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## Part B: Summary of Significant Events:

1. Personnel.

a. The strength of the battalion was decreased by a total of 330 during the month as follows:

(1) Gains: 32 (2 MC Off; 26 MC Enl; 1 Navy Off; 3 Navy Enl)

(2) Losses: 362

(a) Battle: 6 (1 Off WIA; 2 Enl KIA; 3 Enl WIA)

(b) Non-Battle: 5 (Includes 1 death)

(c) Administrative: 351 (Go "A" & "C" 1stEngrBn returned to control of 1st Marine Division)

b. A shortage of personnel exists in the following ranks:

7, Captains; 4, WOs; 2, 1st Sgts.

On 1 April Companies "A" & "C", 1st Engineer Battalion returned to control of 1st Marine Division. Capt R. J. GADWILL and 1stLt M. J. CHUMER departed on PCS orders to CONUS. Capt C. D. FREY and CWO-2 P. A. DEAN joined the battalion; they were assigned duties as Assistant S-3 and Battalion Supply Officer, respectively.

On 2 April 1stLts J. W. NICHOLS and I. E. PISTELLI departed on PCS orders to CONUS. LCpl D. E. YOUNG was KIA and LCpl R. L. ROSE was WIA from small arms fire while making a helicopter landing with 1/3 on Operation ORANGE.

On 3 April Memorial Services were conducted by Chaplain BROWN at the 3d Engineer Bn for PFC J. R. TOWATER. Sgt W. F. HUGHSON was WIA.

On 4 April 1stLt J. A. STRALEY departed on PCS orders to CONUS.

On 5 April 2ndLt R. K. CULLERS joined the battalion and was assigned to Company "B" for duty. 1stLt H. A. TOMPKINS, Jr., departed on PCS orders to CONUS.

On 6 April LCpl J. F. MATHENY departed on emergency leave to CONUS.

On 7 April LCdr T. A. KENNY reported aboard for duty as Battalion Chaplain.

On 8 April PFC G. M. RADFORD was killed in an accident while driving a forklift.

On 10 April LCpl P. G. MCGREW returned from hospitalization as the result of wounds. Major R. B. MCCLAUGHLIN was transferred to HqBn for duty.

On 12 April LCpl P. L. SHINNEMAN was WIA as a result of a boobytrapped

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artillery round while on a sweep with 3/3.

On 16 April Sgt J. E. PROMMERSBERGER was KIA and Cpl R. B. CHAVEZ, LCpl F. L. SMITH, and PFC F. G. WHITE were WIA as result of mortar fire while in defensive positions with 2/9.

On 18 April Captain C. D. FREY was WIA as result of a trip flare device while on recon with A-1/11.

On 22 April Sgt W. R. CAMP and Cpl J. O. LUJAN departed on PCS orders in connection with emergency leave.

On 25 April SSgt R. BORING departed on PCS order in connection with emergency leave. LCpl KINSER departed on emergency leave to CONUS.

The following awards were made during the month: 18, Purple Heart Medals; 17, Meritorious Masts; 2, Letters of Appreciation.

The following recommendations for awards were submitted during the month: 1 Silver Star Medal; 2, Bronze Star Medals; 5, Navy Commendation Medals.

The following promotions were effected: 1 to SSgt; 40 to Cpl; 79 to LCpl; 22 to PFC.

## 2. Administration.

- a. The Battalion Promotion Board met on 9 April 1966.
- b. The Augmented Mess Board met on 27 April 1966.
- c. A debriefing was held 29 April 1966 for all personnel departing as part of May Rotation Draft.
- d. The Battalion published the following orders during the month of April.

- e. Career Advisory figures for the past three months reflect 100% reenlistment rate. This is attributed to a vigorous and productive reenlistment program within this battalion.

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### 3. Intelligence

a. The S-2 officer continued the practice of nightly intelligence briefings for battalion officers. The S-2 chief provided an intelligence briefing for the Staff NCO's on a weekly basis, and one briefing was held for the troops. In addition to briefings, classes were conducted for the companies. These classes covered security procedure, security clearances, local customs, and monetary exchange policies.

b. Operational requirements during the month necessitated several aerial reconnaissance missions. Photographs of the routes to the AN HOA industrial complex were requested on 1 April. Service was good and the photos were received on 4 April. Visual reconnaissance was made of National Route #1 in conjunction with operation ROUGHRIDER. On 6 April a route reconnaissance made by 7th Engineer Battalion was duplicated for use by 3rd Engineer Battalion. Of particular value were photographs and data on bridges. Current aerial photographs were requested of National Route #1 north of HUE and of National Route #9, on 29 April. At the same time extensive coverage was requested for areas along National Route #14. These photos are to be used in planning engineer requirements for projects likely to be assigned to 3rd Engineer Battalion.

c. Due to increased activity and civil unrest, security measures were tightened. Liaison was made with the local village chief and hamlet chief in an effort to better control the neighboring populace. On the 19th of April and again on the 21st of April, visits were made to the HOA VANG district chief. The first visit was to obtain Vietnamese military security for one engineer water point. This was necessary to control Vietnamese civilians who were continually gathering at the water point. The visit on 21 April was to request assistance in controlling unfamiliar Vietnamese Nationals gathering in the market place and hamlet near the battalion area.

