This oftimes results in replacement with untrained and inexperienced personnel in critical areas without time for indoctrination into the procedures of these areas, i. e. intensive care ward, Triage, minor surgery. The ultimate result is reflected in poor patient care. There were fourteen (11) Navy and Marine personnel of Delta Company who received minor injuries from schrapnel or while rapidly seeking cover during a rocket and mortar attack at Dong Ha approximately 0230, 28 April 1967.
