The compliment included three (3) Medical Officers, one (1) Medical Service Corps Officer, sixteen (16) Hospital Corpsmen and one (1) Marine. All personnel, vehicles, supplies and equipment were loaded aboard the USS WESTCHESTER COUNTY LST-1167 by 1800.
- (d). On 28 January 1966, arrived at objective area, but was unable to off-load because of heavy seas.

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- (e) At approximately 1100, 30 January 1966, the Shock-Resusitation Platoon disembarked from the LST-1167 by LCM to the beach. The LST-1167 was able to beach at 1800, but not close enough to off-load the vehicles. Upon reaching the beach, the Shock-Resusitation Platoon's strength was augmented by seven (7) Hospital Corpsmen from Company "A", 1stMedBn., 1st MarDiv. attached to 3dBn., 1stMar., two (2) Medical Officers, two (2) Hospital Corpsmen and one (1) Marine Driver from 2ndBn., 4th Mar.
- (f) At 0900, 31 January 1966, the two (2) M-17- Jeep Ambulances were off-loaded by LCM. All vehicles were off-loaded by 1800 after the construction of a ramp between the LST-1167 and the beach, and the treatment area tentage was set up by 2100.
- (g) At 0900, 1 February 1966, completed the setting up of the treatment area and assumed the duties as Beach Support Area Medical Evacuation Station at 1000. At 1645 blood was on hand, but the reefer was not holding properly. A constant check on reefer temperature instituted at half-hour intervals was maintained in order to keep blood at the correct temperature.
- (h) From 2 February 1966 to 15 February 1966 the platoon acted as a receiving, treatment and evacuation section for Phase I of this operation. Patients were evacuated to Company "B", 3dMedBn. at Chu Lai and to the USS VALLEY FORGE LPH-8 operating off-shore.
- (i) On 15 February 1966, turned over operation of medical evacuation to USS VALLEY FORGE LPH-8 at 1700 and departed to back-load on the USS TICGA COUNTY LST-1158 with one (1) 6x6 prime mover borrowed from 3d Shore Party.
- (j) At 2000, 16 February 1966, personnel and equipment disembarked the LST-1158 and spent the night on the 3d Shore Party sand ramp.
- (k) At 1430, 17 February 1966, Company "D" personnel reported to Company "B", 3dMedBn. with equipment to await further orders.
- (1) LCDR Roger M. HAUSER, MC, USN, releived LCDR R. K. MOLL, MC, USN, as Commanding Officer of Company "D", 3dMedBn.
- (m) At 0600, 19 February 1966, the advance party from 3d Shore Party and Company "D" departed Chu Lai with the first truck convoy to Tam Ky to establish a new Landing Support Area prior to the arrival of personnel and supplies. At 1700, Company "D", mobile loaded, arrived at Tem Ky. At 2010 the treatment area, supply tents and living tents were set up and started operation to receive, treat and evacuate casualities to Company "B", 3dMedBn. at Chu Lai and to the USS REPOSE AH-16 operating off-shore.
- (n) Company "D" continued to receive, treat and evacuate casualities until 1600, 28 February 1966 at which time the operation "DOUBLE EAGLE" was secured.

(o) At 1600, 28 February 1966, Company "D" personnel, supplies and equipment were loaded on a truck convoy to return to the 3d Medical Battalion Headquarters.
