

221115H Jan67 YD098672 approximately 20lbs charge set off by VC electrically, 4 infantry WIA. 221800H YD120662 tank ran over unknown explosive device. No damage to tank or injury to personnel in area. 221135H YD119665 ChiCom booby trap pull release detonated by infantry, 1 WIA.

231215H Jan67 YD115664 approximately 15 lbs of unknown type of explosives detonated by VC electrically, 3 WIA. 231215H YD115665 bunker (MG) blown by engineers with 7½ lbs C-4. 231340H YD196630 ChiCom booby trap pull detonated by engineers with 2½ lbs C-4. 231320H YD115665 engineer detonated two 60mm duds with 3 lbs of C-4. 231335H YD119663 engineers detonated two 60mm duds with 2½ lbs of C-4.

7. Engineering observation: 3d Battalion 4th Marines utilized all engineers personnel attached to full extent. The only weak area noticed that the infantry personnel weren't familiar with the deployment and signs of VC booby traps. This could have resulted from new replacement within the Battalion.

8. Lessons learned: All first timers to RVN be indoctrinated on types of deployment and signs of VC mines. The end results would greatly serve as a reduction of WIA's from VC Mines and booby traps.

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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

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**A. INTELLIGENCE**

1. The Intelligence Officer held nightly briefings for the Battalion Commander, Staff and Company and Section Commanders. The briefings stressed mine and booby-trap incidents in the 3d Marine Division TAOR and significant VC/NVA activities effecting engineer operations. In the absence of the Intelligence Officer the Intelligence Clerk gave the briefings.

2. In preparation for a convoy to PHU BAI, a special briefing was held for the Staff NCO's and the NCO's in charge of the sweep team preceding the convoy covering mining activities and order of battle along Route #1.

3. During the month of January, a total of 103 mine incidents were recorded. Of that total, 57 were destroyed and 43 were detonated. The largest noted concentration of mine incidents has been in the Operation CHINOOK area where 60 incidents were reported. Of that number a total of 21 were detonated and 39 found and destroyed. The most common type explosive device thought has been ordnance rounds rigged as Anti-Personnel booby-traps or mines.

4. In an endeavor to collect as much intelligence on mine warfare as possible, reports from 15th CTF and agencies in QUANG TRI have been collected. A close liaison has been established with the A-110 Detachment Special Forces Intelligence NCO toward this same end.

B. Training

1. Training during January consisted of GMS training as outlined in Part IV Paragraph E.

2. Four (4) men were trained as qualified generator operators upon successful completion of the 3d Engineer Battalion Generator Operators School. In the future the classes are expected to increase in size and frequency.

3. The 3d Marine Division Land Mine Warfare and Demolitions School, conducted by this battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, boobytraps, and demolitions. The instruction was conducted by contact teams and by resident courses in the battalion school areas at DA NANG and PHU BAI. The latter part of the month saw LMWS at DA NANG close in preparation for its movement to DONG HA. The following is a recapitulation of the training conducted by the school during January 1967.

C. Operations

1. General. During January the 3d Engineer Battalion remained in general support of the 3d Marine Division. Company "C", 3d Engineer Battalion remained under the operational control of the 1st Engineer Battalion, 1st Marine Division. Employment of the battalion was in the following two categories: Combat Support and Combat Service Support.

(a) Combat Support operations consisted of providing mine detection and demolition teams in support of infantry operations and daily sweeps of MSR's for mines and boobytraps. Companies "A" and "B" supported 6 infantry battalions. The combat support provided involved:

- (1) A total of 151 deliberate mine detector sweeps of MSR segments.
- (2) A total of 0 visual sweeps.
- (3) Daily average distance swept was 7,829 meters.
- (4) Excluding clearance, 9 incidents required engineer effort during sweeps. See Part II, Paragraph A, Intelligence.
- (5) Ordnance and Fortifications destroyed by combat engineers during January is documented in Part IV, Paragraph F.

2. DONG HA TAOR (COMBAT SUPPORT)

(a) During the month of January no visual sweeps were made.

(c) In addition sweep teams were provided on an on-call basis for sand hauling operations at (YD 222681) and tracked vehicle movements utilizing the bridge by-passes on Route #9.