d. Analysis of Viet Cong mine techniques continued. Mine incidents for April dropped. As compared to 180 incidents reported in March, only 150 were reported during April. It was also noted that a far greater percentage of mines and boobytraps were detected and destroyed than in past months. The locations and types of mine incidents are included as enclosure (2). On 2 April a member of 3d ITT visited the battalion with information in response to EEI's which had been submitted by 3d Engineer Battalion on Viet Cong mine warfare. This information, obtained by 3d ITT through interrogation of VC prisoners, did not appreciably add anything new to the data already compiled. A report on Viet Cong marking devices was forwarded on 8 April to Commanding General, 3d Marine Division. Several new types of mine detonating devices were obtained for Mine Warfare and Demolitions School.

e. The S-2 section continued to collect data on VC tunnel activities. See paragraph 5.b. (9), operations.

f. A VCS was apprehended on 9 April in the vicinity of 3d Engineer Battalion equipment lot. The suspect was a boy about fifteen years old,

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who had burns covering a large part of his body. He was treated in the battalion aid station. Interrogation by 3rd ITT revealed that the boy was not Viet Cong.

g. On 21 April two officers from 3rd Tank Battalion were given a special briefing on antitank mine warfare conducted by the Viet Cong. Incidents in the DA NANG area were discussed and information on marking devices was provided. A special tour and instruction in the Mine Warfare and Demolition School was arranged.

h. During April, CySgt F. C. LINDSAY Battalion Intelligence Chief, attended the 4-week Vietnamese language school at Fort Buckner, Okinawa. This added a significant capability to the Civil Affairs program, as well as, the intelligence capabilities of the command.

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4. Training

a. Emphasis continued on training personnel within the battalion. MOS training was conducted primarily on the job but certain specialized skills received more formal training. GMS training was conducted for the most part outside of working hours or at job sites while waiting for transportation or materials. Officers and Staff non-commissioned officers received instruction of one-half hour to one hour three evenings each week. Battalion Training Schedules are attached as ENCLOSURE (3).

b. In compliance with Division Orders 1510.3 and 7000.3A, newly arrived personnel received troop indoctrination and lectures on the monetary systems in the REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM. In addition, lectures were conducted weekly at company level on current events and on topics of troop indoctrination.

c. Three enlisted personnel, MOS 1372, attended refresher training in ADM at CAMP HAGUE, OKINAWA, 11 - 22 April.

d. The Division Mine Warfare and Demolitions School, conducted by the battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, demolitions, and boobytraps. This instruction was conducted by contact instructor teams and by resident courses in the battalion school area. The following is a recapitulation of the training conducted by Mine Warfare and Demolitions School during April:

(1) A Contact Instructor Team was deployed to MASS-2 on 14 April and taught 60 personnel, to HqBn on 18 April and taught 85, to 1st AMTRACBn on 22 April and taught 206, and on 28 April taught 25 personnel at 3d Shore Party Battalion, to 3d Recon Bn on 2 April and taught 50. Total trained by contact teams: 426.

e. The Generator Operators School trained two personnel from 3d Antitank Battalion during 13-20 April. This course was designed for the specific needs of the unit, covering only PU 239, PU 482, and 60KW generators.

f. The two four-man tunnel teams continued to train in their specialty. The officer-in-charge, 2dLt K. WILSON, attended and participated in division seminar on use of Riot Control Agents and tunnel team equipment on 22 April 1966. See 7a (7) Logistics.

g. GySgt F. C. LINDSAY attended the Vietnamese Language Course at SUKIRAN Army Language Center, Fort BUCKNER, OKINAWA, 4 - 29 April.

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5. Operations

a. General. During April, the 3d Engineer Battalion (Reinforced) remained in general support of the 3d Marine Division. On 1 April, Company "B" (Reinforced) at PHU BAI was chopped to Opcon of the 3d Engineer Battalion. Employment of the battalion was in the following three categories: combat support, combat service support, and provisional rifle unit operations.

(1) Combat support operations consisted of providing mine detection and demolitions teams in support of infantry "search and destroy" operations, daily sweeps of MSR's for mines and boobytraps, and engineer support of convoys traveling to and from PHU BAI. In the DA NANG enclave, combat support was provided to five infantry TAOR's by Companies "A" and "C" and in the PHU BAI enclave to three infantry TAOR's by Company "B". VC mine incidents data, obtained during the month, was recorded by the S-2 and is contained in enclosure (2). The combat support provided involved:

(a) A total of 460 deliberate electronic mine detector sweeps of MSR segments. Daily average distance swept was 22.6 kilometers.

(b) A total of 124 visual sweeps. Daily average distance was 4.8 kilometers.

(c) Excluding minefield clearances, <sup>there were</sup> six incidents that required engineer effort during deliberate mine sweeps. See paragraph 3, Intelligence.

(d) Total ordnance destroyed by combat engineers is recorded in enclosure (4).

(e) Support of over 22 infantry "search and destroy" operations.

(f) Support of six convoys, Operation ROUGHRIDER North, to PHU BAI.

(g) Support of Operation ORANGE, (See subparagraph (4) 1/3 TAOR), Operation VIRGINIA (See subparagraph (1) 1/1 TAOR), and Operation GEORGIA (See subparagraph (9)). The Commanding Officer or his representatives visited the engineer elements on each operation.

