2. Polisted members left the Medical Battalion area by road convoy with the vehicles and equipment on the evening of 3 May 1966. The officers joined them at "A" Medical Company via fixed wing aircraft on the next morning. Contact was made in person with the beginnental S-4 Officer for assignment and general arrangements.

- 5. The operation originally scheduled to begin on early morning of 4 May, was delayed 24 hours because of bad weather, and medical personnel remained at "A" Had during this period.
- 4. At 0445 cm 5 May the detachment joined Regimental convoy and arrived at the LSA area at 0700. A hospital area was set up and first essentities were reserved at 0945. All tents were exected by 1150.
- 5. Three telephones were placed in the hospital tent, one to Shore Farty, one to Regimental switchboard and one to the Air Officer. The latter phone was manned personally by the medical evacuation helicopter pilots who stood by in the medical unit.
- 6. A separate landing area for medical execuation bulicopters was laid out near the hospital area.
- 7. A total of 31 patients were breated by the detachment. These included ten combat injuries and one IIA. We seriously ill patients were received the required vigorous remuncitation. The unit was bypassed by three patients who were taken directly from the field to A Sec.
- S. All personnel assigned to the detechment performed their duties with dispatch and efficiency.
- 9. We significant deficiencies in the medical supply block vers noted. The use of the double GP tent is not recommended for further use because the large overhead flat area collects considerable rain during a storm.