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(d) Combat Support of infantry operations was provided by personnel from Companies "A" and "B", Support Company and H&S Company. On the 9th and 10th of January 1967, a detachment of "A" Company, led by SSgt M. VEGA, escorted two resupply convoys from (YD 116583-098520) on Route #558. See Part IV A, Paragraphs (1) and (2). From 25-27 January, three demo/sweep teams from "A" Company supported an operation in Cam Lo Province. The units supported were the 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines and 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. See Part IV A, Paragraph (3). "A" Company also supported a two (2) day sweep operation conducted by 3/3 from 27 to 28 January. The engineer mission was two fold; (1) to provide combat support and (2) to complete a detailed reconnaissance of the road and bridges from (YD 998476) to (YD 090426). See Part IV A, Paragraph (4). Five (5) engineers remained in support of units at KHE SAHN, while 35 engineers from "B" Company supported 3/26 in the "Operation Chinook" area. Thirty-one engineers, led by 1stLt KIRIACOPOULOS are now based at PNU BAI. The 3d Battalion, 4th Marines was supported on several occasions during the month by "B" Company. On the 12th of January a call was answered for a mine sweep team to be helilifted to ARVN position D.5. ARVN engineers there were in the process of clearing a minefield and had sustained two casualties in the field. "A" Company responded and a team led by Cpl PATTERSON was dispatched. Upon arrival at D.5 the team swept a path to the men allowing them to be extricated from the minefield. The 1st Platoon, 3d Bridge Company decked a bridge at (YD 102536) and retracted a fixed span bridge at (YD 164587) after it was damaged by a tank retriever. Two class 60 M-6 aluminum panel bridges of 60' and 75' in length were assembled and launched into place at (YD 981544) and (YD 983532). The 2nd Platoon of Company "A" was airlifted to DA NANG in preparation for a period afloat in support of 1/3. The most ambitious project undertaken by the 3d Engineer Battalion during the month of January was the opening of Route #558. The engineer work accomplished makes possible both military and civilian traffic between CAM LO and the CUA VALLEY areas. Militarily the route is significant because it is the only land link between D.5 and Route #9. Route #558 also provides access to the farming communities of the CUA VALLEY and will aid greatly in the economic development of the area. The work done to improve the road was in the main heavy equipment work and included grading and ditching, and the installation of a bridge at (YD 102536) and one culvert. It is apparent from the recent enemy contacts, by engineers, along the route that the opening of Route #558 will hurt VC/NVA activities in the CUA VALLEY .

### 3. Combat Service Support

(a) Roads and Bridges. The majority of the work done on routes of communication was centered to the west and southwest of the Dong Ha Combat Base. A bridge, fifty feet in length, was constructed on

Route #558 at (YD 102536) and heavy equipment work was performed in an effort to repair this same route, south of CAM LO. West of Camp Carroll on Route #9 the construction of an access road from L/3/3 to Route #9 continued and a waterpoint was installed at the new 3/3 CP. Repair work was effected along Route #9 from the M-6 Bridge at (YD 027562) to the triple-single Bailey Bridge at (YD 009465) and a culvert was installed at (YD 009465). On several occasions during the month engineer recon teams proceeded along various segments of Route #9, Route #558, Route #8B, and Route #561. The mission of these reconnaissance teams was to check on future engineer projects, make estimates of repair work necessary, and to insure that proper maintenance was being carried out along these routes of communication. The battalion sustained four casualties on 26 January when a road grader hit a mine on Route #558 near (YD 102536). A culvert was installed in the 3d Engineer Battalion CP (Fwd) at a vehicle crossing point near the lumber yard and work was continued on the widening and improvement of the LCU Ramp at Dong Ha.

(b) Field Fortifications. During January the work done on field fortifications consisted of the continued improvement of defensive positions and perimeter wire at the 3d Engineer Battalion CP. An 8'x16' bunker was rebuilt at the 3/3 CP and a detail of engineers cut and hauled timber for the construction of other bunkers. At the end of the month the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines requested assistance in clearing fields of fire in the vicinity of the CAM LO bridge at (YD 149604). Company "B" and the Heavy Equipment Platoon combined forces to complete this project.

