 Navy Enlisted rotated to CONUS. 1 Marine Corps Officer, 2 Navy Officers, 54 Marine Corps Enlisted and 2 Navy Enlisted replacements were received.
- (3) During the reporting period the Battalion had the following casualties: -O- KIA and 28 WIA
- (4) During the reporting period the Battalion had 4 extensions of overseas tours, 1 extension of enlistment, 6 new enrollments in MCI Courses and maintained a savings bond participation of 65%.
- (5) There were no significant administrative problems encountered during the reporting period.

b. Intelligence

- (1) Battalion S-2 conducted normal administrative and combat intelligence operations during the reporting period. An area intelligence estimate was completed and forwarded to Division G-2 on 16 January 1968.
- (2) The Battalion had ll LVT's mined during the reporting period. In seven days from the 14th to the 21st seven LVT's detonated enemy mines. Of the ll LVT's, seven were repairable and four were combat losses.
- (3) During the reporting period the Battalion had a total of 19 contacts. They consisted of 11 mining incidents, 5 sniper incidents and 3 ambushes.
- (4) Two booby traps were uncovered by the Battalions patrols during the reporting period. They were as follows:
- (A) A stake driven into the ground with propaganda leaflets attached. The stake was booby trapped with one M26 grenade which detonated instantaneously when the stake was moved.
- (B) A point man using a probe found a punji pit covered with a woven bamboo top that was covered over with dirt. Inspection revealed a trip wire inside the pit. A grappling hook was used to uncover the pit which contained one 81 MM mortar round that was rigged Downgraded to UNCLASSIFIED on Serebruary 1969

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
as a booby trap. The pit and mortar round were destroyed.

- (5) During the reporting period the Battalion participated in two county fair type operations with Popular and ARVN Forces in our AOR. The results of these operations are as follows:
- (A) Operation commencing 180600HJan68 and terminating at 190700HJan68 produced the following: fifteen illegal residents, twenty-six Viet Cong suspects (3 of which wore clothing of Buddhist Monks), eleven draft dodgers and one confirmed VC who was an infrastructure chief with an additional duty as a finance officer.
- (B) Operation commencing 261745HJan68 and terminating 271000HJan68 produced the following: four VC suspects, one draft dodger, and one K-50 magazine containing twenty-nine rounds. Magazine was given to AmTrac Blocking Force by a Vietnamese child. Child was given a reward of 200 piasters.
- (6) On 30 January 1968 the Battalion provided two provisional infantry platoons and one LVTP5Al Platoon for support of the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines at coordinates 050720. The LVT's and infantry platoons were used to sweep and as a blocking force. During the operation the Battalion accounted for 6 VC KIA and 12 probable VC KIA. The Battalion apprehended 132 suspects, 9 of which were confirmed VC. The following weapons and equipment were captured: 10 AK-47 rifles, 5 SKS 7.62 MM rifles, 1 caliber 38 pistols, 1 caliber 45 pistol, 2 30 caliber (US) carbines, 1 M14 rifle, 1 M16 rifle, 2 K-50 rifles, 1 7.62 MM Degtyarev Squad Light Machine Gun, 3 B-40 rockets, 11 Chinese Communist 60 MM mortar rounds, 2 US 60 MM mortar rounds, 10 M-26 grenades, 65 Chinese Communist and VC (Homemade) grenades, assorted web gear, assorted papers and documents and approximately 2,000 rounds of assorted ammunition.
- (7) During the reporting period the Battalion conducted in excess of 130 squad size patrols, and 20 platoon size patrols within our ACR. Squad size operations were conducted during daylight and darkness with platoon size operations being mainly at night.

c. Training


(1) Formal training was conducted throughout the reporting period in conjunction with operational commitments. Troops attended classes on the following subjects:

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

- (2) OJT and normal maintenance procedures were conducted during the reporting period.


f. Logistics

(1) Significant Events: The most significant problem facing the logistical posture of the Battalion during January occurred as the result of enemy mine activity and the resulting loss of operational LVT's. During the reporting period, 11 LVT's were damaged of which 4 are being coded out as combat losses. At one point, 7 LVT's were damaged in 7 days. The frequency of these mining incidents placed a heavy burden on maintenance personnel and compounded the short supply of critical suspension repair parts. The current skills required to repair these vehicles has reached a high level but the nature of equipment required, availability of necessary repair parts to effect repair and the location of the LVT's at the time of the mining incidents are key factors in the time-length required to restore the LVT's to operational status.

