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3. Intelligence(a) Viet Cong Mine Warfare

(1) During January the S-2 section continued to compile data on Viet Cong mine warfare. Data compiled to date indicates two patterns. In the eastern part of the Da Nang TAOR, most of the mine incidents have been booby trapped artillery rounds. These have been located on or adjacent to the MSR. In the western part of the Da Nang TAOR, incidents have primarily been mines and booby traps encountered in or around key hamlets. The number of mine incidents increased from forty incidents in December, to eighty four incidents in January. Viet Cong mine activity was of such intensity that by fourteen January mine incidents had reached the same level as December. A report of this activity was made to CG, 3rd Marine Division (SCI-2), on 14 January. A report of statistical data compiled during January is reported in Enclosure (2).

(2) In order to facilitate location of Viet Cong mines, a program was recommended to G-2, 3rd Marine Division, where by rewards would be given to those persons informing on the location of Viet Cong mines. The suggestion was made that a uniform system of rewards be established in each TAOR.

(3) In an effort to gather more information on Viet Cong mining techniques, arrangements were made through proper channels to have 3rd ITT interrogate all VC or VCS apprehended in the immediate area of mine incidents. A list of EEI's on Viet Cong mine warfare techniques (Enclosure 4) was forwarded to G-2 to help 3rd ITT in interrogating of suspects.

(b) Area Security & Surveillance. Area security and surveillance patrols furnished by 3rd Engineer Battalion required four hundred and sixty-five man hours patrolling during January. These patrols are conducted through grid squares AT-9475, AT-9575 and AT-9574. These patrols produced no positive contacts.

(c) Aerial Photographs. Two groups of aerial photographs (one group of verticles, 1:50,000 and one group of obliques, 1:25,000) were obtained during January. These photographs were secured for reconnaissance requirements along National Route #1, between the Chu Lai and Phu Bai enclaves.

(d) Counterintelligence. In connection with "TET" (Lunar New Year), the Government of Republic of Viet Nam instigated a program by which Viet Cong were encouraged to return to governmental control. A bulletin (Enclosure 3) was published to the battalion explaining participation and duties of Marines in connection with the program.

(e) Visitors. On 28 January, LtCol SCHRIEVER, assistant G-2 3rd Marine Division, made an informal visit to the S-2 section. The purpose of this visit was to familiarize the new G-2 chief with the intelligence activity in progress in this battalion and to familiarize the new G-2 chief with members of the S-2 section of 3rd Engineer Battalion.

(f) Intelligence Briefings. In addition to nightly briefings for the battalion officers, a program has been initiated to ensure dissemination of pertinent intelligence information to every level. Seven lectures were given for the five companies in 3rd Engineer Battalion. These lectures were approximately 45 minutes each. The S-2 Chief holds an intelligence briefing for the Staff NCO's weekly. All troops rotating from Viet Nam are given a debriefing lecture and all troops arriving in Viet Nam are oriented in the current intelligence picture.

(g) Training. Training was conducted in the following subjects:

- (1) Aerial Photograph Reconnaissance
- (2) Photo Interpretation
- (3) Orientation in Basic Map Study
- (4) Viet Cong Weapons
- (5) Viet Cong Mine Warfare Operations
- (6) Local Customs and Traditions

#### 4. Training

a. The battalion training program continued to be a combination of on-the-job-training and scheduled training. Weekly training schedules were published, but a large degree of flexibility was built into the scheduled training to prevent interference with operational requirements. One-half hour to one hour classes were conducted for all officers and staff non-commissioned officers three evenings per week. Troop Indoctrination was continued on an average of <sup>two</sup> class per week. Copies of Battalion Training Schedules are attached as enclosure (5).

b. The Mine Warfare and Demolitions School conducted by the battalion continued to instruct division personnel and non-division personnel in mines, demolitions, and boobytraps. This instruction was conducted by sending contact instructor teams to the units in addition to the formal school at the battalion school area. Special instruction is provided as requested, but the three primary courses are:

- (1) Course "A" - Infantry Personnel - US and VC mines, VC boobytraps, mine detection, and military explosives. Two day duration.
- (2) Course "B" - Engineer Personnel - US and VC mines, VC boobytraps, mine detection, and military explosives, minefield breaching. Two day duration.
- (3) Course "C" - Personnel Other than Infantry or Engineers - US and VC mines, VC boobytraps. One day duration.

