



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Part II

Narrative Summary

Enclosure (1)

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A. Intelligence

1. Nightly briefings continued to be held during the month of June for the Battalion Commander, Staff Officers, Company Commanders, and Section Heads, with the Battalion Intelligence Chief substituting in absence of the Intelligence Officer. The briefings consisted of mine and boobytrap incident reports in the 3d Marine Division TAOR, current tactical situations and VC/NVA Order of Battle, and information pertinent to Engineer Operations.

2. During the month of June, a total of 116 mine/boobytrap incidents were recorded. Of that number 55 devices were detonated and 61 were found and destroyed. The most common type device identified during the month was the rigged ChiCom grenade, although rigged dud ordnance continued to comprise a significant number of the total incidents. A true picture of the type mine/boobytraps most commonly employed by the enemy is difficult to obtain however, due to the large percentage that are detonated rather than destroyed and because of the number that are blown in place before identification can be made. Areas most heavily mined during June in the 3d Marine Division TAOR are as follows: 1. Area in QUANG TRI Province in the vicinity of CON THIEN and along the cleared strip between there and GIO LINH. 2. Area north of HUE in THUY THIEN Province in Operation CHOCTAW AO and including CO FI THANH TAN Valley. 3. Along National Route #1 in the southern portion of PHU LOC District.

3. On 21 June 1967 the Battalion Intelligence Officer attended an S-2 conference conducted by 3d Marine Division G-2 staff. Topics of discussion centered around problems of intelligence gathering and dissemination and proper employment of advisors and CHIEU HOI/KIT CARSON Scouts. Sources of information available to the Battalion S-2 were also discussed.

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B. Training

1. Training during June consisted of GMS Training as outlined in Part IV, Section B.
2. Three (3) Marines from the 3d Motor Transport Battalion were schooled in the operations and maintenance of the 30 KW and 60 KW generators. Classes for this instruction were conducted by the 3d Engineer Battalion Generator Operator's School. Emphasis was placed on the instruction given on the 30 KW generator. The graduates were licensed to operate that generator.
3. The 3d Marine Division Land Mine Warfare School, conducted by this battalion, continued to instruct both division and non-division personnel in mines, boobytraps, and demolitions. The instruction was given through contact teams and resident courses in the battalion school area at PHU BAI as follows:

4. During June, 1967 the 3d Marine Division Tunnel Team continued to train.
5. Utilizing the battalion's allotment of 25 XM16A1 rifles for training, selected staff NCO's have conducted classes in each company to familiarize the unit's Marines with the nomenclature, functioning, operation, and maintenance of the weapon. These classes will continue until all members of the battalion are thoroughly indoctrinated in the weapon in anticipation of the replacement of the M14 with the M16.
6. During the early part of the month a contact assistance team from EMF Pac visited the Motor Transport Platoon of this battalion to evaluate, educate, and recommend methods to improve the existing 1st and 2d echelon preventative maintenance/supply procedures. Informal periods of instruction were attended by nearly all personnel in the section. The information gleaned from these classes has already proven to be very beneficial to the entire platoon.

C. Operations

1. General. During June the 3d Engineer Battalion remained operational in general support of the 3d Marine Division. Employment of the battalion was in the dual role of combat support and combat service support.

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2. General Combat Support

(a) No visual sweeps were made during June

(b) A total of 291 deliberate minesweeps were conducted during June for a daily average distance swept of 28,828 meters. This represents an increase of 39.2% in the number of deliberate sweeps and an increase of 44.8% in the average distance covered per day over that of the preceeding month. 3. Direct Combat Support

(a) Combat support of infantry operations was directly provided through task organized engineer elements from the battalion. For the most part, this support was rendered by the three letter companies. On a daily average, more than 295 members of the Third Engineer Battalion were in the field assisting twelve (12) infantry battalions. Their proficiency with demolition materials enabled them to destroy enemy ordnance when captured, render enemy field fortifications, especially bunkers, completely useless, and to clear landing zones for helicopters. Minesweep teams cleared areas for the establishment of CP sites. Tunnel teams stood by for action upon the location of suspected enemy cave and tunnel complexes. Their training and proficiency saved Marine lives

and time during search and destroy operations. A case in point is documented in Part IV, Section A.

