a. The strength of the Battalion was decreased by a total of nine (9) during the month as follows:

 - (a) Battle: 3 (3 WIA, Evacuated)
 - (b) Non-Battle: 4
 - (c) Administrative: 72

b. A shortage exists in the following ranks and MOS's;

On 1 September LCpl J. E. GREESEM was WIA while on a search and destroy operation with 2/3.

On 4 September the Engineer Camp was dedicated as Camp STEPHENS in memory of the battalion's first man killed in action.

On 6 September Sergeant R. A. REAMS departed on emergency leave to CONUS.

On 8 September Corporal D. E. POTTER departed on emergency leave PCS to CONUS.

On 14 September Sergeant L. B. SEARS returned from emergency leave. Sergeant C. R. EDGE was WIA while operating a 550 grader when it struck a mine.

On 17 September Captain G. H. ROOT was WIA from an unknown explosive device while on a road recon.

On 18 September LCpl J. E. BANKS was wounded by sniper fire while riding shotgun on a grader.

On 19 September Staff Sergeant P. R. CAMPANA departed on emergency leave to CONUS.

On 26 September Major J. A. SHEARMAN joined the battalion.

On 27 September Private First Class T. E. BENNETT was WIA while on Operation PRAIRIE.

On 28 September 2dLt K. J. KIRIACOPOULOS and Lance Corporal G. G. MORSE JR. were WIA while on Operation PRAIRIE.

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On 29 September Private First Class J. V. CROMIE was WIA for second and third time while on Operation PRAIRIE. Major G. M. PEARCE JR. joined the battalion for duty as relief for Major C. D. WOOD.

On 30 September a change of command was held and Major G. M. PEARCE relieved Major C. D. WOOD who rotates to CONUS.

The following awards were made during the month: 12 Purple Heart Medals; 25 Meritorious Medals; 1 Letter of Appreciation; 1 Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

The following recommendations for awards were submitted: 2 Bronze Star Medals; 2 Navy Commendation Medals; 1 Navy and Marine Corps Medal.

The following promotions were effected: 1 to Master Sergeant; 2 to Gunnery Sergeant; 3 to Staff Sergeant; 35 to Sergeant; 5 to Corporal; 5 to Lance Corporal; 8 to Private First Class.

2. Administration

a. A debriefing was held on 30 September for all personnel departing as part of the October Rotation Draft.

b. The battalion promotion board met on 28 September.

c. Morale, Welfare and Chaplains Activities

(1) Morale

(a) The following R&R quotas were utilized by this battalion: Okinawa - 9; Hong Kong - 6; Bangkok - 8; Taipei - 4; Singapore - 2; Penang - 2; Kuala Lumpur - 1; Manila - 1; Tokyo - 8; Hawaii - 1.

(b) Each Sunday approximately forty (40) men are transported to China Beach Recreational Facility. Picnic style food, beer and soda are provided at no cost to the individual.

(2) Welfare

(a) Improvement of billeting, messing and recreational facilities is being continued.

(3) Chaplains Activities

(a) During the month of September, Catholic and Protestant services were held each Sunday morning in the battalion chapel. On two Sundays the Chaplain travelled to Hill 5 and remained overnight conducting a service on the hill in the evening and one on Monday morning for A-1/9. A memorial service was also held in the battalion on 3 September.

(b) The Chaplain visited ten (10) people in the hospital and counseled six (6) men. A class was conducted for 35 Staff NCO's, a prayer was

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offered at the dedication of Camp STEPHENS, and arrangements were made for 50 children from an orphanage in PHU THUONG to visit the battalion for a USO show.

(c) The new battalion chapel was built, and dedicated on 25 September. Also a bell was installed in the new chapel and dedicated as a memorial to those killed in action. The bell was purchased and donated by a couple in Muskegon, Michigan, and shipped to DA NANG via Navy Air Transport.