## 5. Operations

### a. General

(1) During the month of January, the 3d Engineer Battalion remained in general support of the 3d Marine Division. The employment of the battalion in the DA NANG enclave fell into two categories: combat support and combat service support operations.

(2) Combat support operations consisted of providing mine detection and demolition teams in support of infantry "search and destroy" operations, and daily sweeps of MSR's for mines and boobytraps. In the DA NANG enclave, combat support was provided to six infantry battalions by companies "A" and "C", 3d Engineer Battalion. VC mine incident data is contained in enclosure (2). This support involved:

(a) 392 deliberate electronic detector sweeps of MSR segments.

(b) Support of 24 infantry "search and destroy" operations. Including Operations WAR BONNET, BIG LODGE, LONG LANCE, and GOLDEN SPIKE.

(c) 2,871 man days of effort in combat support operations.

(d) 43 incidents of enemy engagement requiring engineer support.

(e) Company "A" (-) (Rein) in support of 3d Marines Operation MALLARD.

(f) Visual sweeps, not of a deliberate nature, on the forward area MSR's on a daily basis.

(3) Combat service support of the 3d Marine Division fell into three major categories: roads and bridges, fortifications, and general construction. Company "A" and Company "C" were primarily committed to road and bridge construction in the 3d Marines TAOR and the 9th Marines TAOR respectively. Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion, was committed primarily to cutting and assisting division units in erection of MLR bunkers. Engineer Support Company provided normal vehicle equipment and construction support. All of the battalion units contributed to cantonment projects for eight 3d Marine Division organizations.

, b. Combat Support

(1) 1/1 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 1/1 TAOR was provided by the 2nd Platoon, Company "A", commanded by 1st Lieutenant O. SIEBER. The platoon was billeted within the supported units' area to enhance the support required. The 2nd Platoon had a daily average of twenty men supporting combat operations in the 1/1 TAOR. The platoon provided daily visual and deliberate mine detection sweeps of the 1/1 MSR from (AT-955715) south to (AT933466), near Hill 41. In addition to the daily requirement for mine sweeps of the MSR, the platoon provided close combat support for the battalion's "search and destroy" operations.

On 6 January 1966, an M-37 hit a mine vicinity of (AT938-687). During investigation of the incident, it was estimated the charge was 30-50 pounds of explosive and electrically detonated. The crater measured 12 feet in diameter and was 6 feet deep.

During the period 4-8 January 1966, twenty-eight engineers were employed in support of the battalion-size "search and destroy" operation, Operation LONG LANCE. It was during this operation that LCpl Robert A. BELL was WIA.

On 9 January 1966, the 2nd Platoon was redeployed to provide engineer support for Operation MALLARD. The platoon began conducting both day and night mine sweeps of Route 5 south of Hill 41 when the operation got underway. On 12 January 1966, the platoon found a 105mm shell placed in a culvert at (AT920-600). On 14 January 1966, an Engineer Battalion M-37 hit a mine vicinity (AT932623), PFC R. H. PEARLMAN was WIA in this incident. The crater measured 5 feet across and 2½ feet deep. The charge was estimated about 10 pounds. On the same day, another M-37 hit a similar mine in the same vicinity. The operation secured on 18 January 1966, and the 2nd Platoon was deployed in the 1/1 TAOR.

