- (a) Adequate personnel are on board for the Battalian to generally accomplish its mission. A shortage of forty-eight (48) Hespital Corponent precludes implementation of significant casualty holding espabilities. Deployment of a team (shock/surgical or a clearing platoon) to the field would further impair the functioning of the Medical Battalian should increased muster of casualties be received. Some vital camp maintenance was unavailable due to deployment of personnel in support of Operation Hastings.

#### (2) Administration.

(a) Out-of-RVN patient evacuation was 600. Number of patients transferred to the USS REPOSE was 88. Number of patients transferred to NSA Hospital was 200. Number of patients returned to duty was 273.

  - (a) Weekly water samples were collected from all water points of the 3dMarDiv, and reports submitted to the cog. COs. Three new water points were inspected and approved for use. They are located at Hill 47 (2/3 area), Hill 55 (1/9 area) and in the 2/9 TAOR. One water sample from the 2/9 water point was positive for Coliform, but the repeat sample was negative. Water from the new tank installed at the 3dMedBn remains very rusty, but of good quality.

- (b) On 14Jul66 LCDR RUFFIN and ENS HMEL made a trip to the PMS unit at Phu Bai. Supply routines were formulated for our unit at "A" Med.
- (c) On 25Jul66 the animal clinic was held at the 3dMed Bn by the Army Veternarian. Prior notification was made by the PMS to all 3dMarDiv units.
- (d) Larval surveys were conducted throughout the 3dMarDiv. Nightly adulticiding with 6% malathion was accomplished. Larviciding with "Batex" was done in areas where larva were found.
- (e) Rodent control in the 3dMedBn was continued, with renewed effort given to the use of break-back traps, The use of live traps continues, but the nightly catches indicate the rodents are becoming "trap" wise.
- (f) A study was started this month by the PMS laboratory to determine the effectivness of the water purification tablets on the highly contaminated water found in Vietnam. The study is not complete at this time, but the samplings so far indicate good protection, when the directions on the bottle are followed.

- (f) Casualties remained heavy to moderate the first ten days of the operation and then were practically non-existent except for routine sick call patients. The work load remained light until 31 July 1966, at which time the team returned to Da Nang.
