PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. HES Company. The Company remained in the Battalion Command Post (AT 989711) throughout the month and provided personnel for the Command Post security and Reaction Forces, a commitment which utilized an average of 35% of the available personnel each day. During the month, repairs to all bunkers and improvement and enlargement of the trench systems were commenced. The reaction force was reorganized into three permanent eight man squads, plus a corpsman in each squad. During the month the company conducted 29 night patrols/ambushes, one blocking force in support of Hoa Cam Training Center night daylight clearing sweeps of the Yen Bac Hamlet complex and participated in a three day County Fair Operation on 12, 13, 14 December in the Hoa Thinh Village Complex (AT 95711). The clearing operations resulted in the destruction of one cave and the County Fair netted five VCC and 34 VCS.

2. LA Company. The company remained in direct support of the 3d Marine Regiment throughout the month. On 4 December the Heavy Section of the 1st Platoon, in support of "L" Company, 3d Marines. (XD 975567) suffered one WIA (n re-evacuated) when the position was attacked with small arms, mortar, and recoilless rifle fire. Automatic weapons fire and 79 106mm MHP-T rounds were returned with undetermined results. On 11 December, 2d Platoon relieved 1st Platoon, which returned to the Company Command Post at (YD 060541), at Camp J. J. Carroll and became part of the Camp Reaction Force. The Light Section of the 3d Platoon took over from the Light Section of the 2d Platoon, in support of Company "F", 3d Marines, on bridge security at (YD 026561). On 20 December, Company "L", 3d Marines received 20-40 rounds of mortar fire which inflicted four WIA (two Med-Evac) on the Heavy Section of the 2d Platoon. Automatic weapons fire was returned with undetermined results. On 21 December, the Light Section of the 2d Platoon returned to the Company CP. On 31 December, the Heavy Section of the 3d Platoon accompanied Company "E", 3d Marines into the Gua Valley south of Camp J. J. Carroll to bolster forces of the Army of the Republic of Vietnam in the valley.

3. HE Company. The Company remained in Direct Support of the 4th Marine Regiment throughout the month. On 2 December the 2d Platoon was dropped to BLT 4/4. On 14 December, the CMCOS Platoon from BLT 3/26 was joined as the new 2d Platoon. On 15 December, the 1st Platoon moved from Dong Ha (YD 234585) by LCU to the Company CP in Phu Bai (YD 694143), and arrived on 16 December. On 16 December the new 2d Platoon also arrived at the Company CP from Dong Ha. On 18 December, the 2d Platoon moved to support 2/26 on Operation Pawnee III at (YD 129012). On 22 December the Company (-), consisting of a Command group and two platoons, moved to (YD 531315) to support 3/26 on Operation Chinook. At 222300H December, the 3/26 defensive perimeter came under mortar and small arms fire which lasted until 230600H December. The 3d Platoon suffered one KIA during the action. In addition, one L-35 was destroyed.

one M-107 and one M-422A1 suffered minor damage from shrapnel and small arms fire. One enemy mortar position was silenced by 106 Recoilless Rifle fire during the engagement but the enemy casualties could not be determined. On 24 December the light section of the 2d platoon moved with 2/26 (-) into the Operation Chinook Area. On 25 December Headquarters, 4th Marines assumed control of the Operation. The Heavy Section of the second Platoon remained at (ZD 129012) with a company from 2/26 to provide security for the Phu Loc Area.

