

On 9 June LCpl R. F. LYNCH departed on emergency leave.

On 17 June 2dLt W. G. HAUGHT joined, assigned duty as Asst CommO.

On 18 June LCpl G. A. SADOROWITSCH was WIA while in position with provisional platoon. Sgt B. L. FERGUSON was WIA while in position with 2/9. Captain G. R. ROOT assumed duties as Commanding Officer, Company "B".

On 20 June Pfc A. R. BOEHME departed on emergency leave.

On 21 June SSgt H. DANIELSON and Sgt J. D. KIDD departed on emergency leave.

On 22 June SSgt I. P. CHAPMAN, Sgt D. L. PRICE and Cpl E. L. CONLEY were WIA while on a mine sweep in the 2/9 TAOR.

On 23 June SgtMaj C. M. LONG was reassigned to the 3rd Marines. SgtMaj W. T. QUIGLEY assumed duties as Battalion Sergeant Major.

On 24 June LCPL R. M. RZASA departed on PCS orders in connection with emergency leave.

On 25 June Pvt M. K. MORRISON was WIA while on Operation JAY.

On 26 June LCpl D. ROYSTER, Company "A" 1st Engineers, LCpl W. H. BOYD and Pfc D. L. CORE were WIA while on Operation JAY. Sgt H. E. SCALF and Pfc A. B. MURPHY were KIA while on a "search and destroy" operation with 2/9. SFC S. L. GORDON joined, assigned as Communications Officer.

On 27 June Cpl G. A. STEIGLEMAN departed on PCS orders in connection with emergency leave.

On 28 June Captain W. H. LONG and 2dLt L. G. ELDER returned from sick. Major W. G. VILERS joined, assigned duty with H&S Company.

On 29 June Pfc T. R. COLRS and Pfc J. V. CROMIE were WIA while on a "search and destroy" operation with 2/9. LCpl D. H. GINGER was drowned while on a river recon.

On 30 June a Change of Command Ceremony was held. Major C. D. WOOD relieved Major Conway J. SMITH, who is rotating to CONUS on 1 July, 1stSgt S. H. SCOTT, MSgt J. R. READ and GySgt D. J. YESIERSKI were appointed to Warrant Officer. CWO-2 P. A. DEAN was promoted to 2dLt.

The following awards were made during the month: 13 Purple Heart medals; 1 Letter of Appreciation; 10 Meritorious Hosts.

The following recommendations for awards were submitted: 1 Silver Star Medal; 2 Bronze Star Medals; 2 Navy Commendation Medals; 1 Navy Commendation for Achievement; 1 Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Bronze Star.

The following promotions were effected: 1 to 2dLt; 3 WO; 1 to MSgt; 1 to BSgt; 9 to GySgt; 6 to SSgt; 1 to Pfc.

2. Administration

a. The Battalion Meritorious Promotion Board met 22 June 1966.

b. A debriefing was held on 30 June for all personnel departing on the July Rotation Draft.

3. Intelligence

a. The S-2 Officer provided the battalion officers with nightly intelligence briefings reviewing mine incidents in the DA NANG TAOR. Included was related information as to significant VC troop movements in areas of close proximity to engineer project sites. The S-2 chief gave periodic briefings to the Staff NCO's and Mine Warfare School instructors and provided information to the S-2 section of 3d Tank Battalion. The briefings included summaries of current VC mine warfare tactics and trends.

b. The S-2 section continued its surveillance and analysis of VC mine incidents within the DA NANG enclave. A mine analysis and mine report are submitted as enclosure (2). The report enumerates incidents by month with a brief description and location. An incident overlay accompanies the report. The analysis gives a breakdown by week of mine incidents. Additional appended overlays provide a further detailed analysis of incidents on the basis of type of mine by week and location, and on the basis of proximity patterns (similarity analysis) also by week. This reporting is an attempt to correlate past experience with mines and thereby seek conclusions as to trends and tactics used by VC.

c. Projects begun during June required aerial photographic coverage of the operational areas. Missions were requested covering possible land routes south to the AN HOA industrial complex. Additional missions requested covered areas south of Hill 55 to Route 14, the area of Operation LIBERTY and "Liberty Road" (See paragraph 5.c (1)(c)).

d. The S-2 inventory of maps was reviewed and updated. A new series of 1:25,000 scale photo map supplements was procured and distributed to the companies. The battalion inventory of 1:50,000 scale maps was replenished with complete coverage from the 17th parallel to QUANG NGAI.

