

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

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## A. INTELLIGENCE

1. During the month of May nightly briefings were held for the Battalion Commander, Staff Officers, Company Commanders, and Section Heads. All Intelligence information of any value to this organization was presented at the nightly briefings. Spot reports on sweep teams, patrol reports, and mine and boobytrap incidents along with VC/NVA Order of Battle and activities affecting engineer operations were presented.

2. During the month of May a total of 112 mine/boobytrap incidents were recorded. Of that number 47 devices were detonated and 65 were either found and disarmed or destroyed. As in past months the most common type device has been dud ordnance rigged as either AP or AT mines. The main areas of concentration of mine/boobytrap incidents are as follows; CON THIEN, GIO LINH, Artillery Plateau, Operation Shawnee AO, PHU LOC, and Route# 1 from GIO LINH to PHU LOC. The greatest increase in the employment of mines and boobytraps by the VC/NVA has been in the CON THIEN area.

B. TRAINING

1. Training during May consisted of GMS Training as outlined in Part IV, Section B.
2. No classes were scheduled during May for the 3d Engineer Battalion Generator Operator's School due to the non-availability of students for programming into the course of instruction.
3. The 3d Marine Division Land Mine Warfare School, conducted by this battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, boobytraps, and demolitions. The instruction was conducted by contact teams and resident courses in the battalion school area at PHU BAI and DONG HA as follows:

4. During May, 1967 the 3d Marine Division Tunnel Teams continued to train.
5. On 19 May 1967 a contact team from Division G-3 Training instructed 30 personnel from the battalion in the nomenclature, functioning and care of the XM16E1 rifle. Included in the instruction package was a familiarization and zero fire of the weapon. The students that underwent the training will instruct the remainder of the battalion in a similar manner upon receipt of the weapon as a replacement item for the M-14 rifle.

**G. OPERATIONS**

1. General. During the month of May the 3d Engineer Battalion operated in general support of the 3d Marine Division. Employment of the battalion was in the following two categories: Combat Support and Combat Service Support.

### 3. Direct Combat Support

(a) The tempo of enemy activity increased rapidly during May in the northern I Corps area causing a marked increase in the number of Marine and ARVN infantry operations. Task organized engineer elements rallied with the infantry in direct support of their efforts to counter and destroy the enemy. The battalion's three letter companies provided a daily average of 390 engineers for close combat support of infantry operations in the QUANG TRI, PHU BAL, THUA THIEN and KHE SANH TAORs'. Demolition, mine sweep, and tunnel teams were the major methods of utilization of engineer personnel during this period.

Operations SHAWNEE and CHOCTAW were supported by engineers from "B" Company who provided sweep teams of MSR's, landing zone clearing teams for 3d Recon. Bn. elements and demolition teams to destroy enemy bunkers, tunnels and ordnance.

Engineer support of operations in the vicinity of KHE SANH was given by "A" Company based in DONG HA while continual support was lent along Routes 1 and 9 at CON THIEN, GIO LINH, CAM LO and the ROCK PILE. "C" Company was heavily involved with the infantry in Operations PRARIE IV and HICKORY, near the DMZ.

Ordnance and fortifications destroyed by these teams is listed in Part IV, Section E. Documentation of the same is found in Part IV, Section A.

### 4. Combat Service Support

#### (a) Roads and Bridges

Road repairs and maintenance to include drainage improvements constituted the major efforts of the battalion in this category. A 36" culvert was replaced at (YD565316) and three 30' culverts were installed: one for the access road to Operation CHOCTAW, another for the water point access road at Operation SHAWNEE, and the last one in the 4th Marines' C. P. A 24" culvert for the artillery access road at Operation SHAWNEE was installed at (YD517297).

The most noteworthy undertaking during May in this category was the coordination of the engineering efforts being made to develop Route #547 southwest of HUE.

Decking was replaced on a bridge at (YD476376).

#### (b) Field Fortifications

Continual efforts were made during May to improve upon existing field fortifications to include defensive wire, timbered bunkers, mortar bunkers, and fighting holes. Among the more note worthy projects undertaken by the 3d Engineer Bn. in this category were the complete installation of defensive wire around the DONG HA Air Strip and that of CAC Units 2 and 3. Many engineer man-hours were devoted to bunker construction of the timber and sandbag type to provide additional protection from the increased enemy mortar and rocket attacks throughout the Third Marine Division TAOR. Bunker construction is mentioned in Part II-C, Paragraph 3-C.

