  - Significant events during the month of May 1967
    - (1) Personnel:
- (a) Personnel strengths have centinued to improve so that the battalien is now near T/O strength. The distribution of specialties is adequate, however, we presently have an inordinately high number of senior personnel i.e. 42 Yavy E-7 or above with T/C billets for 17!

(b) Awards Made - Three Commanding General's Certificates of Commendation and one Purple Heart were presented at a battalion formation on 18 May 1967. Certificate of Commendations were presented to:

HMCS Roger S. CHOAT, USN; HM3 John T. MCNIFF, USN and HM3 John M. LITTLE, USN. A Purple Heart was presented to HN Richard A. JAMISON, USN.

#### (2) Administration:

- (a) Number of patients transferred to NSA Hospital -393 to 22nd CSF -317; to Sea -330; to 1st MedBn 27; returned to duty 351
  - (b) Total number of casualties processed 1418
- (c) Additionally 353 of the total casualties were triaged at D-Med and evacuated to A-Med, therefore, the 1418 casualties received 1771 treatments.

#### (3) Logistic:

(a) The delivery of medical supplies has improved, however, the lead time remains about the same (minimum 30 days). Organic supply is still unable to obtain adequate office supplies. This is a continuous problem, which sometimes delays daily Sick List and other reports.

#### (4) Miscellaneous:

- (a) 2nd Clearing Platoon C Company remains assigned to Khe Sanh operations. 1st Clearing Platoon C Company returned to Phu Bai on 15 May 1967 from Chinook OA.
- (b) The Phu Bai Hospital Laboratory, CSR, and Blood Bank quonsets were occupied in May. Sandbagging of vital buildings continues. Hospital Construction at Dong Ha is practically complete, However, the billeting and supply area construction has not yet begun. There remains a need for protective and defensive bunkers and the installation of an adequate perimeter. If these items were accomplished the hospital would be ready for occupancy.