4. Training

a. Emphasis continued on training personnel within the battalion. MOS training was conducted primarily on the job but certain specialized skills received more formal training. GMS training was conducted for the most part outside of working hours or at job sites while waiting for transportation or materials. Officers and Staff Non-commissioned Officers received instruction of one-half hour to one hour, three evenings weekly. Battalion Training Schedules are attached as Enclosure (3).

b. In compliance with Division Order 1510.3 and 7000.3A, newly arrived personnel received troop indoctrination and lectures on the monetary systems in the Republic of Vietnam. In addition, lectures were conducted weekly at company level on current events and on topics of troop indoctrination.

c. On 26 June 1966, Sergeants E. R. RADFORD and G. M. CAMPBELL departed for Vietnamese Language School at Fort Buckner, Okinawa.

d. The Division Mine Warfare and Demolitions School, conducted by the battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, boobytraps, and demolitions. This instruction was conducted by contact teams and by resident courses in the battalion school area. The following is a recapitulation of the training conducted by Mine Warfare and Demolitions School during June 1966:

(1) A contact instructor team was deployed to 3/3 on 23 June 1966, where it instructed fifty-two (52) personnel in demolitions. This instruction was of five (5) hours duration. Another contact instructor team was deployed to PHU BAI on 27 June to teach VC mines and boobytraps to members of the 4th Marines for a period of about ten (10) days duration. The team, conducting a series of one day classes, had instructed forty-seven students by 30 June.

f. The Generator Operators School trained one operator from 9th MTBn, one operator from FLSG "A", two operators from 1/12, and two operators from Co "B" MP Bn during the month of June 1966.

g. The tunnel teams continued to train during the month of June and were utilized on Operation LIBERTY, and a COUNTY FAIR operation, and in the 1/9 TAOR. New personnel were trained also.

5. Operations

a. General. During June, the 3d Engineer Battalion (Reinforced) remained in general support of the 3d Marine Division. On 28 June, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion, commanded by Captain G. R. MELBAUM, came under OPCON of 3d Engineer Battalion. Employment of the battalion was in the following three categories: combat support, combat service support, and provisional rifle unit operations.

(1) Combat Support operations consisted of providing mine detection and demolitions teams in support of infantry "search and destroy" operations, daily sweeps of MSR's for mines and boobytraps, and engineer support of convoys traveling to and from PHU BAI. In the DA HANG TAOR, combat support was provided to eight infantry battalions (including 3/9 at AN HOA) by Companies "A", and "C" and in the PHU BAI TAOR to four infantry battalions by Company "B". VC mine incidents data, obtained during the month, was recorded by the S-2 and is contained in enclosure (2). The combat support provided involved:

(a) A total of 228 deliberate electronic mine detector sweeps of MSR segments. Daily average distance swept was 10.0 Kilometers.

(b) A total of 66 visual sweeps. Daily average distance was 4.0 Kilometers.

(c) Excluding minefield clearance, twenty-two incidents that required engineer effort during deliberate sweeps. See paragraph 3, Intelligence.

(d) Total ordnance destroyed by combat engineers is recorded in enclosure (7).

(e) Support of over four infantry "search and destroy" operations.

(f) Support of one COUNTY FAIR Operation.

(2) Combat service support of the 3d Marine Division was in four categories; roads and bridges, fortifications, general construction, and utilities. Companies "A", "B", and "C", assisted by Engineer Support Company, were committed to road construction in the 3d Marines TAOR, 4th Marines TAOR, and 9th Marines TAOR. Most general construction projects were accomplished by Engineer Support Company and one platoon of Company "A". Water points and shower units were under the operation of Engineer Support Company.

(3) A provisional unit was employed as part of a provisional infantry platoon in the Marble Mountain Area pacification program. This unit consisted of a SNCO acting as platoon leader, seventeen combat engineers, and one corpsman. The platoon was located near the hamlet of XOM DA ME, west of the Marble Mountain Air Facility.