4. 101st Company. The Company remained in direct support of the 9th Marine Regiment throughout the month. On 8 December C-32 from the Light Section of the 3d platoon in support of Company "B" 26th Marine, fired 12 106mm HEP-T rounds from (AT 923535) at a boat in the Song Thu Bon at (AT 901523). The boat was destroyed and there were three VC KIA (Probable). On 15 December, the Light Section of the 3d Platoon was escorting two wheeled vehicles back to the Company/3d Platoon Command Post (AT 967617), along Liberty Road when the convoy was ambushed by an estimated VC Platoon of 35-40 men at (AT 968596). The lead ONTOS was hit by a Russian RPG-2 Antitank Rocket resulting in the destruction of four 106mm Recoilless Rifles and three WIA (Med-Evac). Automatic weapons and small arms fire and 13 - 106mm HEP-T rounds were returned by the second ONTOS and personnel in the wheeled vehicles, suppressing the incoming fire and permitting the damaged ONTOS to continue to the Platoon Command Post. The position was supported within 15 minutes by tanks from Company "B", 3d Tank Battalion, and infantry from 1/26. Fire from the second ONTOS was credited with inflicting three VC KIA and six VC KIA (Probable) on the enemy force. On 16 December, C-33 from the Heavy Section of the 3d Platoon had a malfunction of one of its 106mm Recoilless Rifles which caused the accidental discharge of one 106mm HEP-T round, resulting in the destruction of one water buffalo and slight injury to one Vietnamese woman. Investigation failed to determine the cause of the malfunction. Solatium payment was made to the victim at Dai Loc District Headquarters (AT 917578) by the Battalion S-2 Officer. On 20 December, C-33 detonated a mine at (AT 949583) while escorting an engineer sweep team on Highway 14 resulting in the destruction of the ONTOS and one KIA and one WIA to the crew. The vehicle was recovered and Code X'd. Also on 20 December, C-32, at the Company CP, fired in on a VC flag at (AT 971604) and fired two 106mm FLESHETTE rounds when a TPS-er from 1/26 registered movement in the vicinity of the flag. The results were undetermined. On 26 December, the 2d Platoon returned to the Battalion CP (AT 989714), from An Hoa (AT 875775), where it had been in Direct Support of 2/5, preparatory to going afloat with BLT 3/9. 1st Platoon remained in Direct Support of 3/7 throughout the reporting period and had its Command Post located on Hill 65 (AT 975775).

1. In accordance with reference (a), the following information is submitted:

a. Reaction Force

During the month of December, the Reaction Platoon was re-organized into three (3) permanent eight (8) man squads plus a corpsman with each squad and conducted twenty-nine (29) night patrol/ambushes.

The Reaction Force conducted eight (8) ^{CLEARING} ~~search and find sweeps~~ of the Yen Bac Village Complex, destroying one (1) cave complex and discovering one dead Vietnamese, in casket, in the village school house.

The Reaction Force was also called upon to act as a blocking force for a combined sweep by 3d Tank Bn and a force from Hoa Cam Training Center, conducted on 20 December. Negative results were reported.

The Reaction Force participated in a three (3) day County Fair type operation of the Hoa Thinh Village Complex, conducted by 3d Tank Bn. Results were five (5) confirmed Viet Cong and 34 suspects.

b. C.P. SECURITY

Re-construction of the defensive bunkers and increasing the trenches of the perimeter were started during this month. A complete new top was placed on the Command Bunker and also the Ammunition Bunker.

Training for the month included normal on-the-job training plus FAM fire of the M-60 Machine Gun, M-14 Rifle, and those armed with the .45 Cal. Pistol, on 4 December and again on 31 December 1966. Both FAM firings were conducted at the Hoa Cam Training Center.

1. Operations.

a. During the reporting period this company continued in support of 3d Marines. 2/3 relieved 2/9 on 4 December 1966. F2/9 remained OPCON to 2/3. G2/3 was OPCON to 4th Marines. During the reporting period there were three direct fire missions of 114 rds. of 106mm MFP-T. A total of 374 rounds of 106mm MFP-T were expended as M&I fires with unknown results. A total of 1480 rds. of Cal..30 ammo expended.

b. Statistics.

1st Platoon remained in support of 3/3 with 3 ONTOS located at YD975567 in support of L3/3 and two ONTOS located at YD978587 in support of I, K, M, & H&S3/3. On 041530H returned enemy small arms, mortar, and 82mm recoilless rifle fire received from enemy at YD989567. Expended 79 MFP-T rounds of 106mm and 1480 Cal..30 rds. with unknown results. On 051530H to 061530H expended 33 MFP-T rds. in support of L3/3 conducting sweep at YD968566. Negative results. On 082200H fired 2 MFP-T rds. Results unknown. Fired 298 rds. MFP-T as M&I fires. Results unknown.

2nd Platoon remained in support of 2/9 & 2/3 with three ONTOS located at ID060541 in support of F,G,H,&I&S2/9; F,H,&I&S2/3. Two ONTOS located at ID026561 in support of E2/9 & E2/3. E2/3 relieved E2/9 on 4 December 1966. Fired 78 M16-T rds. of 106mm as H&I fires with unknown results.