During the remainder of the month, the 2nd Platoon conducted daily visual and deliberate mine sweeps of Route 5 from the float bridge (AT946700) south to Hill 41 (AT934664). More detailed sweeps were started to locate mines and boobytraps. Daily searches were made of all bridges for explosives. Rice paddies were drug with hooks to locate possible electrical lead wires and observers were placed to watch activity on and adjacent to the road.

(2) 1/9 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 1/9 TAOR was provided by the 3rd Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 1st Lieutenant T. W. RODRIQUEZ, until 22 January 1966. On 23 January 1966, the 1st Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 1st Lieutenant M. J. CHUMER, was assigned combat engineer support responsibility

in the area. The platoons were billeted with units of 1/9 to shorten reaction time on requests for engineer support. An average of 24 men remained in support of 1/9 units throughout the month. The platoon was often split into 3-4 man teams, providing mine detection and demolition support to the infantry units on "search and destroy" operations, or mine sweeps of the routes of communication in the TAOR.

As in previous months, the mine sweeps of the MSR's were scheduled by the S-3, 1/9 in conjunction with the Engineer Platoon Commander. A total of 145 deliberate deliberate sweeps were made of the MSR.

On 7 January 1966, while conducting a mine sweep, an engineer team and infantry security detail were ambushed vicinity (BT083-607). During this ambush LCpl R. E. NELSON and two infantry Marines were KIA. Four VC were confirmed killed.

On 30 January 1966, a wooden mine containing about 15 pounds of explosive was found vicinity (BT067680). The mine was detected with the new P-153 mine detector. The only metal contained in the mine was in the firing device. The mine was rigged for electrical detonation, activated by an improvised pressure device.

(3) 2/9 TAOR. The 2nd Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2nd Lieutenant R. L. BENTLEY provided combat support in the 2/9 TAOR throughout the month of January. The number of engineers supporting 2/9 combat operations averaged 22 men during the month. Teams of 3-8 men were located with the forward units to support, assist in "search and destroy" operations, and conduct daily mine sweeps of the MSR's. The platoon conducted 101 deliberate sweeps of the MSR, involving 14 VC incidents.

On 21 January 1966, a mine sweep team found one AT mine (US type) M1A1 at (AT979624) while conducting a routine deliberate sweep. The mine was found using the new P-153 mine detector. It was buried three inches below the surface.

It was on 24 January 1966, that Pvt W. H. WALLS was KIA by a 60mm mortar vicinity (BT033640) while a member of the engineer team providing combat support.

The remainder of the combat engineer support was routine, but significant in that large amounts of ordnance and VC fortifications were destroyed. The following is a summary:

(4) 3/3 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 3/3 TAOR was provided by the 4th Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 1st Lieutenant J. F. BRENNAN. The number of engineers supporting combat operations of the battalion averaged fifteen men throughout the month. Teams of 4-6 men were located with units of 3/3 on Hill 22, Hill 55, and at AN TRACH (1) (AT968664). The Lateral Road from YEN NE (1) (AT987663) to LE SON (1) (AT980662) and the access road from Route 5 to Hill 22 were swept for mines daily. In addition, the teams accompanied patrols and supported "search and destroy" operations as required in the 3/3 TAOR.

There was high concentration of boobytraps in the 3/3 TAOR during January. Seven boobytraps were detected by engineer personnel and disarmed or destroyed before causing casualties. Two of the boobytraps were unique in that the method of employment had not been previously encountered.

On 24 January 1966, an engineer mine sweep team detected a 155mm round rigged for controlled detonation vicinity (AT955664). The shell was found with a P-153 mine detector on a routine deliberate sweep from (AT943663) to (AT955664). The artillery fuze had been removed and an electric blasting cap inserted, held in place with candle wax. The shell was wrapped in a sheet of plastic. Electric lead wires ran from the shell to a nearby tree line.