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3. Intelligence

a. The Intelligence Officer provided nightly briefings for the Commanding Officer, Staff Officers, Company Commanders and Section Heads. Included were all reports on mine and boobytrap incidents in the DA NANG TAOR, and significant intelligence reports relating to engineer project areas. The Intelligence Chief gave periodic briefings to the battalion staff non-commissioned officers.

b. The monthly mine incident report was submitted for the month of September 1966 (See Enclosure 2). Copies of the daily mine and boobytrap report were delivered to III MAF each week. In compliance with Division Order 3435.1A, the battalion intelligence section submitted 16 reports on mine and boobytrap incidents involving 3d Engineer Battalion personnel. In this month there was a total of 201 mine/boobytrap incidents, 84 discovered, 117 detonated.

c. Two VC mine and boobytrap reports are under preparation by this section. Each deals with new or recent trends in the construction and/or deployment of these devices. Both reports will be promulgated in the near future.

d. On 26 September 1966, the Intelligence Section received its semi-annual Commanding General's Inspection, by the Assistant G-2, 3d Marine Division. No discrepancies were noted.

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4. Training

a. Emphasis continued on training personnel within the battalion. MOS training was conducted primarily on-the-job, however, certain specialized skills received more formalized training. GMS training was conducted outside of normal working hours or at job sites. Officers and staff non-commissioned officers received instruction of one-half hour duration, two to three evenings weekly. Battalion Training Schedules are attached as Enclosure (3).

b. Lectures were conducted weekly at Company level on current events and topics of troop indoctrination.

c. On 24 September, Corporal G. J. LONG departed for Motion Picture Projectionist School, YOKOSUKA, Japan.

d. The 3d Marine Division Land Mine Warfare and Demolitions School, conducted by the battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, boobytraps, and demolitions. The instruction was conducted by contact teams and by resident courses in the battalion school area. On 12 September a branch of the school was established in PHU BAI for the purpose of training division units in the PHU BAI - DONG HA area. The following is a recapitulation of the training conducted by the school during September 1966:

(1) Contact instructor teams deployed to the 3d Shore Party Battalion on 6 September and instructed 75 students in VC mines and boobytraps; to "B" Btry, 13th Marines on 18 September and instructed 150 students on placement and pyrotechnics; and to 3d Motor Transport Battalion on 26 September and instructed 92 students on Claymore mines.

(2) Formal classes at the Land Mine Warfare and Demolitions School:

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e. The Generator Operators School trained four operators from 5th Communications Battalion, two operators from 3d Recon Battalion and two operators from 2/26. The above students were issued Generator Operators Licenses for 20KW and 60KW generators.

f. The tunnel teams continued to train during the month and participated in tunnel destruction in east DA NANG.

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5. Operations

a. General. During September, the 3d Engineer Battalion remained in general support of the 3d Marine Division. Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion remained under operational control of the 3d Engineer Battalion throughout the month. Employment of the battalion was in the following three categories: combat support, combat service support, and provisional rifle unit operations.

(1) Combat support operations consisted of providing mine detection and demolition teams in support of infantry "search and destroy" operations and daily sweeps of MSR's for mines and boobytraps. In the DA NANG TAOR, combat support was provided to nine infantry battalions by Companies "A" and "C", 3d Engineer Battalion, and Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion. Company "B", 3d Engineer Battalion supported four (4) infantry battalions in the PHU BAI TAOR. The combat support provided involved:

(a) A total of 213 deliberate mine detector sweeps of MSR segments. Daily average swept was 28 kilometers.

(b) A total of 193 visual sweeps. Daily average distance was 25 kilometers.

(c) Excluding clearance, 16 incidents that required engineer effort during sweeps, See paragraph 3, Intelligence.

(d) Total ordnance destroyed by combat engineers is recorded in Enclosure (11).

(e) Support of operations PRAIRIE, PAWNEE, PAWNEE II in addition to nine (9) company size "search and destroy" operations.

b. Combat Support

(1) 1/1 TAOR - The 2d Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion, commanded by 2dLt L. W. PRICE JR., provided combat engineer support for the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines throughout the month. The platoon strength averaged 26 during September. Three (3) engineers conducted daily deliberate sweeps over MSR (BT106583) to (BT104588), a distance of 700 meters. This platoon supported four (4) company-sized "search-destroy" operations providing demolitions and mine clearing personnel.

(2) 2/1 TAOR - During September the 1st Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion commanded by 2dLt T. C. CARTWRIGHT continued to provide close combat engineer support to this battalion. During the month infantry companies had a small number of engineers with them at all times. Additionally, engineers swept an average of 5500 meters of roads daily by visual means. Deliberate sweeps were commenced late in the month on sectors of the MSR.

(3) 3/1 TAOR - Engineers from the 3d Platoon, Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion commanded by 2dLt F. J. HALLISSEY provided sweep team and demolition teams, in this TAOR. During September, three (3) Company-sized operations required demolition support. Beginning on 17 September, and daily thereafter, engineers visually swept 7,200 meters of the MSR.