- (2) Maintenance Situation: In order to preclude the Battalion attaining a C-3 status as a result of increased deadline, the following steps were taken and are in effect:
- (A) All LVT components at 3d echelon repair at FLC were nominated for Red Ball during the period.
- (B) Additional maintenance personnel were obtained from Ordnance Maintenance Company, 1st Force Service Regiment.
- (C) Welding equipment that became deadlined was placed on Red Bali.
- (D) Battalion maintenance assets were pooled to remove from deadline those LVT's with the least damage and priorities for repair were established.
- (E) All supply itmes required were resubmitted as Priority 02 "Walk-throughs".
 - (F) Selective interchange policy was followed.
- (G) A Battalion Maintenance team has been formed to concentrate on repair of mined vehicles thereby utilizing the best skills available.
- (3) Although all measures have been taken to remain in C-2, this posture is directly related to the frequency of mining incidents and resultant combat losses. This Battalion remains 20 LVT's short of authorized T/E.

g. Civic Action


(1) During the reporting period a water pump was purchased from local sources for the Church of Christ Orphanage in DaNang. The Battalion S-5 has sufficient plumbing equipment on hand to complete the shower system in the orphanage in the near future, tactical situation permitting. The orphanage was given ten pounds of food, 35 pounds of clothing, 200 bars of soap and approximately fifty toys during the reporting period. TET toys, food, clothing and school supplies will be delivered to the orphanage as soon as the tactical situation permits. On 14 January 1968 nine volunteers from the Battalion worked at the orphanage erecting a tower and tank for the shower and a septic tank for the shower run-off.

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- (2) The following is a daily chronology of significant S-5 activities:
- (a) 18-19Jan68, a County Fair Operation with Hoa Vang Sub Sector. S-5 supplied 1,000 pounds of rice, 700 gallons of water and two GF tents for PSYOPS. The 244th PSYOPS Company showed 3 hours of progovernment films and cartoons.
- (b) 23Ian68, a ceremony was held to celebrate the closing of the Nui Kim Son School for TET. The 244th PSYOPS Company showed $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours of cartoons and pro-government films at the FM Club.
- (c) 24Jan68, 250 toys were given to the village chief of Nui Kim Son for distribution to children for TET.
- (d) 27Jan68, a County Fair Operation with Hoa Vang Sub Sector. S-5 supplied 700 gallons of water.
- (3) During the reporting period 7 villagers of Nui Kim Son were evacuated to the USAID Hospital, 3 adults, 3 children and 1 baby. 738 persons were treated, 3,925 bars of soap, 2 loads of fire wood, 650 toys, 60 pounds of food and 105 pounds of clothes were distributed. The repairing and paving of the road through the village of Nui Kim Son is approximately 20% complete.

h. Communications

- (1) The Communications Section was inspected by the First Marine Division Inspection Team on 29 January 1968. The overall rating was satisfactory with minor discrepancies present. No significant problem areas were encountered.
- (2) The final modification of LVT's of the Battalion to the VRC radio system was completed on 26 January 1968 enabling LVT's to have an increased radio range and improved communication facilities with the addition of a radio circuit solely for the use of embarked infantry units. LVT's now have the capability of monitoring three radio circuits at one time or transmitting on any one of ten pre-set channels.
- (3) On 17 January 1968 the battalion converted to the Division wire circuit from radio relay.improving the battalions telephone/teletype communications. The battalion gained a direct circuit TIII MAF and two circuits to the First Marine Division in addition to the teletype circuit.