The second significant boobytrap was found on 26 January 1966, Vicinity coordinates (AT955664), an area where numerous boobytraps and mines have been found, and where an engineer was killed by a trip-wired grenade in December. The team noticed a number of suspicious signs. A piece of communications wire lead away from a patch of fresh earth, and several feet away, a piece of broken bamboo forming a "V" pointed toward the fresh earth. The team proceeded using a P-153 mine detector until a loud reading was obtained. While uncovering the device and checking for antilift devices, it was discovered that the device was rigged to go off if the bamboo were removed. Further examination revealed that the device consisted of two M-26 grenades, with pins removed, resting with the spoons under them. The grenades were held down by a short section of bamboo. The pressure of the bamboo and earth cover prevented the grenades from kicking off the spoons and exploding. A wire was tied to the short piece of comm wire attached to the bamboo, and at a safe distance the team pulled the bamboo free. The grenades sprung into the air as the spoon kicked free and they exploded. A drawing of the device is enclosed as enclosure (7).

(5) Operation MALLARD. During the period 5-18 January 1966, Company "A" (-) (Rein) and the 3rd Platoon, Company "C", 1st Engineer Battalion provided combat engineer support of the 3d Marines Regimental size operation in the southwest sector of the DA NANG TAOR. The 1st Platoon, Company "A", 3d Engineer Battalion and the 3d Platoon, Company "C", 1st Engineer Battalion provided close combat engineer support for 1/3 and 3/7, respectively. Company "A" (-) remained in general support of the operation, providing mine sweep teams and maintenance crews on the MSR. The "A" Company CP, commanded by Captain L. L. O'LAUGHLIN was located with the Regimental CP on Hill 65. A water point was established within the Logistical Supply Area on Hill 41.

On 5 January 1966, men and equipment were moved to Hill 41 to begin improving Route 5 south from that point. During the period 5-9 January 1966, the road was opened between DU YEN SON (1) (AT943663) and AN MY (3) (AT926607) in preparation for moving infantry forces south to Hill 65. This road extended through a previously uncontrolled area. The task required:

- (a) Installation of 10 culverts.
- (b) Assembly of nine 24 foot sections of culvert for emergency use.
- (c) Hauling and spreading 240 cubic yards of fill to repair the road surface.

During the period, two culverts were destroyed by the VC using demolitions. The culverts were hastily replaced with little interruption to traffic. Engineer personnel staged on Hill 41 assisted in night defense of the ISA.

On 9 January 1966, the 2nd Platoon, Company "A" moved to the vicinity of AN MY (3) (AT926607) with the mission of installing four bridges south of that point. An M4T6 fixed-span bridge was installed at (AT924606) and the platoon's engineer support area established at the bridge, to facilitate night defense of the bridge. Beginning on 10 January, the platoon began patrols and mine sweeps of the MSR on a continuous basis.

From 11-17 January 1966, the MSR was continually swept for mines. In addition, engineer road maintenance teams were dispatched from the 3d Engineer Battalion CP on a daily basis to improve Route 5 from the float bridge (AT946700) south to Hill 65, (AT878576) approximately 16.5 kilometers. Fill was hauled from Hill 41 to improve bridge approaches and soft areas in the road damaged by heavy traffic. During the period of the operation, over 2,000 additional cubic yards of fill material was hauled and spread on the road, and five additional culverts and

bridges were improved to make Route 5 more trafficable.

The engineer water point supporting the operation from Hill 41 distributed 20,300 gallons of potable water. An improvised shower facility was set up and operated during the operation.

Retraction from the operation began the morning of 17 January 1966. The engineer company returned to the battalion area at 180145H January 1966.