#### (c) General Construction

Letter company engineers in support of infantry battalions assisted their operations in part by constructing bunkers of various dimensions and a variety of other necessary items such as 4 holer heads, water towers, and strongbacks. Two 12'x24' bunkers and one 20'x30' were built for 4/12 at PHU BAL on 4/12.

"D" Med at DONG HA, 3/3, and 2/4 had bunkers of various dimensions fabricated by engineers during May.

The Construction Platoon of Support Company expended in excess of 10,580 man-hours in constructing the Division C.P. in PHU BAI marking this project as the most time and material consuming undertaking for the month. Approximately 30% of this project is complete. Progress has been somewhat hampered by the nonavailability of necessary plumbing and roofing items but is expected to accelerate rather quickly as these items become available.

(d) Utilities

The Utilities Platoon of Support Company wired the 3d Engineer Battalion area at GIA LE for overhead lighting and installed a water line from the new water point. It also conducted an extensive electrical survey for the 4th Marines C.P. at Operation SHANNON.

Division and non-division units were provided a continual supply of raw and potable water. Nine (9) water points were operational during May in the QUANG TRI and PHU BAI TOARS'. Totals for the month are as follows:

(e) Drafting and Surveying

This section continued to support division unit with a survey, layout, and drafting capability. During May this section continued a topographic survey of the GIA LE Combat Base and reworked drafting and layout plans for the new Division C.P. The Division Sniper School range facilities were laid adjacent to the GIA LE Combat Base by this section

2. THE COMBAT BASE MEDICAL HOT LINE WAS INSTALLED.

4. A PROGRAM FOR PLACING MARS CALLS WAS ESTABLISHED.
5. ESTABLISHED RADIO AND WIRE COMMUNICATION TO 1/26 DISCONTINUED SERVICE UPON MOVEMENT 1/26.
6. FOUR OPERATORS AND ONE TECHNICIAN FILLED THE TELETYPE SCHOOL QUOTA ESTABLISHED BY CG 3D MARDIV HSG 300203Z APR 67. CLASSES WERE CONDUCTED BY COMMUNICATION COMPANY 3D MARDIV.
7. A WARNING SYSTEM WAS INSTALLED FOR THE 3D ENGINEER BATTALION CAMP UTILIZING THE PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM AN/TIP-1.
8. A HOT LINE WAS INSTALLED FROM THE 155 SP GUNS TO THE COC.
9. A HOT LINE WAS INSTALLED FROM MCB-3 TO THE COC.
10. CAPTAIN WOODALL JOINED AS THE BATTALION COMMUNICATION OFFICER.
11. COMMUNICATION AND CONTROL WAS PROVIDED FOR A HELICOPTER MED EVAC.
12. CAPTAIN WOODALL WAS APPOINTED AS THE CRYPTO SECURITY OFFICER. AN INVENTORY WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MATERIAL ACCOUNTED FOR IN ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING REGULATIONS.
13. THE 3D ENGINEER BATTALION ASSUMED COMMUNICATION GUARD FOR THE GIA LE COMBAT BASE.
14. ESTABLISHED A HOT LINE FROM DUSTER TO THE 455 MM SP GUNS FDC.

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**E. LOGISTICS**

1. During May the 3d Engineer Battalion conducted logistic and service support operations from the Gia Le Combat Base. Support was also provided to Companies "A" and "C" operating from Dong Ha and to Company "B" in the Co Bi-Then area. Expansion of Base support functions continued as additional units moved into the Gia Le Combat Base.

2. The main logistic effort was concentrated in the area of supply.

a. The conversion to MILSTRIP continued throughout the month, culminating in the final reconciliation of SLIT obligations and the conversion of document numbers. Normal MILSTRIP requisitioning was commenced on 28 May. Follow-up on critical items had to be held in abeyance pending the conversion. Also, the conversion and the programming of the 360 computer by the Force Logistics Command caused a general cutback in the processing of demands during May.

b. The Battalion S-4 Officer was sent to Danang for 15 days as Project Officer for the procurement of materials for construction of the Division Command Post Complex at Phu Bai. This complex represents the major construction effort of the Battalion at this time. The combined resources of 1st Force Service Regiment, the Naval Support Activity, Danang, and the RMK-BRJ Corporation are being used to assemble the required materials.