(c) General Construction. Work was continued on weatherproofing billeting spaces in the Dong Ha Combat Base. Within the 3d Division CP (Fwd) several major projects were undertaken. The utilities platoon began installing telephone poles to accommodate the wire necessary for the renovation of the electrical network within the CP. Construction platoon formed and poured a concrete pad for the new pot shack at the General's Mess and one for the General's Shower. The materials for the pot shack were precut in the 3d Engineer Battalion area and moved to the Division CP for assembly. Duck board walkways were cut and assembled in the Division CP Area. The roof on the AID Warehouse was repaired and sixty doors and windows were constructed and delivered for use in the buildings under construction for ARVN dependent housing. The water tank pads from the CAM LO water point were torn down and moved to the 3/3 area where they were re-built and materials for the bridge at (YD 102536) on Route #558 were precut. A sink was installed in the Battalion Aid Station and a water line was put in to "A" Company's billeting area. Forms were constructed and a deck was poured for the new "A" Company Supply Building and construction began on two 16'x40'

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buildings for the 3d Marine Division Land Mine Warfare and Demolitions School.

(d) Utilities. The 3d Engineer Battalion Utilities Platoon continued to supply division units with raw and potable water. Four (4) water points were under the operational control of the 1st Marine Division in DA NANG and five (5) were operational in the PHU BAI and DONG HA TAOR's. Totals for the month at DONG HA and PHU BAI are as follows:

(e) Drafting and Surveying. The Drafting and Surveying section continued to support division units with a survey, layout, and drafting capability. Two projects of note were the construction, electrical and plumbing diagrams for the new 3d Marine Division, Commanding General's Mess and the construction drawings for the projected 3d Marine Division Command Post at PHU BAI.

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D. Communications

1. Continuous communication was maintained with 3d Engineer Battalion units located at DA NANG, DONG HA, and in the field.

2. Radio and wire communications were established to the "Operation CHINOOK" area. This permits the "B" Company platoon supporting 3/26 to report engineer work accomplished in a timely manner.

3. A local line was established to 3d Bridge Company.

4. Lance Corporal CASEY and Private First Class DAWLEY became prospective members of the crypto board.

5. Radio communication was set up between the battalion listening post and the Officer of the Day.

6. The Officer of the Day has partial radio communications available to the battalion guard posts in the event wire fails. The equipment utilized is radio set, AN/PRC-6.

7. The field wire in the battalion area was moved from temporary supports to the existing telephone pole network.

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**E. LOGISTICS**

1. 3d Engineer Battalion continued logistical operations from the DONG HA and DA NANG combat bases, while formulating final plans for the consolidation of H&S and Support Companies at DONG HA. Concurrently, the Battalion continued its support of BLT's rotating out-of-country by equipment and detaching one reinforced engineer platoon and joining another in early January, and readying a third for detachment early in February.

2. Control of logistical support, though exercised primarily from DA NANG, was strengthened by the establishment of a forward S-4 office in DONG HA. Pending the decision by the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division, to move elements of the 1st Engineer Battalion north in relief of corresponding elements of this Battalion in DA NANG, personnel, equipment, and supplies were readied for the move. Transfer of Battalion stocks was accelerated by the shipment of 120,000 board feet of lumber and 35 short tons of supplies and equipment via LCU to DONG HA in January.

3. There was no improvement in the supply and maintenance posture. 15% of the authorized density of major equipment is on requisition. 18% of all FY 66 and 67 requisitions remain outstanding. Repair parts support became ever more critical as the Battalion deadline rose to 111 items on 31 January. Plywood and 2 x 4 lumber, the most widely used and critical building supplies in the Division, were in such short supply that most construction projects were drastically curtailed.

4. There were some bright spots, however. An inventory of expendable supplies resulted in the return of 290 excess items and cancellation of 113 requisitions. The value of the RED BALL tracer system was proven by the receipt of a shipment of BA-1389 batteries for the P-153 mine detector, a critical item for several months. Supply support through FLSU-1 seemed to improve at DONG HA as there was a drastic increase in the number of requisitions filled for the Battalion (-) there. The validity of proper use of urgency of need designators in requisitioning was shown by the fact that only 11% of this organization's outstanding requisitions are priority O2 and O5, the result of careful screening.