The after action report submitted by 1st Lieutenant B. M. RANTA, Platoon Leader, 1st Platoon, Company "A", which was attached to 1/3 during Operation MALLARD indicated the following ordnance and fortifications were destroyed:

(6) Miscellaneous. During January, engineers supported several "search and destroy" operations conducted by units of the 3d Marine Division. On 3-4 January, thirty engineers supported Operation WAR BONNET. On 5-6 January, thirteen men provided demolitions support of the CAM NE (AT980690) clearance operation. From 15-17 January, forty engineers provided mine detection and demolitions support of Operation BIG LODGE. Beginning on 21 January and throughout the rest of the month, two engineer platoons remained in support of Operation DOUBLE EAGLE, being conducted outside the DA NANG enclave.

c. Combat Service Support

(1) Roads and Bridges

(a) Route 1C (2/9 MSR). This road is built on a railroad bed extending from the SONG CAU DO River (AT999701) south to YEN NE (1) (AT987663), a total of 3.3 kilometers. Because of the good foundation, little work was required on the road. About 30 cubic yards of fill was spread on the road during the month. Periodic grading and shaping of the road was done as required. One culvert was installed at an access point to Route 1C. A new treadway was placed between the railroad tracks on the SONG CAU DO Bridge.

(b) Route 6. The HOA CAM Road from ASP #1 (AT992-733) to the intersection of Route 5 at the floating bridge (AT-947701), a distance of 6.5 kilometers. Efforts to improve the road continued during the month. As during December, the dryer weather offered the opportunity to raise the road level in areas that had been flooded during November. Ditches were improved, culverts installed and headwalls built, and the road raised and widened. During the month over 2,400 cubic yards of fill was hauled and spread on the road. The fill was hauled an average distance of one kilometer.

(c) 1/1 CP Access Road from the junction on Route 6 (AT954714) past the 1/1 CP to (AT937720), a distance of 1.2 kilometers. Attempts to get this road back in shape after the seasonal rains were extensive. Many areas had become completely

saturated, offering no base for the road. To bypass one section of the existing road, which apparently passed over a spring, a new road was cut about 600 meters long. Two additional culverts were installed and 2,800 cubic yards of fill were hauled and spread on the road during January. The majority of the fill was hauled 2.5 kilometers. The trafficability of the road was considerably improved during January.

(d) Route 5. Major efforts were made on Route 5, which is 24.3 kilometers in length, during January. The portion from the float bridge (AT947700) south beyond Hills 41 and 22 was concentrated on during Operation MALLARD from 5-17 January 1966 as previously described. From 19 January throughout the remainder of the month, efforts were concentrated on the road from the junction with Route 4 (AT912743) south to (AT935715). On this northern portion of the road, plans were made to improve it to a Class 60 road. Several small concrete slab bridges were replaced with 36" culverts and 775 cubic yards of fill hauled over 1.6 kilometers and spread on the badly rutted areas. Initial shaping of the road was accomplished. By the end of January progress was well under way to begin widening and raising the entire road. Plans to reinforce two thirty-foot span bridges were made.

(e) Route 4. DAI LA PASS (AT940753) to (AT925-742), 3.2 kilometers. With the advent of drier weather, this road became more trafficable. During January 158 cubic yards of rock and 635 cubic yards of fill, hauled about .2 kilometers was spread over an area that had previously been impassable at (AT926742). In addition, the ditches and shape of the road were improved to allow for better drainage. Except for brief periods of heavy rains during January, the road was easily passable to traffic of all types.

(f) Other Roads. Throughout the month of January, the urgency of road work was less as the monsoon abated. All responsible roads were open to traffic throughout the month. Continued grading and ditching have kept the roads in satisfactory condition.

## (2) Fortifications

(a) Division CP Bunker. On 12 January 1966, work was initiated to construct a parking area below the CP bunker. Initial survey work of the area indicated that the only feasible plan was to put in a two-terrace parking lot. Even by terracing the lot, an extensive fill operation was required. Over 3,400 cubic yards of fill was hauled, spread, and compacted to terrace two parking areas totaling over 18,000 square feet of parking space. By the end of the month, the lots were very close to grade and plans were made to surface the areas with rock and bituminous material.