(4) 2/3 TAOR - The 2d Platoon, of Company "A", 3d Engineer Battalion continued to provide support within this area. During September as many as five (5) deliberate sweeps and five (5) visual sweeps were conducted daily,

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averaging 32,00 meters. The platoon was led by gunnery sergeant Joseph VANCE until his relief on 3 September by 2dLt E. C. WENTWORTH. On 1 September one engineer was wounded by a fragment from an M-16 mine detonated by a member of the security party.

(5) 2/26 TAOR - Engineers of Company "A", 3d Engineer Battalion provided support to 2/26 on an "on call" basis. One company requested a mine detection team for a search and destroy operation. It was thought that the mine detector would assist in locating arms and ammunition caches. Additionally since many VC tunnels are often shored up with steel barbed wire pickets the mine detector might enable the Marines to locate tunnels. However, no finds resulted in either case.

(6) 1/4 TAOR - Company "B" continued to provide support in the form of mine clearance teams and demolition teams. Demolition teams were assigned to infantry companies during Operation PRAIRIE and Company "B" provided general support to all the battalions involved in the Operation. Company "B" engineers continued to sweep routes by visual and deliberate means and averaged sweeping 2,300 meters of roads daily.

(7) 2/4 TAOR - 2/4 continued participating in Operation PRAIRIE with engineer demolition teams in direct support of the companies. Three (3) combat engineers were placed in direct support of Company "C", 3d Tank Battalion.

(8) 3/4 TAOR - Company "B" engineers continued to support operation PAWNEE and PAWNEE II during September.

(9) 1/9 TAOR - Engineers of Company "C", commanded by 1stLt D. A. DEMATTEO continued close and general support rolls for the first and third battalions of 9th Marines. Daily mine sweeps of the roads resulted in six (6) incidents involving mines or VC ambushes set for the sweep teams and the security elements. On 2 September a box mine was located and destroyed at (AT978584). On 14 September, two 81mm mortar rounds rigged as mines were located and destroyed. On 19 September engineers in direct support of a company "search and destroy" operation destroyed eight (8) bunkers, 3 tunnels and several dud artillery and mortar rounds in GS (AT9760). A command type directional mine fired electrically preceded an ambush set for the sweep team and security element at (AT908477). There were no USMC casualties. One VC was killed and one SMG captured. Again on 25 September the sweep team was ambushed at (AT968598) receiving heavy automatic weapons fire. (See Enclosure 4, page 8). Return fire was given and contact was broken off by the VC. There were no casualties to either USMC or VC. Barely 40 minutes later this sweep team was again ambushed, however, the fire was less intense. Again there were no casualties. A few minutes later, a road block of bamboo and steel was encountered and removed.

(10) 3/9 TAOR - Daily sweeps both visual and deliberate, produced good results in locating VC mines in this TAOR. Engineers of Company "A" conducted sweeps along the AN HDA highway. On 5 September one mine improvised from a 105mm round was found and destroyed at (AT908498). On 11 September an

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M-51 dump truck detonated a mine at (AT923517). No casualties resulted from this incident. At (AT907494) 12 September an M-14 mine was located and destroyed. On 14 September one 550 Grader was damaged by a detonated mine. One WIA resulted, non medevac. On 17 September, two (2) box mines were located and destroyed at (AT922516). On 20 September at (AT918516) another box mine was located and destroyed. On 23 September a mine improvised from a 60mm round and another improvised of an M-26 grenade was found and destroyed. Also one VC was apprehended in the same vicinity (AT912506). These sweep teams averaged 4,600 meters daily by visual means and 8,000 meters deliberate. Within this TAOR also was the 1st Platoon of Company "C" commanded by 2dLt L. G. ELDER. This Platoon provided combat engineer support for the infantry companies on "search and destroy" missions. Demolition teams destroyed several bunkers, tunnels, punji pits and ordnance as reflected in Enclosure (11).