b. Combat Support

(1) 1/1 TAOR.- Combat engineer support in the 1/1 TAOR was provided

by 1st Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2dLt K. J. KIRIACOPOULOS. This platoon, which was billeted at the 1/1 CP, had an average strength of one officer and twenty-four enlisted engineers until 13 June; on that day an eighteen man squad was moved to 3/1 and the strength average at 1/1 was one officer and sixteen enlisted. During 1-5 June deliberate mine sweeps were conducted daily by eight engineers from (BT069663) to (BT072705) to (BT079698). On 6 June, 7th Engineer Battalion assumed responsibility of the MSR sweeps. On 1 June an Ontos detonated an unidentified explosive at (BT086622). During the period 10-13 June engineers supporting 1/1 on "search and destroy" operations destroyed 319 fighting holes, 250 punji stakes, a tunnel complex, seven bunkers, two boobytrapped CHI COM grenades, three boobytrapped 20mm shell, and one boobytrapped M-26 grenade. On 19 June the French Fort at (BT074700) was destroyed by the engineers; 860 pounds of C-4 was required to completely destroy the structure. This platoon provided close combat support to the battalion, on Operation LIBERTY 17-30 June.

(2) 2/1 TAOR. General support was provided by 1st Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion attached to Company "B", 3d Engineer Battalion. The platoon, commanded by 2dLt R. K. GULLERS, had an average strength of twenty-one combat engineers; the platoon was billeted with 2/1 in order to provide better response to the battalion's needs. A deliberate mine sweep was conducted daily from (YD558297) to National Route 1 at (YD573312). During the period 5-8 June one officer and five engineers enlarged the radio relay site and helicopter landing zone on Hill 674 in the CO BI-THANH TAN area. Support was provided for Operation BEAVER on 13 June and Operation KANSAS 16-17 June. The platoon provided close combat support on Operation JAY sustaining one KIA on 26 June during a mortar attack.

(3) 3/1 TAOR. Company "C" provided general support to 3/1 during June. A squad of eight men were billeted at the CP. Four of these daily conducted deliberate mine sweeps of the two lateral roads, (AT987663-967664) and (AT992684-975685), which led to Route 1C. The other four engineers provided close combat support to the battalion. On 28 June a minefield clearing team composed of 1stLt R. L. BENTLEY and five engineers began removing the minefield around the battalion CP. By the end of the 30th, 104 mines had been removed. These mines had been improvised by putting C-4 in C-ration cans and arming with MK1, Mod 1 firing devices.

(4) 1/3 TAOR. Company "A" provided general combat support to 1/3. No personnel were billeted with the battalion; all requirements were easily met due to the close proximity of the 3d Engineer Battalion to 1/3 CP. Four-man demolitions team was deployed with Company "C" on an Operation CORMORANT. A four-man demolitions team supported Company "C" and another four-man team supported Company "D" on "search and destroy" operations 9-11 June.

(5) 2/3 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 2/3 sector was provided by 1st Platoon, Company "A" commanded by 1stLt R. L. STUTTS. On 2 June 7th Engineers relieved the platoon of all the daily sweeps except the one from Hill 22 to Route 5, (AT954665-943663). On 1 June a sweep team discovered a "Flower Box Mine" at (AT953674) while wire-dragging dikes for mines. It contained approximately 20 pounds of explosive which was covered with glass and tile. The container was wooden, joined with wooden dowels, and was buried

about eight inches below the surface of the road. On 10 June support was provided for an Operation COUNTY FAIR in LA CHAU (2). As Operation LIBERTY got under way on 10 June, 2d Platoon, commanded by Cysgt W. R. FREESTONE, began to provide support in addition to the 1st Platoon. As Route 5 was extended southward from (AT943663), the daily mine sweep extended to clear for construction. On 15 June, a 105mm round rigged as a mine was found at (AT937636) and destroyed by a sweep team. Another boobytrapped 105mm round and a boobytrapped grenade in a beer can were located and destroyed in place at (AT927610) on 17 June; an improvised foot mine made of a 20mm round was also found. At 1315, a 3d Engineer Battalion TD-15 supporting Operation LIBERTY detonated a mine estimated to be 10-15 pounds of TNT in the vicinity of (AT928615); the right track was blown off, but no further damage resulted. At 1425, while an MRS-100 tractor was retrieving the TD-15, the scarifying teeth of the MRS uncovered a box mine; it measured 3"x7"x5" and was rigged for pressure activation. As a result of this incident, a jury rig roter, called "Road-a-Rooter", was installed on a TD-18 to search for box mines. (See Exposures 1 and 2 of Enclosure (4)). The bar is twelve feet long and cut the road shoulder where the box mines were located. On 18 June an M-51 dump truck detonated a mine in the vicinity of (AT927631); also during that day from 1000 to 1345, a tunnel team was employed by 2/3. Another 105mm round rigged as a mine was found and destroyed on 20 June at (AT919598); this one was rigged for electrical detonation. On 28 June, a twelve-man clearing team commanded by Cysgt FREESTONE at 2/3 new CP on Hill 37 removed 400 M16A1 mines, five 105mm rounds rigged as mines and three 81mm rounds rigged as mines. On 29 June, the clearing team removed 313 M16A1 mines and two 105mm rounds, two 81mm rounds, and a French bomb all rigged as mines. This same team on 30 June, removed 49 M16A1 mines and two 105mm rounds rigged as mines.