3. The following significant events in the area of equipment were noted for May.

a. The adequacy of the Tables of Equipment for operations in Vietnam continued to be reviewed, and special allowance requests formulated. Operating conditions have necessitated much heavier capabilities than have been envisioned in the T/E:

(1) The extreme distances at which engineer companies are removed from the parent organization and the level of support required of them dictates the availability of additional lowbeds to sustain mobility.

(2) The engineer squad requires a chain saw as part of its normal equipment for support of infantry units operating in heavily vegetated inland areas.

(3) T/E refrigeration units are grossly inadequate to provide cold storage of foods being provided to in-country units. A walk-in reefer in addition to reach-in reefers is necessary for each battalion subsisting on A-rations.

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(4) Internal redistribution of P-153 mine detectors organic to the Division became necessary to assure sustained capability for engineer units in all areas of operation.

(5) A special allowance of M79 grenade launchers is urgently required to provide Engineer Squads something besides an M14 or M16E1 rifle for counter ambush operations.

b. The Battalion received its first increment of 19 multi-fuel dump trucks, thus providing full relief from a chronically critical shortage of this item. Replaced M51 models are being cannibalized and disposed of locally as they become unserviceable.

c. TD-18 Tractors are no longer being repaired but are being disposed of as they become unserviceable. While such action was inevitable, this has had the effect of emphasizing maintenance problems with the TD-15. This organization is in poor condition with regard to its tractors.

d. Water Purification Unit 600 GPH (Erdlator) and the associated water distribution set were finally received in May. Maintenance problems have already been encountered, although none of the units have been operated. Almost all plastic cups from the filter section were unserviceable on receipt. The component generator set is a critical item, for which required preventive maintenance items are not available. Lacking also are the personnel to service the generator set on the full time basis which will be required when this equipment is installed in water points.

4. A more detailed analysis of logistic operations during May is provided in the attached Logistic Summary Report for May.

## F. CIVIL AFFAIRS

1. During the first part of the month of May the 3d Engineer Battalion continued in general support of Civil Affairs projects throughout the PHU BAI TAOR. This included lending support by making several engineer estimates of proposed jobs such as the requirements and correct procedure for constructing a rice paddy dike near the village of LOC SON in 3d Tank Battalion's Civil Affairs area.

2. On 12 May the 3d Engineer Battalion was assigned the village of LOC DIEN in PHU LOC District as a Civil Affairs area. It was determined that their immediate needs were for cement to complete the school house deck, build one water well, and construct a village headquarters. Tin was also requested for the village headquarters project. On 29 May, 70 bags of cement was picked up at HUE and delivered to the village of LOC DIEN. The initial 50 bags were used for the school house and the remainder for the village headquarters.

3. L/Cpl HEDGER continued to conduct English classes in the CAM LO Public School on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, in the Private School on Tuesdays, and Thursdays, and evening classes weekly for Vietnamese school teachers in DONG HA three times a week. Diplomas were prepared by the Drafting and Surveying Section, 3d Engineer Battalion and forwarded to DONG HA for L/Cpl HEDGERS graduating classes at CAM LO. Sixty students are scheduled to graduate on 1 June 1967.

4. No MEDCAPS were held for the month of May due to the lack of MEDCAP supplies.

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B. S-2 SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT INTELLIGENCE EVENTS:

1. 08 May 1967 - Documents captured on 8 May at CON THIEN have suggested that elements of the 90th Regiment, 324B Division were involved with the infiltration of a flame thrower unit. The unit is said to have infiltrated down the coast of South Vietnam. UNRATED
2. 08 May 1967 - The utilization of kinship and/or administrative terms as code names for military units is very common. Regiments are known to take the cover designation of key rivers, provinces, and Battalions are known to take districts. The selection of districts in QUANG TRI and THUA THIEN may suggest possible moves in these areas in the near future. UNRATED
3. 10 May 1967 - 15th CIT Reported that the VC plan to occupy QUANG TRI and THUA THIEN Provinces, after occupation they will organize the 4th Strategic Group consisting of four divisions. Previous reports indicate the enemy's desire to open a "Big Battle" in QUANG TRI, THUA THIEN (p). However, it is improbable that the enemy will attempt to occupy the two provinces. The enemy's capability to occupy QUANG TRI City and HUE City for a short duration is rated F-6.
4. 10 May 1967 - Documents captured during the attack on CON THIEN indicate the flame thrower unit employed during the attack is the second known use of flame throwers in the I Corps Area.
5. 18 May 1967 - QUANG TRI National Police agent reported that approximately one NVA Battalion is deployed along Route# 76. (YD129623-140625). Route# 76 is a known infiltration route.
6. 27 May 1967 - Captured documents reveal that opening day of Summer Campaign is 29 May 1967. Enemy have been instructed to be prepared and to coordinate so that fire will be continuous and spectacular. The enemy was also instructed that they must win the first and second battles in this period. UNRATED During this period the enemy is likely to use varied diversionary tactics.