(2) Combat service support of the 3d Marine Division was of three categories; roads and bridges, fortifications, and general construction. Companies "A", "B", and "C", assisted by Engineer Support Company, were committed to road construction in the 3d Marines TAOR, 4th Marines TAOR, and 9th Marines TAOR. Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion, was primarily employed in cutting MIR bunkers and assisting units in the creation of bunkers. Most general construction projects were accomplished by Engineer Support Company. Water points and shower units were under the operation of Engineer Support Company.

(3) A provisional infantry unit was employed as part of a provisional infantry platoon in the Marble Mountain Air Facilities defense. This unit, consisting of one officer, seventeen combat engineers, and one corpsman, was located near the hamlet of XOM DA ME, west of the air facilities.

b. Combat Support

(1) 1/1 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 1/1 TAOR was provided by the 1st Platoon, Company "B", commanded by 1st Lt R. S. VANSTICKLE. A four-man sweep team was billeted at the 1/1 CP in order to better perform its MSR sweep mission. Daily the MSR from National Route #1 (YD819183) to (YD809164) was swept deliberately using electronic detectors. No mines or evidence of mining activity was found. One officer and seventeen combat engineers provided close combat support to 1/1 for Operation VIRGINIA, 12-30 April. On 25 April, these engineers were augmented by another engineer officer and a division photographer in order to conduct a road reconnaissance of National Route #9 from KHE SANH (XD845380) to DONG HA (YD240608).

(2) 2/1 TAOR. General Combat engineer support was provided by Company "B". A two-man sweep team daily conducted deliberate sweeps from (YD855101) to (YD862124). No mine incidents occurred during April. Four engineers were deployed on 30 April with Company "H" for a "search and destroy" operation.

(3) 1/4 TAOR. Combat engineer support was provided to 1/4 by four combat engineers until 22 April when the 3d Platoon, commanded by SSgt F. L. MIGLIORINI, was deployed to the unit. These thirty engineers were then billeted with the battalion in order to provide quicker response and during the period conducted various sweeps, but not on a daily basis. In addition they assisted 1/4 in improving field fortifications.

(4) 1/3 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 1/3 TAOR was provided by the 2nd Platoon, Company "A", commanded by 2nd Lt. G. H. WALLS, Jr. On 1 April, one officer and twenty-five enlisted departed the DA NANG enclave on Operation ORANGE. Sixteen of these engineers conducted a deliberate sweep of the airfield at DAI AN (ZC150539). On 4 April, twelve additional men from Company "A" staged at 1/3 CP for Operation ORANGE. Company "C" 3d Engineer Battalion had three combat engineers accompany I-3/3 and three others L-3/3 on Operation ORANGE. The twelve additional engineers departed for Operation ORANGE on 5 April, bringing the totals to one officer and thirty-four enlisted (Two WIA's and one KIA had been returned) from Company "A" and six engineers from Company "C". During 4-7 April the 3-man demo/ team with I-3/3 destroyed six bunkers, twenty-seven tunnels of varying sizes and twenty-one shelters associated with trenches. 8 April, one team officer, team leaders from each of the two tunnel teams, and an instructor from Mine Warfare and Demolitions School visited Operation ORANGE to observe destruction of tunnels. One officer and twenty-one enlisted returned from Operation ORANGE on 10 April and the remainder of the engineer personnel the next day. On 18 April following a VC attack on A-1/11 and K-4/12 positions, a four-man team began daily deliberate mine sweeps of Route 33 (AP936791-909783). At 0730 a 7th Engineer Battalion MRS-200 detonated a mine at

(AT929795) and later the sweep team located at (AT920794) a 20-pound mine with pressure-electric firing device. On 20 April, the daily sweeps of Route 33 were adjusted to cover (AT920793-945787). A special deliberate sweep was conducted of an island centered at (AT925840) on 23 April and the following day at Route 2 (AT875762-860736-866737). The four-man sweep team was billeted in the 1/3 TAOR with A-1/11 to provide better response to sweep needs.

(5) 2/3 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 2/3 TAOR was provided by 1st Platoon, Company "A", commanded by 2dLt W. B. ST JOHN Jr. The platoon had nine men billeted at Hill 41 and twelve men at SIERRA to enhance its support capability. An average of eighteen of these engineers daily conducted both visual and deliberate mine detection sweeps of Route 5, south of the float bridge at (AT946998) to (AT944663), and branch roads (AT943688-936687), and (AT944663-935667). On 5 April a sweep team found a detonated boobytrap which had been set off by a cow at (AT944670). Because the sweep team lives in the area and had become familiar with most of the local Vietnamese, they were able on 5 April to detect two strangers. Upon investigation it was discovered that one was a VC (confirmed) and was transporting 150,000 grains of penicillin. On 20 April a sweep team located at (AT944675) a C-ration can with a wire attached to simulate a mine; the device was buried in the road.

During 26-29 April nine combat engineers accompanied Company "E" on "search and destroy" operations.