5. In the area of services, the Battalion fed a total of 76,097 meals from two messhalls; purified and issued a total of 3,147,000 gallons of fresh water and 878,000 gallons of raw water (for showers) for 3d Division units in all three TAOR's; and provided electric power for major command elements in the DONG HA combat base.

6. A complete and detailed analysis of logistical operations during January is provided in the Logistics Summary Report, Part IV G.

**F. CIVIL AFFAIRS**

1. On January 6 a series of English classes was begun by 3d Engineer Civil Affairs personnel. LCpl R. C. HEDGER and Pfc A. E. HENDERSON, college trained in languages, teach 1½ hour classes at two schools in the CAM LO school system. The classes are convened on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week and include 40 students between ages of 12 and 14 in each class. The program has been coordinated between 3d Division G-5 Fwd and the CAM LO District Chief and advisors. The school administrators have shown great enthusiasm over the classes and the students have been very receptive.

2. The 3d Engineer MED CAP program has been temporarily curtailed due to operational commitments. MED CAP operations are being planned for the CAM LO area and the CUA VALLEY in support of engineer projects.

3. During the month of January the 3d Engineer Battalion used 1800 board feet of 1 x 6 lumber and expended 148 man-hours in the construction of 60 window shutters and doors for the ARVN dependent resettlement project. The addition of the doors and shutters completed the project initiated by the Sea Bees. The project has greatly improved the living facilities of ARVN enlisted and their families.

4. On 29 January the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer accompanied G-5 personnel to the site of the USAID Saw Mill in QUANG TRI to provide an engineering estimate for proposed construction of dwellings in that area. The structures will provide housing for 30 Vietnamese operating the Saw Mill and learning the lumber trade. A detailed design and bill of materials will be produced by the Battalion's drafting section to support the project.

5. Vietnamese removing graves for the 3d Engineer Battalion area have been given soap from the Civil Affairs Office. It was given as a gesture of friendship and in keeping with the spirit of the TET celebration early in February.


24. COMPUTATION OF BRIDGE CLASS



1. SUPPLY SITUATION

a. Primary supply activities during January centered around movement of Battalion supplies to DONG HA, rotational deployment, inventories, and maintenance problems.

(1) All stocks held by the Battalion Supply Officer which could be shipped northwithout curtailing support to the Detachment in DA NANG were so moved, leaving only the formal account and essential stocks. On 31 January the Supply Officer began packing the remainder of his account. The intention is to leave a small supply detachment at DA NANG to support the companies which will remain under the operational control of 1st Marine Division, and until they are in turn attached to the 1st Engineer Battalion. This detachment will operate temporarily under RUC 13405, and RUC 13400 will then transfer to DONG HA and absorb RUC 13403 now in operation there. All that is presently required of 1st Engineer Battalion is the ability to process requisitions and provide accountability.

(2) Supply procedures relating to rotational deployment continue to be confusing because there are variations for each BLT. The main problem is that of requisitioning in support of attached units. Regardless of how simple the procedures may be, the parent organization's Supply Officer loses control of all document numbers he provides to the unit being attached to the BLT. Experience has shown that control is very difficult and rarely regained, and reconciliation of obligations relating thereto is difficult, if not impossible. Further, it is felt that requisitioning for BLT units by 9th MAB organizations is contrary to

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correct supply procedures as long as accountability for BLT equipment (including that of the attachments) rests with the BLT. Supply procedures could be greatly clarified to the advantage of all concerned if the following policies were adopted:

(a) 3rd PRR handles requisitions prepared by parent organizations prior to departure of the BLT on a fill-or-kill basis and report status of all documents received to parent organizations.

(b) All requisitioning for attached units after departure out-of-country be submitted by the BLT Supply Officer using BLT RRC, document number, and cost code. Requisitions so submitted but not completed upon return in-country would be cancelled.

(3) In response to O3 3rd MarDiv msg 311223Z Dec 1966, a "wall to wall" inventory of expendable items was conducted. RRC 13400 report 122 excess items and cancelled 59 requisitions. RRC 13403 reported 168 excess items and cancelled 54 requisitions.