2 May 67	S-4 paid follow-up Staff visit to FLSG-A to discuss procedures for expediting delivery of materials for Division Command Post complex. S-4 also paid Staff visit to Division Industrial Relations Officer to discuss pay for indigenous employees. IRO was able to work out new procedure for payment of all indigenous personnel in the Phu Bai TAOR where by IRO would obtain all payrolls from the Naval Support Activity, DaNang, and units would then pick-up from IRO. This eliminated the need for individual units to pick-up payrolls at DaNang.
3 May 67	S-4 visited Senior Adviser to Phu Bai Critical Zone Headquarters to discuss clearance of indigenous personnel to pass through Dong Da Training Area to work at the Gia Le Combat Base.
5 May 67	S-4 met with Commanding Officer Phu Bai Critical Zone to negotiate further for passage of indigenous personnel across the Dong Da Training Area.
5 May 67	S-4 met with the Division Engineer to discuss status of lumber on requisition and issue of lumber by the Force Logistics Command. All lumber requisitions submitted prior to 25 April 1967 were to be cancelled. Lumber being delivered at present time will be considered a Force-issue.
6 May 67	The main body of 1st Battalion, 26th Marines, arrived at the Gia Le Combat Base for a period of about three days prior to deployment on a security mission. Logistic support was coordinated by this Headquarters and provided by all battalions headquartered at Gia Le.
7 May 67	Situation on tentage is slowly becoming critical. Borrowed tents are being reclaimed, while at the same time the Battalion is receiving additional personnel at Gia Le, necessitating additional tentage. Much canvas considered new for supply purposes is so dry-rotted from long term storage that it does not hold up under the heavy winds experienced in the Gia Le area.

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- 8 May 67 S-4 departed for DaNang to act as Project Officer for the procurement of materials for the Division Command Post complex. S-4 checked in at Headquarters, Force Logistics Command and established basic plan of action. It was decided that the resources of the Naval Support Activity, DaNang, the R&K-BRS Corporation, and the 30th Naval Construction Regiment would be used for this purpose.
- 15 May 67 S-4 returned to Gia Le, after having submitted requisitions in the amount of \$27,549.20 for plumbing and electrical supplies, corrugated metal, and bunker material. About 40% of the time spent in DaNang was devoted to research. The other 60% was spent in preparation of requisitions, liaison visits, and establishment of procedures.
- 16 May 67 S-4 paid Staff visit to Division Headquarters. The Division Engineer was advised that the new Water Purification Units 600GPH would remain on administrative deadline until the essential support not covered in provisioning directives was available. G-4 (Plans) advised that the CG, III MAF concurred in the requirement for each Engineer Squad to have a chain saw as part of its normal in-country equipment. G-4 and Ordnance Officers advised that there is no hope of redistributing M79 grenade Launcher until XM-148 is available.
- 18 May 67 The Battalion received 11 Water Purification Units 600 GPH. Associated water distribution sets are also on hand.
- 19 May 67 S-4 again met with Commanding Officer, Phu Bai Critical Zone. Much has been learned about negotiation with Oriental personages.
- 23 May 67 S-4 returned to DaNang to further coordinate delivery of materials for Division Command Post complex and induct additional requisitions.
- 29 May 67 S-4 returned to Gia Le. 1st FSR is holding about two-thirds of the materials covered by the first batch of requisitions. Shipment will follow the clearance of issue mats and transportation control movement documents. The second batch of requisitions totalled \$3,691.17. The total buy from NSA and R&K-BRS is \$31,240.37 to date.
- 30 May 67 The Battalion received 19 of the multi-fuel dump trucks scheduled for delivery to this organization. S-4 paid cannibalization of replaced M51's.

3. This team was also involved in several other work details and jobs which involved no demolition work whatsoever. A few of this additional tasks were:
  - (a) Night patrols and ambushes.
  - (b) Guard duty.
  - (c) Police work which included cleaning heads.
4. It is understandable how men living in an infantry company area might perform the above extra duties, but the fact remains that this team was sent to perform demolition work. I believe that the infantry carry enough demolitions with them to perform the few tasks this team was asked to accomplish in this period of time.