(6) 3/3 TAOR. Company "A" began providing general combat support to 3/3 on 18 June. Six combat engineers were billeted at the battalion CP to be available for short notice employment.

(7) 1/4 TAOR. Combat engineer support to 1/4 was provided by Company "B". The support provided was minimal due to requirements elsewhere and the position of 1/4. Mine sweeps and demolition support for patrols and CAC units was provided on an as required basis averaging three requirements a week.

(8) 2/4 TAOR. First Platoon Company "B", commanded by 1stLt R. A. VANSICKLE began supporting 2/4 on 4 June. A daily mine sweep of the MSR from (YD809164) to National X₂ Route 1 was conducted. From 10 June to 13 June the platoon was on Operation FLORIDA. During 17-23 June, Operation DODGE, and 25-30 June, Operation JAY, involved the platoon. Two KIA and one WIA NE were sustained.

(9) 3/4 TAOR. Company "B" provided combat support in the ATHENS operating area. This consisted of demolition and mine sweep teams. During 1-7 June daily mine sweeps were conducted from (YD892089) to (YD887105) and an average of 4 men per day for demolitions support. 15-17 June, six men participated in "search and destroy" operations providing demolitions support and four men during 21-23 June, provided demolitions support for I-3/4.

(10) 1/9 TAOR. Combat support was provided to 1/9 by the 4th Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2dLt J. R. ARMSTRONG. The platoon was billeted on Hill 55 to provide better and more responsive combat support. A daily average of ten combat engineers conducted deliberate mine sweeps and fifteen other engineers supported the letter companies. A mine sweep was conducted throughout the month along Route 1D (AT989644-983623) and as construction of "Liberty Road" began on 10 June, a deliberate mine sweep was conducted along the right-of-way. By 30 June this latter sweep was from (AT965609) to (AT968584). On 1 June, a tank detonated an unidentified mine at (AT981623). The sweep team detected and destroyed a box mine at (AT984624) on 2 June; the resulting crater indicated that the mine contained about ten pounds of TNT. On the same sweep, the P-153 had a weak signal while on high intensity at (AT984622). In probing, a large rock was struck. Suspecting the rock to be a cover for a pressure or pressure release firing device, the team detonated a small charge over the rock. The resulting crater indicated a charge of about ten pounds had been under the rock. Boobytrapped 105mm rounds were destroyed at (AT949604) on 3 June, and at (AT949602) on 4 June. Members of the platoon provided close combat support to the letter companies 15-30 June for Operation LIBERTY. One engineer on this operation was WIA on 15 June. Numerous dud ordnance was destroyed and is listed on enclosure (2). Mine activity along Route 1D was considerably less than previous month. It is considered that this is a result of placing each night, a tank with searchlight on the hill at (AT983623) and frequent patrols and ambushes along the road. The hill is sufficiently high to permit observation of about 80% of the road.

(11) 2/9 TAOR. Combat engineer support for 2/9 was provided by the 2d Platoon, Company "C", commanded by GySgt W. C. SCHICK. Average daily strengths for support to rifle companies varied from seven to twenty, but an average of ten engineers. The platoon was billeted at the 2/9 CP and with forward companies to reduce reaction time for combat support and to reduce time for sweeping and clearing the roads. Deliberate sweeps were conducted daily, by an average of fourteen engineers, of Route 1C from (AT991641) to BICH NAM (AT994633) and the lateral road from BICH NAM (AT994633) through PHONG LUC (1) (BT012635) to National Route 1 at (BT031644). No evidence of mines were found on Route 1C, during the month. On 1 June, a 60KW generator being towed by a 6x6 detonated a mine at (BT015636). An M16A1 was disarmed by a sweep team at (AT999634) on 3 June and a VC shaped charge was disarmed at (AT998634) on 4 June. Sweep teams detected and neutralized M16A1 mines on 5 June at (BT000634) and (BT010634). On 11 June a sweep team, investigating a site of an explosion believed to be a shaped charge, found and disarmed a locally manufactured shape charge at (BT012637). A sweep team detected and neutralized a box mine on 18 June in the vicinity of (BT000634). On 22 June three members of a sweep team were WIA when an electrically controlled mine was detonated at (BT006634); two were medical evacuated. Engineers supported 2/9 on Operation LIBERTY 15-30 June. Engineers located and destroyed on 26 June one boobytrapped CHICOM grenade at (BT055633). Two combat engineers were WIA on 26 June at (BT001613) when an M16 mine was detonated. On 29 June two more engineers were WIA when a boobytrapped grenade was detonated.

(12) 3/9 TAOR. Combat engineer support to 3/9 in the AN HOA area was provided by 3d Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 1stLt D. A. DE MATTEO. During the period 1-11 June, one officer and twenty-four engineers were billeted with 3/9 CP; after then the strength averaged thirteen combat engineers.

c. Combat Service Support. Four categories of combat service support were provided. These were: (1) Roads and Bridges, (2) Field Fortifications, (3) General Construction, and (4) Utilities.

(1) Roads and Bridges

(a) PHONG LUC Road (2/9 MSR) (AT994663) to (BT032643), 2.6 miles. This road was begun by Company "C" during May and provided convenient lateral communications between Hill 55 at (AT970621) and Route 1 at (BT032643), in addition to serving as the 2/9 MSR. During the period 1-9 June the road was widened and brought to grade. This work required the expenditure of 641 manhours, 593 motor transport hours, and 136 engineer equipment hours. The bulk of the motor transport used was the M-51 dump trucks, which hauled and distributed 1795 cubic yards of fill from Hill 55 in this nine-day period.

(b) Route 13, (BT071700) to (BT066654) to (BT075656) 3.5 miles. Company "C" ceased southward movement along this route at the end of May. From 1 through 8 June, 640 cubic yards of fill were hauled to elevate roadbed in places and to repair, surface damage caused by tracked vehicle traffic. A total of 407 manhours, 153 motor transport hours, and 134 heavy equipment hours were expended in this effort.

(c) Route 5, (AT899774) to (AT943663) 8.5 miles. For the first two days in June, Company "A" expended 221 manhours and 9 motor transport hours constructing abutment wingwalls for the few bridges that lacked them after May's efforts.

(d) A-1/3 Access Road (AT860736) to (AT871732) 0.9 miles. Company "A" with the assistance of Engineer Support Company provided final work on this pioneer road early in the month expending 189 manhours, 5 motor transport hours, and 80 heavy equipment hours.

(e) Route 4A (AT908744) to (AT897717) to (AT905718), 2.6 miles. For the first three days in June, Company "A" continued to improve the drainage features including the placement of additional culverts and headwalls in potential washout areas and the construction of a diversion ditch. A total 408 manhours and 24 motor transport hours were expended in this effort.

(f) Route 5 Extension (AT943663) to (AT911577), 6 miles. Starting on 9 June and continuing throughout the month, Company "A" put forth maximum effort to open this route vital to the tactical plans of the 3d Marines for Operation LIBERTY. Bridges were constructed at (AT924606, 919599, 918596, and 912591). (See Exposure 3 and 4 of Enclosure (4)). Additionally, culverts were installed at (AT942652, 937635, 936633, and 925605). Assisted by equipment, motor transportation, and personnel from Engineer Support Company, Company "A" hauled and distributed 8992 cubic yards of fill. By

21 June, the road was opened to all traffic. 8665 manhours, 1120 motor transport hours, and 727 heavy equipment hours were expended in this effort. (See Exposure 5 and 6 of Enclosure (4)).

(g) Route 1D "Liberty Road", (AT964609) to (AT968584) 1.7 miles. Upon completion of the PHONG LUC Road, Company "C" opened a new borrow pit in the Hill 55 area and commenced construction of a new north-south road in connection with Operation LIBERTY. Between 9 and 15 June a new road was cut to connect the existing Hill 55 Road with the north bank of the river at the selected site for a proposed MAT6 float bridge. This road, including the preparation of the north approach to the bridge was completed on 14 June. Also, at this time, low water in the river permitted tractors to ford and clear the southern approach to the bridge. First Bridge Company, 7th Engineer Battalion during the period 15 to 18 June, erected and placed 283 feet of MAT6 bridging. Beginning on 19 June and continuing throughout the month, a concentrated effort was made to complete the southern part of the road by early July. In order to elevate the road base (originally consisting of a 8-foot paddy dike topped by an irrigation ditch - (See Exposure 7 of Enclosure (4))). Four tractors worked dozing up soil from 50 meters on either side of the road. This was then capped with 8-12 inches of laterite from Hill 55. An average of 185 meters of new road was pioneered each day and by 30 June, the road was trafficable to within 500 meters of the proposed intersection with Route 14. During this period 8745 cubic yards of fill were hauled; 2664 manhours, 724 motor transport hours, and 701 heavy equipment hours, were expended in this effort. (See Exposures 7 through 16, Enclosure (4)).

(h) Route 14. The bridge (AT919577) was re-decked by Company "A", 3d Engineer Battalion. Work began at 1300, 25 June, and was completed at 1100, 26 June.

(2) Field Fortifications

(a) Bunker Erection. Company "B" completed the 4th Marines COC bunker on 3 June, having utilized 178 manhours, during June, and completed 3/12 communications bunker on 15 June having employed 713 manhours. On 23 June, Company "B" began the 4/12 FSOC bunker and had spent 284 manhours on it by the end of the month. In the DA NANG TAOR, Company "A" utilized 1934 manhours during 1-17 June in building blast walls around the operating rooms of 3d Medical Battalion; this job also included sandbagging the wall and installing half-culverts around the operating room.

(b) 3d Medical Battalion Wire Fence. Throughout the month Company "A" had the responsibility of installing defensive and protective wire fences around 3d Medical Battalion. This project included installation of high wire entanglements and concertina wire fences. Marine manhours at the end of the month were 1287 and Indigenous 2440.

(c) Salvage of Fortification Material. On 2 June, the salvage of fortification materials project was completed. The last work was done at (AT923737) and during June, 50 fence stakes were salvaged and 2900 feet of single strand barbed wire. This effort required 28 manhours by Marines and 160 by Indigenous labor.

(3) General Construction. Continued development and expansion of facilities in the Division Command Post took place during June. However, with the transfer of Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion in May, the "special project" organization was disbanded. The tasks for continuing the work were assigned to construction platoon, Engineer Support Company and 3d Platoon, Company "A". Work continued on the ADC quarters in PHU BAI. Numerous minor projects were completed in the battalion construction shop with the assistance of locally-hired Indigenous personnel.

(a) Division Command Post Facilities. A 96-foot quonset hut was built for the Provost Marshal and a 48-foot quonset was 90% complete by the end of the month. The 96-foot hut required many partitions making offices spaces, interview rooms, etc. This project required 1228 manhours by Marines and 160 manhours by Indigenous. The slopes of the banks in the Command Post area were rip-rapped to prevent erosion; this project was done primarily by Indigenous labor with Marines supervising. This project required 8320 man-hours by Indigenous and 1405 by Marines.

(b) Construction in PHU BAI. The primary project in PHU BAI was the continued construction of the ADC quarters. This included trim, plumbing, fixing windows, and installing electrical fixtures. At the end of the month, the project was 96% complete and 936 manhours by Marines had been devoted to the effort during June. Company "B" continued to assist MCB-7 in site preparation for the 4th Marines cantonment. A total of 271 manhours and 93 equipment hours were utilized in this project. Many miscellaneous jobs were also accomplished by Company "B" during June.

(4) Utilities. The 3d Engineer Battalion Utilities Platoon, continued to supply division units with potable and raw water. Twelve water points were operated during the month seven in the DA NANG TAOR and five at PHU BAI. Totals for June are as follows:

d. Infantry Role. The 3d Engineer Battalion remained committed to the defense and pacification of the Marble Mountain Air Facility Area. The battalion provided a platoon headquarters and one rifle squad; the platoon was commanded by SSgt R. A. PAINTER (1-6 June) and SSgt C. W. SNEDEKER (7-30 June). The platoon, which is under OPCON of III MAF, had the responsibility of controlling by active patrolling and perimeter defense positions in grid square (BFO573) and the village of XOM DA ME (BFO55728). Additionally, the corpsman for the platoon conducted an active MREDCAP program (See paragraph 8, Civil Affairs).

6. Communications

a. During June 1966, continuous communications was maintained with units of companies "A" and "C" while detached from the battalion area utilizing an AN/MRC-83 at each field position and an AN/PRC-47 at the battalion CP. Slight technical difficulties were encountered on three occasions with the AN/PRC-47 at which times an AN/MRC-83 was utilized at the battalion CP. One AN/PRC-25 is positioned with the second platoon of Company "C" for relay to and from all field positions if the need arises. Another AN/PRC-25 is monitored continuously at the battalion CP.

b. The AN/PRC-125 was withdrawn from the provisional platoon and installed in the Commanding Officer's vehicle. This radio is utilized constantly whenever the Commanding Officer leaves the battalion area for communications to and from the CP. No difficulties have arisen with this equipment.

c. The full compliment of AN/PRC-10's have been used daily for mine sweep teams, listening posts, helicopter direction, and communications within the provisional platoon with no major difficulties.

d. One AN/PRC-83 has been deadlined at FMSG for mechanical repairs, but caused no noteworthy decline in our communications capabilities.

e. Communications with Company "B" is still unreliable due to poor condition of their radio equipment.

f. No teletype circuit is maintained in the battalion; therefore, intra-division message traffic is delivered by helicopter courier service.

g. Wire communications is being used to it's full limitations utilizing our entire allowance of telephones plus an excess of ten. Withdrawal of the ten excess telephones would cause a noteable decrease in the efficiency of communications within the battalion.

7. Logisticsa. Supply Material

(1) Enclosure (5), Analysis of Outstanding Requisitions, reflects the battalion's supply posture at the end of June. Enclosure (6), Combat Essential End Items on Requisition, depicts the status of combat essential end items on requisition as replacement for previously evacuated equipment. The latter has been reduced with the receipt during the month of two urgently required end items, an M-60 Anthony Crane and a TL-16 Scoop loader. The arrival of these two items coincided with expanded operational commitments toward the southern position of the TACR. The two items are particularly suitable for diversified engineer requirements as encountered during June.

(2) Class I availability sustained an excellent status with the cessation of civil unrest and reopening of normal supply channels. Class II availability continued to be adversely effected by extended requisitioning lead time. Critical items were 3000-gallon tanks, required for division water points, $\frac{1}{2}$ " plywood, 16D and 20D nails, and screen wire mesh required for division cantonment construction projects. Class III, IV, and V availability was excellent. Enclosure (7) cites the expenditures of Class V for the month of June.

(3) On 17 June, the command was issued forty-nine hats, jungle type, green, to field test through the balance of the month. Distribution was made to Support, Companies "A" and "C" to be issued to individuals in forward areas. A report of results will be submitted by 5 July 1966.

(4) A special procurement trip to SAIGON was made early in June to procure green paint for the newly constructed division staff office building. While procurement outside of normal supply channels has been considerably reduced, requirements of this nature periodically arise are becoming less frequent is indicative of the overall improvement in responsiveness of normal supply channels.

(5) Two quonset huts were procured from MCB #1 for use within the division CP area during the month.

(6) Two 5000-gallon steel tanks were received from procurement sources in Okinawa on 20 June 1966. Their immediate installation in existing semi-permanent water points enabled four 3000-gallon collapsible tanks to be released for deployment to the more forward and less permanent water points. Availability of 3000-gallon tanks continued to be critical.

(7) Receipt of items procured in April from Camp Butler sources occurred during the month. Included were 16 electrical transformers (assorted KVA), sheet insulation (division construction projects), light green interior paint, white enamel paint, copper tubing, commodes and assorted plumbing fixtures, shower stalls and three water tanks (800 to 1000-gallon capacity).

(8) Canvassing of FLSG "A" storage lots resulted in issue to this organization quantities of sheet steel for equipment maintenance and metal fabrication, 3/4" and 1 1/2" pipe for plumbing projects, and a filter unit for a WUF 1160 water purification unit.

(9) Logistics support continued to be provided Company "B", located at PHU BAI. This consisted mainly of construction materials and repair parts. (See Enclosure (8)).

b. Maintenance

(1) Extended deadline intervals imposed severe limitations upon availability of TD-15 crawler tractors and P-153 mine detectors in view of the heavy operational commitments for these items. Seven TD-15's (of 14 on hand) were deadlined at 3d echelon most of the month as were fifteen (of 35 on hand) P-153 mine detectors. Assistance from higher headquarters was requested to expedite repair parts procurement.

(2) Motor Transport component part direct exchange program continued to be somewhat less than effective during the month. A total of 26 direct exchange TARO's were outstanding at the end of the month. The operational effectiveness of motor transport equipment has been adversely effected.

(3) The operational status of battalion equipment during June is reflected in enclosure (9). The residual combat readiness at the end of the month was 82 per cent.