(b) MLR Bunker Program. This project, assigned to Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion, consists of cutting and erecting bunkers in four standard sizes. During the first weeks of January, the priority of the program was erection of previously cut bunkers for division units. About the middle of the month, new allocations were authorized and cutting of bunker materials on a full scale got underway again.

During the month, materials for 59-8x8 bunkers and 15-12x24 bunkers were cut. A total of 48 bunkers were issued to division units; 26-8x8's, 3-8x12's, and 19-12x24's. The engineer teams sent to units receiving bunkers assisted in erecting; 34-8x8's, 3-8x12's and 10-20x30 bunkers during January.

A recapitulation of the bunker program at the end of January indicated the following totals to date:

(c) River Barriers. A need to control boat traffic on rivers in the TAOR continues. Three previously constructed barriers, having proved effective, influenced construction of a similiar barrier on the SONG VINH DIEN River vicinity (BTO32648). A photograph of the barrier is shown in enclosure (8). The project required 600 man hours to complete.

(d) Marble Mountain Airfield Barrier. During January, engineers were called upon to relocate the south perimeter of the minefield barrier. The project began on 10 January and was completed on 17 January 1966, requiring removal and relaying of 1800 meters of minefield. The barrier was originally installed during November 1965.

(e) Field Fortifications. Engineer teams supporting infantry units in the 3d Marines and 9th Marines TAOR's assisted in erection of barbed wire entanglements, bunkers, and other fortifications upon request.

(3) General Construction. The 3d Engineer Battalion Cantonment Program continued throughout the month of January. Projects involving precutting and assisting in construction of strongbacks for 3d Marines, 2/9, and 12th Marines were completed. In addition, construction began on galleys and shower buildings for six division organizations. During January, a shower building and galley was completed for 9th MT Bn; and concrete decks were

poured for the 1st AMTRAC Bn and 3d MT Bn shower buildings and the 3d MT Bn galley. In conjunction with the program, heads and screened enclosures were provided the organizations as requested. Twelve 8-hole heads with enclosures, three 4-hole heads with enclosures and four 1-hole heads were cut, prefabbed and erected during the month. Also completed during the month were 42-eight man mess tables and 10 galley work tables for division units' messing facilities.

The Construction Platoon cut and prefabbed file boxes, desks, and shelves for the Division Staff Sections. Also during January, 440 mount-out boxes were cut, fabricated and issued to 3d Marines units.

A permanent railroad crossing for tracked vehicles was constructed at (AT931836) during 24-26 January 1966. The project consisted of pouring 3-foot wide concrete ramps on each side of the railroad, high enough to allow the tracks of tanks and AMTRACS to clear the rails. Arrangements were made with the National Railroad to remove sections of track from three locations to permit vehicular traffic.

## 6. Communications

a. The Battalion Command Net continued to provide operational communications with units of Companies "A" and "C" when operating away from the battalion area. The net consisted of one AN/PRC-47 with a modified antenna at the Battalion CP, one AN/MRC-83 with Company "A" and two with Company "C". It was also used at specified times during each day to pass administrative traffic to Company "B", 3d Engineer Battalion and Company "C", 1st Engineer Battalion, both at CHU LAI. Each of these companies is equipped with an AN/MRC-83. No technical difficulties were encountered in the operation of the net with AN/MRC-83 and AN/PRC-47 radios.

b. During Operation MALLARD, 5-18 January, two AN/MRC-83's provided communications with "A" Company during support of this 3d Marines "search and destroy" operation. One AN/MRC-83 from "A" Company was employed to provide immediate communications with the Battalion CP. The maximum straight-line distance involved was approximately 12 miles. The net proved satisfactory under these conditions. Additional communications were provided for convoys. These were used to report traffic and road conditions for Support Company, 3d Engineer Battalion convoys. These proved satisfactory and alleviated much of the existing traffic confusion.

c. The helicopter courier service was utilized for intra-division message traffic.