(4) The verification of equipment serial numbers and on-hand end item quantities against stock record cards continued at a slow pace. Completion of this verification is a major requirement for this organization and must be completed prior to the annual physical inventory. To this end the Battalion Commander directed all company commanders to report by 15 February all serialized items on hand or in use by them which are not charged to them on Equipment Custody Records. The data from these reports will then be matched against T/E and Special Allowances and the need for requesting additional special allowances determined.

(5) Customer Record Cards were established in accordance with iv0 PH400.223 for all companies and maintenance activities. Concomitant to this, maintenance requisitions continued to be compared with outstanding TEMO's to assure firm control of maintenance supply procedures. The turnover of maintenance personnel has been such that there is a constant need for indoctrinating new arrivals in basic supply procedures and for the exercise of very detailed supervision.

b. The following is a synopsis of supply performance during January. Basis for this synopsis is contained in enclosure (1).

(1) RRC 13400 (A HANG)

(a) Most requisitioning was in priority 17. Priorities 02 and 05 requisitions comprised 11% of the total requisitions submitted.

(b) 158 fewer requisitions were filled in January than in December, while the total number of outstanding requisitions remained almost the same.

(c) 16% of all 66 and 67 requisitions remain outstanding at 31 January. 60% of these are more than 60 days old, showing no relative improvement in posture in the last two months.

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(d) The only significant factors in performance are the continued reduction in the number of priorities 02 and 05 requisitions and the increase in percentage of priorities 17 over priorities 12 on requisition.

(e) Supply activity by RUC 13400 will diminish sharply in February as Battalion supply phases north.

(2) RUC 13403 (DONG HA)

(a) More requisitions were submitted from RUC 13403 in January than from RUC 13400; further, RUC 13403 also experienced a higher fill rate, a predicted reversal of the situation reported for December.

(b) 22% of the requisitions submitted during January were priorities 02 and 05, reflecting the lack of the restraining influence of supply officer and a supply chief on the spot to provide routine screening of demands.

(c) About 25% of all FY 66 and 67 requisitions submitted are currently outstanding, one-third of which are over 60 days old.

(d) There were no FY 66 requisitions filled during January; however, the total number of requisitions filled was up drastically from the 31 reported for December to 298 for January.

c. The direct exchange program for secondary repairable component items has been in effect within III MAF under the provisions of MCC 4442.3 for about a month. Overall results, shown in enclosure (1), indicate that about one-third of the unserviceable components turned in were replaced immediately. The rest were back-ordered.

d. The Engineer CRITIPAK established by CG, FMFPac msg 122006Z Jan 1967 is apparently held up to some degree by lack of parts in the pipeline, as was noted in the creation of specific tracing instructions and the cancellation of some documents.

e. It was noted during January that the response to tracer messages from FLC and 3rd FSR, particularly the latter, was very poor. The majority of speedletters released were unanswered, and frequently such replies as were received arrived after release of the next tracer. It was noted that there were almost no tracer replies to RUC 13403 at DONG HA, and that very few advice cards were received by RUC 13403. It is felt that poor response is due first and foremost to the high volume of traffic, and second to the substitution of speedletters for naval messages. It is strongly felt that the only way to call attention to critical items of supply is to take stern measures to downgrade priorities of items that may be essential but not critical.

2. CLASS II AND IV

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A. General

(a) Class II Type 1. A total of 55 major end items are on requisition against authorized allowances. A total of 107 major end items are on deadline. The total authorized density of all types either on requisition or on deadline is 378; thus equipment capability of this organization for those items is 57% of what it should be ideally. A more comprehensive picture of allowances, availability, and non-availability of organic equipment may be seen in enclosure (2). Further, enclosure (1) indicates seven major items on requisition were received in January, while seven others were placed on requisition. The rise in the number of items on requisitions at end-of-period from 43 in December to 55 in January is attributable to the omission of 12 items in the December report.

(2) Class II Type 2 and Class IV

(a) The situation remained normal for Class II, except lumber, and Class IV supplies. There were no problem areas.

(b) 103,354 board feet of lumber, in dimensions varying from 1 x 6 to 4 x 4, were drawn from FLSG-A and shipped via LCU to BONG BA, one load going to PHU BAI. These stocks represented the completion of all lumber requisitions from 00C 13400 except 56,000 BF of 2 x 4 and 154,000 BF of 10 x 10 and 2471 sheets of plywood. Lumber not drawn will be treated under critical items.