(11) During September a Platoon of the east DA NANG combined action company captured one VC after a brief firefight. After intense interrogation the prisoner revealed the location of three tunnels at (AT044769) and at (BT043771). The CAC unit requested engineers to investigate the tunnels. On 10 September the 3d Engineer Battalion Executive Officer, Major W. G. VIERS JR. assisted by 2dLt E. A. CLARK and Private L. D. ROSSER investigated the tunnels with a view to determine their size and exact location. The tunnels were found to have been used extensively and recently. Although the tunnels were comparatively small, they were large enough to accommodate approximately thirty (30) VC estimating the amount of explosives necessary to destroy the tunnels. Major VIERS dispatched demolitions personnel of Company "A" to destroy the tunnels. It should be noted that these tunnels were within 1000 meters of the III MAF Headquarters, 1400 meters from Headquarters, Naval Support Activity, within 60mm mortar range of I Corps Headquarters, and many other U. S. and RVN activities.

c. Combat Service Support

(1) Roads and Bridges. The major construction project during the month was the extension of Route 5 to AN HOA. Emphasis was placed on widening the roadway, adding fill to raise several of the causeways, grading, and ditching. Enemy activity continued to impede construction efforts. These activities included mining the road and sniping at equipment. Equipment losses due to enemy action included 1 M-51 dump truck and 1 550 grader. The ferry, located at (AT922534), was operational, but due to a marked drop in the level of the THU BON river the LCM-8 did most of the ferry work. With the approach of the monsoon and the drainage problems that it presents the ditching and culverting work done reevaluated and four (4) additional culverts were installed while others required extension to accommodate widening of the road. The pit located at (AT907511) continued to provide a good source of fill and during the month 4,495 cubic yards were extracted from this area. The route construction effort for the month expended 1179 man-hours. During the week of the eleventh, heavy equipment not needed for the completion of the road was returned to the battalion, leaving 1 550 grader, 3 M-51 dump

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trucks, 1 TD-18, 1 TD-15 working on the project. All heavy equipment and motor transport personnel and equipment were returned to the 3d Engineer Battalion CP by the 23d of the month.

(a) Bridge Construction Route 9

(PHU BAI TAOR) - Company "B" commenced work on Route 9 in the DONG HA and CAM LO areas. The work accomplished was primarily site preparation for the nine (9) bridges which will be repaired or rebuilt. Work was done on bridges at (YD096575), (YD026575), (YD182587) and culverts at (YD182587) and (YD149587). In addition fill was hauled and stockpiled. By-pass construction to allow tanks to skirt the damaged bridges and headwall erection were also completed during the month.

(b) LCU Ramp (DONG HA)

Construction of the ramp was completed with the placement of 150 cubic yards of fill on 2 September and assistance was given to MCB-7 in loading and hauling fill.

(c) Artillery Access Road (PHU BAI)

285 cubic yards of fill were hauled and spread and 300 cubic yards of fill were stockpiled for future use on this project.

(d) Dust Suppression

During the month 22,399 gallons of water and 3900 gallons of asphalt diesel solution were spread in the DA NANG and PHU BAI TAOR's. 545 miles of road surface were treated.

(2) Field Fortifications. During September requests for inspection of bunkers were made to determine if they could withstand the heavy rains and the resultant additional weight. 1/12, 2/12 and the 12th Marines CP were inspected and discrepancies were pointed out to Unit Commanders. 2/12 bunkers were in excellent condition. Seven enlisted men under the supervision of 1stLt R. T. BELLESHEIM removed approximately 400 meters of minefield for MAG-16, near Marble Mountain. A total of 256 mines were removed. (See Enclosure 4, page 4).

(3) General Construction. Work continued on projects begun in August. Two Marines and a crew of Vietnamese laborers continued throughout September to work on the Headquarters Battalion Enlisted Club (See Enclosure 4, page 1). Construction of a school in the village of PHU HA was commenced on 2 September. (See Enclosure 4, page 2). Two Marine engineers and an operator for the concrete mixer assisted local civilians in the construction of decks. Although an excellent working relationship with the local civilians has been established the work progressed slowly. This was due to the non-

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availability of the Vietnamese for work on the school. In the 3d Engineer Battalion area work on a Battalion Chapel was begun on 11 September and completed for the dedication ceremony on 25 September. (See Enclosure 4, page 3). The senior officer's living quarters in the Headquarters Battalion area was modified by the addition of hinged shutters and canvas curtains. (See Enclosure 4, page 10 and 11). These modifications will prevent rain from blowing into the billeting spaces. In the 3d Engineer Battalion CP area work was started to improve the enlisted living quarters. The work was done by the members of the respective companies. (See Enclosure 4, page 12). The majority of the battalion was living under tin roofed buildings by the end of the month. (See Enclosure 4, page 13). Renovation of the Division COC office which was begun in September and was completed on 30 September was accomplished with close coordination with communications and much of the new construction was pre-fabricated to speed the project. The resulting layout of the COC enhanced the efficiency of the office.

Company "B" constructed strongbacks for their quarters and office spaces in the vicinity of DONG HA. Company "C" completed a large drainage complex in the Headquarters Battalion area. Ditches were lined with rock masonry to prevent scouring. (See Enclosure 4, pages 4 & 5). Indigenous personnel employed by the 3d Engineer Battalion started cutting, transporting and placing sod on steep, bare banks of earth in the Headquarters Battalion area where new construction and fill is susceptible to serious erosion problems. (See Enclosure 4, page 6). This is a very effective erosion control method. Cost and availability makes it particularly desirable over the rock masonry or rip-rap methods. A Butler building to be used by 3d Engineer Battalion as a Heavy Equipment Maintenance Shop was completed early in the month. (See Enclosure 4, page 7). This facility will greatly improve maintenance effort of this organization by giving 100% more working space to Heavy Equipment and Motor Transport.

(4) Utilities. The 3d Engineer Battalion Utilities Platoon continued to supply divisional units with potable and raw water. Twelve water points were operating during the month. Nine of these in the DA NANG TAOR, and three were in the PHU BAI TAOR and DONG HA areas. Totals for the month are as follows:

(5) DAI LAI Pass - By assuming the responsibility of providing the security detachment in the DAI LAI Pass the 3d Engineer Battalion became, in part, a provisional rifle unit. The men who man the pass guard are provided by the individual companies on a rotating basis. The detail is responsible for checking vehicles and indigenous personnel going through the pass and providing nighttime security. During the daylight hours six (6) men are on duty and at night they are augmented by seven more men. (See Enclosure 4, pages 14 & 15).

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6. Communications

a. The Battalion Command Net continued to provide operational communications with units of Companies "A" and "C" while operating away from the battalion area, and Company "B" at PHU BAI. The net consisted of three (3) AN/MRC-83's, eleven (11) AN/PRC-25's, and one (1) AN/PRC-47's. Seven (7) TA-312/PT telephones were received and installed to provide better service to the "S" sections, Officer's Mess and Communications Officer. A new COI was received and the new pyrotechnique information was disseminated. Lieutenant DUBE from 7th Engineers conducted an inspection of communication-electronic equipment on 6 September. 5th Communications Battalion installed wooden telephone poles in the Engineer Support Company area on 9 September 1966. This was done to facilitate erection of a 100 pair cable from Shave to Red Beach. Between 13 September and 18 September 1966 the battalion received forty-three (43) AN/PRC-25 radios. Distribution of these radios to field units was begun on 14 September 1966. Lance Corporal DANIELS and Private BUTLER passed the crypte beard examinations and are new members of the crypte beard. The Commanding General's inspection of communication-electronic equipment was conducted on 27 September by Captain SEYMOUR of the Division GEO office. The Division wire officer, Captain HAMMOND informed the Communications Officer that the battalion trunk lines would be installed on the III MAF pole system.

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7. Logisticsa. Supply Material

(1) Class I availability was sustained in an excellent status with no problem areas encountered during this reporting period, Class II availability has not changed from previous reporting period. The operational capabilities has been effected by the extended lead time on requisitions.

(2) Enclosure (5), analysis of outstanding requisitions, reflects the battalion's supply posture at the end of September. Enclosure (6), Combat Essential End Items on requisition, depicts the status of essential end items on requisition as replacement for previously evacuated equipment. Enclosure (7), Critical Building Supplies on requisition represents the shortage of nails and plywood in all sizes.

(3) Enclosure (9) denotes the expenditures of Class V during the month. This organization procured one (1) Butler building 40'x100' from 30th NCR. This building is being erected in the industrial lot, to be used as a construction and storage facility. Building materials that are adversely effected by inclement weather will be stored in this area.

(4) The continued requirement for the P-153 Mine Detector remains urgent with the increased size of the TAOR and the deadline of all AN/PRO-3's. The availability of third echelon repair parts for the mine detector has declined slightly from previous report. At present there are 7 on 2d echelon and 12 on 3d echelon deadline for spare parts.