7. Logistica. Supply/Material

(1) Supply activity during the month of January centered around aggressive follow up to outstanding requisitions. Enclosure (9) reflects the status of supply as of 31 January 1966. Enclosure (10) reflects the outstanding combat essential end items on requisition. Enclosure (11) was submitted on 25 January in an effort to generate a positive response to selected outstanding requisitions. Other correspondence was similarly initiated on critical material requirements.

(2) Thirty-five (35) P-153 Mine Detectors were received during the month as replacement items for the AN/PRS-3 mine detector. The capabilities of the new items far exceed the ones replaced. In addition a number of replacement items were received including five (5) chain saws, two (2) 55GPM pumps, two (2) R&E M-172 low/bed trailers, two (2) 125 air compressors, self propelled, one (1) TD-15, tractors, and (2) 20KW generators.

(3) The battalion continued its logistic support of engineer units at the Chu Lai enclave by shipping water purification equipment, water supply chemicals, pre-cut bunkers and lumber on several occasions throughout the month.

(4) On 13 January 1966, this command was advised of the contents of a COMUSMACV (070630Z Jan 66) restricting the local procurement of lumber, cement and corrugated metal. The effect of this message curtailed construction projects. A source of a substitute asbestos fiber corrugated roofing has been subsequently located and work will continue.

(5) A 1500 gallon steel water tank for truck mounting was procured locally to haul water to isolated units. A 5,000 gallon steel water storage tank was procured on 13 January for replacement of 3000 gallon nylon tanks, which are critically required in forward water points. The nylon tanks are in short supply.

(6) Transit mix concrete was obtained from MCB-5 for pouring of the battalion butler building maintenance facility, and also a number of cantonment shower and galley projects.

(7) MC-2 asphalt (500 drums) was procured for future use in battalion dust control and road construction programs. The drums were transported from MCB-5 to this organization by organic low/beds.

(8) three separate actions were initiated in an endeavor to widen the battalion's counter mine warfare capabilities. These included requests for longer mine probes, three (3) M141 line charges, and a truck mounted mine detector. Eleven (11) probes, of 18", 24", and 30" in length were received on 29 January, and are currently in use.

(9) Preliminary activity in preparation for the Commanding Generals inspection February took place. During the closing days of January, all areas of logistical operations were reviewed for procedural and operational correction.

(10) Phase over of the division operated lumber yard to FLSG began during the month with the arrival in-country of new lumber stocks. These materials are being picked up on Fleet Stock Account records since they are being shipped to ANC-2. This will relieve the engineer battalion of a supply function, the receiving and accounting of all lumber materials for Marine Units in VietNam. The division stocks on hand are being depleted as bunker construction continues.

(11) A total of 330 sections of culvert were received during the month of January. Heavy use was made during Operation Mallard conducted over the same period, and various road improvement projects. The total expended during the month amounted to 566 sections.

b. Maintenance

(1) The operational status of battalion combat equipment status rose to nearly 74% by the end of the month. Sixty-three percent of all battalion deadlined equipment is at the third echelon maintenance level. While repair parts availability has improved at the second echelon level on certain items, there still remains a dearth of parts at the third echelon level.

(2) Enclosure (12) reflects the operational equipment status during the month for the Da Nang enclave only.

(3) Mr Arthur MAEDER of International Harvester Corporation and Mr James SCHROEDER of Drott Manufacturing Corporation continued their study into problems associated with the TD-15 Crawler Tractor. Their itinerary included visual inspections of tractors, on-the-spot and programed instruction for operators and mechanics. Specialized instruction for equipment mechanics at FLSG/FLSU was also given. They also conducted these activities at Chu Lai during the period 18 to 28 January. Their ETD Da Nang

for 3d FSR, Okinawa is expected to be 6 February 1966. Enclosures (13) and (14), reflect the subject matter of the instruction given. The activities of the technical representatives in support of all division units were programmed by this organization. A final report will be submitted to the CG III MAF via the CG 3d Marine Division.

c. Food Services

(1) Approximately 43,307 meals were served during the month of January as follows:

- (a) 10% MGI
- (b) 63% "A" Rations
- (c) 27% "B" Rations

(2) The frequency of "A" rations has continued to increase. The quality food has been excellent.