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

7. Supporting Forces

a. Plateen (-), Ce "A", 3dAmTracBn. Four LVT's were effectively employed along the beach as a blocking force from 180600HJan68 to 181200HJan68.

8. Intelligence

It is estimated that prior to the operation the area that was cordened and searched contained possibly as squad of guarrillatic. This estimate is based on prior contacts plus intelligence information obtained from the village chief and the 5th Counterintelligence Team which works in this area.

One confirmed Viet Cong was captured during the operation. There were no enemy weapons or supplies captured. No enemy units were identified.

The terrain in the area was conducive to an operation of this type. Avenues of escape were effectively blocked before daylight on the day of the operation. The weather was clear and sunny.

In conclusion, it is highly probable that the Viet Cong had prior knowledge of the operation and evacuated the area before its commencement.


9. Mission

a. To conduct a County Fair type operation from 180600 to 190700 by blocking the area sunrounding Marble Mountain, BT 075710, collect and screen local inhabitants, and to search the mountain and surroundings for tunnels and caves hiding VC, their weapons and/or supplies and direct a psychological operation towards the people.

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10. Concept of Operation. See enclosure (1).

11. Execution. Planning conferences began as early as 27 December 1967. Final details of the operation were published on 16 January 1968 and presented by Captain J. T. PARKER, USA, Infantry, at a briefing held for all participating units at the FOB-4 Special Forces COC. During the operation there were no significant enemy actions. One confirmed VC was captured who was an infra-structure chief with an additional duty as a Finance Officer. 3dAmTracBn S-5 distributed one thousand pounds of rice, one thousand gallons of water and furnished two GP tents for the use of PSYOPS. 3dAmTracBn treated five hundred Vietnamese at Med Cap's held in conjunction with the operation. 1st Marine Division PSYOPS Team supplied equipment for six hours of pro-government lectures by government representatives. Also, three hours of cartoons, sanitation and pro-government films were shown.

12. Results. Several caves were found, one confirmed VC, 26 VC suspects, who had either improper ID or papers and relatives who were known VC, 11 draft dedgers, fifteen illegal residents. Three of the VC suspects were clothing of Buddhist Menks.

13. Administrative Matters

a. Communications: Communications were excellent.

14. Special Equipment and Techniques

- a. Scout Dogs were used effectively in searching both the mountain and the village.
- 15. Commanders Analysis. Since this command provided only a blocking force and PSYOPS Team for the operation, comments from a command point of view are not considered apprepriate. The operation was successful and beneficial to all concerned and certainly contributed to a better understanding between allied forces. They should be continued as a vital part of our operations in this area.

16. Recommendations

- a. That 3dAmTracBn be authorized to participate in such future operations.
 - b. That such operations be conducted in other villages in this area.

1. SITUATION

- a. Enemy VC guerrillas (Unit designation and strength unknown)
 may be using caves and tunnels located in Marble Mountain BT 075710
 as a supply base and/or a haven during daylight hours. Enemy
 units in this area have been harassing local units and civilian
 population using small arms, mortars and rockets and have had
 minor successes in the past. Morale should be high.
- b. Friendly forces 2/3 USMC, 3dAmTracBn, CAP's Golf 5, 6, & 7, 5th Special Forces Group Alpha, Mike Force, POW Security, FOB-4, MAG-16.
- c. Attachments Vietnamese National Police, Popular Force (w/advisors), Hoa Vang District, Co "B", 1st MP Bn, NSA Dog Handlers, 7th PSYOPS Bn.

2. MISSION

To conduct a County Fair Type Operation from 180600 to 190700 by blocking the area surrounding Marble Mountain BT 075710, collect and screen local inhabitants, and to search the mountain and surroundings for tunnels and caves hiding VC, their weapons and/or supplies and direct a psychological operation towards the people.