(4) Enclosure (10), Operational Analysis Table, contains a breakdown of T/E and item average daily operating time, maintenance manhours per failure and days down time per failure. The basis was the first eight months expansive in Vietnam.

c. Food Services

(1) Approximately 41,323 meals were served during June consisting of the following:

- (a) 83% "A" Ration
- (b) 17% "B" Ration
- (c) Additionally 3,394 MCI's were consumed

(2) Availability of ice throughout the month was excellent, approaching 600 pounds per day.

(3) A field mess was operated by two men at (AT935663) for 1st Platoon (Rein), Company "A" in support of sustained field operation. Hot breakfasts and suppers were being served with resupply of fresh stores and ice daily.

d. Facilities

(1) Extension of the battalion water system into company billeting

areas, laundry, dispensary, and industrial area was accomplished.

(2) Improvement in grounds and drainage continued to be stressed throughout the month.

e. Industrial Relations

(1) A total of 204 indigenous personnel were being employed on 30 June. The AIK payroll approximated 603,000 piasters for June.

f. Medical

(1) The battalion aid station treated 948 men during the month.

(2) A total of 117 immunizations.

(3) The predominant afflictions were respiratory infections, gastroenteritis and diarrhea. There were 38 dermatological condition and numerous cases of heat rash.

g. Fiscal

(1) Enclosure (11) depicts the battalion fiscal status as of 15 June.

8. Civil Affairs

During June the 3d Engineer Battalion's Civil Affairs team continued to improve upon projects of a permanent nature and participated in joint ventures with the 3d Regiment and 9th Regiment.

In the DA SON dispensary both medical and dental treatment was administered to members of the surrounding hamlets. The III MAF Dental Team visited the dispensary on Monday afternoons and treated a total of 82 persons during the month. The program was initiated in May and its success will insure its continuation for months to come. The Medical Staff of 3d Engineer Battalion provided continuous medical treatment throughout the month. A total of 528 persons were treated at the dispensary. Medical requirements within the battalion and responsibility with other units in the rear area prohibited the development of an extensive MEDGAP Program in forward areas. For this reason medical attention has been directed toward military needs of the battalion and administration of the DA SON dispensary. A Vietnamese nurse has been included in the battalion civil affairs team. She has had previous experience as a nurse working for the Vietnamese government and is receiving further training from the 3d Engineers Medical Staff. She will administer aid in conjunction with the industrial relations office and is also helping to provide medical treatment at the DA SON dispensary.

On two occasions during June the DA SON dispensary was visited by representatives of American Aid Association. On 7 June, a group of doctors representing "Project Vietnam" were shown the dispensary. The doctors were in the country to observe medical practices and offer assistance, at their own expense, in the care and treatment provided in Vietnam. On 25 June, two representatives of the International Rescue Commission visited the dispensary. The representatives have been touring various facilities in Vietnam, in search of worthy recipients of grants-in-aid from the commission.

Along Route 5 in the hamlets of TUY LOAN (1), DUONG LAM (1), DUYEN SON (1) and LA CHAU (1), frequent visits were made by members of the battalion civil affairs team. Distributed to the people were wheat, clothing, school kits, and sewing kits. 3d Engineers use Route 5 South constantly and maintain a high volume of traffic, including equipment and material, on the road bound for forward project sites. The people have been cooperative with engineer efforts on the road.

The Indigenous employee program progressed during June. Presently 160 clearances of the 204 workers have been obtained through the Military Security Service in DA NANG. The Industrial Relations Department in DA NANG helped obtain the clearances.

In other areas of the 9th Marines TAOR a number of schools are being constructed. There was a requirement for blackboards in all the schools. The 3d Engineer Civil Affairs Team constructed six (6) blackboards for the schools and delivered them on 17 June to the 9th Marines Civil Affairs Officer. The boards will be included in the newly constructed schools.

Efforts were renewed in the 3d Marines TAOR. Aid has continued to PHU HA where refugee families have recently moved in. Material distributed in the hamlet included soap, wheat, clothing, and scrap lumber.

On June 10th the house of Mr. LE QUANG was repaired by members of the civil affairs team. Earlier an unidentified USMC vehicle had damaged a portion of the house by knocking over the wall.

In DAI IA twelve dump truck loads of scrap lumber ^{were} ~~was~~ delivered to be distributed among the hamlet members. The wood was used for the improvement of private dwellings.




