PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During August the Battalion performed 771 operational missions and 1,548 sorties. An increase in the number of troop movements, convoy escorts and medevacs characterized this month's operations.

The Division adopted an expanded TAOR during August which required the deployment of all eight tractor platoons to the field in direct support of fourteen infantry battalions. A platoon of LVT's has established a new cantonment within the 7th Marine's CP at LZ Baldy and another platoon has set up camp at FSB Ross in the QueSon Valley.

Receipt of 45 rebuilt vehicles as R&E or T/E deficiency replacements greatly enhanced the Battalion's overall combat readiness.

Both operational LVTEL's were committed most of the month in support of the 2d ROK Brigade and the 5th Marines. The two vehicles fired a total of 36 line charges and were both credited with a number of secondary explosions.

Bravo Company supported the ROK Marines in Operation Victory Dragon XIV by mounting 106 mm rifles and assuming blocking positions for the search and destroy operations.

LVTH6 training of the ROK Marines terminated at the end of the month and preparations were made to pass OpCon of these vehicles to the Koreans. Final training included actual indirect firing exercises.

Alfa Company lost one of their most outstanding crewchief's when Corporal T.L. JUSTICE 2374151/1833, USMC was killed as his tractor was hit by a command detonated 200 pound mine buried in the road south of Liberty Bridge.

In August the Battalion assumed control of the Marble Mountain TAOR. Observation posts and defensive positions were coordinated and fire discipline enforced. Two platoons of cooks, bakers and mechanics successfully cordoned off the village of Xom Thuy during pre-dawn hours of 30 August and the Battalion conducted its first County Fair Operation in the new TAOR. One VC suspect was detained and three secret caves were found and sealed.

During the month of August 1969, this Battalion conducted a total of 62 night patrols and five day patrols. A total of five persons were detained as VCS's. All five persons were delivered to the 5th Counterintelligence Team for further interrogation. There were 16 enemy contacts during the reporting period as follows:

- 1 - LVT mined (operations)
- 6 - SFD's
- 2 - Enemy sightings (15 in operations and 1 in the CP wire)
- 3 - Enemy incidents incoming (operations)
- 4 - Enemy attacks by fire (operations)

The Battalion processed the granting of 18 Secret Security Clearances and one Top Secret Security Clearance.

The Battalion had its Intelligence Section Technical Inspection, 1st Quarter FY-70 conducted by G-2, 1st Marine Division. The inspection results were very satisfactory with discrepancies in the S&C Files security.

The Battalion had an average of 85 vehicles committed daily in direct support of the 1st Marine Division and 2d ROKMC Brigade. The mission and frequency of specific tasks were:

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. TOPICS

a. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

(1) The personnel combat readiness category is C-1. We do not anticipate a change during the month of September 1969.

(2) Two Marine Officers and 86 Marine Enlisted rotated to CONUS. Six Marine Officers and 45 Marine Enlisted were joined during the month of August 1969.

(3) Our first team reenlistment rate was 75% and career reenlistment was 100% based on 2 reenlistments. Overall percent was 78.6%.

(4) The Battalion sustained the following casualties:

(a) Four Marine Enlisted were wounded during the month of August due to enemy action. One Marine Enlisted was KIA and another DOW during August due to enemy action. Twenty-two Marine Enlisted were medevaced out of country.

(5) There were 12 new MGI enrollments and 5 new USAFI enrollment. Thirty-two Marines took USAFI high school GED test. Twenty-three applications were received for the college GED test. Fifty-eight Fleet Home Town News releases were processed during the month of August.

(6) Seven Purple Hearts were awarded during August 1969.

(7) Three Marine Officers and 52 Marine Enlisted went on R&R during August 1969. This program receives full participation and is essential to the morale of this command.

(8) Eleven extensions of overseas tours were forwarded for approval.

(9) The Battalion Savings Bonds participation for August 1969 was 76.1%.

(10) The exchange services are excellent.

b. ENEMY

(1) The enemy units operating near our TAOR continued to range from squad to platoon size. These units usually operate south and west of our TAOR. During the month of August the local enemy initiated activity remained at an extremely low level with a rise in enemy SFD's. The enemy continued to avoid a contact with our perimeter guards, patrols, and OP's. The mining/SFD's in the area south west of our TAOR continued at a high level as the enemy continued to make his presence known.