(6) 3/3 TAOR. Combat engineer support was provided to 3/3 by the 4th Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2dLt. J. R. ARMSTRONG. The platoon was billeted on Hill 55 and 22 to provide better and more responsive combat support. A daily average of fourteen engineers conducted deliberate sweeps and seventeen engineers supported the letter companies. Mine sweeps were deliberate and were conducted throughout the month on the lateral roads from Route 1C at (AT987663) to AN TRACH (1) (AT973661) and (AT989643) south of Hill 22 to (AT963663). Three combat engineers provided support to Company "I" and three others to Company "L" for Operation ORANGE during the period 4-20 April. Engineers accompanied units of 3/3 on thirteen "search and destroy" operations. On 7 April a demo team destroyed seven CHICOM grenades, one VC shape charge, one cave at (AT978675), and another cave at (AT976674). Caves were destroyed at (AT978675, 976675, and 956683) during a "search and destroy" operation on 8 April. Also on that day a VC shape charge was found in the vicinity of (AT976674); the charge was returned to the battalion for test and evaluation. A demo team with Company "M" destroyed on 9 April two caves near (AT976646), a cave and bunker (AT978643), and a boobytrapped 81mm round at (AT970659). Another boobytrapped 105mm round at (AT981624) on 12 April and the next day three safe-lanes were blown through fences, and destroyed one M16A1 in place, a punji trap, and a boobytrapped 81mm round. One trench, a cave, a bunker, two boobytrapped M-26 grenades, and one boobytrapped 81mm round were destroyed during 14 April. A member of the security element for a sweep team tripped a boobytrapped

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105mm round 15 April and the following day a demo team with Company "M" destroyed two VC grenades while a sweep team destroyed a boobytrapped M-26 (AT952664). Demo team with Company "I" on 18 April destroyed one mantrap at (AT947605), another mantrap which was boobytrapped with a WP round at (AT949608), and a boobytrapped M-26 attached to a fence gate at (AT955606). A sweep/demo team accompanying a patrol on 21 April destroyed a boobytrapped 105mm round at (AT985635). This boobytrap had a pull-friction firing device from which trip wires led to two bamboo stakes in a mantrap. A sweep team discovered and destroyed on 22 April a VC shape charge at (AT973614); the charge had a MUV pull-type firing device. On 23 April a sweep team discovered and destroyed a tarpaper box that contained about 10 pounds of TNT with a pressure type firing device. When it was destroyed, a secondary detonation occurred about 25 yards away in the rice paddies. A demo team accompanying Company "I" destroyed a house and a tunnel covered by it at (AT961676) and another tunnel at (AT983626) on 25 April. A boobytrapped grenade was destroyed, 27 April. The next day a team with Company "J" destroyed a boobytrapped fence and a boobytrapped gate both at (AT977648) while an engineer team with Company "K" destroyed a VC gate at (AT913593) and a 4' x 10' cave at (AT915594). This TAOR had more mine and boobytrap activity than any of the other areas.

(7) 2/9 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 2/9 TAOR was provided by the 2d Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2dLt. L. G. ELDER. Average daily strengths for support to rifle companies varied from eight to thirty-three, but averaged nineteen. The platoon was billeted at the 2/9 CP and with forward companies to reduce reaction time. Deliberate sweeps were conducted daily of Route 1C from (AT999699) to (AT989644) near HA DONG; on 28 April this sweep was extended south of the river to BIC NAM (AT994663). As the road construction progressed from BIC NAM toward PHONG LUC (1), the daily sweep was increased to clear the right-of-way for this construction. The lateral road from National Route #1 (BT031644) to PHONG LUC (1) (BT012635) was also swept daily. During most of the month, the sweeps had negative results. On 9 April a wooden box mine was uncovered at (AT985636) and returned to EOD and eventually to 3d Engineer Battalion for evaluation. Another box mine was located at (AT998697) on 18 April. The mine was buried about four inches below the road's surface. The sweep team cleared the top and sides of the mine, but investigation revealed no firing device. This fact coupled with the high reading on the detector caused suspicion. Therefore, the mine was blown in place with a one pound block of C-4. The resulting crater, 3 feet deep and 12 feet wide, indicated additional explosives beneath the mine. While on a "search and destroy" operation with Company "E", 9-13 April, an engineer demo team destroyed two tunnels, three bunkers, and one punji trap. On 15 April, a special sweep team, consisting of one officer and eight enlisted, was deployed to PHONG THU, grid square (A9858), to sweep and destroy an ARVN minefield which had been abandoned about 9 April. During the early hours of 16 April, this engineer team suffered one KIA and three WIA when VC attacked Company "H". The minefield clearance was completed on 17 April.

(8) 3/9 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 3/9 TAOR, was provided by 1st Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2dLt. K. J. KIRIACOPOULOS.

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This platoon, which was billeted with 3/9, had a daily average strength of twenty-five enlisted. Throughout the month an average of eight engineers were employed conducting deliberate sweeps of the MSR from (BT080694) to (BT072707) to (BT073656) to (BT076647). On 16 April, a sweep team found a 90mm HE round wired to an 81mm HE round at (BT069667). No other incidents occurred during the month on sweeps. Combat engineers supported four company-size "search and destroy" operations. On 3 April, a five-man demo team with Company "B" destroyed five fighting holes, one fortified sniper position, and at (BT057628) one boobytrapped CHICOM grenade. A demo team with Company "M" on 12 April destroyed four fighting holes, four tunnels, and two bunkers. During the period 14-16 April a demo team with Company "L" destroyed four fighting holes, a boobytrapped M-26, and one bunker. While on this operation one combat engineer killed three VC as they tried to flee. On 15 April, a demo team with Company "M" destroyed six fighting holes, one tunnel, and three bunkers. After 21 April when 3/9 deployed on Operation GEORGIA, sixteen engineers remained in the 3/9 TAOR to continue daily mine sweeps and to provide combat support for 2/4. For Operation GEORGIA see subparagraph (9).

(9) Operation GEORGIA. The "insertion phase" of Operation GEORGIA began on 20 April following the normal daily sweep of Route 5. Two officers and twenty-eight combat engineers, augmented by one officer and twenty-three enlisted from 1st Bridge Company and hauling bridging on four LVT's, deployed south on Route 5. Their tasks included sweeping an additional 7,000 meters of road and using demolitions to destroy a bamboo barricade reinforced with steel pickets (AT927610), a boobytrapped 155mm round at (AT927611), and a boobytrapped 105mm round at (AT923918). On 21 April the special 7,000-meter mine sweep was conducted again, a bridge was installed at (AT925606) and the bridge at (AT919598) was re-decked. In addition, using demolitions the combat engineers destroyed the abutments to a damaged bridge at (AT916594) thereby permitting passage of track vehicles through the dry stream bed. After this engineer effort, the track vehicles of Operation GEORGIA traversed Route 5 southward. Upon the completion of the insertion, the bridge was removed and the engineers and bridge personnel were chopped from the operation. Company "C" (-), commanded by Capt D. L. HICKS, was attached to provide support to 3/9. The company consisting of three officers and forty-five enlisted, was composed of 3d Platoon, commanded by 1stLt. D. A. DE MATTEO and 2d Platoon commanded by 2dLt. K. J. KIRIACOPOULOS. Company "C" (-) was augmented by a tunnel team of one officer, four combat engineers, one communications wireman, and one corpsman. This team, commanded by 2ndLt. K. L. WILSON, was the first employed under combat conditions and will serve to evaluate the training previously conducted. See paragraph 3.f, Training.

(10) ROUGH RIDER Operations. Six ROUGH RIDER Operations North were conducted during April. Two departed DA NANG and returned on the same day, three departed on one day returning the next, and one departed one day and returned two days later. No incidents occurred on any of these convoys.

c. Combat Service Support. Four categories of combat service support were provided. These were (1) Roads and Bridges, (2) Field Fortifications,

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## (3) General Construction, and (4) Utilities.

## (1) Roads and Bridges

## (a) Route 1C, (AT700999) to (AT994663), 4.5 miles.

Company "C" had the responsibility of improving Route 1C and extending it from HA DONG (AT643989) to BIC NAM (AT994663). Improvement of Route 1C, that was begun in March, continued during April. During the last three days of April, fill was hauled to the south of the river as far as BIC NAM and the lateral road from there toward PHONG LUC (1) was begun. A total of 3547 cubic yards of fill was hauled, spread and compacted during April. In addition, a bridge was installed at (AT988676) and another rebuilt at (AT999699). Marines expended 2135 manhours and indigenous labor 320 manhours.

(b) Route 13, (BT071700) to (BT075656), 3.2 miles. Company "C" continued improving Route 13 to provide an MSR for 3/9. This included widening the road to accommodate two lane traffic, capping and crowning the road, and installing two culverts. During April, 1695 cubic yards of fill was hauled to the road and 1040 Marine manhours were expended.

(c) Route 5 (Center), (AT912743) to (AT946700), 3.9 miles. Company "A" continued to improve the road by installing nine culverts and improving the approaches to the bridges. Fill was hauled and spread at the approaches to eliminate the sharp rise to the bridge and thereby preventing impact of approaching vehicles against the end dam of the bridges. In addition, headwalls and wingwalls were placed on all of the culverts; sandbags were used for this purpose. Manhours expended on this route were Marines 681, indigenous 1938.

(d) Route 2, (AT899774) to (AT860745), 2.9 miles. Company "A" finishing rehabilitation work on Route 2 which it had begun in March. During the current reporting period an additional 1400 meters was widened and the brush cleared from the road area. The entire road was graded and five culverts were installed. Marines expended 268 manhours and indigenous 410 in accomplishing the engineer task.

(e) 2/3 CP Road, (AT934715) to (AT947725), 1.1 miles. Company "A" continued to improve the 2/3 CP Road. During April the ditches were pulled, the road was brought to final grade, seven culverts were installed, and headwalls were installed on all culverts. This project utilized 372 manhours by Marines and 640 manhours by the indigenous force.

(f) Miscellaneous Road Projects. Company "A" pioneered an access road to C-1/3 positions at Hill 358 during 7-9 April; this project required 78 manhours and 30 equipment hours. Company "B" cut an access road to 1/1 during 17-20 April, expending 85 manhours; one culvert was placed in the road. An access road to 4th Marines was also constructed by Company "B" 17-18 April. Company "A" installed culverts on Route 4A 19-20 April; this task consumed 40 manhours by Marines and 212 by indigenous laborers. On 27 April, Company "B" installed a footbridge for 2/1, at (YD874135).

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## (2) Field Fortifications

(a) MLR Bunker Program. This project, assigned to Company "C" 7th Engineer Battalion, consists of cutting and assisting in the erection of bunkers in four standard sizes. Assistance was also given to 2/3 in non-standard bunkers. Materials were cut for seventy-eight 8x8, thirty-eight 8x12, and six 12x24 bunkers. A total of 109 bunkers were issued; included were twenty-nine 8x8, forty-nine 8x12, twenty-nine 12x24, and two 20x30 bunkers. When bunkers were issued, one or two combat engineers were dispatched to the receiving unit to supervise and assist in the "self-help" erection of the bunkers. A recapitulation of the bunker program at the end of April reveals the following:

(b) Salvage of Field Fortifications. On 20 April, the 3d Engineer Battalion initiated projects of recovering field fortifications from abandoned positions. Company "A" began salvage of the wire and stakes of a position at (AT935718) while Company "C" started a similar project by the battalion. Manhours expended were 298 by Marines and 1518 by indigenous. Materials recovered were 293 rolls of concertina, 25,200 feet of single-strand barbed wire, and 344 steel pickets. See paragraph 7.a. (4), Logistics.