B. Critical Items

(1) Critical end items on requisition are shown in enclosure (3).

(2) Critical items required by CG 3rd Mar Div msg 191350Z Jan 1967 to be reported are listed in enclosure (4). Comments on items shown as critical follow.

(a) Body Armor, Upper: The quantity on hand is less than T/E requirements, and a significant quantity in the hands of troops is in need of replacement.

(b) Boots, work socks, utility uniforms: Quantities shown reflect requirements to bring individuals up to minimum clothing allowance and replace unserviceable items. In this regard, jungle utilities and boots were not required to be reported as critical items; however, in view of the shortage of standard items and the high rate of replacement caused by the nature of engineer activities, the shortage of jungle wear must also be considered critical.

(c) Individual equipment: This organization lacks the necessary items to give all hands a complete issue and unserviceable

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assets in the hands of troops are substantial. Only those items in enclosure (4) are shown as critical that are essential in the combat environment experienced to date.

(d) The exact extent of deficiencies in individual equipment and clothing is not known at this time; however, a survey of all hands is being initiated to determine replacement requirements.

(e) Battery 6 TN: This is a critical item because of wide and item application and long leadtime in obtaining it.

(3) P-153 line detector: Some improvement in deadline status is noted; however, this item remains a critical maintenance problem.

(4) Battery BA-1389 for P-153 Detectors: A quantity of 103 placed on RED BALL tracer were received on 23 January. Stocks on hand are now adequate for about 30 days. Additional batteries are on requisition.

(5) Generator 60 KW: Six sets have been in use by this organization at DONG BA, but have not been transferred to the organic account. It is hoped that this will be rectified shortly, and a request for a special in-country allowance is anticipated. Meanwhile, three sets remain on requisition and the 1st 3rd Engr Bn at DA NANG is operating with 30 KW sets on temporary loan from other organizations. It is expected that the lack of a 60 KW set for 1st 3rd Engr Bn will not be critical any longer because of the impending move of elements to DONG BA.

(6) Lumber:

(a) 2 x 4 is the most critical building material in the Division at this time. 2 x 4 is used in almost every type of construction project and is required for the completion of almost every Division work order. For this reason alone most construction projects in the DONG BA area have come to a halt. It is felt that this item should receive a priority in procurement and shipment above all other construction supplies until such time as sufficient operation stocks and backup are on hand.

(b) Plywood and nails are second to 2x4 in criticality because of the requirement for large quantities for cantonment projects.

3. MAINTENANCE SITUATION

a. The maintenance situation did not improve in January. A total of 111 items are now on deadline with 36 at second echelon and 71 at third. Enclosure (5) is a display of equipment on deadline by echelon and date. 40 items went to deadline in January, half to second and half to third echelon. One 550 grader was sent to M. 1 in January as a result of a mine incident; all other deadline occurred as the result of mechanical failure. Primary causes of equipment failure are:

(1) A requirement for continuous support of extended operations.

(2) A requirement for more combat and combat service support than is envisioned in T/O and T/E.

(3) Extreme geographical factors.

(4) A requirement for progressively increasing maintenance support as equipment grows older.

b. The sole cause of the continuing high deadline within this organization is lack of repair parts support.

4. MAJOR ITEMS OF EQUIPMENT STATUS. See enclosures (6) through (10).

5. SERVICES

a. Utilities

(1) Electrical power supply continues to be provided as previously reported.

(2) Water supply. Total water production for January is as follows:

(2) 600 pounds of ice are used daily by Det 3rd Engr Bn and about 150 pounds per day by 3rd Engr Bn (-).

(3) Baker supplies have been adequate in DA NANG; however, sporadic shortages of bread, flour, milk, and eggs curtailed preparation and service of pastries at DONG HA.

(4) Sporadic shortages of milk and eggs also curtailed general food preparation, necessitating more emphasis on "B" rations.

(5) Ice Cream has been available at DA NANG about twice weekly.