(5) This organization received a special allowance for the following items to be used by tunnel teams. These items have been placed on requisitions:

b. Maintenance

(1) The direct exchange program for certain motor transport component items has shown signs of effectiveness from last reporting period. The principle items that are experiencing some difficulty are listed below, are associated with M-54, M-37 and M-51 trucks.

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- (a) Door Glass
- (b) Wheel Cylinders
- (c) Carburetors
- (d) Radiators
- (e) Tongue Rods
- (f) Braks Shoes

(2) The battalion equipment maintenance posture improved slightly, enhanced by the improvement of the direct exchange program as cited in paragraph 7b(1). Operational readiness of 77.7% was attained by the end of the month, as reflected in Enclosure (8).

c. Feed Service

(1) Approximately 30,480 meals were served during September consisting of the following:

- (a) 867 "A" Rations
- (b) 47 "B" Rations
- (c) Additionally 2496 MCI's were consumed

(2) Availability of ice throughout the month continued to be of sufficient quantity with daily receipts and usages of 600 pounds per day.

d. Facilities

(1) Improvement in troop living quarters, grounds, industrial area, and drainage continued to be stressed during the month, the following facilities and projects are in progress:

- (a) Battalion Chapel
- (b) Cerrugated Tin Roofing on Troop Living Quarters
- (c) Heavy Equipment "Butler Building"
- (d) Construction Shap "Butler Building"

(2) Considerable progress was made on the installation of culverts, wingwalls, headwalls and ditches within the battalion area.

e. Industrial Relations

(1) A total of 182 Indigenous personnel were being employed on 30 September 1966. The monthly payroll is now approximately 650,000\$ VN Piastras.

(2) On the last pay day preceding the beginning of the Lunar Year, each eligible employee on the payroll shall be paid a "TET" bonus. An employee who has been on the payroll for one year prior to payment of the bonus will be entitled to the full bonus value which will include one-twelfth of his annual salary, one-twelfth of the annual value of his family allowance, and one-twelfth the annual value of his language differential. An employee on the payroll that has less than twelve months continuous service, shall be paid the prorated value of the "TET" bonus. Prorating shall be accomplished by counting one-twelfth of the bonus value command for each month of service or functional part of a month of fifteen or more calendar days. The approximate cost will be 506,646\$ VN Piastras for 180 indigenous personnel working an overall average of six (6) months during the calendar year.

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f. Medical

- (1) The battalion aid station treated 339 men during the month.
- (2) A total of 405 immunizations were given during the month.
- (3) The predominant complaints resulted from respiratory infections, 52 gastroenteritis and diarrhea. There were 32 dermatological conditions and numerous cases of heat rash.

g. Fiscal

- (1) Enclosure (10) depicts the battalion fiscal status as of 15 September 1966.

8. Civil Affairs

The primary project currently underway in the 3d Engineer Battalion Civil Affairs program is the six room school in PHU HA. During the month of September the site was surveyed, leveled and laid out. Pouring of the concrete deck was substantially completed. The 128 foot breezeway that connects the six rooms was completed on 13 September. By the end of September five of the six building pads had been poured. Vietnamese from PHU HA have been doing much of the work. Sand and gravel, purchased by III MAF, has been delivered by a Vietnamese contractor. Work will continue on the walls in hopes of completing the project prior to the heavy monsoon weather.

At the dispensary in DA SON sick call was held five times during the month. A total of 486 persons were treated. Of that number there were 87 adult women, 19 adult men, and 380 children treated. The Vietnamese nurse, employed at the Industrial Relations Office, accompanied the MEDCAP teams on sick calls. Due to preparation requirements for Division Inspection, the medical staff was unable to conduct sick call more frequently.

At DAI LOC District Headquarters the headmaster of the high school requested school kits for students. A total of 65 kits were delivered to the headmaster by members of the civil affairs team. At that high school the battalion interpreter, deployed in the area with an engineer company, began giving English classes to Vietnamese high school students. The classes are conducted on Saturdays and Sundays and have an enrollment of 73 students. Additional classes in English have been started for RVN personnel. Marine personnel have given classes in English pronunciation. The classes will continue as long as 3d Engineer Battalion personnel are deployed in the area.

On 20 September a USO show was presented in the battalion area featuring a popular American singing trio. Children from DA SON and PHU THUNG were invited to attend the show. They were driven into the area and were given soda and candy. A total of 120 attended with teachers.

The Commanding General's inspection was held in the civil affairs section and no discrepancies were noted.