- 220745H Arrived at OP "230". Coordinated with NCOIC, informed of mission, exchanged radio frequencies, left one days supply of rations.
- 220830H Departed OP "230" for patrol base with six cases of "C" Rations, three; five gallon cans of water, and normal equipment.
- 220930H Arrived at foot of Hill 230 (YD851089). Had three (3) near heat casualties.
- 221000H Attempted to move on toward objective but was repeatedly halted by the heat and excessive loads carried.
- 221100H Held up at water hole (YD849096) for the remainder of the excessive heat period of the day. Resupplied deminishing water supply.
- 221600H Moved to (YD846100). Had evening chow and refilled canteens at nearby water hole.

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- 221800H Proceeded to (YD842100). Moved one fire team to observation point after dark. Remaining elements set up perimeter in nearby defilade area.
- 222000H Called in 155 artillery for registration (7 rounds HE, 1 round Illum.)
- 222130H - 222400H Observed (2) lights in vicinity of (YD837095) that appeared to be stationary. No other signs of enemy or enemy movement had been observed during the day.
- 231030H Took four man team for water resupply in vicinity of (YD835102). Searched area of artillery registration and area where lights appeared to be coming from, both with negative results. Remainder of patrol left on hill top in position of good general observation.
- 231600H Returned to OP with water resupply. Consolidated patrol in defilade area, had evening chow, and prepared to move to Hill 200 (YD842096).
- 232000H Left OP at (YD842100) for new OP on Hill 200.
- 232030H Arrived at Hill 200 and set up defense. Called in one round 155 artillery illumination with negative results. No enemy movement or lights observed during the night. Continued observation until 241100H from Hill 200 with negative results.
- 241100H Moved to water point vicinity of (YD841090) for water resupply and shade. Proceed to OP "230" at 241730H.
- 241900H Arrived at OP "230". Awaited resupply helicopters.
- 250930H Conducted Fam-Fire of all T/O weapons plus M-79 grenade launcher and M-60 machine gun.
- 251600H Boarded CH34 helicopters for return trip to area.
- 251730H Arrived GIA LE Combat base.

6. Observations - No enemy forces were noted in the area of observation but the area is relatively open to enemy infiltration due to the lack of friendly forces in the area and the somewhat favorable terrain.

7. Recommendations - It is recommended that no permanent Observation Post be established on Hill 200, because the area which can be observed from 200 can also be observed from OP "230" and OP "180". 3/26 now has permanently established observation posts on these two hills.

8. Lessons Learned - That 8 - 9 man reconnaissance patrol would be sufficient and reduce the possibility of being observed. That movement not be made during the heat of the day with anymore than normal combat gear, if not at all. It was found that two rations per day per man was sufficient and that the average consumption of water was about 1 1/2 gallons (6 canteens) per day per man. Good water sources were found in the vicinity of Hill 200 which precludes carrying additional water while patrolling the area. That 1 - 2 plastic water can with pack board(s) be taken for water resupply runs.

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Weapons which deliver maximum fire power with minimum or reduced weight such as the M-79 grenade launcher and the M-16 automatic rifle be carried on future patrols.



# Diagram Showing Configuration of Tunnel Entrances







**1. SUPPLY SITUATION**

a. This organization is in a very precarious position due to acute shortages of DD-Form 1348 and NAVMC 708-SD. Inasmuch as the entire supply structure depends on these basic source documents, it is remarkable that stocks of these forms are completely exhausted. It is strongly recommended that this situation be rectified as soon as possible.

d. The big logistics effort for May was the assembling of materials for the Division CP complex. Total cost of plumbing and electrical hardware, nails, corrugated metal and bunker materials is estimated at \$31,240, and total of 297 line items. The 9-4 spent 15 days in Danang organizing and coordinating this project. Special procedures had to be developed because everything was handled on an exception basis. As of 31 May, no materials have been delivered to the Battalion, but about half have been positioned at 1st FSR awaiting clearance of the necessary paperwork. Assistance and cooperation from FLC, Support Battalion 1st FSR, NSA, and RMK were outstanding.

e. Lumber continued to be an unresolved issue. The recommendations has been made on several occasions to establish stock levels for lumber, specify criteria for its use, and allow requisitioning to proceed on a routine stock replenishment basis. Special projects should be handled as non-recurring demand. If this recommendation is not implemented, there will never be a simple or satisfactory means of controlling lumber.
