2. Training:

A. A formal training program has not been established and training has been accomplished by rotation of personnel and on the job training, especially in the areas of mass casualty handling.

B. Weekly fire drills and periodical "Red Alert" drills are conducted to maintain organizational readiness.

3. Command and control:

- A. The Commanding Officer meets weekly with the officers and staff to discuss medical, administrative, military and organizational matters of current importance and interest.
- B. The Administrative Officer meets daily with the senior petty officers and section leaders to discuss matters of daily significance and to keep informed of local problems, current events and future planning.

4. Logistics:

A. This command maintains an IOL for a Collecting and Clearing Company in addition to the maintenance of the normal medical supplies and equipment used by this unit in the accomplishment of it's mission.

5. Chaplain support:

A. This unit is provided with one chaplain corps officer to administer to the religious needs of the staff and patinet personnel.

6. New construction:

- A. The Company is still building above ground bunkers to replace the underground ones that have proved hazardous. Work is continuing on water drainage.
- B. Three tropical huts have been completed and the 903rd Air Evacuation detachment has been moved into a permanent building. Berthing is now available for the men of the Air Force in a tropical hut precluding the further use of the Air Force tent.
- C. Utilization of the new Butler building is almost complete. Medical supply has completed the move from it's old location and pending the completion of grading, which is in process, organic supply will complete thier move.
- D. CBMU-301 is continuing maintainance to all buildings and have "monsoon proffed" all tropical huts and are currently patching tin roofs. They have installed an electric hot water heater in the galley to replace the gas operated one which had proved unsatisfactory and have repaired the diesel fuel operated hot water heater which supplies hot water for the head.
