### PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During this period the Battalien supported the 1st, 5th, 7th, and 26th Marines; RCK Marine Corps and Task Force Yankee. Technique of employment consisted of two plateens (+) to RCK Marine Corps, one plateen each to 2/1, 5th Marines, 1/7 and 3/7; one plateen (-) to 1/26; and a section (-) to Task Force Yankee.

During the second half of the month, a significant increase in Viet Cong activity occured in the Chinstrap Mountain complex. This increased Viet Cong activity prompted our Battalion to meet with the various Vietnamese Religious and Military authorities to solicit their recommendations on how to halt the Viet Cong's infiltration of these mountain/cave complexes. A variety of proposals and counter proposals were offered. Finally, by mutual consent it was determined that the villagers from Nui Kim Son, utilizing American furnished materials, would close the caves by constructing brick walls at their entrances. Similar cave denial operations are planned for the adjacent mountains and will be implemented as time and materials become available.

The Battalien had an average of fifty-three vehicles committed daily in direct support of the 1st Marine Division. The mission and frequency of specific tasks were:

Convey Escent - 50
Blocking Force - 43
Reaction Force - 81
Administration - 51
Troop Movement - 81
Search and Destroy - 37
Patrols and Mine Sweeps - 37

Vehicle utilization averaged seven hours per day carrying an average of four persons and 330 pounds of cargo per day. In addition, the LVTE-1's fired nine line charges.

### a. Personnel and Administration

- (1) Our persennel readiness category remains as C-2. We do not anticipate a change in this readiness category unless a significant increase er decrease in replacements occurs.
- (2) Two Marine efficers and forty-nine Marine enlisted retated to One Marine efficer, ferty-nine Marine enlisted and three Navy enlisted were received as replacements.
- (3) Recollistment rate for the month was 43%. This was based on three reenlistments.
  - (4) Casualties were two USMC KIA and six USMC WIA.
  - (5) There were seven extensions of everseas tours.
- (6) Five new USAFI and eleven MCI enrellments were received this menth.
  - (7) Awards. Six Purple Hearts were awarded.
- (8) Forty-five personnel went on R&R. This program is well received and a great merale beester.
  - (9) Our Savings Bend participation was 81%.
  - (10) The Exchange Services were adequate.


### b. Enemy

- (2) During the menth there were three detainees. ified as innocent civilians and released.
- (3) A total of one hundred and five patrols were conducted of which forty-five were during the hours of darkness.

- (2) One efficer and one enlisted Marine attended the Division Leadership School.

### d. Legistics

### (1) Supply Situation

- (a) Minor LVT suspension parts continue to be a problem. The D.X. pregrom is impreving and has become more responsive to our needs. Adequate quality central checks appear to be absent as some of the LVTP5Al starters were found to be insperative once installed in the vehicle.
- (b) One LVTE1 has been deadlined since 3 September 1968 awaiting a pallet lift cylinder. This vehicle is incapable of firing line charges until the defective cylinder is replaced. The ICF at Philadelphia is the present holder of this requisition.

- (c) T/E replacement vehicles are badly needed to maintain 9 a C-1 status of equipment/supplies on hand. Combat losses through enemy mine activity and the recent submergence of one LVTP5A1 has brought the Battalion to the brink of entering into a C-2 status for equipment/supplies on hand.
- (d) The shortages of typowriters remains critical, of the 18 typowriters authorized 13 are on hand.
- (e) The LVTR-Is are essential vehicles within an Amphibian Tractor Battalien as they provide a recovery and maintenance capability for each of the Companies. As a result of the unavailability of beem chains, "A" Company has been unable to fully utilize their LVTR-1.

### (2) Maintenance

- (a) There were two vehicles destroyed by enemy mine action; one has been dropped as a Code H loss; the other is pending as a Code H loss.
- (b) One T/E deficiency was received. The LVTP5Al submerged on 17 Nevember 1968 has been located and liasion effected with salvage personnel. A fermal request for salvage assistance has been forwarded.
- (c) The average Battalien daily deadline rate was six vehicles with an average vehicle deadline of two LVTE-1s and four LVTP5Als.
- (d) A maintenance area which is quickly developing into a problem is antenna matching units (MX6707). Presently there are sixteen of the subject units in the D.X. program at 1st FSR. The units have not been repaired nor have code letters been received; consequently, we are unable to order replacements and are short sixteen antenna matching units.

### (3) Meter Transport

- (a) The daily deadline rate for wheeled vehicles was %.
- (b) The Battalien Meter Transport legged 28,665 vehicle miles with one miner accident. A total of 1,748 passengers were carried and 490.8 short tens of carge were transported.
- (c) Our vehicles participated in five Rough Rider conveys to An Hea to resupply the 4th Platon, "A" Company.

## e. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- (1) 453 Vietnamese were treated in MedCaps in addition to thirty-two Vietnamese dental patients.
- (2) The fellowing commodities were distributed to the villagers of HOA LONG: 140 pounds of rice, 230 individual rations, 230 packs of cigarettes, twenty pounds of candy, 200 pencils and writing tablets.
- (3) The Battalien Commanding Officer and the S-5 efficer presented ten General WALT Scholership awards to the children of HOA-VANG Elementary School.
- (4) A Battalien spensered Christmas party for the Orphanage denated \$120.00 in cash, a refrigerator and various toys to the children.
  - (5) Two selstium payments were made.
- (6) Building materials were purchased from AIK funds to construct a toilet for the HOA-VANG Elementary School.

### f. Communications

(1) <u>Personnel</u>. The everall personnel status remains adequate. Two personnel were joined this menth, one a radio operator, the other a teletype operator. Ten Communications personnel were transferred from this unit; the majority of these Marines were in OF28 which has been in excess of the M/L.