3rd Platoon remained in Company CP and acted as reaction force for Camp J. J. CARROLL. Corporal T. L. McFARLAND 2116434 USMC WIA, superficial flesh wound in buttocks. Not Evacuated.

c. Cross country mobility considerably impaired due to poor trafficability of terrain.

d. At 041530H when L3/3 position was taken under enemy fire, Corporal T. L. McFARLAND with complete disregard for his own personal safety ran to his ONTOS in the face of hostile fire and began returning fire, thereby inspiring the other Marines of his section to take immediate action.

1stLt. R. F. PINION and 1stSgt. E. J. THOM administered first aid to wounded helicopter crewman.

1. Operations.

a. The Company Headquarters group with First and Third Platoons departed PHU-BAI on 22 December 1966 for "Operation Chinook" in THUA THIEN Province (YD5230). The company forward was placed in D/S of 3d Battalion, 26th Marines. On the evening of 22 December 1966 at 2230 the 3d Battalion, 26th Marines perimeter came under intense mortar and small arms attack, which lasted sporadically until 230600 December 1966. The Company suffered one (1) KIA (Third Platoon) and varying degrees of sharpnel/small arms damage to the wheel vehicles.

Assesment of damage. One M-35 sharpnel holes in body, water jacket broken, distributor wires cut; One M107A1 two flat tires, four (4) large sharpnel holes; One M422A1, flat tire, gas tank punctured, small arms hits; One M105 Trailer, sharpnel. The Company Forward came under OP CON 4th Marines on 251600 December 1966 when the Regiment Command group moved in. The Company Forward remained in the "Operation Chinook" area.

On 22 December 1966 the platoon departed PHU-BAI with Company "B" Forward to the "Operation Chinook" area. On the evening of 22 December 1966 the Heavy Section was placed in D/S of Company "I", 3d Battalion, 26th Marines and the Light Section in D/S of Company "L", 3d Battalion, 26th Marines, both on the defensive perimeter.

A Light Section patrol was also made on 23 December 1966 and 28 December 1966 between the same points. On 24 December 1966 the Light Section was attached to 2d Battalion, 26th Marines Headquarters group and two companies for movement to the "Operation" Chinook. The Heavy Section remained with one company of 2d Battalion, 26th Marines for security of the PHU-LOC area.

d. The Third Platoon moved with the Company Forward to "Operation Chinook" on 22 December 1966. On the evening of 22 December 1966 the platoon was placed in D/S of Company "M", 3d Battalion, 26th Marines on the defensive perimeter. During the ensuing action the platoon fired 29 rounds HEP-T, 75 rounds .50 spotter, and 600 rounds of .30 caliber at enemy positions. Results unknown. At 222300 one (1) KIA was suffered by the platoon from an accidental firing of a 106MM, when the loader was caught in the backblast area. The remainder of the period was spent on perimeter security.

Subj: After Action Report

1. At 1715 on 15 December 1966 a convoy from this Company was proceeding north on Liberty Road at coordinates 968598. The convoy composition was C-34 (1) M422, (1) M-37, followed by C-3-2. The convoy stretched about 200 meters. At 1715 an explosion was noted about 300 meters to the right of the convoy followed closely by an explosion on the left bank of C-34's guns. Less than 30 seconds later C-32 in the rear, heard an explosion on their left flank lifting their vehicle slightly. In all there were an estimated 4-5 explosions during a two minute time frame. (Later confirmed to be RPG-2 rockets by fire assembly found the next day near where 3-2 has situated). After the initial fire by the AT rockets, the whole left flank erupted in small arms and automatic fire pinning the convoy down. C-32, with the left gun bank knocked out of action and three WIA, proceeded up to hill 55 to receive medical aid for the wounded. At about the same time as the small arms and automatic fire started C-32 returned fire with 30 cal and six 106's. The lead vehicle which was now the M422 spotted 7 or 8 irregular dressed V.C. with weapons. The M422 occupants returned fire and the V.C. started disengaging, moving west. At approximately the same time C-32 saw an estimated 25-30 V.C. dressed in brown uniforms with camouflage helmets and weapons start to disengage. By this time 2 tanks moved down the road to C-32's position and began firing. C-32 continued to pursue by fire until its ammunition was exhausted. It had, by this time, expended 18 106's and 2,250 30 cal. The initial action was over by 1730. The artillery began firing and the 1/26 reaction force by this time began to arrive. The PC and "mite" continued up to hill 55 and at this time C-31 and C-34 (with a new crew) were back down on the road, providing a blocking force for the 1/26 sweep. They remained until 1845 at which time they returned to "G" Co C.P. Later reports from "C" Co, 1/26 reported seeing V.C. carrying off bodies and seeing (1) 106 round blowing 2 V.C. through the air. The S-3 of 1/26 gave the Ontos 3 confirmed kills and 6 probable.