3. EXECUTION

Area surrounding Marble Mountain will be encircled and blocked by 5th SFGA, 3rdAmTrao, CAP's Golf 5,6, & 7. Local inhabitants will be collected by PF's, National Police and directed to old French Fort, BT 071708 for screening. Caves and tunnels will be searched by teams consisting of QC, Sentry Dog Handlers, PF's, National Police and U. S. MP's. Surrounding hamlet will be searched by PF's and CAP units. Ambushes will be established for night operation by PF's and CAP unit.

- a. 5th SFGA at 0600 hours will establish blocking force's to the north of objective from BT 072711 (3dAmTrac Check Point) to BT 081714 (Beach) following south side of fence line.
- b. 3dAmTracBn at 0600 hours will establish blocking force to the east from BT 081714 to BT 083708 (Beach) with four LVT's and prevent fishing boats from leaving area, also establish a blocking force to the south from BT 073707 (Road) to BT 083708 (Beach), following north side of fence line north of hamlet Nui Kim Son refugee camp and 3dAmTracBn Compound, but south of fishing hamlet- Son Thuy BT 081715.







- c. CAP GOLF 5 at 0600 will establish blocking force to the west from BT 073707 (3dAmTracBn Check Point) to BT 0707708 (North West corner of French Fort). At 0800 hours they move blocking force to BT 073707 to BT 072711 (along road).
- c. CAP Golf 6 at 0600 hours will establish blocking force to the west from BT 070708 (south west corner of French Fort) to BT 07;711 (tie in with 3d/mTracBn). At 0800 hours will move blocking force position to fishing hamlet and carry out search & clear operation, remaining at hamlet and establishing ambush sites for night operations.
- e. PF's, National Police, PSYOPS Units, QC and Formand Hq will assemble at gate (3dAmTrac Check Point). At 0615 hours move to French Fort for segregation into search units. On order those personnel (PF's & National Police) selected will collect population and return them to French Fort BT 071708 for screening by PSYOPS.
- f. The PSYOPS En will support the PF's and National Police with P.A. systems during collection and will conduct PSYOPS program on personnel gathered at collection point.
- g. Search teams consisting of QC, National Police, PF's, MP's and Sentry Dog Teams will move from French Fort on order and search caves and tunnels of Marble Mountain.
- h. PF's and two members of National Police on order will move and search hamlets at base of Marble Mountain.
- i. National Police, Village Consul, S-2 Hoa Vang District & 5th CIT will screen inhabitants of area and determine status. VC Suspect's will be moved to separate area for isolation and interrogation.

j. Points:

- 1. Only National Police will enter and search pagoda's
- 2. All blocking forces will move into position at 0600 hours
- 3. Reaction Force available at French Fort
- 4. Buddhist Monks will not be forced to leave pagoda's
- 5. No items will be removed from hamlet or tunnels without proper notification to Command Post
- 6. No fire support to be used on Mountain
- 7. A final briefing will be held at 170900 in the Command Bunker, FOB-4.





4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

a. Rations

- (1) All units will be responsible for resupply and feeding of their own troops
- (2) 3dAmTracBn to supply rice, water, two tents at French Fort for local inhabitants by 0900
- (3) Hoa Vang District to provide firewood at Fort for local inhabitants
- b. Weapons: Unit responsibility to insure all troops properly armed
- o. Medical: Hoa Vang District to provide Corpsman to be stationed at CP. Evacuation to be by vehicle to NSA Hospital.
- d. Special Equipment: QC, National Police, PF's will insure adequate torches are provided for personnel engaged in search operations.

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL

Capt PARKER, Hoa Vang Sub Sector is Commander of Operation. Command Post will be established at French Fort, BT 071708.

All Units will monitor radio frequency 56.75 beginning 180600 Jan. NCS call sign is JULIET. Key personnel and units are identified as follows:
