a. The strength of the battalion was decreased by a total of 44 during the month as follows:

b. A shortage of personnel exists in the following ranks:

On 1 July Major C. J. SMITH departed on PCS orders. GySgt W. F. FREESTONE, and Sgt J. B. HOLDER were WIA and Cpl J. H. RABER and Cpl P. W. BAXTER were KIA while on a mine clearing operation. Cpl R. H. MURPHY was WIA while on a search and clear with Company "C", 3rd Engineers.

On 2 July, Major C. D. WOOD assumed command of the 3d Engineer Battalion.

On 4 July Pfc J. J. SPINELLI was WIA while on a minesweep with K-3/9.

On 5 July, GySgt W. F. FREESTONE died of wounds incurred on 1 July.

On 6 July, Pfc D. R. SPICER departed on PCS orders in connection with emergency leave.

On 10 July, Sgt D. H. PERRIN was WIA while on a search and destroy with 1/9.

On 15 July, 2dLt R. K. CULLERS, Company "A", 1st Engineers and Cpl J. M. REID were KIA while on Operation HASTINGS, as the result of a helicopter being shot down.

On 16 July, Cpl L. E. POTTER was KIA while on Operation HASTINGS. LCpl G. T. LUNSFORD was WIA while on a search and destroy with 1/9.

On 18 July, LCpl J. T. KYSER and LCpl G. W. BARTLOW were KIA and Sgt J. W. ELLIOTT, Cpl V. ROSATI, LCpl W. G. BERNYK and Pvt R. M. SMITH were WIA while on Operation HASTINGS as the result of mortar and small arms fire.

On 20 July, Cpl C. F. HEFLIN was WIA while on a minesweep with 3/9. LCpl F. R. BROWN was WIA when the tractor he was operating ran over a mine.

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On 23 July, HM3 J. W. MINER, LCpl P. A. DAVIS, LCpl C. W. RUST Jr. and Pfc J. R. JONES were WIA while on a minesweep with 1/9. Cpl G. J. BALDASSARI and LCpl D. J. FERGUSON were WIA while on Operation HASTINGS.

On 25 July, Pfc G. R. HEAD was WIA while on Operation HASTINGS.

On 26 July, HM3 J. E. CHRISTIANSEN was KIA while on a minesweep with 1/9.

On 28 July, SSgt C. E. WILLEY and LCpl Z. M. FISSELL Jr. were presented the Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V" by the CG 3rd Marine Division.

On 29 July, 1stLt J. H. ARMSTRONG, SSgt L. C. FITTS, Sgt A. J. INFANTE and LCpl J. S. LUNDWALL were WIA while on a road sweep with 1/9.

The following awards were made during the month: 2, Bronze Star Medals with Combat "V", 1, Purple Heart Medal; 1, Letter of Appreciation; 14, Meritorious Masts; 2, Vietnam Crosses of Gallantry; 1 with Silver Star and one with Bronze Star.

The following recommendations for awards were submitted: 4, Bronze Star Medals with Combat "V"; 3, Navy Commendation Medals; 2, Letters of Appreciation.

The following promotions were made: 1 to 1stLt, 1 to WO, 1 to GySgt, 5 to SSgt, 28 to Cpl, 52 to LCpl and 3 to Pfc.

2. Administration

a. A debriefing was held on 31 July for all personnel departing on the August Rotation Draft.

b. During July, the Battalion Chaplain conducted ten (10) Protestant Services with a total attendance of 134. Five (5) Catholic Services were held in the Battalion Chapel. The Chaplain also held five (5) Memorial Services with a total attendance of 290, eight (8) Counseling Sessions and made twelve (12) hospital visits. The Chaplain spent 2 days with Company "B" at PHU BAI, further, he assisted in the dedication of "Liberty Road" on 4 July.

3. Intelligence

a. The S-2 Officer continued nightly intelligence meetings with coverage of all mine incidents in the DA NANG TAOR. Significant enemy troop movements and related reports were included when they applied to engineer projects. The progress of Operation HASTINGS, North of PHU BAI, was included. Periodically the enemy situation and order of battle were summarized at the nightly meetings. The Intelligence Chief gave periodic briefings at the Staff NCO Mess, and Mine Warfare School.

b. The Monthly Mine Report and Mine Analysis were submitted in the month of June (see enclosure (2)). In attempting to obtain the most information possible from each mine incident, the Intelligence Section developed a new format. This format includes the number of casualties incurred, when available, by the detonation of mines and boobytraps. Additional information includes location by coordinates, reporting unit, discovering or detonating unit, description and classification of the mine, and the date-time-group. A weekly compilation of these reports is being delivered to the III MAF Inspector's Office. In the Mine Report and Analysis for July a total of 268 incidents were recorded and of those 124 were cases of discovery and destruction. The remaining 144 were detonated.

c. Road construction in the southern extremities of the DA NANG TAOR required additional aerial photography of the area. Areas of interest included a possible bridge/ferry site across the THU BON River northeast of AN HOA. A reprint was received covering this area. Additional coverage has been requested from the III MAF Photo Interpretation Team of the area south of the bridge/ferry site as far as AN HOA, and will be received early in August.

4. Training

a. Emphasis continued on training personnel within the battalion. MOS training was conducted primarily on-the-job, however, certain specialized skills received more formalized training. GMS training was conducted outside of normal working hours or at job sites. Officers and Staff Non-commissioned Officers received instruction of one-half duration, two to three evenings weekly. Battalion Training Schedules are attached as encl (3).

b. Lectures were conducted weekly at company level on current events and topics of troop indoctrination.

c. On 25 July, Sgts E. R. RADFORD and G. M. CAMPBELL returned from Vietnamese Language School at Fort Buckner, Okinawa. LCpl R. E. KERRIGAN returned from Motion Picture Projectionist School, Yokusuka, Japan on 11 July and on 22 July LCpl J. R. DAFOE departed for the aforementioned school.

d. The 3d Marine Division Land Mine Warfare and Demolitions School conducted by the battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, and boobytraps, both US. and Viet Cong, and demolitions. The instruction was conducted by contact teams and by resident courses in the battalion school area. The following is a recapitulation of the training conducted by the school during July 1966:

(1) A contact instructor team, deployed to the PHU BAI TAOR on 27 June and presented a two-day, modified "A" Course to members of the 4th Marines and attached units, returning to the battalion area on 17 July. During 16 days of July, the contact team instructed 200 students. A contact instructor team was deployed to 1st AMTRAC Battalion on 23 July, where it instructed twenty personnel in demolitions.

(2) Formal classes at the landmine warfare and demolitions school (see enclosure (4); Photographs of the Landmine Warfare and Demolitions School):

e. The following classes were conducted at the 3rd Marine Division Field Fortifications School:

f. The Generator Operators School trained one operator from 1/1, two operators from 3rd Tank Battalion, two operators from 9th Motor Transport Battalion, two operators from FLSG, and two operators from 1/3. The above students were issued Generator Operators Licenses for 20KW, 30KW, and 60KW generators.

g. The tunnel teams continued to train during the month of July and were utilized on Operation MACON, two COUNTY FAIR Operations, and in the 2/9 TAOR.

h. The ADM Platoon conducted nine days of refresher training on Okinawa to WO1 READ, GySgt BUCY, GySgt SALDANA, SSgt MIGLORINI, and SSgt JONES.

5. Operations

a. General. During July, the 3rd Engineer Battalion (Reinforced) remained in general support of the 3rd Marine Division. Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion remained under operational control of the 3rd Engineer Battalion throughout the month. Employment of the battalion was in the following three categories: combat support, combat service support, and provisional rifle unit operations.

(1) Combat support operations consisted of providing mine detection and demolitions teams in support of infantry "search and destroy" operations and daily sweeps of MSRs for mines and boobytraps. In the DA NANG TAOR, combat support was provided to nine infantry battalions by Companies "A" and "C", 3rd Engineer Battalion and Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion. Company "B", 3rd Engineer Battalion supported five infantry battalions in the PHU BAI TAOR. The combat support provided involved:

(a) A total of 341 deliberate mine detector sweeps of MSR segments. Daily average distance swept was 24.6 kilometers.

(b) A total of 186 visual sweeps. Daily average distance was 16 kilometers.

(c) Excluding minefield clearance, 29 incidents that required engineer effort during sweeps. See paragraph 3, Intelligence.

(d) Total ordnance destroyed by combat engineers is recorded in enclosure (11).

(e) Support of Operations JAY, HOLT, MACON, and HASTINGS in addition to five company-size "search and destroy" operations.

b. Combat Support

(1) 1/1 TAOR. From 1 through 4 July, combat support was provided by the 1st Platoon (-), Company "C", commanded by 2dLt K. J. KIRIACOPOULOS which had a deployed strength of one officer and fourteen men. During this period engineers destroyed two tunnels at (BT081589), two tunnels at (BT089590) and a VC roadblock at (BT096571). On 5 July, the 2nd Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion, commanded by 2dLt E. C. HEINES, assumed the combat support of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. The strength of this platoon averaged one officer and 32 enlisted. Throughout the month, daily mine detection sweeps were conducted from the new CP location at (BT106583) to Route 14 (BT104588). On 9 July, a 105mm dud and a boobytrapped grenade were destroyed at (BT104580). On 11 July, a 60mm dud was destroyed at the CP and on 14 July, a 105mm dud and an 87mm dud were destroyed at (BT106608). On 16 July, six engineers departed the DA NANG area with two companies of 1/1 to participate in Operation HASTINGS. On 21 July, an additional deliberate sweep of 1000 meters of Route 14, (BT173581-181587), was started on a daily basis. This sweep was expanded 700 meters to the east to (BT165576) on 24 July. On the latter date, the sweep team located and destroyed in place, a mine wrapped

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in palm leaves and rigged for remote electrical detonation at (BT170581). On 26 July, an engineer demolition team destroyed six caves and one bunker in GS (BT1064).

(2) 2/1 TAOR. 1st Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineers attached to Company "B" and commanded by 2dLt R. K. CULLERS, continued to support 2/1 during July. This platoon continued to provide close combat support during Operation JAY which secured on 3 July. A strength of one officer and from 20 to 26 enlisted remained in the operating area near DONG HA (XD240610) until the commencement of Operation HASTINGS when this unit supported the maneuver elements of 2/1 throughout the remainder of the month. On 15 July, 2dLt R. K. CULLERS and Cpl J. M. REID were KIA when the helicopter in which they were passengers was brought down by enemy fire.

(3) 3/1 TAOR. One eight-man squad of Company "C", 3d Engineer Battalion continued to support 3/1 until 8 July, when this squad was relieved by a squad from Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion. Daily mine detection sweeps continued on the two lateral routes from AN TRACH (AT972662) and CAM ME (6) (AT977683) to Route 1C. A detail of one officer and five men continued removing the non-standard perimeter minefield started in June and completed removing and destroying the 572 mines on 5 July. On 12 July, punji traps near KHAI TAY (1) (BT050688) and two near KHAI TAY (3) (BT050667). This same team destroyed fourteen punji traps on 13 July near TU CHU (1), two of which were boobytrapped with CHICOM grenades.

(4) 2/3 TAOR. Combat engineer support in the 2/3 sector, continued to be provided by 1st Platoon, Company "A", commanded by 1stLt R. L. STUTTS. Daily mine sweeps continued from Hill 22 (AT954665) to Route 5 at (AT943663) and then south to the 2/3 CP (AT916582) and Hill 65 (AT878576) until 6 July when the Hill 22 access road sweep was turned over to the 7th Engineer Battalion. On 1 July, clearance of the minefield at the 2/3 CP was completed. This project was started in June. A total of 771-M16A1 AP mines, 9-105mm, 5-81mm, 7-60mm, and 1 French bomb (all rigged as mines) were removed. This same day work was started on the partial clearing of the ARVN minefield, on Hill 65 when the accidental detonation of two M16A1 mines resulted in one engineer KIA, two DOW, and one WIA. Work on this field continued throughout the month resulting in a total of 114-M16A1 mines removed. On 7 July, a deliberate sweep of Hill 22A (AT921674) which had been left unoccupied for one day revealed what appeared to be a dud M-26 grenade. When destroyed in place, a secondary explosion occurred 4 feet away. On 12 July, an additional sweep was started from Route 14 at (AT921577) south along the alinement of a north-south road development. On 15 July, engineers detected and destroyed a 10-pound SCHU mine at (AT892569). On 16 July, the sweep from (AT943663) south to (AT925606), AN MY (3) was turned over to the "A" Company, 9th Engineer Battalion. On 22 July, the sweep to the 2/3 CP was extended to the east along Route 14 to link up with a sweep conducted by Company "C", 3d Engineer Battalion. On 24 July, engineers located and removed one 60mm round with safety intact at (AT945585).

(5) 3/3 TAOR. Company "A", continued to provide general support for 3/3 during July. Six engineers participated in daily "search and destroy"

missions from 1 through 7 July. Three engineers were located at the CP from 8 through 13 July. Two engineers accompanied a company-size operation on 18 July. Three engineers conducted a deliberate mine detection sweep from Route 5 to the CP with negative results on 21 July.

(6) 1/4 TAOR. Combat engineer support continued to be provided by Company "B", and remained minimal throughout the month because of 1/4's position. Mine sweeps and demolitions support continued to be provided to patrols and CAC units upon request.

(7) 2/4 TAOR. The 1st Platoon, Company "B", commanded by 1stLt R. A. VANSICKLE continued the combat support of 2/4 through July. Daily mine detection sweeps were conducted on the MSR from (YD809164) to National Route 1. A four-man mine clearance/demolition team accompanied Company "G" on an operation from 9 through 12 July. On 11 July, this team found and destroyed two M16A1 mines and five pressure activated homemade concussion mines at (YD794107). On 13 July, one officer and 13 men supported 2/4 on Operation HASTINGS, which continued throughout the remainder of the month. On 16 July, a 60mm mortar round and an M-26 grenade, both rigged as mines, were located and destroyed at (YD811149). On 24 July, a sweep team destroyed a mine in place at (YD790104). On 26 July, a four-man team, sweeping (YD809153-836149), located and destroyed in place what appeared to be an old French mine.

(8) 3/4 TAOR. Company "B" continued to support 3/4 during July with demolition and mine sweep teams. During 1-7 July, daily mine sweeps were conducted from (YD635249) to (YD668270). During 4-6 July, twenty-six engineers provided close combat support for Operation HOLT. Starting on 13 July, 16 engineers were provided to support Operation HASTINGS which continued throughout the month.

(9) 1/9 TAOR. Combat support was provided to 1/9 by 4th Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 1stLt J. R. ARMSTRONG. The platoon remained billeted near the 1/9 CP in order to provide the constant close combat support required in this active TAOR. From 1-11 July, daily mine detection sweeps were conducted on the road from Hill 55 (AT970621) to HA DONG (AT989644) with no incidents.

3rd Shore Party Battalion assumed responsibility for this sweep for the remainder of the month. Daily road sweeps were also conducted supporting construction of Route 1D, the Liberty Road, to the intersection of Route 14 at (AT968584) thence progressively west supporting road repair. This team linked up with Company "A"'s sweep team on 22 July thus providing complete sweeping of Route 14 between the 2/3 CP and the intersection of the Liberty Road for the remainder of the month. In preparation for the repair of Route 14 from the intersection of the Liberty Road east, daily sweeps were started on 14 July and led construction crews on a daily basis throughout the month. On 18 July, on this new section of road, an M-51 dump truck went off the shoulder of the road at (AT974583), detonating an explosive device estimated to be 15 lbs of TNT. The dump truck was moderately damaged but there were no casualties. On 19 July, the security element for the sweep team detonated an M16A1 AP mine and a second unknown explosive device. These detonations caused one KIA, and one WIA in the security element, and four engineers WIA from the sweep team. On 26 July, an unidentified explosive device was detonated electrically at (AT984584) resulting in one engineer corpsman KIA. At approximately 1100 on

29 July, one of the infantry security personnel detonated an M16 mine near the village of NONG SON (1) (AT994575). During the attempt to evacuate the wounded another mine of the same type was detonated resulting in four engineers WIA, in addition to casualties among infantry personnel. Throughout the month, two to four-man engineer demolition teams supported infantry "search and destroy" operations largely in the section of the 1/9 TAOR bounded on the north by the SONG LA THO and the south by the SONG THU BON. The results of this activity are listed in enclosure (2) and enclosure (12).

(10) 2/9 TAOR. Combat support for 2/9 was provided by the 2d Platoon, Company "C", commanded by GySgt W. C. SCHICK until 8 July, when this platoon was relieved by the 1st Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 2dLt K. J. KIRIACOPOULOS. Since this is one of the most active TAOR's in the 3d Division, engineers were billeted at the CP and mine clearance/demolition teams constantly accompanied the forward companies in their operations. Daily mine detection sweeps were conducted on Route 10, Anderson Trail, from the CP east to Route 1, and intermittently, west to Route 1C. On 5 July, an alert sweep team noticed unusual footprints along the road, and located and neutralized a 15 lb SCHU mine at (AT998634). On 6 July, the sweep team on the east portion visually detected and removed two 15 lb SCHU mines from the road at (BT028648). On 12 July, the sweep team shortly located and destroyed a boobytrapped M-26 grenade at (AT994633). The mine clearance/demolition teams with the forward companies were employed daily in destroying large numbers of enemy fortifications, mines, and boobytraps and US dud ordnance. Totals are listed in paragraph 3 and in enclosures (2) and (12).

(11) 3/9 TAOR. Combat engineer support for 3/9 was provided by a 13-man detachment of the 3rd Platoon, Company "C", commanded by 1stLt D. A. DEMATTEO for the period 1-4 July. On 5 July, six additional engineers were furnished in preparation for Operation MACON. On 8 July, the 2d Platoon, Company "A", under the command of 2d Lt G. H. WALLS moved into this TAOR to support Operation MACON and remained until 14 July. A 5-man tunnel team from Company "A" was employed in the operation 10-13 July. Company "C" support throughout the month, consisted of performing deliberate road sweeps of sections of Provincial Route 40 from the AN HOA Industrial Complex (AT8746) to the SONG THU BON at (AT865487) and the road from the railroad track at (AT910486) to Provincial Route 40 at (AT903520). Additionally, three and four-man teams were with company operations on a daily basis, destroying enemy fortifications and mines. The results of these efforts are listed in enclosure (11).

c. Combat Service Support. Four categories of combat service support were provided. These were: (1) Roads and Bridges, (2) Field Fortifications, (3) General Construction, and (4) Utilities.

(1) Roads and Bridges. Throughout the month the primary route construction effort continued to be in the southern portion of the division TAOR. The completion of Route 1D, the repair of Route 14 between DAI LOC and Route 1, and the continued construction of Route 5 were of primary importance. Additionally, an access road was constructed from Route 14 to the 2/3 CP and several bridges were constructed or repaired throughout the Division TAOR.

(a) Route 1D (AT964609) to (AT968584), 1.7 miles. During the period 1-17 July, Company "C", assisted by motor transport, heavy equipment and personnel from Engineer Support Company, continued to improve the road and complete the final five-hundred meters to join Route 14. The road was opened between Hill 55 and Route 14 on 4 July. A Dedication Ceremony took place on that date and an appropriate sign was placed on the route. During this period 7,352 cubic yards of fill were hauled from the borrow pit at Hill 55; 2,390 man-hours, 638 motor transport hours, and 513 heavy equipment hours were expended on this project.

(b) Route 14, (AT914577) to (BT055589), 8.5 miles. Company "C", reinforced with heavy equipment, motor transport and personnel from Engineer Support Company began repairing this route on 6 July. The road had been cut in many places. Material was hauled from the borrow pit at Hill 55 to fill in the trenches. Company "A" was called upon to install a bridge at (AT925577). The existing concrete slab bridge at that location had been severely damaged and reinforcement of the structure was not feasible. The concrete bridge was demolished on 7 July. A timber bridge was started on 8 July, and completed on 12 July. Company "C" completed repair operations of this portion of Route 14 on 17 July and concentrated on that portion between the junction at (AT968584) and the junction of Route 1 and Route 14 at (BT055589). In spite of the constant nuisance mining by the Viet Cong which resulted in several casualties and damage to vehicles and heavy equipment, the work progressed on schedule. By 31 July the road was trafficable to (AT946583), a distance of 1.3 miles from Route 1D. A total of 928 cubic yards of material was hauled to repair this route expending 1005 man-hours, 164 motor transport hours, and 152 heavy equipment hours. 2d Battalion, 3rd Marines Command Post Road, (AT920574) to (AT919580), 400 meters. On 5 July, Company "A" with equipment and motor transport and personnel from the Engineer Support Company commenced construction of an access road for the 2/3 CP. The road consisted of 400 meters of steep side-hill cut and required extensive dozer work. The road was passable to all traffic on 8 July, however, work continued through 26 July on the installation of culverts, sandbag headwalls, and continued surface improvement. A total of 200 cubic yards of fill; 503 man-hours, and 76 heavy equipment hours were expended on this project.

(c) Route 5, (AT943663) to (AT911577), 6 miles. Between 1 July and 11 July, Company "A", assisted by equipment, motor transport and personnel of Engineer Support Company, continued to improve this route. On 10 July Company "A", was relieved of this construction responsibility by 7th Engineer Battalion elements. Moving further south, Company "A" continued construction of Route 5 from Route 14, at (AT922576) to the banks of the THU BON River at (AT921534), a distance of 2.8 miles. Construction on this section of Route 5 commenced on 13 July and by 26 July a pioneer route had been completed as far as the river. The expedient method of stripping topsoil for fifty yards on either side of the road and pushing it up to use as the subgrade was again employed. The subgrade was then capped with approximately twelve inches of laterite bringing the road to grade. The month's end saw Company "A" reinforced with personnel, heavy equipment, and motor transport from the Engineer Support Company, continuing to widen, cap, grade, and improve the drainage of this road. Three culverts were installed at (AT927570) and preparations

were made to install several more. During July, a total of 9,969 cubic yards of fill were hauled; 4,129 man-hours, 799 motor transport hours, and 1,025 heavy equipment hours.

(d) 3rd Engineer Battalion Bridge (AT947757). A bridge on the 3rd Engineer Battalion Access Road was constructed by elements of Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion in preparation for the heavy runoff during the monsoon rains. The bridge is of timber and of standard design over a gap of 36 feet. The construction started on 8 July, and was completed on 16 July. On 30 July, personnel and equipment of Support Company started improving the access road.

(e) 1/1 Bridges at (BT181587) and (BT090587). 2d Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion commenced major repairs of two bridges in the 1/1 TAOR on 11 July, and continued through 20 July when they were completed. Frequent small arms fire hampered the construction effort on the bridge at (BT090587).

(f) Dust Suppression Efforts, PHU BAI and DA NANG TAORs. During July, the dust suppression effort continued, with availability of equipment and materials. In the 1/9 TAOR, approximately 23,000 gallons of asphalt cut back was spread on 45 miles of road.

(2) Field Fortifications

(a) Bunker Errection. Company "B" expended 219 man-hours on the 4th Marines COC Bunker during the period 9-12 July. This bunker was completed during June, however, additional work was requested in July. Company "B" continued work on the 4/12 FSCC Bunker and completed the project on 4 July.

(b) Company "A" continued the work on defensive wire fences and bunkers around the 3rd Medical Battalion. This project was completed on 8 July. A total of 198 man-hours were expended on this job during the month.

(c) During the periods 3-5 July and 4-7 July assistance was provided by Company "B" to 3/12 and 1/4 respectively in erecting bunkers. These jobs required 64 man-hours, and 20 motor transport hours.

(d) Company "A", 1st Engineers began work at the 1/1 CP, placing wire and constructing an earthwork berm on the perimeter on 7 July, and work continued through 19 July. A total of 2,245 meters of defensive wire fencing and 4,125 meters of an earthen berm were constructed expending 872 man-hours, 92 equipment hours, and 28 motor transport hours.

(e) Beginning 24 July, Company "A" commenced construction of preparing defensive positions for the 1st Marines CP. These positions included four observation towers and two sentry booths. Additionally, heavy equipment was employed to level areas for tents and other cantonment facilities. Equipment was further used to dig positions for the defensive system on the perimeter. This project was completed on 31 July, expending 656 man-hours, and 140 heavy equipment hours.

(f) Company "A" excavated sites for seven ammunition bunkers and eight security bunkers on 3 July for 2/3. This work required 8 man-hours, and 8 heavy equipment hours.

(g) Drainage in and around the 2/3 CP fortifications was improved by Company "A" on 1-2 July. A small concrete wall was constructed at the CP bunker.

(h) Company "A" commenced constructing a site for one bunker for Headquarters Battalion. The bunker was located in a rive paddy and required fill to elevate it above the water level.

(3) General Construction. Development and expansion of facilities in the division command post were continued during July. This work consisted primarily of drainage adjacent to structures erected during the previous months. These drainage areas included the quonset hut area and at the Division Photography-Reproduction facilities. Work was completed on the ADC quarters at PHU BAI on 30 July. Numerous minor projects were completed by battalion construction shop, with the assistance of locally-hired Vietnamese carpenters.

(a) Refurbishment of the 3rd Marines CP was started on 25 July. The requirements of engineer assistance in this project were limited to drainage problem areas and the moving of several existing strongbacks to new locations. Three new strongbacks modified with tin roofs were constructed.

(b) Excavation and forming for the footings of a butler building at the 3rd Engineer Battalion Heavy Equipment lot were started on 22 July. This butler building will be used for a heavy equipment maintenance shop.

(4) Utilities. The 3rd Engineer Battalion Utilities Platoon continued to supply divisional units with potable and raw water. Twelve water points were operating during the month. Seven of these were in the DA NANG TAOR and five were in the PHU BAI and DONG HA areas. Totals for the month are as follows:

d. Infantry Role

(1) The 3rd Engineer Battalion assumed responsibility for defense and security of DAI LAI Pass (AT939753), relieving the 3rd Marines security detail on 12 July. 3rd Engineer Battalion personnel were augmented by 12th Marines personnel until 31 July when the security was taken over entirely by engineers.

(2) During the period 1-29 July the 3rd Engineer Battalion remained committed to the defense and pacification of an area near the Marble Mountain

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Air Facility. The battalion furnished an infantry squad plus the platoon headquarters, a total of 19 men. This platoon under OPCON of III MAF, had the responsibility of controlling by active patrolling and perimeter defense, positions in grid square (BT0573) and the village of KOM DA ME (BT055728). Additionally, the platoon conducted an active MEDCAP Program. (See paragraph 8, Civil Affairs).

6. Communications

a. During July continuous communications were maintained with units of companies "A" and "C" operating in the DA NANG TAOR.

b. The communications platoon of 1/4 performed minor repairs of the AN/MRS-83 attached to Company "B" which reestablished their radio communications with the 3rd Engineer Battalion CP. Though operational, the AN/MRS-83 remains in poor mechanical condition.

c. Two AN/PRS-10s and one RC-292 were sent to 3rd Platoon, Company "C", at AN HOA. This provided communications with the battalion CP, by relaying through 1st Platoon, Company "A". At present action is being taken to provide this platoon with a PRC-47 for direct communication with the battalion.

d. Two new PRC-47s were received of which one is being utilized on the battalion Command Net with notable improvement over the old one.

e. The AN/MRS-83 deadlined during June has not been returned from FLSG. Another AN/MRS-83 is presently at FLSG for electronic repairs. This leaves the battalion with one AN/MRC-83 and one AN/PRC-47 for back-up equipment which is considered sufficient at present.

f. The full complement of AN/PRC-10s are in continuous use on mine sweep teams, helicopter direction, and battalion security.

g. A new Teletype AN/TGC-14A(V) was received with extensive damage. It is presently undergoing a limited technical inspection at FLSG in preparation for return to F.S.R.

h. The battalion CP was rewired for telephone communications with notable improvement in appearance and maintenance.

7. Logisticsa. Supply Material

(1) Enclosure (5), Analysis of Outstanding Requisitions, reflects the battalions supply posture at the end of July. Enclosure (6), Combat Essential End Items on Requisition, depicts the status of essential end items on requisition as replacement for previously evacuated equipment. Enclosure (7), Critical Building Supplies on Requisition represents the shortage of nails and plywood in all sizes.

(2) Class I availability was sustained in an excellent status with no problem areas encountered during this period. Class II availability has not changed from previous reporting period. The extended lead time on requisitions has adversely effected the smooth operational capabilities of this organization. Enclosure (8), "Requisitioning Lead Time", is a copy of a letter submitted to the Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division explaining in detail the seriousness of the extended lead time involved with requisitioning activities.

(3) This organization procured one (1) butler building 40' x 100' from MCB 10, trading for a previously issued Stran building. This building will be erected in the industrial area, to be used as a heavy equipment repair shop, welding shop and parts storage.

(4) Nine P-153 Mine Detectors were picked up on temporary loan, six from 9th Marines and three from 3/3, to offset the critical shortage of this item due to the extended deadline rate at FLSG, caused by lack of replacement parts. The need for the P-153 has increased two-fold, with the extended TAOR and voluntary deadline of all AN/PRS-3s as a poor substitute for the P-153.

(5) This organization made the following recommendations of replacement factors on High Usage Items of Equipment to III MAF.

Contributing factors for the recommended increases are sustained by the experience factor in Viet Nam, high heat and humidity, extreme dust, lengthy pioneer road construction, and long operating hours. These conditions manifestly contribute to accelerated equipment deterioration.

(6) Enclosure (11) denotes the expenditures of Class V during the month.

b. Maintenance

(1) The extended lead time on requisitions for motor transport spare

parts are causing a severe deadline time on vital equipment.

(2) The limitation of the availability of fuel injectors for the MRS-100 is posing a problem in the maintenance of this vital equipment. Various tests are being made to determine the cause of the short life span of this particular fuel injector.

(3) The operational status of battalion equipment during July is reflected in enclosure (9). The combat readiness at the end of the month was 80 percent.

c. Food Services

(1) Approximately 31,581 meals were served during July consisting of the following:

- (a) 88% "A" Rations
- (b) 12% "B" Rations
- (c) Additionally 1,680 MCI's were consumed

(2) Availability of ice throughout the month continued to be of sufficient quantity with daily receipts and usages of 600 pounds per day.

d. Facilities

(1) Improvement in troop living quarters, grounds, and drainage continued to be stressed throughout the month with completion of the following projects:

- (a) Installation of cement block sidewalks in the officers living area.
- (b) Additional concrete drainage at the battalion Sick-Bay.
- (c) Concrete steps were installed at the battalion Sick-Bay from ambulance dismount point leading to entrance of treatment area.
- (d) Bulk fuel section hose were installed for drainage of grease traps from enlisted, SNCO, and officers messes. This was initiated to alter the drainage of spoilage into the troops living area, which was considered a sanitation hazard.
- (e) Completion of washroom and shower for SNCO's.
- (f) Transite roofing was installed on nine SNCO strongbacks. This completes this project.

e. Industrial Relations

(1) A total of 188 indigenous personnel were being employed on 31 July. The AIK payroll approximated 575,000 piasters for July.

(2) This organization received an allocation of 1,396,646 piasters from Division IRO for 1st Quarter FY-67. This amount is planned to sustain the employment of one-hundred-seventy-three (173) indigenous personnel for this period. It should be noted that verbal instructions have been received from Division IRO that, a drastic cut in AIK Funds are forthcoming. Positive instructions from IRO will be implemented in the near future as to maximum numbers of indigenous personnel this organization will be allowed to employ, and the type funds to be used.

f. Medical

(1) The battalion aid station treated 496 men during the month.

(2) A total of 290 immunizations were given during the month.

(3) The predominant complaints resulted from respiratory infections, gastroenterites and diarrhea. There were 29 dermatological conditions and numerous cases of heat rash.

g. Fiscal

(1) Enclosure (10) depicts the battalion fiscal status as of 30 June 1966.

8. Civil Affairs

a. From 18 July to 22 July the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer attended the MACV Advisor Orientation Course in SAIGON. The course was directed toward the U. S. Sector and Sub-sector Advisor, and included a familiarization of and orientation to the many aid programs provided by the United States, and the proper employment of them.

b. At the DA SON Dispensary a total of 489 persons were treated during the periodic sick calls held by members of the battalion medical staff. The total number included 53 men, 187 women, and 299 children. The Vietnamese nurse, hired during June, has provided much help at the dispensary and can operate the sick call independantly. She has been employed at the IRO Office to administer medical treatment to members of the Indigenous Labor Force. The III MAF Dental Team visited the dispensary twice during the month of July and treated 13 women and 21 children or a total of 34 persons. On 19 July the battalion surgeon gave the DA SON Hamlet Chief three boxes of assorted toys. These were distributed to children at the school.

c. Over the past several months the Hamlet of PHU HA has joined 20 refugee families. At present most of the men are unemployed. The Civil Affairs Officer made available clearance forms for these men and has included them on the replacement list at the Industrial Relations Office. When it is possible to make replacements individuals from PHU HA will be able to join the battalion's Indigenous Work Force.

d. Two dump truck loads of useable scrap lumber was delivered to a church in HOA MY Hamlet. The wood will be used to construct benches for Vietnamese attending the church. Personnel from the ARVN engineer compound adjacent to the church have agreed to construct the benches with the wood provided by 3rd Engineers.

e. On 15 July, the Civil Affairs Officer met with Mr LE KHANH, the Hamlet Chief of PHU HA, to discuss the feasibility of constructing a school in the hamlet. The meeting was followed up by additional meeting with the chief and the head master at the school in PHU THOUNG, Father HUYNH QUANG SINH. The resulting project was the construction of a high school in PHU HA. There are five trained teachers available who are qualified to teach the GVN approved curriculum. These teachers are nuns provided by the bishop in DA NANG. The design of the school has been completed and approved and a bill of materials is in process of completion. Materials required: cement, brick, and tile for for the roof, are being supplied by Division G-5. Construction should begin early in August.

Legal activity during July continued at a favorable level. A statistical breakdown of legal follows:



1. References (a) and (b) admonished unit commanders against "layering" of supplies. Reference (c) further directed this unit to live within a 45 day requisitioning objective which includes a 15 day requisitioning lead time.

2. In early June 1966, this command, recognizing the extended lead times being experienced in the Republic of Viet Nam, reviewed the repair parts requirements in the motor transport and engineer equipment areas. A program was developed whereby the anticipated six months requirements for repair parts were determined. The quantity presently on requisition was then ascertained and the differences between the six months requirements and the quantities on order were placed on priority 17 requisitions. This action has been subsequently retracted as directed by reference (c).

3. Enclosure (1) outlines the battalion requisition status as of 6 July 1966. A more abbreviated format of this analysis has been submitted with each LOGSUM and LOGSIT report since November 1965. This particular version has been expanded to indicate the quantity of requisitions outstanding over ninety days, and the distribution among the functional areas.

4. The situation portrayed by enclosure (1) is not surprising to anyone closely associated with supply support in Viet Nam during the past twelve months. It does, however, illustrate the gravity of the extended lead time involved with requisitioning activity. Simply stated, portrays a distinct lack of supply responsiveness within the time frames authorized by reference (d). A detailed analysis of enclosure (1) reveals the following.

Encl (8) (4)

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a. Over 26% of all outstanding requisitions exceed six months longevity. Paralleling this, 20% of all outstanding engineer and motor transport equipment repair parts requisitions exceed six months life.

b. In addition to the above, another 26% of the outstanding requisitions fall within the three months to six months life category. By the same token, 32% of all engineer and motor transport repair parts requisition fall in this category.

c. The analysis in other functional areas is very similar, and establishes a realistic basis for assuming that one of every two requisitions will not be filled in less than three months and one of every four will exceed six months duration.

5. Faced with the situation described above, and having seemingly exhausted all attempts to meet minimum requirements within the established supply procedure limitations, and after repeated declarations as this being a significant problem area within the periodic LOGSUM and LOGSIT reports, the action as described in paragraph 1. was initiated. The theory underlying that action was:

a. To initially generate an influx of repair parts without abusing the priority system, establishing on hand stocks and a requisitioning objective that could cope with the actual lead time being experienced.

b. Normal priority 17 requisitions could then be utilized to maintain the requisitioning objective and preclude the necessity of priority 02 and 05 requisitions for all but the most urgent situations.

c. Close monitoring of the 708 cards was to be accomplished to adjust for improved item availability, negation of any excess generation or conversely, to adjust for conservative reorder points.

d. The remunerations of this program would not be realized for three to six months, based upon the evidence of enclosure (1). However, the relief would be expected to be forthcoming at an extremely critical period; during the wet monsoon when all available engineer equipment will be required to maintain the MSR's of widely dispersed units within a greatly expanded Division TACR.

e. The 708 card usage data is not wholly adequate nor realistic under the current conditions of supply and maintenance response. The majority of 3d echelon equipment failures result in deadline for periods of one to four months due to lack of 3d echelon repair parts at the FLSG/FLSU level. This "down time" reduces usage of repair parts and the reorder points are thus not being computed on realistic data.

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6. As previously stated, compliance with reference (c) is being accomplished. However, there being no evidence of a remedial trend in recent months, and faced with the impending urgent tactical engineer employment needs in support of division units it is recommended that the action directed in reference (c) be rescinded. This would allow anticipated requisitioning action in correlation with experienced lead time and insure maximum availability of engineer and engineer-oriented motor transport equipment during the forthcoming monsoon period.