## (3) General Construction

(a) The 3d Engineer Battalion completed the HqBn Senior Officers Head and Shower on 3 April. Marine labor required during April was 187 manhours.

(b) On 1 April, the quarters for the Senior Officers in HqBn were begun. These quarters were modified GP strongbacks with louvered walls and transite roofs. The project, which was completed on 22 April, required the modification of eleven of these quarters. See exposure 3 and 4 of Enclosure (5). Manhours expended were 3247 by Marines. During the remainder of the month 170 manhours were utilized by Marines and 1088 by indigenous labor in installing walks and retaining walls in the area of the Senior Officers Quarters.

(c) During 1-16 April four quonset huts were installed as administrative offices for Division Special Staffs. These quonsets were modified to one of tropical design. See Exposures 1, 2, 5, and 6 of Enclosure (5). This project required 5062 manhours by Marines and 58 by Vietnamese.

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(d) Two other modified quonset huts were erected 7-22 April for administrative offices for the Division Chaplain. The erection of these buildings consumed 3212 manhours by Marines. See Exposures 7 and 8 of Enclosure (5).

(e) A site was prepared and the deck for the 32x80 office building at Division CP during 7-24 April. Note the site preparation above the four quonset huts on Exposures 1 and 2 of Enclosure (5). Marine labor was 1070 manhours and indigenous 382. During the remainder of the month 1593 Marine manhours and 120 indigenous were expended in erecting the building. At the end of this reporting period, it was estimated that two more days would be required to finish the building.

(f) An antenna site was prepared for Division CP during 11-25 April. A total of 120 feet of culvert was installed and 4213 cubic yards of fill was hauled, spread, and compacted. See Exposure 9 of Enclosure (5). This project required 656 manhours by Marines and 990 by the indigenous labor force.

(g) Ten strongbacks were dismantled, moved to a new location, and rebuilt to house the Division Post Office personnel. Company "A" performed the task 12-25 April utilizing 565 manhours.

(h) During 23-27 April, 3d Engineer Battalion spent 1115 manhours removing a damaged helipad cover, preparing the site of the helipad, and the installation of a new neoprene cover for the helipad at "C" Med. A half culvert was installed on three sides of the helipad to drain the area.

(i) On 23 April construction began on retaining walls along the slopes of the areas previously filled for buildings at the Division CP. Manhours employed were 936 Marines and 1105 Vietnamese.

(j) Company "B" began on 25 April to assist MCB-7 in constructing cantonments in the PHU BAI area. By the end of the month 763 manhours were consumed in this effort.

(k) Site preparation for Block II Cantonment, PHU BAI, was begun on 25 April. Company "B" used 118 manhours and almost as many equipment hours on this project.

(l) Site preparation began on 26 April for SNCO Quarters, HqBn. By the close of the reporting period 2082 cubic yards of fill had been hauled, spread, and compacted and 319 manhours expended in preparing this location.

(m) Construction of ADC Quarters, PHU BAI, was started on 27 April. A total of 109 manhours had been employed on this job by the end of the month.

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(n) Site preparation and cutting of materials for new quonset office buildings below S&C files. This project required 424 man-hours by Marines.

(o) The deck for 3d Engineer Battalion Utilities Building was poured on 29 and 30 April utilizing 250 manhours.

(p) Miscellaneous general construction projects included the following:

Construction of a desk for Aide-de-camp  
 Construction of 3 desks for G-4  
 Construction of 10 bookcases for G-3  
 Installation of 5 Air Conditioners in Div CP Bunker.  
 Repairs of 2/4 Cantonment.

(4) Utilities

(a) The 3d Engineer Battalion continued to supply water to the 3d Marine Division. In the DA NANG enclave, eight water points were in operation until 13 April. When 3/3 displaced forward, the water point at the former CP was closed. Six water points are in operation in the PHU BAI enclave. During the reporting period over 2,065,597 gallons of potable water was distributed and 1,239,450 gallons of raw water.

(b) Installation of the 3d Marines/3d Engineer Battalion water distribution system continued. See Exposure 10 of Enclosure (5).

d. Infantry Role. On 12 April, 3d Engineer Battalion was again committed to assisting in the defense of the Marble Mountain Air Facility with the secondary mission of pacification of the surrounding area. The number of personnel required from the battalion was reduced to one squad and a platoon headquarters. Headquarters Battalion and 3d Tank Battalion each provided a squad to complete the provisional rifle platoon. Operational control remained with B-1/9. The platoon had the responsibility of controlling by active patrolling and perimeter defense positions in grid square (BT0573) and the village of KOM DA ME (BT055728). The platoon was commanded by 1stLt. L. L. ANDERSON until 29 April when GySgt R. E. TAYLOR relieved him.

## 6. Communications

a. The Battalion Command Net continued to provide operational communications with units of Companies "A" and "C" while operating away from the battalion area. The net consisted of one AN/PRC-47 with a modified antenna at the Battalion CP, one AN/MRC-83 with Company "A", and one other with Company "C". An AN/MRC-83 and AN/PRC-47 were also used at specified times during each day to pass administrative traffic to Company "B", 3d Engineer Battalion at PHU BAI. No technical difficulties were encountered in the operation of the net with AN/MRC-83 and AN/PRC-47 radios. An AN/PRC-25 has been used to replace a AN/MRC-83 at Sierra with Company "A" and has proved to be highly reliable in communications.

b. Communications have been provided for the 3d Engineer Battalion Provisional Platoon through the use of AN/PRC-10's for internal communications between squads, and AN/PRC-25 for communications between the platoon and the battalion. A wire system with sound powered phones served as another communications system between squads.

c. Convoy communications for 3d Engineer Battalion elements have been provided through the use of AN/PRC-10's. These served as internal communications for the engineer element. They have also been used to maintain contact with helicopter support on the Division AO Net. See paragraph 5b (10), Operations.

d. The helicopter courier service was utilized daily for intra-division message traffic.

e. Three (3) AN/MRC-83 radios were declared Code-X during March. Three requisitions were placed, no issue was made. Three AN/MRC-83 radios are on hand of six authorized.

f. A battalion inspection of communications equipment of Company "B" was held during this reporting period. Equipment was kept in a satisfactory condition but PM records are few and not kept up to date.

g. Paragraph 7, ENCLOSURE (6) cites the status of outstanding documents for communication equipment.

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7. Logisticsa. Supply/Material

(1) Enclosure (6) reflects the battalion supply posture at the end of April. Enclosure (7) depicts the status of combat essential end items on requisition as replenishment for evacuation like items.

(2) Class I and III materials availability were adversely effected during the early part of the month due to civil unrest in the DA NANG area which necessitated restriction on fresh stores and diesel oil usage. B rations were substituted where necessary on the one hand and the use of diesel as a dust pallative was suspended on the other. See paragraph 8a, Civil Affairs.

(3) Enclosure (8) denotes the expenditures of class V during the month. M-127 White Star Parachute flares were unavailable for most of the month.

(4) With the exception of concertina wire, class IV supplies were readily available throughout the month. A concerted effort was made by both Companies "A" and "C" to salvage concertina, barbed wire and stakes from abandoned positions and billeting areas within the TAOR. See paragraph 5c (2) (b), Operations.

(5) Logistics support for Company "B" at PHU BAI continued in the form of lumber, nails, repair parts, and general construction materials including pre-cut bunkers. Extensive use was made of ROUGHRIDER operations to transport materials to that enclave. Enclosure (4) denotes the scope of materials shipped via ROUGHRIDER. See paragraph 5c (3) Operations.

(6) Materials for new division command post construction projects were procured on an expeditious basis from OKINAWA. This consisted primarily of electrical and plumbing items.

(7) Four manual resuscitators were received on 7 April 1966 for use in conjunction with the tunnel teams. This device is designed for rapid emergency resuscitation treatment for asphyxiation casualties, a high incidence possibility in tunnel "search and destroy" operations. See paragraph 4f, Training.

(8) The availability of operational equipment was increased considerably during the month by receipt of four TD-18 tractors, two TD-15 tractors, one MRS-100 tractor, one concrete mixer, one 550 road grader, one M-54 cargo truck, one M-62 wrecker, and four 55 GPM pumps, all from supply sources. Additionally, two TD-18's and two TD-15 tractor were received from the CHU LAI enclave, formerly Company "B" equipment.

ENCLOSURE (1)

(9) Enclosure (10) contains a summary of requested T/E allowance increases submitted by the battalion since July 1965.

b. Maintenance

(1) The battalion equipment maintenance posture continued to improve (enhanced by the additional items cited in paragraph 7a (8)), reaching an operational readiness of 83 per cent by the end of the month.

(2) The P-153 mine detector continued to be subject to extended deadline due to repair parts non-availability. Operational effectiveness continues to be far superior to the replaced item.

(3) FLSG reduced the third echelon deadline of M-51 dump trucks from eleven on 1 April to zero on 30 April. This provided a major impetus to the overall battalion operational status and engineer capability. (See Enclosure (12)).

(4) Receipt of an M-62 wrecker has now provided the battalion with a responsive capability to field breakdown. This will enable the rapid retraction of deadlined equipment from job sites or on the road, expeditious transfer of equipment to FLSG, and reduction of total down time from the moment of deadline.

(5) The FLSG motor transport direct exchange program is operating effectively. The principle items utilized within this program are listed below, and are associated with five ton vehicles.

- (a) Wheel Cylinders Rear
- (b) Wheel Cylinders Front
- (c) Air Hydraulic Cylinder
- (d) Master Cylinders

(6) High temperature grease was received during the month, for application with the TD-15 crawler tractor.

c. Food Services

(1) Approximately 32798 meals were served during the month of April as follows:

- (a) 07% MCI
- (b) 60% A Rations
- (c) 31% B Rations

(2) The increase incidence of B rations is attributed to the civil unrest in the DA NANG enclave during the early weeks of the month. See paragraph 8a Civil Affairs.

d. Facilities

(1) Considerable improvement in facilities was underway by the end of the month, with construction of the following in progress:

- (a) Utilities building
- (b) Officers billeting tropical huts
- (c) Battalion Catholic Chapel

(2) A rock wall and planter entrance-way to the battalion area was also under construction.

(3) The outdoor movie theater was completed.

