(3) Administration:

(a) The total number of casualties processed was 5,515.

(b) Of the above total, 173 were triaged at Dong Ha and evacuated to Phu Bai.

(4) Logistics:

(a) Lead time continues to be excessive, approximately 50 to 60 days, with priority classifications having little meaning as to receipt of material in any priority order. Pending work orders for drainage improvements and road repairs are not as urgently needed as previously reported due to the monsoon rains apparently ending. However, these improvements remain highly desirable for improved and more effective patient care.

(5) Medical Support:

(a) D Company is assigned in support of the Dong Ha Combat Base and in support of units operating in that area.

(b) 2nd Clearing Platoon, C Company is assigned in support of the Khe Sanh Combat Base.

(c) MUST #2 is operational at 3rd Medical Battalion Headquarters, Phu Bai.

(d) 1st Clearing Platoon, D Company, 5th Medical Battalion, is deployed with Battalion Landing team 2/4.




