(2) Training:

(a) The company, for the last month, has been supplying and equipping the new medical facility. 

(8) There were 311 cross matches performed by the Laboratory. 64 units of whole blood were received during the month. 182 units were sent to assist the Quang Tri Hospital in their treatment of the sick and wounded.
