(2) Training:

- (a) The company, for the last month, has been supplying and equipping the new medical facility. Department Head's have been conducting extensive "on the job" training programs to better prepare the corpsmen in both the performance of their duties and in anticipation of the future advancement examinations.
- (b) Weekly fire drills and periodical "Red Alert" drills are conducted to maintain organizational readiness.

(3) Command and Control:

- (a) The Commanding Officer meets weekly with the staff officer's to discuss medical, administrative, military, and organizational matters of current importance and interest.
- (b) The Administrative Officer meets daily with the senior petty officer's and section leader's to discuss matters of daily significance and to keep informed of local problems, current events, and future planning.

(4) Logistic's:

(a) This command maintains an I. O. L. for a Collecting and Clearing Platoon, in addition to the maintenance of the normal medical supplies and equipment used by this unit in the accomplishment of it's mission.

(5) Chaplain Support:

(a) This unit is provided with one chaplain corps officer to administer to the religious needs of staff and patient personnel.

(6) New Construction:

- (a) The hospital facility has been relocated and the building's are being stocked and equipped. There are 12 "strong backs" and 9 "quonset huts", and the foundation has been laid for one "Butler" building; which will be utilized by medical supply. The "mine field", that is to be eventually a billeting area, is in the process of being cleared.
- (b) The company is building "above ground" bunkers to replace the "underground" personnel bunkers, that have proven hazardous during moderate rainfall. The "Revetment Wall" has been completed. Sandbagging is continually underway. Work is still being done on water drainage.