- (b) In addition to close combat support activities, combat engineers assisted rear echelons in clearing and constructing base areas from which to operate. In many instances they had to depend upon a basic working knowledge of field engineering for improvisations in the face of material shortages and time requirements.
- (c) 2d Lt. Marion R. SKINNER, Jr. and four squads supported the 3d Bn., 4th Marines from 17 May 67 to 2 June 67 during Operation HICKORY. Canned rations and 20,000 lbs. of rice belonging to the NVA were found and destroyed. Also a variety of NVA ordnance was rendered useless to the enemy through the efforts of a team under Cpl. BROWN attached to "M" Co. 3d Bn., 9th Marines was given engineer support by twelve Marines from "A" Co. at DONG HA. Organized in four man teams, these engineers supported three full infantry companies from 15 May to 6 June 67. They expended a ton of high explosives destroying bunkers, mines, and enemy ordnance. ICpl. EURNS was killed by automatic fire while attempting to remove wounded Marines from the battlefield.

Two companies from 3/4 were benefitted by capable engineer assistance from an eight (8) man team under Cpl. T. CASTERLING from "A" Co. The results of their efforts are listed in Part IV, section A.

Twenty-one (21) Marines from "C" Co. at DONG HA breached an ARVN mine field using an LVTE-1 to create a secure 8 foot path through the field.

The 2d Platoon of "B" Co., 3d Engr. Bn. supported 1/4 during a search and destroy operation in Operation CHOCTAW from 7 June to 15 June 67. Previously this platoon had worked with 2/4 and destroyed a large amount of ordnance.

"C" Co., 3d Engr. Bn. sent a platoon out with 3d Bn., 4th Marines during the period 13 - 20 June 1967. Their assigned mission was to destroy all enemy fortifications, bunkers, and emplacements in operational areas, and to detect and destroy mines, boobytraps, and dud ordnance. So formidable is the array of their efforts that mention here is impossible. Documentation is made in Part IV, Section A.

Lt. STEVENS and his platoon cleared helicopter landing zones for 2/4 during the conduct of a search and destroy mission from 16 - 22 June 67.

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The Tunnel Team from "B" Co. searched and eventually destroyed a suspected enemy tunnel at (YD 471222). The main shaft was nearly 30 feet straight down. One infantryman had died attempting to enter it and a second was overcome by a toxic gas. The "tunnel rats" successfully entered the complex and destroyed it without further injury.

4. Combat Service Support

(a) Roads and Bridges.

- (1) Other than dust suppression efforts on major cantonment roads in the PHU BAI vital area and routine maintenance on MSR segments in the CHOCTAW area, little work was done on road construction by this battalion. The PHU BAI water point turn-around was built up and rocked.

No bridge construction was done. Several bridge reconstructions were made, however, to make repair estimates on enemy destroyed bridges for ARVN engineers. Also, a recon was conducted covering bridges between the HUE LCU ramp and PHU BAI to determine bridge classes in anticipation of a heavy load to be transported over them.

- (2) The coordination efforts made in connection with Operation CUMBERLAND are mentioned in a separate section.

(b) Field Fortifications.

The expansion of the DONG HA Combat Base perimeter required the installation of 4000 meters of defensive wire. "A" Co. engineers undertook this task and have nearly completed it. Heavy equipment assets were used to dig gun positions for 3/12. Earth works for the GIA LE Combat Base COC were finished.

The battalion's defensive bunkers were rebuilt and sandbagged and the perimeter wire was improved with installation of a belt of tanglefoot.

(c) General Construction.