(4) Considerable progress was made on the installation of culverts, headwalls and ditches within the battalion area.

e. Industrial Relation

(1) A total of 204 indigenous personnel were being employed on 30 April 1966. The monthly payroll is now averaging 4,500,000 piasters. Cognizance of battalion messhall and laundry employees was assumed by this AIK fund program on 18 April thus adding sixteen employees to the total. Work attendance was curtailed to some degree by civil unrest. See paragraph 8a Civil Affairs.

f. Medical

(1) The battalion aid station treated 627 men during the month. There were no incidents of venereal diseases nor any contagious diseases that would pose a threat to the battalion personnel.

(2) A total of 486 immunizations were given as receipt of syringes and vaccine gave impetus to this heretofore restricted program.

g. Fiscal

(1) Enclosure (11) depicts the battalion fiscal status as of 15 April 1966.

8. CIVIL AFFAIRS

a. Civil unrest in the DA NANG area restricted military traffic and relations with Vietnamese nationals adversely. Transport of supplies, availability of indigenous labor and the purchase of materials were curtailed. Also, security measures were tightened, thus there were added demands for military manpower. The period lasted from 6 - 19 April 1966.

b. During April, 3d Engineer Battalion civic action program was administered in the hamlets of DA SON, PHU HA, and XOM DA ME. The program was not limited to these areas, however, operational commitments in the DA NANG area included members of the civic action team on numerous occasions. During the month 1868 persons received medical treatment, 2750 bars of soap, 60 pounds of clothing, 1630 pounds of food, and 491 miscellaneous items were distributed. The miscellaneous items included school kits, sewing kits, textile kits, vitamins, toys, and washing powder. A total of 2656 persons were in some way assisted by the civic action program. A statistical summary of the civic action conducted is included as ENCLOSURE (14).

c. The indigenous work force employed by 3d Engineer Battalion reached two hundred and one during the month. The mission of the program is to provide capable Vietnamese laborers to fill certain jobs, thus making more Marines available for combat support operations. In addition to general labor, some Vietnamese laborers are learning how to be carpenters, electricians, mechanics, welders, and clerks. Most of the personnel work on bridge and road construction. They have also performed extensive drainage and culvert work throughout the DA NANG area. Most of the workers are conscientious about learning their jobs and qualifying for higher ratings. During the recent civil unrest in the city of DA NANG, workers from the city made every effort to continue working but were prevented in doing so by outside pressures.

d. On 14 April the civil affairs officer negotiated for authorization to utilize a borrow pit in the vicinity of Marble Mountain. Road construction in the area dictated use of the pit. The HOA VANG district chief authorized use of the land. Liaison was then effected with the NOI HAI village chief and a plan devised by which the fill could be removed with minimum inconvenience to local inhabitants.

e. On 18 April it became necessary to acquire a right-of-way for a road in the vicinity of TRA KHE hamlet. Proper government channels were utilized and authorization obtained. Initial and followup visits were made to the area to insure that inhabitants of the area were aware of the project. Arrangements were made to settle claims of those people sustaining valid damages from the project.

f. In the vicinity of PHOUC THAI hamlet the civil affairs officer was involved in an effort to eliminate pilfering of sand bags by local residents. The village and hamlet chiefs were asked to stop the local residents from removing sand bags from the headwalls of culverts. Results have thus far been marginal.

g. In conjunction with efforts to improve the facilities of the school in DA SON, school kits were obtained. On 2 April the village chief, hamlet chief, and school master distributed 250 "CARE" school kits to pupils of the DA SON school (See ENCLOSURE #13 Print #1). Also the school was presented with two athletic kits containing volley balls, basketballs, and other athletic gear.

h. Significant gains were made in the village of HOA KHANH during the recent period of civil unrest in the city of DA NANG. It became impossible for people in the village to obtain their rice ration. During the period the civil affairs officer supplied the HOA KHANH village chief with 1650 pounds of rice and 60 pounds of clothes.

i. After much planning and work, the dispensary in the hamlet of DA SON was completed. The finished structure is 20' x 40' and has treatment and washing facilities. There are four rooms including two examining rooms. The people of the hamlet have taken an immense pride in the dispensary as it was built by members of the hamlet. The children of the hamlet regard the dispensary with a social significance as well as medical. They visit the facility when any member of the civic action team is in the area. (ENCLOSURE #13, print #2). Four boys from the hamlet are currently undergoing training in the dispensary. They have progressed to the point where they can treat cuts, scratches, and some skin rashes. They treat burns, apply bandages, and diagnose worms. They are also valuable in controlling people during sick call. The boys are conscientious about their training and learn quickly.

j. Positive gains were made during the month of April. Future plans include expanding the current civic action program into forward areas.

k. The Intelligence Chief completed Vietnamese language school and this should add to the civil affairs efforts of the battalion.

9. LEGAL

Legal activity during the month of April was at a favorable level. This was the first month in 1966 in which there was neither a Summary or a Special Courts-Martial. A statistical breakdown of legal activity is presented as follows:


d. Lesson plans for all classes will be submitted to the S-3 one day prior to scheduled classes.


d. Lesson plans for all classes will be submitted to the S-3 one day prior to scheduled classes.



The instruction is particularly important on the squad and platoon level. Points to be stressed include searching the jobsite, establishment of security, and prevention of routines or patterns. Special care should be exercised when returning to an incomplete project, such as a bridge or culvert. The V. C., knowing that the marines will return, may leave a surprise waiting for the careless squad.