(6) a 100 cubic foot reefer, a freezer, and an ice machine were put into operation at DONG HA during January. Further plans are underway to expand the messhall at Dong Ha to accommodate Battalion personnel moving up from DA NANG.

c. Medical

(1) Medical

(2) The question has been raised as to the necessity for this organization constructing a 6-10 bed holding ward for the Battalion Aid Station. One is in operation and is required at DA NANG because of the dispersion of units in that TAOR; however, the need for such a facility for this organization at DONG HA is questionable because of the close proximity of all units and the availability of rapid medical support.

d. General engineering. As reported in daily summaries and other operational reports.

## 6. TRANSPORTATION

a. Deadline status and dispersion of the Battalion have imposed a serious shortage of organic transportation, even for basic housekeeping tasks.

b. Support to Det 3rd Engr Bn in DA NANG from the 1st MarDiv Motor Transport Officer was outstanding throughout January, and was sufficient for all commitments.

c. The Battalion continued through January to move supplies and lumber northward from DA NANG by LCU. Boat availability for this organization is considered to have been excellent, though not on the scale necessary to displace elements of Det 3rd Engr Bn northward in a short period. Normal channels were used for requesting sealift at all times.

d. Movement of supplies by air freight was highly unpredictable and only very limited quantities of the most essential supplies, such as chemicals for water purification, for KHE SANH, could be moved.

e. Scheduling of air and sea lift is far easier from DA NANG than from DONG HA or PHU BAI, but even then it is unpredictable. Last minute orders to stage supplies are the norm at DA NANG because lift capabilities are not available until the afternoon of the day before the lift is called away. This substantially complicates the orderly planning of movement and coordination of equipment for staging. It is felt that some improvement in control and scheduling can and should be made.

## 7. MISCELLANEOUS

### a. Status of Organic Equipment Associated with Rotational BLT's.

Enclosure (1) is a display of the major items of equipment invoiced to BLT's rotating out-of-country and received from BLT's coming in-country. It can be seen that the effect of the rotational cycle on this organization has been to generate substantial on-hand stocks of equipment, some of which are excess to allowances, though not necessarily to requirements. This was brought about by the induction of RL7-26 units into the cycle. This organization is beginning a comprehensive review of its equipment posture with relation to the adequacy of current allowances. Equipment overages resulting from rotational deployment will be considered in this review.

b. Determination of Special Allowances

(1) The T/E for an FFF unit is based on a balanced and generalized operational capability. Special allowances are created for the purpose of meeting specific requirements, temporary in nature, not envisioned in T/E. Special allowances characteristically lag behind requirements. In Vietnam the requirement is usually met before the allowance is obtained, thus complicating logistical planning and support.

(2) The problem with the present concept of logistical support is that it is geared to the basic T/E and not to a T/E that is augmented in order to accomplish an expanded mission. If logistical support is to be adequate for the situation, it must be able to provide the personnel, equipment, repair parts, and funding authority all along the pipeline that will assure that support on a continuing basis. The T/E of this organization is not adequate for the situation, nor is the T/O. The following examples illustrate the scope of the problem:

(a) Tractors: This organization is authorized 13 T-18's in the III MAF Provisional T/E P-4960; yet operators are lacking for this added capability because there was no related increase in personnel allowances.

(b) Generators: This organization uses more generators than it rates, as does every other unit in Vietna; yet there is no special allowance of personnel who can operate and maintain these extra generators or install the distribution systems they serve. Consequently, many generators are lost through neglect for lack of personnel.

(c) Pump Trucks: An allowance in excess of T/E can be justified, not only because of the operational requirement for them, but also because of their high deadline rate caused by old age, lack of repair parts, and combat losses. Currently, allowances are not adequate to cope with losses of these types and extent.

(d) Mine Detectors: The Battalion's allowance of P-153 detectors is grossly inadequate in view of the tactical situation, and the problem is compounded by high and long-duration deadline. Special allowances in this case should provide for both factors.

(3) A unit having only 70% of the necessary personnel or equipment can accomplish only 70% of its mission, and this is the type of situation many units find themselves in today. To alleviate this, it is felt that special allowances should be applied not only to specialized requirements not covered by T/E, but also to the quantities of essential equipment that should be available to compensate for deficiencies in maintenance and supply support. This would only be a stopgap measure, for the real answer lies in providing all of the equipment and personnel necessary for the job, backed up by adequate resources of funds and material.