Letter company engineers and members of Construction Platoon, Support Co. fabricated a wide variety of items during June. "B" Co. provided the 4th Marines at Operation CHOCTAW a concrete deck for the regimental messhall, generator bunkers, a strongback for the CO, and Torts for the area gates. They also built a wooden deck into the 4th Marines COC bunker, constructed a regimental aid station, and erected a house for the CG. "A" Co. began construction of barracks for Task Force KRUEGER and finished fabrication of a sentry booth for Camp CARROLL. Construction Platoon erected a water tower for Cantonment #1 in PHU BAI and repaired heads

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in Cantonment #2. Two (2) 4 hole heads were made for 3/26. Two (2) 6 hole and two (2) 4 hole heads were pre-fabricated and sent to 1/26 at KHE SANH. Road signs were made and painted for use in the PHU BAI area.

- (d) Utilities Platoon of Support Company continuing wiring the battalion area during June. Extensive electrical surveys were made for the 3d Tank Bn., the 3d Antitank Bn., and 4th Marines. The wiring and plumbing of the new Division CP complex was also done by the utilities platoon. This involved many man-hours and will be completed upon the receipt of items currently not available from in-country supply outlets.

Division and non-division units were provided a continual supply of raw and potable water. Ten (10) water points were operational during the month in the QUANG TRI and PHU BAI TAOR's. The totals for the month represent a 42% increase in the amount of raw water produced and a 19% increase in potable gallonage. The addition of one water point and the increased demands for water during summer months were responsible for raising total output in gallons 29% over that of the previous month. The totals for June are as follows:

- (e) Drafting and Surveying

This section continued to support division units with a survey, layout, and drafting capability. During June, its personnel continued a topographic survey of the GIA LE Combat Base and reworked drafting and layout plans for the new Div. C.P. complex.

5. Combat

- (a) The 3d Engineer Battalion on occasion sent platoon and reinforced platoon sized units into the corners of the GIA LE area of operations with combat missions. Apart from routine security patrols regularly dispatched by the GIA LE Combat Base COC, a number of platoons participated in sweep and clear, cordon and search, and search and destroy operations in conjunction with combined action company units, the National Police, and the 26th Marines.

The GIA LE COC continued to coordinate the base defense and security efforts of the tenant units. This was accomplished by improvements on the existing field fortifications, overseeing patrol activities, and maintaining base alertness through recurrent drills.

Major General Bruno HOCHMUTH toured GIA LE Combat Base on 17 June and inspected the operations of the Combat Operations Center.

6. Special Significant Projects.(a) Operation GUMBERLAND

The 3d Engineer Battalion assumed overall responsibility for the coordination of the construction of Route #547 from the southwest corner of HUE to the fire support base at (YD 6008). At the present, engineers have reached the location of the support base and have completed upgrading the first one-half of the road to Class 60 while most of the second half is Class 30.

The ferry now in operation at NAM HOA will be replaced with a Class 60 floating bridge. Materials are being staged at the site in anticipation of the removal of the ferry.

A suitable rock source for surfacing has been located and an access road is being cut for hauling.

(b) New Division Command Post Complex

To date in excess of 25,610 man-hours have been expended by the Construction and Utilities Platoons in construction of a new command post for the division. The entire project, consisting of the erection of an eight winged main building, CG's quarters, VIP quarters the ADC's quarters, and the general's mess, is nearly 40% complete. A shortage of critical items and the non-availability of others has continually hampered progress. A representative from this organization was sent to OKINAWA in hope of buying and expediting the flow of necessary materials into the project. Work, however, has continued by paralleling jobs and improvisation wherever possible.

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D. COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications were maintained with Engineer units located at Dong Ha and the Choctaw operating area.
2. Installed a local telephone to the Officers and Staff NCO Club.
3. Engineer Battalion acted as a relay between C Company, 1st Battalion 4th Marines and the 1st Battalion 4th Marines until satisfactory communications were established. This was accomplished by having the 1st Battalion 4th Marines send equipment and personnel to the Engineer Battalion Command Post to act as a relay.
4. Provided radio communications for the road recon conducted by the S-3.
5. Provided med evac assistance for two separate heat casualties suffered by the recon patrol.
6. Established radio communications with the Motor Transport Battalion to facilitate the control of convoys to the Cumberland operating area.
7. Provided radio communications for the blocking force assembled in conjunction with CAC operations. Assistance for a med evac of a patrol member was provided.
8. Colonel Kern, the division CEO, visited the Communication Bunker.
9. Relocated, tagged, and sandbagged the Trunk Line Terminal Board.
10. Discontinued telephone service to the Special Forces Group due to their movement.
11. Installed a local telephone to the Dental Office.
12. Provided radio communications for the road recon conducted by the S-3.
13. Completed the underground construction of the Combat Base Trunk Lines in conjunction with Third Tank Battalion.