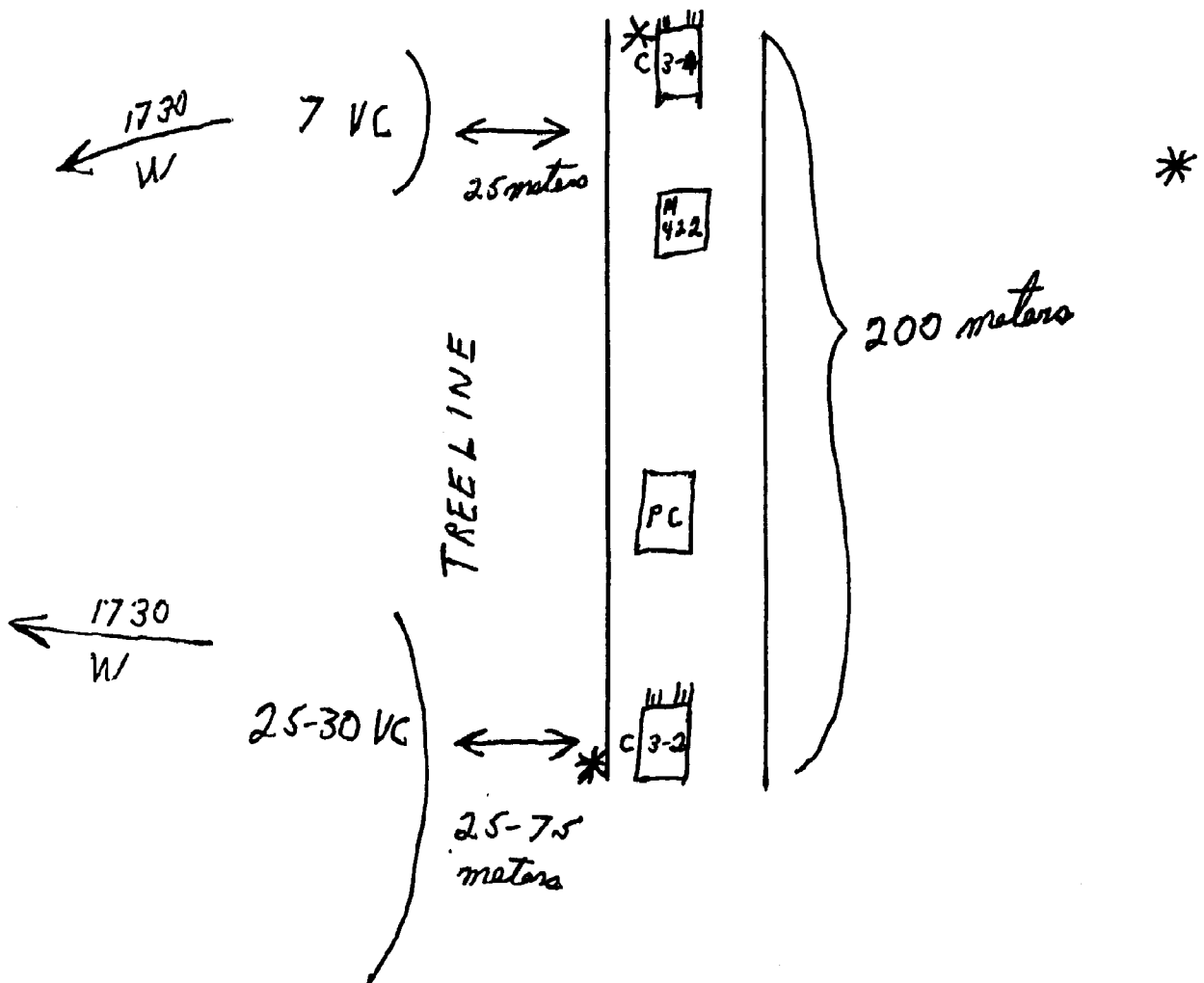