(2) The enemy has the capabilities to conduct single or multiple ground attacks against our CP/TAOR. These attacks can be supported by 122mm/140mm rockets, mortars and RPG's. He can interdict lines of communications and routes of movement by mining, SFD's and ambushes. He can conduct sapper attacks against selected targets. He can avoid contact completely and either remain in remote areas or withdraw completely from our TAOR. He can engage in terrorist activity and conduct political warfare to expand the current Provisional Revolutionary Government (PRG). Due to recent tactical defeats in the battlefield, sickness, hunger and shortage of ammunition and medical supplies and austere living conditions have increased his vulnerability to psychological operations.

c. CIVILIAN POPULANCE

(1) The inhabitants of the immediate area of operations continue to be pro-government of RVN; however, due to the presence of the VC in the area, they continue to render assistance to him. The attitude of the villagers continues to be one of knowledge of most incidents prior to its occurrence and most of the time a lack of warning to friendly troops. Current counterintelligence to FWMAF, thus leading to the credence of the populace control factor by the Viet Cong in the area.

d. WEATHER

(1) During the month of August, the monthly mean precipitation remained at 0% with only a trace of rain. The temperature ranged from a low of 72° on 26 August 1969 to a high of 101° on 5 August. The moon illumination was 0% on 13 August and 100% on 27 August. The average visibility was 6 plus miles. The average wind direction was variable with an average velocity of 7-13 knots. The general overall weather conditions were partly cloudy with an average cloud ceiling of 3,500 feet. This unit could have participated with other units in low level operations without being hampered by severe weather conditions.

f. LOGISTICS

(1) Supply.

(a) The overall supply situation is adequate. However long leadtime exists for most major end items and components.

(2) Maintenance.

(a) During the reporting period two LVTP5A1's sustained combat damage. Vehicle #108199 sustained damage from a land mine and is awaiting disposition instructions. Vehicle #108128 sustained damage from an RPG round. Vehicle has been repaired by this command.

(b) LVTP5A1 #107446 submerged 3 Jul 69 will be evacuated CONUS under the R&E program. CG MCSA Phila msg 121050Z Aug 69 refers.

(c) LVTP5A1's #107874 reported damaged in July has been repaired.

(d) LVTP5A1's #107585 and 108292 reported in July LOGSUM as suspected combat losses are awaiting disposition instructions. Liaison with Maintenance Bn., 1st FSR indicated authorization to drop and requisitions are forth coming.

(e) During the reporting period 27 LVTP5A1's and one LVTR1 were received on the FY-69 R&E Program. In addition 17 T/E deficiencies were received.

(f) T/E deficiencies in the tracked vehicle family have been filled with the exception of 2 LVTE1's. These new vehicles are presently in-country.

(g) The overall tracked vehicle maintenance situation has improved and should continue to improve with further issue of R&E vehicles to the companies.

(h) During the reporting period eight LVTP5A1's were received with the fire suppression system installed.

3. Communications.

(a) Antenna AS-390. This item is a UHF antenna required for each command vehicle. The present allowance of LVTP5A1 Command tractors is nine. Two UHF antennas are completely unserviceable and one has broken ground plane elements and requires replacement. The lack of these antennas reduces the communications capability of the command tractors.

(b) Antenna Matching Unit MX-6707/VRC. Two of these are required for each LVTEL and five for each LVTP5A1 Command tractor. At the present, there are nine six-inch holes in tractors where these matching units are supposed to be installed. Failure is due to corrosion on the interior of the matching unit and has been the subject of several UER's. The most recent of these was submitted on 8 August 1969. Tractors missing a matching unit have a reduced capability in that only one radio may be used at a time and water-tight integrity is lost.

(c) Receiver - Transmitter RT-671/PFC-47. Of nine authorized LVTP5A1 Command tractors, two have not had ML-00348E-35/1 performed. This is the modification required to provide a high frequency capability for command tractors (installation of AN/PFC-47). TERO's were initially submitted for this modification on 29 December 1967. FSR documents were placed on "Red Ball" during June 1968. Requisitions were subsequently cancelled by FSR during November 1968. TERO's were resubmitted to FSR during April 1969. Upon refusal of the Shop Stores Officer to provide document information, TERO's were submitted to the Division G-4 during May 1969 in accordance with DivO 10010.1B. Lack of this equipment reduces the communications capability authorized for command tractors.

4. Motor Transport.

(a) Deadline rate during the period was 14%. The Battalion Motor Transport section logged 38,143 miles with one major accident in which one M-37 was rolled.

g. CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

(1) Two-hundred fifty-nine Vietnamese were treated this month by the 3dAmTracBn MEDCAP. One-hundred and eighty-three Vietnamese were treated the first two weeks at S-5 building and 76 were treated the following 2 weeks at the dispensary in Nui Kim Son. The S-5 MEDCAP has been discontinued and we have started a MEDCAP in Nui Kim Son once a week.

(2) VIP funds of 7,500\$ VN were expended to Vietnamese personnel for bringing in munitions such as grenades, M-79rds, Claymore mines and various other types.

(3) Ten pounds of clothing and ten pounds of soap were distributed to the people of Nui Kim Son and Xom Son Thuy.

h. COMMUNICATIONS

(1) During this period there were 99 communications-electronics items turned in for 2d echelon maintenance. Of them, 29 were referred to 1st FSR for 3d and/or 4th echelon maintenance. Nineteen DX items were turned in along with fifteen completed TERO's. One item is in for scheduled calibration and five items of test equipment are on valid requisitions.