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E. LOGISTICS

1. During June the Battalion continued to direct its logistic, combat, and combat service support from its Headquarters at Gia Le. This organization has men committed in every tactical area of the 3d Marine Division. Its service functions, water supply, shower points, are fully as dispersed as its combat support elements. Logistic support of Battalion elements presently extends to Operations CUMBERLAND, CHOCTAW, CROCKETT, and CHARRON. No one of these operations involves quite the same logistic problems; on the contrary, each of these operations had unique characteristics involving specialized solutions. All operations have had one common characteristic; that being the requirement for specific materials or equipment for in excess of expenditure rates or allowances.

2. Never before in its history has the 3d Engineer Battalion sustained such diverse operations over so wide an area. In one month, June, the Battalion issued 7,500,000 gallons of potable water, committed its Construction Platoon to the building of a large Division Command Post complex, assumed logistic control of a major operation of combined arms (CUMBERLAND), moved its heavy equipment and vehicles between tactical areas to meet expanding commitments and maintain operational continuity, acted as installation coordinator for the Gia Le Combat Base, pioneered MSR's, provided numerous tunnel, demolition, and sweep teams, and carried out internal housekeeping functions.

3. The Battalion S-4 Officer spent one week in Danang as a "bird dog" to complete delivery of materials for construction of the Division Command Post at Phu Bai. Many construction items are not commonly stocked, and the procurement of materials involves a high degree of liaison and perseverance. Naval Support Activity, Danang, is now becoming the normal source of construction materials for III MAF, and it is expected that this will enhance the flow of these materials.

F. Civil Affairs.

1. During the month of June significant progress was made in the 3d Engineer Battalion Civil Affairs area, the Village of Loc Dien. Much of the progress can be attributed to the increased in the availability of material supplies and Medcap supplies. Materials delivered to the village for completion of the school house and village headquarters, included the following: 50 sheets of tin, 26 bags of cement, 30 liters of paint, 10 pounds of nails. Three midwife kits and refills and soap were also delivered for the use in the village.

2. On 17 June 1967 the 3d Engineer Battalion Civil Affairs Officer accompanied by the Battalion Executive officer, Battalion Sergeant Major, and Vietnamese interpreter, visited the 3d Engineer Civil Affairs area. Members of the visiting party met with the village chief Mr. Nguyen Chuong, and plans were discussed for upgrading and widening a road into the village market place which also allow access of vehicles to the newly completed village school house. Plans for sending students from Loc Dien to school in Hue were also discussed plus future prospects of building an addition room on to the school house.

3. On 20 June a Medcap was conducted in Loc Dien. The Battalion Surgeon and Dentist participated with the result of having treated one hundred and three patients including thirteen dental patients. The Army PsyOps team also participated by passing out health leaflets and soap. More frequent Medcaps are planned in the future due to the availability of Medcap supplies.

070900H - Fire team and interpreter went into village at YD 787165 to search and ask location. Nothing found. Two persons in village reported they were only there during the day, lived in GIA LE. Village appeared uninhabited except for a few chickens.

071100H - Patrol arrived at Bhuddist temple at YD 782179. Inhabited by approximately 12 people; women, children and monks. No unusually large quantities of stores. People very friendly and helpful.

071300H - Using two squads as blocking force at south end of village, one squad swept and searched village at YD 797166. Approximately 15 structures found. Most had no roofs and were collapsing. Fields and rice paddies cultivated. A group of five were in one house which had a roof and furniture. People said they used house only in daytime, lived in GIA LE. House was in a condition which would permit permanent habitation. All thick veg-

estation, structures both occupied and unoccupied, were searched for weapons, supplies, entrances to underground tunnels, etc. Negative results. People appeared friendly and cooperative.

