(a) Out-of-RVN patient evacuation decreased to 581 for the month.

(b) Cantonment construction progress is unsatisfactory due to the slow delivery of inadequate amounts of materials needed. The surgical and recovery complex remains apart from the improved remainder of the hospital creating problems of patient transportation by litter around the hospital compound. Ambulation to meals is hazardous because of mud and rough terrain resulting from construction.

c. The Command Chronology for "E" Company, 3d Medical Battalion was submitted to FLSU #1 by OPCOM order.

d. A Command Chronology from "D" Company, 3d Medical Battalion has not been submitted in that "D" Company's complement consists of one MCC Officer and six Hospital Corpsmen at this time.

c. Administration

(1) Sgt POORE has been placed in overall charge of the Marines attached to this Company.

(2) Sgt WILKES has been placed in charge of all security, graves registration and Marine administration.

d. Training

(1) Inservice training continues with biweekly lectures to all Corpamen in general sessions and weekly one hour lectures to the OR technicians on surgical topics with a similar weekly one hour lecture on medical topics to the general ward Corpamen.

(2) The biweekly 1½ hour Vietnamese language course given by the Hue University Professor of Law continues.

(3) Additional texts from stateside publishers include nursing guides and general surgical, medical and obstetrical texts. (Advice is given to the Rural Midwife running an inpatient Maternity Clinic within our perimeter as needed.)

e. Command and Control

(1) The Commanding Officer and professional staff meet daily for pertinent discussion. The Commanding Officer and Administrative Officer meet daily to discuss pertinent problems as they arise. Biweekly weapons inspections are conducted by the military adviser during the monsoon season because of the more rapid deteriorating of weapons. The Senior NCO conducts daily working area inspections and the Administrative Officer with the Senior NCO conducts weekly quarters and working area inspections. The military adviser conducts biweekly inspections of the defense positions and at least weekly unannounced defensive drills are carried out.

(1) con'd. Defensive positions have been rebuilt using rocky soil to cover sandbagged bunkers with built in drainage ditches. The defensive plan has been altered to integrate the 52 Seabees presently billeted at A Med. This allows all positions to be manned, one 15 man reaction squad to be available while allowing all OR, Intensive Care, Laboratory and A & S personnel to be free to handle casualties.

i. Logistics

(1) The 10 day block has been brought up to combat readiness and work continues on the 30 day block.



Subj: Mass Casualty Bill

Encl: (1) Mass Casualty Handling Duty Assignments

1. Purpose. To promulgate a mass casualty handling plan, whereby all personnel in the field hospital enclave will report to a designated area for assignment to duties allowing maximum utilization of skills, abilities and training.
2. Cancellation. This order cancels and supersedes Company Order 3040.2 of 7 September 1965.
3. Information. The field hospital is subject to receipt of casualty loads at any time of such magnitude as to require the maximum utilization of all available personnel occupying the hospital enclave. Concomitantly, this requires the cooperation of all hands in reporting and making themselves available for assignment.
4. Action. The word will be passed by the most expedient means available upon receipt of information that mass casualties are expected. Personnel not on duty will immediately assemble and commence preparations for receipt of casualties.
 - a. Assembly. Enclosure (1) reflects areas to which personnel are to report. Personnel required to report to the "triage area" will assemble in an area so designated by the Coordinators adjacent to the A&S tent. Coordinators will then make assignments to areas requiring assistance.
 - b. Triage. Hospital Corps and Dental Technician personnel assembled in the triage area will be utilized for individual patient care and supportive treatment in the triage area, under the direction of the triage officer. Once assigned to an individual patient, the responsible Hospital Corpsman or Dental Technician will remain with the patient until properly relieved, assisting in treatment, movement, etc., as necessary.
5. Assignment. All personnel whose duties under the bill might foreseeably require them to work in areas to which they are not normally assigned should familiarize themselves with the location of supplies and equipment in the triage, shock and debridement areas in order that they may be of maximum assistance when required.

6. Concurrence. The Commanding Officers of 1st S Company and 3rd Dental Company concur in the assignments made herein and agree that operational and organizational control of excess personnel during mass casualties will be vested in the Commanding Officer, "C" Company, or his designated representative. When excess personnel are directed to secure, they shall leave the treatment area immediately so as not to impede the work of personnel remaining on duty.

Subj: Unauthorized Ordnance and Other Contraband in Personal Baggage


Ref: (a) III MAF Order 4651.1

1. Purpose. To establish procedures for indoctrination of personnel and search of personal baggage for contraband prior to departure from the Republic of Viet Nam.

2. Information. Reference (a) requires commanding officers to ensure that personnel departing RVN are indoctrinated on the dangers inherent in carrying items of contraband and unauthorized ordnance in their personal baggage. Carrying of explosives aboard aircraft is expressly forbidden as is the introduction of any item of contraband into countries and territories covered by international law. Reference (a) further authorizes search of personal baggage to ensure compliance with this regulation.

3. Action. Staff personnel departing RVN on any type orders (TAD, TD, E&R, PES) will report to the First Sergeant within 24 hours immediately prior to departure for indoctrination and search of personal baggage. Items of contraband and unauthorized ordnance will be confiscated and appropriate disciplinary measures taken if warranted.

a. Patients. Patients personal baggage will be inspected prior to departure on evacuation flights. This will be the responsibility of the Chief Master-at-Arms and the Ward Supervisor.