(3) A new refuse facility was constructed during the month improving outside sanitation standards considerably.

d. Police

(1) The battalion police was carried out by the battalion maintenance section in the routine manner. Minor area improvement projects were underway throughout the month.

e. Ordnance

(1) Enclosure (15) denotes the expenditures of class V during the month.

(2) Numerous inspections of individual and crew served weapons were conducted. Close supervision is mandatory on the care and cleaning of weapons due to the climatic conditions prevalent in RVN.

f. Facilities

(1) Camp improvement continued throughout the month.

(a) The battalion cantonment shower facility was completed.

(b) The battalion butler building maintenance facility was completed. Occupancy was delayed until after 1 February to allow the concrete deck to cure.

(c) A wood preservation program was initiated consisting of painting all exterior wood with a mixture of diesel oil and asphalt.

g. Roads and Grounds

(1) Extensive organic road rebuilding was accomplished. Fill was hauled and culvert installation was initiated with the advent of improved weather conditions, considerable improvement of the intra-battalion road net was gained.

(2) Near the end of the month work began on improving the motor transport and heavy equipment lot. This involved hauling fill and the installation of a combination ditch and culvert drainage system.

h. Medical

(1) A total of 772 personnel were treated in the Battalion Aid Station during the month of January. The treatments were generally for skin afflictions, lacerations, contusions and sprains.

i. Fiscal

(1) Enclosure (16) reflects the battalion's fiscal obligations through 18 January 1966.

**8. Civil Affairs**

During January, two events highlighted the 3rd Engineer Battalion civic action programs.

On 15 January, a party to celebrate "TET" was held in the hamlet of Da Son, Hoa Khan village. The party included a concert by the Division Band. After the concert, two thousand pounds of food, toys and candy were distributed to the people of the hamlet. Approximately one hundred and fifty pounds of clothing were distributed. Eight gallons of paint were presented to the school master for the hamlet school. The party was attended by approximately 200 persons.

12 January produced the first tangible evidence of a project initiated in November. The project to build a dispensary in Da Son began with requisitioning material through proper GVN channels. On 12 January a working party of Marines and villagers began site preparation for a 20x40 foot dispensary. This facility will provide a much needed medical facility in the hamlet of Da Son.

A statistical breakdown of civic action activity is included as Enclosure (17).

9. Legal

During the month of January, legal activity within 3rd Engineer Battalion was as follows:



On 14 February, a Co "A", 3d Engineer Battalion sweep team using a P-153 mine detector located a 155 mm round buried in the road at AT943668. The round, wrapped in a sheet of brown plastic, was buried about 6 to 8 inches under the roadway on the West side. The artillery fuse had been removed; two instantaneous detonation pull friction fuses inserted and sealed with wax. From the rings on the fuses, wires were stretched across a hole about 14 inches deep to bamboo stakes in each corner. The hole and wires were covered with bamboo matting and then covered with about 3 inches of earth. A vehicle driving across would have caved in the matting and pulled the fuses.

Two dummy wires, simulating electric priming, led from the wax seal to the edge of the road. They were not attached to the blasting caps.

The boobytrap was disarmed by EOD personnel and recovered for training purposes. Photographs of the disarming and recovery are contained on the next page.

e. A post-training report will be submitted to the S-3 by 1800 7 Feb 1966, listing the topic and number of personnel attending troop indoctrination briefings.





  - e. Providing lesson plan forms.
  - f. Provide lesson plans on certain subjects.
  - g. Providing tests for Map Reading.

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