071315H - Routine med-evac of heat casualty, PFC R.T. FISHER at YD 795173.

071500H - Began search of all cultivated fields and paddies following stream southward from YD 799161. Formation employed was one squad on each side of cultivated area, one squad down middle. Found some sheds used for tool storage. Also found one half bag of rice, assorted cans. Large number of people on trail west of stream bank. Majority stopped and searched, no contraband discovered, all had ID cards.

071630 - Searched through village at YD 799142. Structures had no roofs, no signs of use.

071730H - Patrol leader, radio operator, and one fire team searched down trail to YD 796139. Evidence of fire built on bridge at YD 798140. No other unusual signs found.

071930H - Rocks forming arrow pointing northeast found on east side of trail, north bank of stream at YD 798140.

072000H - Set up platoon perimeter at YD 804145. Some arrows about 20 inches in length (made of brush) were found in this area, pointing northeast.

080800H - Swept village at YD 812146. Four people heading south along trail were questioned, belongings searched. Nothing unusual found. Search of village revealed no people, no unusual signs. A pen of five water buffalo was found unattended. Found and blew in place one 105mm round, no secondary explosion.

081000H - PFC F.J. BALDINI evacuated by helicopter for nausea and upset stomach at YD 812149.

081115H - Patrol entered Base perimeter.

6. Observations. No significant evidence of enemy forces was noted in the area.

7. Recommendations.

a. That surveillance of the area be maintained as practicable by patrols from the QIA LE Combat Base, since enemy movement in this area could proceed undetected from the air.

b. That patrols travelling short distances from the perimeter such as this one utilize Observation Post #3

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for route reconnaissance prior to leaving.

c. That sufficient radios be taken for intra-patrol communications in patrols numbering over 30 men.

d. That aerial photos continue to be used in patrol planning.

e. That an interpreter be taken on all daytime patrols.

f. That positions be reported in relation to checkpoints previously passed.

Alpha also reported that five (5) V.C. were spotted leaving through northern sector shortly after our force was set in position.

140830H - Alpha completed sweep and picked up eight (8) V. C. suspects.

140900H - Alpha teams began another sweep through same area with more emphasis placed on search for weapons.

140915H - Routine Medivac of man from 3d Tank Battalion.


141100H - Alpha secured our blocking force from operation.

141200H - Returned to Battalion area.

6. Observations. No enemy forces were detected by our forces. It was noted that the trails in YD 8216 are widely used and that good ambush sites exist throughout the area.

7. Recommendations. It is recommended that daylight recon patrols and night ambush patrols be conducted throughout YD 8216. It is further recommended that these patrols be conducted by elements of Gia Le Combat Base.

8. Lessons Learned. When a search and destroy operation of this type is planned, the blocking force elements should be set in shortly after dark and not before.

7. Observations

Engineers were used extensively blowing close to 500 bunkers and using 2453 pounds of Compound C-4.

8. Recommendations

Demolition techniques of blowing bunkers and tunnels learned by actual experience in the field should be passed on to the Companies in training instruction.

9. Lessons Learned

It is best to blow enemy fortifications by digging a series of holes in the top, placing the charge and tamping down this way the materials are blown into the hole or tunnel covering it up. Dual priming should be used when time permits. Trunk lines and ring mains are excellent for destroying a bunker completely.

On the morning of 18 June 1967 the 1st squad, 3rd platoon, Foxtrof Company, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines discovered an opening in the ground, approximately 50 feet from a trail at coordinates YB71222. The squad leader reported the discovery and immediately dispatched a man down the opening with a life line tied around his chest. Upon reaching a level of 15 feet below ground the man became panicked and appeared to be gasping for air. He began to climb the rope which let slack tangle about his legs. He then became unconscious and fell back into the hole, wedging himself in a doubled position in such a way that he could not be dislodged with the rope.

Another man entered the hole to assist him and also became unconscious. A third man entered the hole 30 minutes later and removed them both by holding his breath. The first man died shortly thereafter of asphyxiation.

The 2/4 Commanding Officer requested support of the Company "B", 3d Engineer Battalion, tunnel team. The tunnel team was alerted and prepared to embark 15 minutes after the request. Late in the afternoon of 18 June the team was landed in the vicinity of the tunnel. The 4th Marine Regimental Doctor accompanied the team. An emergency request was made for an oxygen resuscitator from Jim Hill, which was delivered immediately to the site via the Division Commanding General's helicopter.

A member of the tunnel team entered the tunnel with a lantern and wearing a gas mask. He was able to enter the tunnel 26 feet which appeared to be the end. At this point he discovered that the tunnel turned and went into a small room. He was forced to remove the gas mask because of the restricted maneuvering space and began to come up. At this time he became unconscious due to an unknown gas or the lack of oxygen. He was brought quickly to the surface by his lifeline, and administered oxygen by the Regimental Surgeon who was present. In the Doctor's opinion the man would not have survived evacuation if it were not for the presence of oxygen at the site.

Blow-off blowers were used in an attempt to cause a downdraft to blow smoke through the tunnel exposing the exit. A backpressure was built up which indicated there was no other entrance, however, the smoke was absorbed within the tunnel. After clearing the tunnel a rope ladder was constructed and one man entered the tunnel with the aid of an oxygen resuscitator with extension hose. With the aid of the supplementary air supply he was able to go to the bottom of the tunnel and begin clearing the partially obstructed tunnel. Work relays of 15 minutes were set up to clear a passageway. The tunnel made a 45 degree turn and into a small room. The tunnel team was unable to enter the room due to the heavy concentration of the gas. The team recommended that self-contained breathing apparatus be used to enter the contaminated area and 3d Recon Battalion was notified to send a scuba team to the position. With the help of the tunnel team they were able to enter the room and determine that the tunnel appeared to end there and that it contained no enemy materials. After coming out of the tunnel the recon team and those members of the tunnel team who had been exposed to the air in the tunnel complained of severe headaches. Approximately two hours later two members of the recon team were vomiting. All persons who had spent lengthy periods in the tunnel were passing blood in their urine. The Regimental Doctor present advised that the reaction was from a toxic gas inhaled and all persons were placed under observation for several days. Upon being notified that the tunnel was clear an engineer team placed charges in the tunnel to deny its use to the enemy and in an attempt to expose a hidden entrance. The tunnel was completely destroyed and salted with CS powder.

7. Lessons Learned:

a. The oxygen resuscitator was instrumental in saving the lives of those overcome by the gas and bad air within the tunnel. It is the feeling of the

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Regimental Surgeon and this Command that such a resuscitator should be on call to the tunnel team with an experienced operator to accompany the team. While an incidence with natural gas is a rare case the chance of running into a dead air pocket is very great and its' danger is just as real.

b. Whenever possible it is advised that an Officer or Senior NCO accompany the tunnel team to insure that the maximum amount of safety precautions are observed and so that they may work without the intimidation of those not experienced in their specialized work.

1. SUPPLY SITUATION

a. The rotation of the present Supply Officer on 1 July and the lack of a replacement pose a serious problem for this organization. Until a new Supply Officer is assigned, the S-4 will oversee the functioning of Battalion Supply. Since this account is about the largest in the Division, and certainly the most diversified, it is essential that any officer assigned to the billet be mature and experienced.

b. Conversion reconciliation was largely completed during June. The most significant result was the cancellation of approximately 2600 documents, representing both FY-66 and FY-67 obligations. All documents had been valid as far as this account was concerned. The question of what happened to these documents after induction into the supply system is a ponderous one. Best indications are that the initial reconciliation listings are incomplete. Other interesting aspects of the reconciliation are: unidentifiable document numbers, inverted FSN's, Supply Action Reports which are not to be considered valid, erroneous status cards, and failure to take action on reinstatements from previous Quarterly Reconciliation listings.

c. No documents cancelled by the conversion reconciliation were reinstated. Documents whose validity is reaffirmed are being resubmitted.

d. The Battalion continued to utilize the resources of NSA in procuring materials for the Division CP complex. A 100% fill rate on all documents submitted is expected. It is gratifying to learn that 1st FBT increasingly uses NSA as a source of supply for common items. This should significantly alleviate problems in obtaining construction materials.

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e. The Unit Code Management Report for the period ending 30 April 1967 reflects total obligations against this organization's OPBUD in the amount of \$1,299,390.36. The conversion reconciliation may alter this figure significantly.

f. It came to the attention of this organization that certain provisions of MCO 4400.4A regarding Recoverable Items Reporting require review and possible implementation by the Division.

(1) Paragraph 8a(2) requires commands to submit Recoverable Items Reports for equipment excess to total allowances of the command.

(2) Paragraph 9b requires the use of special advice codes on DD-1348 when requisitioning recoverable items.

(3) Paragraph 12 requires organizations to invoice recoverable items to the holding maintenance facility whenever the latter issues a letter of unserviceable property for a recoverable item.

(4) The matter of excesses is of concern since there is some question as to the total special allowance authorizations issued to Division organizations. Enclosure (3) of MCO 4440.19B (Controlled Items Reporting) indicates the ICP will issue an error card (Code WE6) whenever assets of a controlled item exceed allowances. Action is further required to correct allowance records at the ICP. This organization has received no such error cards, so it is concluded that the ICP shows no excesses for RUC 1348. This has a relationship to Recoverable Items Reporting in that excesses may not have to be reported under MCO 4400.4E if the Controlled Items system generates no excess cards. However, this also points up the necessity for insuring that allowances and on-hand assets are fully equated.

2. Not applicable.

3. CLASSES II AND IV

a. Narrative Summary.

(1) This organization is not in a position to fully evaluate its Class II situation with regard to T/Deficiencies until all records can be fully reconciled.

(2) Major items on requisition include (1) 550 grader, (2) TD-15 Tractors, (1) M60 crane, (1) 12 compressor, (2) high pressure cleaning units, (2) high pressure lubrication units, (1) M/TKO-47, (16) cal .38 pistols, and (1) Benalt saw.

(3) Redistribution of P-153 mine detectors was authorized. To date, 2/4 and 1/9 are the only battalions complying with CG, 3d MarDiv message ~~310009~~ May 67. Additional detectors are required for Operation CUMBERLAND.

(4) Equipment formerly held by BLT 3/4 for the attached Engineer platoon still has not been invoiced to this organization. Cooperation in this regard has not been forthcoming.

(5) During his visit to Phu Bai on 26 June 1967 the Commanding General, FIIPac, authorized a full per-individual allowance of body armor upper torso.

(6) This organization has continuing and heavy operational requirements for the below listed items. FLGG-A should stock these items in adequate quantities to meet daily resupply requirements in the tactical operating areas. These items are available in-country, if FLGG-A is to carry out its mission of support to the Division, it is essential that that organization take aggressive action to position those necessary stocks. The prosecution of certain tactical operations may be seriously hampered without the below items.

- (a) welding Rod 1/4 and 3/8
- (b) Portland cement
- (c) Acetylene
- (d) Oxygen
- (e) Asphalt
- (f) Culvert, 48", 60", 72"

(7) Sandbags were in short supply throughout June, while at the same time demand was building.

d. Items critical or essential in nature whose non-availability jeopardizes some aspect of Battalion operation. The below items and those shown as "Critical" in paragraph 3c are among the problem-type items which have been valid on requisition yet not produced by the supply system. In some cases stocks are known to be held at FLOG-A or 1st F&R, though not carried on balance or locator checks. It is recommended that an inquiry against MC100 backorder files be requested monthly for problem-type items, followed by warehouse search to determine what items may be available but not carried on balance or locator decks. If all supply action available to III MAF commands is to be taken to rectify shortages, such action cannot be overlooked. Below items are grouped functionally.

(1) For care of individual weapons

6. MAINTENANCE SITUATION
